LOCAL COURT REGULATIONS.

STEIGLITZ.

REGULATIONS made by the Local Court of the district of Steiglitz:—

(All former Regulations made by the Local Court of the district of Steiglitz, and assented to by His Excellency the Governor are hereby repealed.)

QUARTZ REEFS.

CHAP. I.—Dimensions of claim.

- i. The length of ground along a quartz reef to be held by virtue of each miner's right shall be twenty feet per man.
- ii. Eighty feet shall be the maximum extent in length along a reef allowed to each party of miners to be held as one claim.
- iii. The discovery or Crown claim on a new reef shall be, irrespective of the number of shareholders, of double extent in length without extra width, should application be made by the discoverer or discoverers for such length of claim, provided that it shall not be held by virtue of this clause at the double rate of forty feet per man fourteen days after discovery and occupation, if the number of shareholders requisite to secure the said extent against occupation, in conformity with section first, is not by that time made up, and their names as occupiers of it entered within the said period on the records of the local court.
- iv. In abandoned ground the claims on reefs shall be double the length allowed on new ground.
- v. A width of fifty yards on both sides of a reef, with all its dips and angles shall be allowed to each claim; provided, that where the space between two distinct reefs does not admit of said allowance to the claims on both reefs, the said space be divided equally between them.
- vi. The double banking of a claim shall not be allowed after it has been proved that the party double banking is quarrying a quartz reef, the dip and angle of which is so decidedly towards the reef in the former claim that the continuation of the working of it would be destructive of the claim allowed to the former in the previous section.
- vii. Tents and buildings not intended for machinery may be erected on the allowed width of fifty yards, where they do not interfere with the working of a claim, and the holders of a claim are unable to produce to the local court a reasonable objection against their erection.
- viii. The divisional line between claims shall be a line running east and west through the end pegs, leaving a wall of two feet between claims.
- ix. The southern peg of each claim shall have the number of the claim attached to it in a conspicuous manner, the numbering of the claims to commence at the Crown claim and to be continued northerly and southerly from it.
- x. A party of miners shall not be allowed to hold more than one claim on the same reef by original occupation, but may by purchase.

CHAP. II.—The working of quartz reefs.

- i. Two men of a party shall be considered sufficient, if they work efficiently, to test a claim till gold is obtained from it in paying quantities, without the remainder of the said party forfeiting their shares in the said claim thereby.
- ii. Permission will be given to the holders of adjoining claims to unite in the working of them more profitably, upon making application to that effect to the local court, and the said permission will be given subject to the regulations in force on these gold fields, and to any special conditions which the court may find it necessary to impose for the security of the mining interest.
- iii. Persons who obtain shares by *bona fide* purchase shall be allowed to hold any number of them in one claim or in several claims, on one reef or on several reefs, provided that each share be efficiently worked by a substitute in conformity with these regulations.
- iv. When water is struck upon in a claim the holders of that claim will, upon application to the local court, and the attendance before it of all interested parties in adjoining claims, obtain from the court such special order as may be necessary for the efficient working of the said claim and of those adjoining it.
- v. Inasmuch as a person who works according to the terms of written agreement to the following effect, a share in a claim subject to adventure of receiving a certain portion of the pro-

ceeds accruing to the said share, at the dividends made of the said proceeds, possesses by statute the right to sell and dispose of his interest in the proceeds of said claim, and title of admission to work in it, subject to the same conditions as those on which he held it: Be it therefore determined by this section that in cases when disagreement ensues between the said working share-man and the sleeping shareholder as to the working capability of the purchaser or intended substitute, the local court shall and may decide the said point of disagreement: And be it further determined that when a division of proceeds takes place the portion falling due to the working share-man shall not be withheld from him but be paid over at once, without reference to the sleeping shareholder when the working share-man shall have notified to the sleeping shareholder, or his accredited agent, at his usual place of abode, a forthcoming division of proceeds from quartz being crushed or from soil being washed: And lastly, be it determined that such payments when made to the working share-man shall be supported by his acquittance, drawn out in proper form.

vi. It shall be optional with all shareholders in mining claims, within the local court district of Steiglitz, either to work or cease to work their respective shares without forfeiture of said shares for so doing, from Christmas in each year to the 7th of January following, and from Good Friday in each year to the Friday following, and on all other holidays observed by the Government and by the banks of the colony, provided that wet sinkings which have been brought under the cognizance and order of the local court, as laid down in section fourth, shall, notwithstanding this section to the contrary, be worked strictly according to the said order of court.

vii. A party of miners, who, from want of means, are compelled to temporarily abandon their claim, shall, if their case upon strict investigation be found to be one of peculiar hardship and deserving of consideration from the large amount of unprofitable work performed, be allowed to leave and register it as unworked for one month at a time, upon making application in writing to the said effect to the local court; provided that written notice of the said application about to be made has been properly served upon the holders of the adjoining claims, and the sanction of the said court to the registration shall then be given: Be it provided further that in cases of sudden emergency and hindrance to the working of a claim, permission to leave the said claim unworked for one week may be given by the acting warden.

viii. To prohibit the forcible occupation of claims which have been at all worked, it shall be held necessary as a preliminary step without which possession shall not be given, that where a claim or share in a claim, is supposed to have become forfeited or abandoned, the former holders, if on these gold fields and in the habit of frequenting it, be served with written notice of intention to occupy, and upon proof of service of notice or of posting of it at the claim for twenty-four hours when the holders are not known, the justice shall, either with assessors or without them, as may be required by Act of Council, decide the possession of it: provided hereby, that reasonable excuse for absence, irrespectively of any fixed period for absence, be accepted at the hearing of any such dispute, and have its due weight.

ix. When a claim which is known to have yielded profitable returns for the labor expended, is to all appearance not continuously and efficiently worked, the said mode of working it, instead of the written notice specified in the previous section, shall be brought in the first instance under the cognizance of the local court, which shall and may, if such course appear to be necessary, notify in writing to the shareholders of the said claim that it shall become subject to the provisions of the previous section, if they fail within fourteen days after the service of the last-mentioned notice to recommence the efficient working of the said claim.

ALLUVIAL SINKINGS.

CHAP. III.—The dimensions of claims.

i. In alluvial sinkings, dry or wet, the discovery claim shall be a hundred feet square, provided that the discovery is made known at once to the acting warden.

ii. Twelve feet in length along the gutter by twenty-four feet in width shall be allowed to each miner in alluvial dry sinkings; and the maximum size of each claim in the said sinkings shall be only double that allowance.

iii. Thirty-six feet in length along a gutter by thirty-six feet in width shall be allowed to two or more miners in alluvial wet sinkings; and the said area shall be the maximum size of each claim in the said sinkings.

iv. Sections No. iv., ix. and x. of chap. I. of these regulations shall be in force on alluvial sinkings.

v. In the bed of the creek opposite to the Police Barracks twenty yards per man shall be allowed along the windings of the creek, with a width of fifty feet on each side of the centre of said allowance.

CHAP. IV.—The working of alluvial sinkings.

i. Sections No. ii., iii., iv., v., vi. and viii. of chap. II. of these regulations shall be in force on alluvial sinkings.

ii. Persons intending to occupy a claim in the bed of the creek, opposite to the Police Barracks, must in the first instance make an application in writing to the local court, for the site they intend to occupy, accompanied by a plan of it, furnished

by a qualified surveyor. The application will be refused should the working of the ground applied for be injurious to the water supply of the gold fields, or in any other way injurious to the interests of the residents.

iii. Each claim in the bed of the creek opposite to the Police Barracks, when allowed, must be worked by not less than six men.

iv. A sufficient number of the best waterholes shall be reserved by the acting warden for the use of the inhabitants of these gold fields, and any person found guilty of bathing in, or of washing soil or disintegrated quartz, or clothing at or near to, or of in any way injuring the purity of the water so reserved, or of suffering animals in his charge to injure its purity, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

The foregoing Regulations, Chapters i. to iv., have been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

LOCAL COURT REGULATIONS.

HEATHCOTE.

REGULATIONS made by the Local Court of the district of Heathcote:—

xxii. *Applications for puddling mills.*—Applicants for sites for puddling mills or other special privileges shall lodge a written application for the same with the clerk of the local court three days before the sitting of the court, and all such applications shall be under the consideration of the court for at least two consecutive sittings, before being finally disposed of.

xxiii. *Notice of application.*—After an application has been lodged with the clerk of the local court, the applicant shall post a written or printed notice thereof upon a stake or board at least eight feet in height, erected solely for that purpose upon the site applied for, during a space of twenty-one days, or for a period including two sittings of the court.

xxiv. *Written authority.*—When an application shall have been granted by the local court, the applicant shall receive from the chairman a written authority, stating the precise terms upon which such application has been granted.

xxv. *Area allowed for dam.*—Any person having permission to erect or having previously erected a puddling mill, shall be entitled to an area of sixty yards in length by thirty yards in breadth for his dam, such extent of ground to be cleared or excavated to the bed rock. Under special circumstances, the local court to have the power of granting a larger space of ground.

xxvi. *Sludge channels.*—All proprietors of puddling mills from the date hereof shall, where practicable, dig a sludge channel from their own as far as the next puddling mill in the same gully, in the direction of or towards the main creek, thus eventually conducting the sludge into the main creek.

xxvii. *Dimensions and course of sludge channels.*—It shall be compulsory upon all proprietors of puddling mills to make their sludge channels of the following dimensions, viz:—

Breadth at surface ... 2 feet.

Depth at centre ... 1 foot 6 inches.

The warden of the district in all cases to direct the course of such sludge channels.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, 14 Victoria No. 20, intituled, "An Act for regulating the formation, drainage and repair of streets, courts and alleys on private property, within the city of Melbourne," it is, amongst other things enacted, that where any street, court or alley on private property in the city of Melbourne, shall not be, or shall not have been sufficiently paved, flagged, macadamised, levelled, drained and sewered, or otherwise completed or repaired, to the satisfaction of the council of the said city, it shall be lawful for the said council at any time, and from time to time, by any order under the hand of the mayor or town clerk of the said city, for the time being respectively, to order that any such street, court or alley, or any part thereof, shall be freed from obstruction, paved, flagged, macadamised, levelled, drained and sewered, or otherwise completed or repaired, in such manner and within such time as to the said council may appear expedient, and thereupon the owners of the tenements adjoining or abutting upon such street, court or alley, on each side thereof, shall, in such manner and within such time as shall be expressed in such order, at their respective costs, charges and expenses, remove all obstructions, and well and efficiently pave, flag and macadamise, level, drain and sewer, or otherwise complete or repair so much of the said street, court or alley, to the centre thereof, as may be opposite to and co-extensive with their respective tenements, adjoining or abutting on such streets, courts or alleys respectively.

And whereas the streets, courts and alleys enumerated in the schedule to this order annexed, marked A, have not been sufficiently paved, flagged, macadamised, levelled, drained and sewered, or otherwise completed or repaired to the satisfaction of the council of the city of Melbourne:

Be it now ordered by the council of the said city, that the streets, courts and alleys enumerated in the schedule to this order annexed, marked A, shall, within forty days from the date of this order coming into operation, be freed from obstruction, paved, flagged, macadamised, levelled, drained and sewered in such manner as is expressed in the schedule to this order annexed, and marked B; and it is hereby notified to the owners respectively of the tenements adjoining or abutting upon the streets, courts and alleys enumerated in the schedule to this order annexed, marked A, that if they or any of them shall neglect or omit to remove the obstructions, and pave, flag, macadamise, level, drain and sewer, or otherwise complete or repair the street, court or alley on which their tenements respectively adjoin or abut, in the manner and within the time expressed in this order, then the council of the said city will remove all obstructions in the said streets, courts and alleys, and pave, flag, macadamise, level, drain, sewer and otherwise complete or repair the same, or such parts thereof as shall not have been so done pursuant to this order, and will thereupon ascertain, determine, and charge such respective owners with their several proportionate parts of the costs, charges and expenses thereof, according to, and co-extensive with, their respective tenements adjoining or abutting on such street, court or alley, having regard in such apportionment to the state and condition of the pavement, flagging, macadamising, levelling, draining and sewerage in which such streets, courts or alleys respectively, or any part thereof, shall or may be at the time of making this order.

SCHEDULE A, REFERRED TO IN THIS ORDER.

Streets, courts, and alleys, ordered to be freed from obstruction, paved, flagged, macadamised, levelled, drained, and sewered.

LOCALITY—LA TROBE WARD.

The private lane or lanes in block G, allotments 7, 8, and 9, running from Flinders lane to Flinders street.

SCHEDULE B, REFERRED TO IN THIS ORDER.

Manner in which the streets, courts, and alleys, enumerated in schedule A, referred to in this order, are ordered to be freed from obstruction, paved, flagged, macadamised, levelled, drained and sewered.

The natural soil is to be reduced or made up as the case may require, so that the longitudinal section of the whole right-of-way shall in no part have an inclination of less than 1 in 120, and where practicable, the entire length is to form one incline. In laying on any stuff it is to be spread in layers of not more than one foot thick. The transverse section of the right-of-way is to show a roadway whose crown shall be one inch above the kerbs of the footways, and in the fall from the crown of the water channels is to be at the rate of 1 in 25.

On either side of the roadway there is to be a water channel eighteen inches wide, consisting of two rows of bluestone pitchers, nine inches deep, and not less than nine inches by fourteen inches on the surface, with upright sides, set in loam and rammed with a rammer weighing forty pounds, so as to subside four inches.

The bottom of the channel is to be seven inches below the top of the kerbs.

On either side of the roadway there is also to be a footway not more than three feet wide, and these are to be separated from the roadway by a red gum plank or kerb ten inches by three, set on edge, and fastened with five-inch spikes to piles four inches by four of red gum, three feet long, driven into the soil.

The footways are to be covered with a coat of gravel three inches thick, and the surface is to fall towards the channel at the rate of 1 in 10. The roadway is to be covered with a coat of broken metal, broken to a two and a-half inch gauge, and laid on seven inches thick at the channels and eight inches at the crown, and this, when necessary, is to be covered with a coat of loam one and a-half inches thick.

Wherever private entrances lead from the rights-of-way they are to be paved to the full width with bluestone pitchers in the same manner as the channels. Paving is to be extended from the channels towards the line of houses or fences, so as to cross the entire footway.

The whole of the work must be done under the inspection and subject to the approval of the city surveyor, who is authorised to order any deviation from these general principles which the particularities of any case may require.




