TRANSFERABLE AND REMITTABLE GOVERNMENT DEBENTURES.

HIS Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to direct that sealed tenders be invited, to be received at the Treasury, Melbourne, until Noon of the eighth day of June, 1857, from persons desirous to advance the whole, or any portion of the sum of One hundred and eighty-seven thousand pounds sterling, secured by debentures, to be issued by the Treasurer under authority of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 40, as follows:—

1st. Each tender must be for an even sum of hundreds of pounds, and must state the year in which the tenderer wishes the debentures he tenders for to be payable, and whether in Melbourne or London, and also where the interest is to be payable.

2nd. The tenders must be sealed and endorsed "Tender for Government Debentures," and addressed to the Treasurer.

3rd. Should the tender be accepted debentures in the form set forth in the schedule A to the said Act will be issued for (£100) One hundred pounds each, secured upon the general revenue of the colony of Victoria, and made a first charge thereon, and will bear interest from the 1st July, 1857, at the rate of Six pounds (£6) per centum per annum, payable half yearly, on the 1st January and the 1st of July, the first payment of such interest being due on the 1st January, 1858.

4th. Any change in the place at which the principal or interest is payable may be made by the holder giving six months notice, in writing, in the manner prescribed by the Act.

5th. The debentures will be made payable to the holders, and will pass by delivery without assignment or endorsement.

6th. The amount tendered, if accepted, must be paid in cash on or before the 1st July, 1857.

7th. No tender below par will be accepted.

8th. The tenders will be opened publicly at the time and place above specified, before the Chief Secretary, the Treasurer, and such members of the Legislature as may desire to attend.

SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATION FOR THE CHINESE ON THE GOLD FIELDS.

HIS Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has made the following Regulation (supplementary to the Regulations dated the 19th of March, 1856*) for the management and good government of the Chinese on the gold fields, in pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 39, section 6.

VIII. *Construction of drains, &c., by Chinese employing puding machines.*—When any Chinese miner or miners shall

occupy and hold any engine, mill, or machine for the separation of gold from the substance in which it may be imbedded, or for any other purpose, it shall be competent for the protector, or, in the absence of such officer, for the warden of the district, to order and direct any such Chinese to execute and make the portion or portions of any sludge or water drain, road, bridge, crossing-place, or other work connected with mining as may be necessary, and which shall, in common with other miners, fairly fall to him or them to execute and make; and the protector, or, in the absence of such officer, the warden of the district, shall point out to such Chinese in an exact manner, the amount and nature of the work to be executed by him or them, and the time when such work shall be commenced and when it shall be completed; and such Chinese shall execute such portion or portions of work so assigned to him or them to execute in a workmanlike manner, and within the time specified in such order: Provided that nothing in this regulation shall be taken to interfere with any rule or regulation which shall have been made, or may hereafter be made by any local court, or with the jurisdiction of such court.

MUNICIPALITY OF BALLAARAT.

BYE-LAW No. 15.—FOR THE BETTER PREVENTION OF FIRES, AND TO GUARD AGAINST ACCIDENTS FROM THE CARELESS OR IMPROPER USE OF FIRES IN OPEN OR PUBLIC PLACES WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP OF BALLAARAT.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Legislative Council in Victoria 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, "*An Act for the Establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*," the council of any municipal district is empowered to make bye-laws for the prevention and extinguishing of fires, and for the general good rule, &c.: Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the municipal council of Ballaarat, that it shall not be lawful for any roof or other exterior covering of canvas, duck, drill, calico, or any such material to be placed upon or on the outside of any building to be erected within the boundaries as hereafter set forth and specially declared, nor shall it be lawful for any such now in use to be repaired or renewed with like material unless such building or erection shall stand and be twenty clear feet apart from any dwelling house, store or other building whatsoever.

That no person shall keep any stack or stacks of hay, corn, or straw, of any description, on premises within the said boundaries, unless the same be under cover of a shed or building, of which no exterior part or covering shall be of canvas, calico, or other like textile fabric whatever.

That no person shall be permitted to erect or put up any bush or brush fence either as a side or partition fence for any purpose.

That it shall be lawful for the said council, or their inspector, or any other officer, upon complaint, in writing, of any ratepayer that any chimney flue or vent is constructed of improper materials, or that the top of such chimney or flue is not sufficiently elevated or removed from any inflammable materials, of which the roof or other portion of the building or any adjoining building is constructed, or that any such chimney or flue is not so constructed as properly to carry up the smoke, so that it becomes a nuisance or dangerous to the neighbours, or if it shall appear to the council, or their inspector, or other duly authorised officer, necessary at any time, he shall and may at any reasonable time, proceed to inspect any such chimney or flue, and if he shall find any proper ground of complaint, or reasonable cause of danger or nuisance, he or they shall forthwith serve a notice upon the owner or occupier of such premises, calling upon him to alter such chimney, vent, or flue, so

as to remedy and abate any such danger or nuisance; and it shall not be permitted hereafter to alter or repair, or to erect any chimney, vent, or flue of any dangerous or inflammable material, nor of any other substance than brick or stone or iron or earthwork of sufficient solidity and proper construction. That in order the better and more effectually to guard against accidents, any person or persons who shall incautiously, carelessly or improperly use, or cause, or permit, or suffer to be used or make, place or deposit any fire or combustible substance whatsoever in or upon any road, street, footway, lane, court, alley or thoroughfare, or open or public place in or near any building, dwellinghouse or place of business, or within or upon any yard, whether fenced or enclosed or not, shall be and be deemed guilty of a breach of this bye-law; and all the provisions of this bye-law shall henceforth extend and take effect within the following boundaries, that is to say: At a commencing point on the southern boundary of Sturt street, five chains from the eastern boundary of Lydiard street, extending south in a straight line to the Golden Point road, and thence along the northern boundary of the said road to the northern boundary of Eyre street at Armstrong street, and thence by the northern boundary of Eyre street to the eastern boundary of Drummond street, and thence north to the southern boundary of Mair street, and thence east by the southern boundary of Mair street to the western boundary of Lydiard street, and thence south to the southern boundary of Sturt street, and thence east to the commencing point; and that it shall be lawful for the said council at any time hereafter to extend the boundaries for the operation of this bye-law in any such manner as to them may seem fit so to do, by a bye-law to that purpose; and upon any infringement or breach of the provisions of this bye-law, or any one of them, or any neglect or refusal to attend to any notice given by the said council, their inspector or other officer, any person so infringing, neglecting or refusing to comply with the same, shall be liable upon conviction before two or more justices of the peace to forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds (£20).

MUNICIPALITY OF ST. KILDA.

BYE-LAW No. 5.—To empower the Municipal Council to STOP UP OR CLOSE AGAINST PUBLIC TRAFFIC ANY STREET, ROAD, WAY, OR FOOTPATH, DURING THE PROGRESS OF WORKS.

WHEREAS it is expedient and necessary that, for the purposes of forming, metalling, paving and repairing the several streets, roads, ways and footpaths within the municipality of St. Kilda, and for the construction and repairs of drains and sewers, or for the laying of water or gas pipes, or for the taking up and relaying or repairing the same, the street, road, way, or path, or streets, roads, ways, or paths where any such works are being carried on, should be stopped up or closed against public traffic, if deemed necessary, during the progress of such works, or any of them: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the council of the municipal district of St. Kilda, that, from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor-in-Chief, pursuant to 18 Victoria No. 15, sec. 33, &c., it shall be lawful for the said council to order and direct the closing up or stopping of any street, road, way, or footpath within the limits of the municipality against public traffic, during the progress therein of any or all of the works above described, by any suitable barrier or barriers, or by notice or notices in writing, at the ends or junction of any such street, road, way, or path with any other street, road, way, or path, and to continue such barrier or barriers, notice or notices until such time as such street, road, way, or path shall be ready and fit for public traffic: And be it further ordered and directed by the authority aforesaid, that if any person or persons shall take down, break, or remove any such barrier or barriers, notice or notices as aforesaid, or proceed along any such street, road, way, or path, without the consent of the said council being first obtained thereto, with any cart, waggon, carriage, or other vehicle, or with any horse, bullock, or other beast of burthen, or cattle, whether attached to any such cart, waggon, carriage, or other vehicle or not, during the progress of any such work or works as aforesaid, or until such barrier or barriers, notice or notices, shall have been removed, as the instance of the said council, any person or persons so offending shall, upon conviction thereof before any two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum or penalty not exceeding five pounds.

PETITION FOR MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS.
BRUNSWICK.

(Second Petition.)

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition to His Excellency hereinafter set forth, signed by three hundred and eighty-two householders resident within the district of Brunswick, in the county of Bourke.

The petitioners state that it will greatly tend to benefit the district of Brunswick that it should be constituted a municipal district, and propose that the boundaries thereof should be as follow, viz.:—Commencing at the bridge on the Merri Creek at the village of Northcote, and bounded on the south by a line bearing west to the eastern boundary of the Prince's Park reserve, by the said reserve northerly and westerly to the Sydney road; thence westerly along the northern boundary of the Royal Park reserve to the Moonsee Ponds, by the said ponds north-westerly to the north-western corner of section 126, parish of Jika Jika; thence easterly along the northern boundary of section 127, parish of Jika Jika, to the Merri Creek, and by the said creek south-easterly to the point of commencement.

The petitioners further state that the area of the proposed district does not exceed nine square miles, and that it contains a population of householders exceeding five hundred, and that no one point in such area is distant more than six miles from any other point.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"May it therefore please Your Excellency to declare by Your Excellency's Proclamation that the said district be a municipal district under the name of 'The Brunswick Municipality,' pursuant to the provisions of 18 Victoria No. 15."

ABSTRACT OF METEOROLOGICAL OBSERVATIONS TAKEN IN VICTORIA DURING THE QUARTER ENDING 31st MARCH, 1857.

By R. BROUGH SMYTH, Esq., C.E., F.G.S., Etc.

ON comparing the mean temperature of each month at Melbourne, during the quarter, with the mean temperatures observed during that period in 1856, considerable differences are apparent:—

The mean temperature of January was not high, but the extremes of temperature were great. The thermometer in shade exceeded 100° on one day, 90° on four days, 80° on four days, 70° on eleven days, and 60° on eleven days. Many days were cloudless or nearly cloudless.

February was remarkable for extreme heat. The thermometer in shade exceeded 100° on one day, 90° on five days, 80° on nine days, 70° on nine days, and above 60° on four days.

March was cool, differing remarkably from March, 1856. The sky was often obscured by dull grey clouds, and occasionally the weather was cold, and a bleak wind blew, but many days were nearly cloudless and moderately warm. The thermometer in shade exceeded 90° on two days, 80° on five days, 70° on ten days, 60° on twelve days, and 50° on two days.

The mean degree of humidity at Melbourne as compared with last year was as follows:—

The mean temperature of the air at Geelong during the summer of 1856-7 was 66.0°.

Lightning was seen but thunder was not heard on the 15th and 29th January at Melbourne; on the 2nd and 30th at Geelong; on the 2nd and 21st February at Heathcote; on the 22nd at Melbourne and Heathcote; on the 23rd at Geelong; on the 8th March at Heathcote; on the 27th at Melbourne, Geelong and Creswick, and on the 28th at Geelong.

Thunder was heard but lightning was not seen on the 1st January at Mount Macedon; on the 12th at Ballarat; on the 16th at Melbourne; on the 22nd at Ballarat; on the 29th at Creswick; on the 31st at Melbourne and Geelong; on the 17th February at Ballarat; on the 21st at Creswick; on the 22nd at Mount Macedon; on the 23rd at Heathcote, and on the 27th March at Heathcote.

Thunder and Lightning were observed on the 2nd January at Melbourne, Mount Macedon and Creswick; on the 30th at Melbourne, Mount Macedon and Creswick; on the 31st at Mount Macedon and Creswick; on the 7th February at Heathcote; on the 17th at Melbourne and Geelong, and on the 27th March at Melbourne.

Fog was occasionally observed during the night and at early morning at Melbourne, and it was prevalent on the coast during the quarter. It was present 37 days at Mount Macedon, and it was occasionally noticed at Heathcote and Ballarat, but inland it was not general on any day.

Shooting Stars were observed at Melbourne on the 1st and 23rd January, and at Heathcote on the 8th February, and 14th and 25th of March.

Solar Halos were seen on the 4th February at Melbourne and Mount Macedon; on the 16th at Melbourne, and on the 12th March, at Melbourne.

Lunar Halos were seen on the 9th February at Heathcote, and on the 11th March, at Melbourne.

A Lunar Rainbow was seen at Melbourne on the 15th January.

Hail fell on the 16th January at Mount Macedon and Creswick; on the 17th at Mount Macedon, Ballarat and Creswick; on the 31st at Ballarat and Creswick; on the 27th March at Mount Macedon, and on the 28th at Melbourne and Creswick.

Hot Winds were felt on the 2nd January at Creswick; on the 8th at Geelong and Ballarat; on the 12th at Melbourne and Ballarat; on the 28th at Melbourne and Ballarat; on the 7th February at Melbourne; on the 16th at Melbourne, and on the 28th at Ballarat.

MUNICIPALITY OF RICHMOND.

THE SECOND HALF-YEARLY REPORT OR STATEMENT OF THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF RICHMOND, FOR SIX MONTHS FROM THE 2ND DAY OF NOVEMBER, 1856, TO THE 2ND DAY OF MAY, 1857, PURSUANT TO THE 43RD SECTION OF THE MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS ACT.

BOUNDARIES OF THE MUNICIPALITY.

THE boundaries of the municipality are as follows:—

On the west by the eastern boundary of Hoddle street, from the River Yarra to the centre of Victoria street east; on the north by a straight line along the centre of Victoria street east to its termination, and thence by a straight line to the River Yarra; on the south and east by the River Yarra.

The northern boundary of the municipality has been extended by Proclamation of His Excellency Sir Henry Barkly,

from the southern boundary of Victoria street east to the centre of the roadway.

An agreement has been made with the municipal council of East Collingwood for the joint maintenance of the roadway, each municipality separately forming and repairing the footpaths and water channels.

APPLICATIONS TO GOVERNMENT.

The council have maintained a correspondence with the various departments of the Government on important public questions affecting the interest of the municipality, with the following results:—

Branch Post Office be established in Richmond.—Refused.
Tolls on Richmond Bridge road be granted to the municipal council.—No answer.

Second moiety of £5000.—Granted.
Set of standard weights and measures.—None in the colony.
Site for quarries.—Granted.

Destruction of thistles.—Prisoners of the Crown sent to cut them down.

Post Office be not removed from Richmond.—No answer.
Proclamation of fifty-three streets, of certain widths of roadways and footpaths.—Granted.

Footpaths on eastern portion of Hoddle street, generally known as Punt road, be formed.—No answer.

Formation and metalling of Hoddle street, between Wellington parade and Victoria street east.—Declined for the present.

Cleanse channels in Richmond Bridge road from Star and Garter Hotel to Church street.—Granted.

Three thousand pounds, portion of grant in aid, apportioned for 1857.—Granted.

Removal of Punt House from the northern bank of the River Yarra.—To be removed in July.

Dangerous state of bridge across the Yarra connecting Richmond with Hawthorn.—New bridge to be erected.

Government to proclaim, under 34th section of the Municipal Institutions Act, the roads, works, places or buildings which the Government intend should be excluded from the interference of the council.—No answer.

Grant of the two acres of land on which the Court House now stands.—No answer.

Grant of land for site for a fair and cattle market.—Council to select site.

MISCELLANEOUS.

Bye-law No. 1, appropriating £5000, grant in aid, adopted by the council on the 17th September.—Gazetted on the 1st January, 1857.

Bye-law No. 2, to prevent accidents from fires in chimney flues, and to cause water carriers to give prompt aid at fires; and Bye-law No. 3, prohibiting damage to public footpaths and water-courses, and regulating the formation of private drains and crossings, adopted by the council on the 19th December, 1856.—Gazetted on the 13th January, 1857.

Two hundred copies of bye-laws Nos. 2 and 3 have been posted throughout the municipality.

Deputations from the council have waited upon the Honorable the Commissioner of Public Works respecting the appropriation by the Government of the tolls receivable at the Richmond road toll-gate, and the punt on the Yarra at the southern termination of Hoddle street; also pointing out the absolute necessity of forming and metalling that portion of Hoddle street situate between Wellington parade and Victoria street east.—Hitherto without success.

The resignation by councillor Little of his seat in the municipal council of Richmond was accepted on the 14th day of November, 1856; on the 13th day of December following, councillor Egan was elected to fill the vacancy.

Francis Greenway, land and house agent, was appointed rate collector on the 13th day of January, 1857, at a fixed salary of £100 per annum.

Sergeant Boylan, of the Richmond Police, was appointed Inspector of Nuisances on the 30th day of January, at a weekly salary at the rate of £50 per annum.

An adjourned public meeting of the ratepayers held at the Assembly Rooms, Swan street, on Thursday, the 5th of February, authorised the council to borrow the sum of £5000 as a cash credit, if required, to enable the council to carry out the projected public works. An arrangement has been proposed by the Bank of Victoria to advance the council the sum of £5000 as a cash credit at 6 per cent.—As yet no final arrangement has been entered into, the council being at present in sufficient funds to carry on the improvements.

The council held two special meetings on the 6th and 13th April, in addition to the usual meetings, for the purpose of enabling ratepayers to place their names on the municipal electoral roll, 69 of whom availed themselves of the opportunity.

At the annual election held on the 20th April, councillors P. Johnson, H. Johnson, and T. Lambert, were elected to fill the vacancies of P. Johnson, H. Johnson, and Horatio St. John Clarke.

The auditors to the council are J. Anketell, Esq., J.P., and Mr. Charles Britten.

The Honorable Henry Miller, M.L.C., was elected chairman of the council for the present year.

The Public Works Committee consists of D. S. Campbell, Esq., M.L.A., chairman, councillors Burnley, Egan, H. Johnson, and Lambert.

The Finance and Legislative Committee consists of the Honorable Henry Miller, M.L.C., chairman, D. S. Campbell, Esq., M.L.A., H. Johnson, and P. Johnson.
Eighteen petitions and memorials have been presented to the council on various local subjects.
