GENERAL ORDER.

IN consequence of a representation from the civil power of their deeming it expedient to undertake the custody and transmission of gold from the several offices in the interior to the Treasury at Melbourne, the Major-General directs that the mounted company of the 40th regiment which has for a considerable period been charged with this important service, return to its legitimate duties at head quarters.

The public records shew that it has faithfully performed this duty for three years and eight months, dating from May, 1853, to the present time, during which period it escorted and delivered into the public Treasury no less than six million (6,000,000) ounces of gold, valued at £24,000,000 sterling, and conveyed to and from the interior in cash £17,000,000, making a total of £41,500,000.

At the representation of the administrative government of Victoria, His Excellency Sir Henry Barkly has been pleased to express his sense of the admirable manner in which this detached force has conducted itself in the discharge of the very responsible and peculiar duty assigned to it.

On such an occasion Major-General Macarthur will have much pleasure in soliciting the especial notice of the General commanding in Chief to the meritorious services of the officers, non-commissioned officers and privates of this portion of the 40th regiment, and in reporting for the satisfaction of His Royal Highness, their, at all times, true and soldierlike bearing.

MUNICIPALITY OF BELFAST.
BYE-LAW No. 3.—STANDING ORDERS.

ORDER 33—For the consideration of any bye-law, or for the raising or appropriating of money, or for the objects contemplated in standing order No 34, it shall be competent for any member, without previous notice, to move for a call of the whole council for the consideration of any such subject at the next or any subsequent meeting, and upon such motion being carried, due notice thereof shall be given in the notice paper for the day when the order of the day or notice of motion for which such call is made is set down for consideration; and the clerk to the council shall give in writing three clear days notice of such call of the council to every member not then present. Any member not in attendance when such order of the day or notice of motion comes under consideration, or not in attendance at the voting upon such question, or any amendment thereof, whether of adjournment or otherwise, shall be liable to a penalty of not more than five pounds, unless reasonable cause for such absence be shown to the satisfaction of the council.

Order 41.—Any one or more of the standing orders of the council may be suspended, *pro tempore*, in case of emergency, provided that a majority of the members present shall deem such suspension necessary, but not otherwise, except Nos. 32 and 38.

The foregoing amended clauses of Bye-law No. 3, made by the municipal council of Belfast, have been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

MUNICIPALITY OF CASTLEMAINE.
BYE-LAW No. 13.—FOR LICENSING AND REGULATING OF NIGHTMEN CARTERS.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, "*An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*" the council of any municipal district is empowered, for the suppression of nuisances, to regulate and license nightmen carters, &c., &c.: Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the municipal council of Castlemaine, that every applicant for a license to ply for hire as a nightman shall at the same time submit the names and residences of two sureties, and on his being approved by the council, and entering into the required bond, he shall receive a license therefrom, and the object and conditions of the said bond shall be for the due performance of the nightman's avocations, and the protection of the public health from the neglect thereof, and the amount of said bond shall be ninety pounds (£90) jointly and severally.

The license fee for each nightman shall be five pounds (£5) per annum for one cart, and one pound (£1) for every other cart or vehicle used by him, and the name and address of every nightman carter, with the number of his license and the word "licensed" shall be legibly painted in letters not less than one inch in height, in white on a black ground, in a conspicuous position on the off side of each cart or vehicle which shall so ply for hire, and each cart shall have affixed thereto when employed in removing night soil, &c., two colored lights (bull's eyes), one on the off side green, and one on the near side red, and each cart or vehicle shall have a properly fitted wood covering.

No nightman's cart shall be employed in the removal of night soil, &c., nor be allowed to remain with such soil therein, except between the hours of twelve o'clock midnight until five o'clock a.m. from the months of September to April inclusive, and until six o'clock a.m. after midnight from May to August, anywhere within the municipal boundary.

In conformity with the bond and license, and the other provisions of this bye-law, there shall be due and paid for any breach of or offence against the same a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds (£20); and any person who shall be found employed or engaged as a nightman without a license as aforesaid, except the *bona fide* servant of a licensed nightman, shall be subject to pay a like penalty, not exceeding twenty pounds (£20).

That forthwith after any such plans and specifications shall have been so laid before the council, the clerk shall post up in the entrance hall of the council offices a notice thereof, and stating that they are open for inspection by any ratepayer, and the day on which they will be considered and ordered on by the council; and calling upon all persons owning or occupying property abutting on or adjacent to such street, or any ratepayer interested in the manner of forming such street, if they object to the said plan, to give notice thereof in writing to the Town Clerk, and to attend on the day appointed for the considering and ordering on such plans to give evidence in support of their objections.

His Excellency the Governor in-Chief directs the publication of the following particulars respecting the new moorings recently placed in the inner harbor of Port Elliot, for general information.

PORT ELLIOT.

The outer end of the mooring chain is fastened round the N.W. rock of the "Sisters," and stretched from thence, in a W.N.W. direction, towards the beach, about half (½) a cable's length to the southward of the red leading beacons; where a single-fluked anchor of four (4) tons is laid down in twelve (12) feet at low water, with the inner end of the chain attached to it.

The mooring chain, one hundred and eighty-seven and a-half (187½) fathoms in length, is two (2) inches in diameter, with the exception of the bight round the rock and twelve and a-half (12½) fathoms next the anchor, which portions are of one and five-eighths (1½) inch chain.

The mooring bridle, at the outer buoy, consists of twelve and a-half (12½) fathoms of one and five-eighths (1½) inch chain, and of fifteen (15) fathoms of one and a-half (1½) inch chain, the latter being next the buoy.

The inner-bridle is of fifteen (15) fathoms of one and a-half (1½) inch chain.

Vessels of large tonnage, drawing twelve (12) feet, may lie at the outer buoy; those of smaller tonnage and less draught of water will find better shelter at the inner one.

Vessels using the moorings, whose house pipes are not large enough to receive the bridles, should have both their own cables shackled thereto, and veer away according to the state of the weather; observing that, with N. and N.E. winds, it

will be necessary to ride with a shorter scope to keep clear of the foul ground near the breakwater.

The moorings, as laid down under Lipson's Island, in the outer harbor, consists of chains and anchors of similar size to those in the inner harbor, and will accommodate three vessels of very large tonnage.

Masters of vessels, using the moorings, are required to land the mooring boys, if desired to do so by the Deputy Harbor Master; and, in all cases, must observe the instructions of that officer in reference to the moorings, or they will be held liable for any loss or damage that may occur to the moorings, whether from neglect or accident on their part.

Port Elliot now being provided with moorings of the heaviest and best description, for five vessels of large tonnage, the Harbor Master considers it his duty to warn masters of vessels from trusting to their own ordinary anchors in the inner harbor, as the rollers setting in through the southern passage keep the bottom in so disturbed a state that no reliable holding ground exists.

The following lay-days will be allowed for vessels using the moorings:—

Vessels under fifty (50) tons will not be permitted to lie at the moorings, in the event of large vessels requiring them.

The Deputy Harbor Master is empowered to grant an extension of lay-days, in the event of bad weather having prevented vessels from loading or discharging; the Harbor Master, however, reminds masters of vessels that additional time will only be granted to those who have taken due advantage of every opportunity afforded them for working.
