PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "An Act for the Establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," it was among other things enacted, that nothing in the said Act contained should authorise the interference, by any municipal council constituted under the said Act, with any public place or building, of what description soever, not erected or constructed by such municipal council, that might be excepted from the jurisdiction of such municipal council by any Proclamation made or to be made by the Lieutenant Governor: And whereas it is deemed expedient to exempt certain places and buildings from the jurisdiction of the council of the municipal district of St. Kilda: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this my Proclamation, except from the jurisdiction of the municipal council of St. Kilda the following public places and buildings, situate and being within the said municipal district, that is to say:—

The Church of England Church.
The Church of England School-house.

EXEMPTION OF THE RACE-COURSE AT BELFAST REVOKED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "An Act for the Establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," it was amongst other things enacted, that nothing in the said Act contained should authorise the interference, by any municipal council constituted under the said Act, with any public place or building, of what description soever, not erected or constructed by such municipal council, that might be excepted from the jurisdiction of such municipal council by any Proclamation made or to be made by the Lieutenant Governor: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twentieth day of May in the present year, amongst other things, the race-course at Belfast was exempted from the jurisdiction of the council of the municipal district of Belfast aforesaid: And whereas it is deemed expedient to revoke such exemption: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly,

the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as excepts from the jurisdiction of the municipal council of Belfast the following public place, situate and being within the said municipal district, that is to say:—

The Race-course.

**WILFUL MURDER BY FRANCIS RODRIGO *alias*
PACCO.**

TWENTY-FIVE POUNDS REWARD.

WHEREAS, about Two o'clock in the morning of Sunday, the 7th of last June, a man named Francis Rodrigo *alias* Pacco, stabbed his wife, Catherine Rodrigo, and his mother-in-law, Catherine Lonsdale, at the house of the latter, situated at Chewton, near Castlemaine, and the said Catherine Lonsdale had died from the effects of the wound: Notice is hereby given, that a reward of Twenty-five pounds will be paid to any person giving such information as will lead to the apprehension and conviction of the said murderer.

PARTICULARS.
Description of the Murderer:—A Spaniard, about twenty-six years of age, five feet four inches high, slight make, black curly hair, black whiskers worn round the chin, large dark eyes, thin face, sallow complexion. He speaks English imperfectly.
Dress:—At the time of his escape his dress consisted of a blue monkey jacket, white cord trousers, lace-up boots, and Panama hat.

Soon after the alarm was given the house of the murderer, situated at Springfield, was found to be burned nearly to the ground. It is supposed to have been set on fire by himself.
The weapon used is said to have been a long Spanish knife.

WILFUL MURDER.

FIFTY POUNDS REWARD.

WHEREAS the head of a murdered female has been found at the bottom of a hole situated in an abandoned gully known by the name of Paddy's Gully, a mile and a half from the township of Avoca, and in a neighbouring hole in the same locality a piece of canvas stained with blood has also been found: And whereas a skeleton without a head and otherwise dismembered, with an axe lying alongside, has been discovered on an open piece of ground about four miles from the said gully: And whereas the said human remains are supposed to have belonged to the same individual: Notice is hereby given that a reward of Fifty pounds will be paid to any person who shall give such information as will lead to the apprehension and conviction of the person or persons who murdered the said female.

PARTICULARS.

On Monday, 15th June, one of two miners working in an abandoned gully called Paddy's Gully, a mile and a half from Avoca, found the head of a European female at the bottom of a hole. The head was fractured in two places. It had been severed from the trunk by a sharp instrument. At the top of the forehead there is a bullet hole. The teeth are entire, except two, which are decayed. Some reddish brown hair lay beside the head. The deceased is supposed to have been about 30 years of age, and to have been dead about three months or more.

In a neighbouring hole had been previously found a tarpaulin or a canvas fly covered with blood: it appears to be a dray cover. The skeleton was found on an open piece of ground near the Four Mile Flat (on Mr. Bradshaw's run): it is destitute of the head, and otherwise incomplete. An American axe, rusted with blood, with a straight handle of iron bark, lay alongside the skeleton.

The murder appears to have been committed while the parties were camped for the night, and the head was carried four miles from the trunk in a direction leading up the country, towards Avoca.

INDUSTRIAL SCHOOLS.

A LADY interested in industrial education is prepared to appropriate £100 in the following manner:—

A premium of £50 to be given to a master in a Denominational or National School who shall give successful instruction in the growth of hemp or flax and their manufacture into rope, or £25 for the cultivation and £25 for the manufacture, in separate schools.

Also a premium of £50 to a master who shall give successful instruction in basket making, and the cultivation of suitable material as osiers, or £25 for cultivation and £25 for manufacture.

Managers of public elementary schools are requested to forward propositions before 1st August next. Not less than three schools must compete, or the premium will not be available.

It is to be observed that considerable assistance is also given by the Denominational School Board, under the rules, in carrying out industrial arrangements.

PETITION FOR MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS.

FITZ ROY WARD—MELBOURNE.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition to His Excellency hereinafter set forth, signed by over one thousand householders and ratepayers of Fitz Roy Ward, in the city of Melbourne.

The petitioners state that having carefully considered the management and financial position of the city of Melbourne, they are satisfied as to the inexpediency of continuing to be a portion thereof, on the following grounds, viz:—

1st. At the present moment the city revenue is insufficient by £36,000 to meet current expenses and keep in moderate repair the "made" streets, without providing for a single mile of new street, and that to meet the deficiency double rates will be required for the ensuing year.

2nd. The streets at present unmade are twenty-four miles in length, and for these and other works it has been proposed in the city council to raise £300,000 (in addition to the Gabrielli loan of £500,000), and thus to add to involvement.

The petitioners observe, that facility in raising such large sums leads to lavish expenditure and increased burthens, and apprehend that all the present rates would barely suffice to pay the interest of the loans, leaving unprovided for the maintenance and scavenging of the present streets.

That it appears from official returns, that during the year ending 31st August, 1856, the payments to the staff of the corporation, or salaries, amounted to £15,300, and the incidental expenses to £4000, making together £19,300, out of a revenue of £49,000, the management thus absorbing 40 per cent., while the corporate income is insufficient by upwards of £36,000 per annum to meet legitimate expenses.

That Fitz Roy Ward, being unequally represented in the city council, cannot obtain justice, Melbourne proper (which contains 640 acres), returning 16 members, while Fitz Roy Ward (which contains 340 acres) only returns 4 members.

Lastly, that there are in Fitz Roy Ward, 13 miles of streets and 10,000 inhabitants, that its importance is such as to require local management, and that its only hope of future prosperity rests in a total and speedy separation from the city.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—
"Your petitioners therefore humbly pray that your Excellency will be pleased to take their case into your most favorable consideration, and cause the necessary steps to be taken to have the district of 'Fitz Roy,' proclaimed a separate municipality, with the following extension of its boundaries, to obviate objections from the city council of Melbourne, namely, that its southern boundary be the centre of Victoria parade, in lieu of the north side line of the same; its western boundary, the centre of Nicholson street, continued in a straight line northwards to the Merri Creek, in lieu of the east side line of the said street ending at Reilly street; that the eastern bound-

dary be the centre of Smith street to the Heidelberg road, and thence along the East Collingwood boundary north to the Merri Creek in lieu of the west side line of the said street ending at Reilly street, and its northern boundary be the Merri Creek, in lieu of Reilly street."

PETITION FOR MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS.

SOUTH YARRA.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition to His Excellency, hereinafter set forth, signed by three hundred and six householders and ratepayers of South Yarra, in the county of Bourke.

By His Excellency's Command,
 B.4713. WILLIAM C. HAINES.

The petitioners state that the locality of South Yarra is within the municipal district of Prahran, and that but a small portion of the municipal rates levied on the property in South Yarra has been applied to local improvements; in short, that the municipal council have almost ignored it, not having metalled or formed the roads, nor removed the rubbish from them, and that horses, cattle, pigs, goats, &c., are allowed to roam at large and commit depredations.

That South Yarra is too remote from Prahran to admit of the petitioners sharing the benefits attending municipal institutions, such as a Post Office, facilities for extinguishing fires, a Mechanics' Institute, &c., &c., and that the requirements of South Yarra, differing from those of Prahran, will be better fulfilled by residents than by strangers interested only in the improvement of distant localities contiguous to their own properties.

That the municipal council of Prahran are about to borrow £8000 on mortgage of the rates, that the properties of the petitioners have been rated for 1857 at 1s. in the pound on a rack rental, and they fear that it will be necessary to levy a yearly rate of 2s. in the pound until such loan be repaid.

That the only improvement by aid of such loan contemplated in South Yarra will consist in making and metalling a short piece of road called Yarra street, a work of little if any benefit to the petitioners, but serviceable to the Prahran municipal council for hauling stones over to make roads distant from South Yarra, and that the formation of the Melbourne and Suburban Railway will obviate the necessity for such a road.

That the majority of the petitioners consented to be included within the municipal district of Prahran upon the distinct understanding that the lowest possible rate only would be assessed, and that the council should not borrow money except with the approval of the ratepayers, signified at a public meeting convened for the purpose, which meeting has not been convened.

That the present rateable property within South Yarra is nearly, if not quite, as valuable as that of the whole municipal district was at the time of its constitution.

Lastly, the petitioners state that the area of the proposed municipal district does not exceed nine square miles, that it contains more than three hundred householders or ratepayers, and that it is bounded on the north by the River Yarra Yarra, on the east by the Kooyong road, on the south by the centre of the Commercial road, and on the west by the centre of the Punt road, as delineated on a plan which accompanies the petition.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners therefore most humbly pray that Your Excellency will be pleased to declare the locality comprised within the boundaries hereinbefore defined a municipal district, by the name of the South Yarra Municipality, or by such other name as Your Excellency may think fit, under the Act of the 18th Victoria No. 15, intituled, "An Act for the Establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," and that for such purpose Your Excellency will, if necessary, vary and alter the present boundaries of the municipal district of Prahran: And that Your Excellency will not consent to the borrowing of eight thousand pounds by the municipality of Prahran, until the

locality in which your petitioners reside has been proclaimed a separate municipality."

MUNICIPALITY OF BEECHWORTH.

BYE-LAW No. 9.

WHEREAS the 18th Victoria No. 15 invests municipal councils with power to frame bye-laws for (*inter alia*) the general good governance of their respective districts: And whereas it is expedient that means should be provided for enabling the inhabitants of this municipality to obtain the correct levels of the intended permanent formation of the streets as a guide to them in the erection of buildings: Be it and it is hereby enacted by the municipal council of Beechworth, that upon any person or persons making application to the town clerk in writing for the adopted levels of any particular spot in any road or street in this municipality, and paying to the town clerk at the same time a fee of One guinea (to go to the council's general fund), the municipal surveyor will, within three days afterwards, furnish such person or persons with the information sought, if the levels of that portion of the township have been decided on, and will, if so requested in said application, attend on the ground to furnish explanations thereof.

MUNICIPALITY OF ST. KILDA.

BYE-LAW No. 9.—FOR THE REGULATION AND GOVERNMENT OF BUILDING OPERATIONS AND THE LICENSING OF BUILDERS.

WHEREAS it is expedient to make the following provisions for the good rule and governance of the said municipal district: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the council of the same that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor-in-Chief, pursuant to 18 Victoria No. 15, sec. 33, &c., the following conditions and regulations shall be binding on all builders or other persons erecting buildings of any kind within the said municipal district, that is to say:—

No builder or other person shall commence erecting or pulling down any building, or placing materials for or from the same, in or abutting on any public thoroughfare or street, lane, court, alley, &c., to which the public may have access within the municipality of St. Kilda, without first obtaining a license from the municipal council in the form or to the effect set forth in the Appendix hereto, authorising him to deposit such building materials.

Before any such deposit shall be made, a good and sufficient fence shall be placed round the space to be occupied by such materials to the satisfaction of the council or their officer, and a light or as many lights as may be deemed necessary by the council or their officer in a conspicuous position shall be left burning from sunset to sunrise. No such materials shall encroach more than one-fourth of any roadway, or so as to render any road impassable to vehicles. The waterways and gutters must in all cases be kept free.

The license shall be charged Five shillings, and it shall remain in force for such time as shall be specified in such license and no longer, but may be renewed on application to the council. Any person producing such license, which has been in any manner altered, or refusing to shew his license when required so to do by any authorised officer of the council, shall be deemed and dealt with as an unlicensed person.

Any person depositing building materials without being licensed so to do, or exceeding the powers granted by such license, shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Twenty pounds; and any person failing to remove scaffolding, &c., on being requested so to do by the local authority, shall forfeit and pay Twenty shillings daily for every day it shall so continue.

MUNICIPALITY OF ST. KILDA.

BYE-LAW No. 10.—FOR THE REGULATION AND GOVERNMENT OF NIGHTMEN.

WHEREAS it is deemed necessary to make the following provision for the preservation of the public decency and public health under the Act 18 Victoria, No. 15: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of St. Kilda as follows (that is to say):—

Every applicant for a license to ply for hire as a nightman shall at the same time submit the names and residences of his proposed sureties, and on his being approved of by the council, he shall receive a license therefrom, in the form or to the effect set forth in the appendix annexed to this bye-law.

The object of the sureties and bond shall be for the protection of the health of the municipality from the consequences of the negligent performance of the nightman's avocations.

The amount of the bond shall be jointly and severally for the sum of fifty pounds.

The license fee shall be four pounds per annum, and the license for each cart shall be twenty shillings per annum.

The name and address of the nightman, together with the number of his license, and the words "Licensed Cart," shall be legibly painted in letters not less than one inch in height, in white on a black ground, or in black on a white ground, in a conspicuous position on the off side of the cart with which he shall ply for hire.

Each cart shall have affixed thereto, when employed in the removal of night-soil, two colored lights (bull's eyes); that on the off side to be green, and on the near side to be red.

Nightmen's carts shall not be employed earlier than ten o'clock p.m., and shall not, with soil therein, be in any part of the municipality after five (5) o'clock a.m.

The district manure depot shall be the ground appropriated for that purpose on the west side of the Puat road, or Hoddle street, and distant 330 yards (more or less) northwards from a point opposite the north-west corner of the slaughter-yards, and comprising two and a half acres, more or less, the limits of such ground being indicated by four posts, one of which is placed at each corner thereof.

Any person or persons not complying with the provisions of this bye-law shall, upon conviction before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding twenty pounds.

LOCAL COURT REGULATIONS.

MOUNT BLACKWOOD.

REGULATIONS made by the Local Court of the district of Mount Blackwood:—

xxxiv. *Dams*.—Any dam erected on ground about to be worked shall be removed at the expense of the party about to work the ground on which the dam is situated.

Upon the removal of any such dam, the party coming in shall render the water as available as it was before to the party to whom the dam belongs.

xxxv. *Water privileges*.—Parties cutting a race, tail race, drain, erecting dams, and all water privileges, shall first obtain the sanction of the local court to cut such race, tail race, or

drain; and all races, drains, dams and such privileges thus sanctioned shall be the property of the party or parties cutting or erecting the same.

xxxvi. *Business licenses*.—Each business license shall entitle the holder to occupy an area not exceeding (50 x 100) fifty feet by one hundred feet, the first mentioned admeasurement to be deemed the frontage, and for any area or portion thereof occupied in addition a similar license must be taken.

This rule to repeal rule No. xiii. of regulations gazetted 12th September, 1856.

xxxvii. *Number of men to be employed*.—No sluice head of water shall be allowed to any party where less than four (4) men are employed.

This regulation not to apply to parties having water wheels or other machinery worked by water power.

xxxviii. *Water to be measured*.—Parties holding sluicing or other water privileges shall place gates or hatches for measuring the water at the dam or creek whence taken.

xxxix. *Reservation of claims*.—It shall be lawful for the Warden, on the recommendation of the local court, to give a written sanction to hold any claim, race, or other privilege in reserve (unworked) for any period not exceeding one month.

Such reservations may be renewed from time to time upon sufficient cause being shown to the court.

Any claim or privilege not reserved under this regulation, and which may be kept in reserve (unworked) for any period exceeding (48) forty-eight hours (Sundays excepted), unless satisfactory reasons, such as sickness or some other urgent cause, can be shown to the satisfaction of the local court for such claim or privilege remaining unworked, may be taken possession of by any other party, subject to regulation No. vi.

This rule to repeal regulations v. and xi., gazetted 12th September, 1856.
