WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18 Victoria No. 15, initituled, "An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district established under the provisions of the said Act to make bye laws for the regulation and licensing of carters, water drawers and public vehicles; and whereas by a Proclamation of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, dated the 26th day of May, 1855, the district of Emerald Hill was duly established a municipal district under the provisions and within the meaning of the said Act; and whereas it is expedient to make a bye-law for the regulation of water carriers within the municipal district of Emerald Hill: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council for the district of Emerald Hill that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, as required by the provisions of the said Act, every water drawer for hire shall keep his cart or dray loaded with water from sunset to sunrise, and on neglect thereof he shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Forry shillings.

Every water drawer for hire, when called upon to attend a

shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Forty shillings.

Every water drawer for hire, when called upon to attend a fire by a constable or fireman, shall, on neglect or refusal of the same, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Forty shillings.

Every regular or occasional water drawer for hire shall have his designation as such painted in white on black ground, or in black on white ground, over his door or other conspicuous part of his dwelling, and his name and address legibly painted and affixed to each water cart in some conspicuous part thereof, and on neglect thereof he shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings.

bye-laws to have force and effect under the thirty-third section of the said Act, upon the assent of the Governor of the said colony having been obtained ther to under his hand: And whereas by a Proclamation of His Excellency the Governorin chief of the said colony, dated the 12th day of February, 1857, the district of St. Kilda was duly established a municipal district: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of St. Kilda that from and after the date of this byelaw recoiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor-in-Chief of Victoria, the proceedings and business of the said council shall be conducted accurating to the following regulations only, which shall be called the Standing Orders of the said council, that is to say:—

Said council, that is to say:—

OHAV. I.—Order of Proceedings.

1. The sittings of the council shall be open to the public, but a majority of the council may require the expulsion of strangers during the discussion of any particular question.

2. The chairman or any three councillors shall have power to call a special meeting of the council by written instructions to the town clerk, provided that the notice be given two clear days before such meeting shall be held, and at all meetings of the council the business shall commence as soon as the legal quorum is present; but if at the expiration of thirty minutes after the appointed hour of meeting there should not be a quorum present, no business shall be transacted at such meeting, but a note of the circumstance (with the names of the members present) shall be entered in the minute look.

3. The first business at each meeting of the council shall be to confirm the minutes of the preceding meeting, and no discussion shall take place thereupon except as to the accuracy thereof.

4. At all meetings of the council, the reading of correspondence unconnected with the orders of the day, the pre-entation of petitions and bringing up of reports of committees shall have precedence of all motions

5. Every communication addressed to the council shall be in

5. Every communication addressed to the council shall be in proper form, and presented by one of its members, who shall be responsible for its being respectfully worded.

6. On the presentation of a petition, memorial, or other similar communication, no debate shall take place thereon until notice has been given in the usual manner, and the only questions that shall be entertained on the occasion of its presentation shall be that it be received, and if necessary that it be referred to a committee.

7. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the council, and any business which the chairman may think fit to bring under the council of the council consideration; any member may however, bring forward such business as he may consider advisable in the form of a notice of motion, such notice to be given at the meeting previous to that at which the same is to be taken into consideration—all such notices of motion to be considered in the order in which

they shall have been given.

8. No report of a committe sha'l be considered or adopted on its presentation, unless notice thereof shall have been sent to each councillor, and posted in the town clerk's office at least

9. No motion entered on the notice paper shall be proceeded with unless the member who has given such notice, or some one authorised by him, be present when the business is called the control of the control of the struck out of the control of the control of the struck out of the control of order. Notices not so proceeded with shall be struck out of

10. No bye-law shall be finally adopted at the meeting at which it shall be first proposed, nor until the next meeting of council, and every such bye-law shall, in the interim, remain open for the inspection of any of the ratepayers, in the town clerk's office, free of charge,

Char. II.—Order of Debate.

11. Any member, when proposing a motion or amendment, or discussing any matter, must rise and address the chairman, and no member shall be interrupted, unless by a call to order, when he shall sit down; the member calling to order shall then be heard upon such point of order, and the question decided before the subject is resumed or any other business entered

12. Any member desirous of proposing either an original motion or an amendment, must state the nature of such motion or amendment before addressing the council in support

13. No question once brought before the council shall be withdrawn without leave of the council, nor shall any motion be entertained by the council until the same be seconded.

14. If more than one councillor rise at the same time, the chairman for the time being shall decide which is entitled to

15. No councillor shall speak twice on the same question, 15. No councillor shall speak twice on the same question, unless by way of explanation merely, or in reply as the mover of an original motion, or upon any amendment; and after such explanation or reply the question shall be forthwith put to the vote, but councillors merely seconding any motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

16. No councillor shall digress from the subject under discussion or inpute motives, and all personal reflections shall be considered highly disorderly.

17. The presiding chairman's decision shall be final in all questions of order or practice, and he shall state the same without comment or argument.

19. Any councillor who shall use expressions capable of being oficinsively applied to any other councillor, shall, if required by the chairman, withdraw such expressions to the satisfaction of the council, under a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

27. No motion, the effect of which would be to rescind any previous resolution of the council, shall be entertained during the same municipal year, unless a call of the whole council be duly made for the purpose.

There shall be three permanent committees of the council, to be called the public works committee, the finance and rate committee, and the legislative committee, which shall be chosen annually at the meeting of council next after the annual election of chairman. The public works committee shall consist of four members, the other committees shall consist of free members each three to be a querying at the public. shall consist of four members, the other committees shall consist of three members each; three to be a quorum at the public works committee, and two to form a quorum at the other committees, provided, nevertheless, that the council shall be at liberty at any time to fill up occasional vacancies.

29. The town clerk shall convene every committee within seven days of its first appointment, and at any time by order of the council, or the written order of the chairman, or of any two members of such committee.

No councillor shall have any direct pecuniary interest (except as shareholder of any public company) in any contract or other work in connection with the council, nor shall be received as surety for any officer; nor shall any auditor or other officer become security for any other employé of the council, or for any work to be done for the council, and in all cases where security shall be required, the expense of preparing the same shall be borne by the party giving the same.

CHAP. V .- Miscellaneous Regulations.

For the consideration of any bye-law or for the raising or appropriating of money, or for the objects contemplated in Standing Order No. 27, it shall be competent for any member, without previous notice, to move for a call of the whole council for the consideration of any such subject at the next or any
