BYE-LAW No. 14.—A BYE-LAW FOR THE REGULATING OF BUILDING OPERATIONS AND THE LICENSING OF BUILDERS THEREON.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, "*An Act for the Establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*," it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district established under the provisions of the said Act to provide for the general good rule of such municipal district, and that such council shall have the care and management of the roads, public streets and public thoroughfares, and shall and may make such bye-laws for carrying out these objects as shall to such council shall seem fit: And whereas by a Proclamation of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, dated the 26th day of May, 1855, the district of Emerald Hill was duly established a municipality under the provisions and within the meaning of the said Act: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council for the district of Emerald Hill, that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor in Chief of Victoria, as required by the provisions of the said Act:—

That no builder or other person shall commence erecting or pulling down any building, or placing any materials for or from the same, in or abutting on any public street, lane, court, or alley, &c., to which the public may have access, within the municipality, without first obtaining a license, in form set forth in schedule A. hereunto annexed, from the said council, to authorise him to deposit such building materials. Before any such deposit shall be made, a good and sufficient hoarding shall be erected, to be placed round such materials, to the satisfaction of the council, their surveyor or other officer, and a light or so many lights as the case may require shall be kept in a conspicuous place thereon burning from sunset to sunrise, and no such material shall encroach more than one-third of the width of any roadway, or so as to render any road impassable to vehicles, and the footways and gutters or drains shall in all cases be kept free.

The license shall be charged for at Five shillings (5s.) and shall remain in force twenty-one days from the date thereof, and no longer, but may be renewed upon application to the council.

Any builder or other person refusing to shew his license when required to do so by the town surveyor or any authorised officer of the council, shall be deemed and dealt with as an unlicensed person, and any person producing such license

which has been in any way altered, shall be deemed an unlicensed person.

Any person depositing building materials without being licensed so to do, or exceeding the powers granted by such license, shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20), and any person failing to remove any scaffolding or hoarding, &c., as aforesaid, on being called on to do so by the proper authority, or order of the council, shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Five pounds (£5) per day for every day that it may continue, and not be removed: Provided always that such cumulative penalty shall not exceed on the whole the sum of Fifty pounds. The council or their surveyor may, however, call as frequently as they or he may deem necessary or proper upon any person contravening this regulation, to remove forthwith the cause of offence, and the refusal or delay to obey any and every such call shall be, and be deemed to be a distinct and separate offence under this bye-law, and shall subject the offender to the penalty hereinbefore set forth.

- T**HAT the ordinary meetings of this Board be held every Saturday at Three o'clock.
2. That special meetings shall be summoned at any time by the chairman, upon receiving a written requisition signed by two members of the Board.
3. That no such meeting shall be held unless notice shall have been thereof at least seven days; that such notice shall be given by advertisement in the local papers, stating the business to be discussed at such meeting.
4. Notices of motions not involving the expenditure of money must be given at least one week previous to their discussion by the Board.
5. Notices of motions involving the expenditure of any sum of money exceeding Ten pounds must be given at least one week previous to being discussed by the Board.
6. Notices of motions involving the expenditure of smaller sums may be discussed at the meeting at which they are brought forward, as also may orders for the payment of salaries.
7. That no payment be made of any account whatever, unless such account be first approved and ordered to be paid by the Board.
8. That the secretary shall attend every meeting, except when absent in case of sickness or by permission of the Board, and at all such meetings the secretary shall read the minutes of previous meeting and have them confirmed, shall read all correspondence, shall lay before the Board all business for consideration at that meeting, make minutes of their proceedings, and submit them to the chairman for his signature at the conclusion of the meeting.
9. That the secretary shall furnish a summary of each meeting to the local paper.
10. That the secretary shall strictly conform to clause 61 in the Road Board Act.
11. That the secretary shall at every meeting lay before the Board a statement of all moneys that have been paid into his hands since the previous meeting, together with the bank-book and rate-book.
12. From and after the ordering of the first rate by this Board the secretary shall attend at his office daily from Ten o'clock to Three o'clock.
13. That the collector shall not distrain in any case, unless previously ordered to do so by the Board.
