## WARRNAMBOOL ROAD DISTRICT ALTERED.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the hand of the then Lieutenant Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the tenth day of July, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, a road district to be called "The Warrnambool Road District," was proclaimed, and the boundaries thereof were defined in accordance with an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the said colony, passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "*An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria.*" And whereas by another Proclamation, bearing date the fourteenth day of February, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, the boundaries of the said road district were altered: And whereas it is deemed expedient further to alter the boundaries of the said road district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, in pursuance of the authority vested in me by the said Act, do hereby revoke so much of the said last-named Proclamation as defines the boundaries aforesaid, and I do hereby proclaim and declare that from henceforth the said Warrnambool road district shall consist of the portion of the said colony comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say:—

Commencing at a point on the sea-coast due south of the boundary line between the farms occupied by Pickering and Sloane respectively, in the parish of Yangery, in the county of Villiers; thence by the coast line south-easterly to Curdie's Inlet, county of Heytesbury; thence northerly by Curdie's Inlet to a point due south of the angle formed by Mount Emu Creek where it changes from a southerly to a westerly direction; thence north to that angle; thence by Mount Emu Creek northerly to Darlington; thence by a line westerly to the north boundary of the township of Hexham; thence by the northern boundary of that reserve and a line south-westerly to the north-east angle of the town reserve of Woolsthorpe; thence by the eastern boundary of the said reserve and a line southward to the north-west angle of portion 6, parish of Yarrpturk; thence by a line bearing south to portion 20 in the said parish; thence by part of the northern and western boundaries of the said portion to the Yangery Creek; thence by that Creek southward to a bridge on the Woodford Road; thence by that road westerly 74 chains and 25 links, more or less; thence by a road due south to Rutledge's special survey; thence westerly by part of the northern boundary line of the said special survey; and thence southerly by the boundary between the farms occupied by Pickering and Sloane respectively and a line south to the sea coast, the commencing point aforesaid, except that portion of the county of Villiers included within the municipal boundaries of Warrnambool.

## HAMPDEN AND HEYTESBURY ROAD DISTRICT.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria; and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's Reign, intituled, "*An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria.*" it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim and declare any such portion of the said colony as to him should seem meet, as and to be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, and also to define the boundaries of every road district thereby proclaimed and declared, and to give a specific name or designation to every such road district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, in pursuance of the power so vested in me by the said Act, and of every other power and authority enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the district hereinafter defined shall be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, that is to say:—

The boundary commences at the north-east corner of the township of Hexham, and bears west to the intersection of the north boundary with the River Hopkins; thence northerly by the River Hopkins to its intersection with the north boundary of the county of Hampden; thence by the north boundary of the said county to the north-east corner; thence southerly along the line of the Guarkeet Ponds to Lake Corangamite; thence southerly along the eastern boundary of the county of Heytesbury to the sea-coast; thence westward by the sea-coast to Curdie's Inlet; thence northerly by Curdie's Inlet to a point due south of the angle formed by Mount Emu Creek, where it changes from a southerly to a westerly direction; thence north to that angle; thence by Mount Emu Creek northerly to Darlington; thence by a line westerly to the commencing point.

And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that the specific name or designation of such road district shall be "The Hampden and Heytesbury Road District."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-fifth day of April, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, and in the twentieth year of Her Majesty's Reign.
