## DESCRIPTION OF A PORTION OF THE SYDNEY ROAD AT THE BIG HILL, IN THE PARISH OF BYLANDS.

NOTICE is hereby given that a map and survey plan, describing the exact course and bearings of, and the admeasurements required for, a portion of the Sydney road at the Big Hill, in the parish of Bylands, and county of Dalhousie, proposed to be made by the Central Road Board, together with a description of the lands through which the same is proposed to pass, and the name of the owner and occupier thereof, so far as known, and also an estimate of the expense of the said work, have been deposited in the Public Lands Office, Melbourne, the particulars of which are as follow:—

The portion of land required is situate on the western side of allotment No. 102, in the parish of Bylands, and county of Dalhousie, and is enclosed by a right line commencing at its north-west angle, and running to a point on its south-western boundary, distance one chain eighty links from its south-western angle, the property of Michael Dwyer.

The quantity of land required to be taken for the proposed road is one acre two roods and thirty perches, and the estimated cost of effecting the said work is £5.

All persons affected by the proposed road are requested to set forth in writing, addressed to the President of the Central Road Board, Melbourne, within forty days from the first publication of this notice, any well-grounded objections that they may have to the said alteration, failing which they will be thereafter precluded from making any such objections or claiming any compensation whatsoever.

**MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS.**

COUNTER-PETITION, FITZ ROY WARD.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a counter-petition (presented to His Excellency on the 16th instant) as hereinafter set forth, and signed by thirteen hundred and eight resident householders and owners of property situate in Fitz Roy ward, in the city of Melbourne, such counter-petition being in opposition to a petition previously presented from the same ward, and gazetted on the 19th ultimo.

The counter-petitioners state that they are resident householders and owners of property in Fitz Roy ward, Melbourne, and have learned with deep regret that a portion of the ratepayers have taken steps to obtain its separation from the city, and its formation into a municipality.

That they are of opinion that the arguments and accounts adduced in favor of separation are erroneous and calculated to mislead, separation not being advisable.

That instead of the corporate revenue being insufficient by £36,000 to meet current expenses and keep in moderate repair the made streets, as calculated with questionable care by the advocates for separation, they estimate the revenue for the current year at £55,000, and the interest on the Gabrielli loan at £27,000, thus leaving £28,000 to meet the cost of management, repairs, scavenging, &c.

That they believe that the proposition made in the City Council to raise a further loan of £300,000, dwelt upon as impolitic, will not be carried out.

That in quoting from official returns the heavy charges for the staff and management of the city corporation for the year ending 31st August, 1856, the petitioners for separation concealed the fact that the same returns indicate an expenditure in that year of upwards of £130,000 of the Gabrielli loan for public works and special improvements whereby extended and professional supervision was necessitated. The counter-petitioners estimate the cost of management for the present year at less than £9000.

That the plea of the unequal representation of Fitz Roy ward rests merely on proportional acreage, and cannot be sustained, for while the assessed annual value of property in the ward for the year 1857 is £102,960, that of the city is £672,560.

That they are unwilling to relinquish their interest as citizens in the valuable city markets and buildings, or in the flagging (worth £10,000), which the corporation offers to the citizens on liberal terms.

That they feel convinced that the separation of the ward would be prejudicial to its interests, and expose it to influences operating in other municipalities, where (the counter-petitioners state) it is unfortunately known that public interests are sacrificed to party feeling; and that their interests and the interests of the ward generally will be safer in the hands of the experienced council of the city (of whose shortcomings they are fully aware) rather than in the management of a new council, under whose care they fear a repetition of the jobbery and self-seeking which are happily now being eradicated from the corporation of Melbourne.

And the counter-petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners therefore most humbly and urgently pray that your Excellency will take their case into your most serious consideration, and that your Excellency will be pleased to favorably entertain our petition by refusing to grant a separation from the city of Melbourne."

**PETITION FOR MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS.**

SOUTH YARRA.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition to His Excellency, hereinafter set forth, signed by three hundred and six householders and ratepayers of South Yarra, in the county of Bourke.

The petitioners state that the locality of South Yarra is within the municipal district of Prahran, and that but a small portion of the municipal rates levied on the property in South Yarra has been applied to local improvements; in short, that the municipal council have almost ignored it, not having metalled or formed the roads, nor removed the rubbish from them, and that horses, cattle, pigs, goats, &c., are allowed to roam at large and commit depredations.

That South Yarra is too remote from Prahran to admit of the petitioners sharing the benefits attending municipal institutions, such as a Post Office, facilities for extinguishing fires, a Mechanics' Institute, &c., &c., and that the requirements of South Yarra, differing from those of Prahran, will be better fulfilled by residents than by strangers interested only in the improvement of distant localities contiguous to their own properties.

That the municipal council of Prahran are about to borrow £8000 on mortgage of the rates, that the properties of the petitioners have been rated for 1857 at 1s. in the pound on a rack rental, and they fear that it will be necessary to levy a yearly rate of 2s. in the pound until such loan be repaid.

That the only improvement by aid of such loan contemplated in South Yarra will consist in making and metalling a short piece of road called Yarra street, a work of little if any benefit to the petitioners, but serviceable to the Prahran municipal council for hauling stones over to make roads distant from South Yarra, and that the formation of the Melbourne and Suburban Railway will obviate the necessity for such a road.

That the majority of the petitioners consented to be included within the municipal district of Prahran upon the distinct understanding that the lowest possible rate only would be assessed, and that the council should not borrow money except with the approval of the ratepayers, signified at a public meeting convened for the purpose, which meeting has not been convened.

That the present rateable property within South Yarra is nearly, if not quite, as valuable as that of the whole municipal district was at the time of its constitution.

Lastly, the petitioners state that the area of the proposed municipal district does not exceed nine square miles, that it contains more than three hundred householders or ratepayers, and that it is bounded on the north by the River Yarra Yarra, on the east by the Kooyong road, on the south by the centre of the Commercial road, and on the west by the centre of the Punt road, as delineated on a plan which accompanies the petition.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners therefore most humbly pray that Your Excellency will be pleased to declare the locality comprised within the boundaries hereinbefore defined a municipal district, by the name of the South Yarra Municipality, or by such other name as Your Excellency may think fit, under the Act of the 18th Victoria No. 15, intitled, "An Act for the Establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," and that for such purpose Your Excellency will, if necessary, vary and alter the present boundaries of the municipal district of Prahran: And that Your Excellency will not consent to the borrowing of eight thousand pounds by the municipality of Prahran, until the locality in which your petitioners reside has been proclaimed a separate municipality."

#### MUNICIPALITY OF MARYBOROUGH.

BYE-LAW No. 4.—FOR THE BETTER PREVENTION OF FIRES AND THE DANGER TO LIFE AND PROPERTY ARISING THEREFROM.

WHEREAS by an Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, "An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," the council of any municipal district is empowered to make bye-laws for the prevention and extinguishing of fires, and for the general good rule, &c.: Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the municipal council of Maryborough, That it shall not be lawful hereafter for any roof or other exterior covering of canvas, duck, drill, calico, or any such material, to be placed upon or on the outside of any buildings erected or to be erected within the boundaries hereinafter set forth, nor shall it be lawful for any such now in use to be repaired or renewed with a like material, unless such building or erection shall stand and be twenty clear feet apart from any dwelling-house, store, or other building whatsoever.

That no person shall be permitted to keep any stack or stacks of hay, corn, or straw of any description on premises within the said boundaries, unless the same be under cover of a shed or building, of which no exterior part shall be of canvas, calico, or any similar fabric, or shall stand twenty clear feet from any dwelling-house or other building whatsoever as aforesaid.

That upon complaint in writing being made by any ratepayer that any chimney or flue is constructed of improper materials, or that the top of such chimney or flue is not sufficiently elevated or removed from any inflammable materials of which the roof or other part of the building or any adjoining building is constructed, or that any such chimney or flue is not so constructed as properly to carry up the smoke, so that it becomes

a nuisance or dangerous to any neighbours, or if it shall appear to the council, or their inspector or other authorised officer, necessary at any time, he shall and may at any reasonable time proceed to inspect such chimney or flue, and if he or they shall find that there is reasonable cause of danger or nuisance, he or they shall forthwith serve a notice upon the owner or occupier of such premises, calling upon him to alter such chimney or flue so as to abate and remedy any such danger or nuisance; and it shall not be permitted hereafter to erect any chimney, vent, or flue of any dangerous or inflammable materials.

That it be prohibited to have any fire burning in any street, lane, road, or other public place, nor within or upon any yard or premises, whether fenced or enclosed or not, for any purpose whatsoever, without first having obtained license or permission from the said council or their duly authorised officer, except such fire be made in a properly constructed fire-place or chimney as above described.

That the owner or occupier of any dwelling or store within the boundaries hereinafter mentioned shall be compelled to keep upon or adjoining his premises a supply of water in a tank or butt, not less than fifty gallons, to be available for the purpose of extinguishing fires.

That this bye-law and the provisions thereof as aforesaid shall henceforth extend and take effect within the boundaries of the present township.

And that it shall be lawful for the said council at any time hereafter to extend the boundaries for the operation of this bye-law, in any such manner as to them may seem fit and proper so to do, by a bye-law to that purpose; and upon any infringement or breach of the provisions of this bye-law, or any one of them, or upon any neglect or refusal to attend to any notice given by the said council, their inspector, or other officer, any person so infringing, neglecting, or refusing to comply with the same, shall be liable and subject to forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 4, made by the municipal council of Maryborough, has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

#### MUNICIPALITY OF BALLAARAT.

BYE-LAW No. 12.—FOR THE REGULATION AND GOVERNMENT OF LICENSED PUBLIC CARRIERS, CARTERS AND WATER-DRAWERS.  
 (Under 18 Victoria No. 15).

CARTERS desirous of plying for hire within the municipality shall apply to the town clerk, during the first fifteen days in October in every year, and he shall register his name and place of abode in the office of the town clerk.

2. On the payment of the fee, he shall receive a license, on which shall be written the number thereof and the applicant's name and place of abode; the license to be renewable on payment of the fees for the same.

3. Licenses shall be in force from the 1st day of October to the last day of September, both inclusive, in every year, and may be obtained on the within-named condition at any time during office hours.

4. Persons using licensed carts may hawk wood and water.

5. Every owner of an unlicensed dray within the municipality shall, after the 1st day of April in every year, register his name and place of abode (notifying any change of the latter) together with a description of his cart or dray, in the office of the town clerk, from whom he shall receive a certificate containing the name of the owner, or hirer of such cart or dray, and the number of such registration.

6. The name and address of every licensed carter, together with the number of his license, and the words "licensed cart or dray," as the case may be, shall be legibly painted not less than one inch in height, in white on a black ground, or in black on a white ground, in a conspicuous position, upon the off side of his cart or dray with which he shall ply for hire.

7. The owner of an unlicensed cart shall have his name and address and the number of his certificate painted in letters not less than one inch in height, in white on a black ground, or in black on a white ground, in a conspicuous position upon the off side of his cart.

8. Carters shall in all cases assist in loading and unloading, and if able must unload the cart themselves.

9. Carters shall be liable to go to any place within the boundaries of the municipality, but not beyond, unless at their own option.

**PUBLIC WORKS.**

The length of pathways formed, or in progress, during the half-year, is two miles and two chains, making the total length of pathways now formed eight miles and forty-two chains. The following works have been recommended by the committee of public works, and have been contracted for, viz:—

East end of Stevedore street, one side of Macquarie street, part of Hammer street, one side of Electra street, northern part of Cecil street; Cox's buildings, Dover street; part of Douglas parade, part of Ferguson street, part of Cole street, and part of Pasco street.

The following road works have been contracted for, viz:— Part of Nelson place, Little Nelson street, part of Ferguson street, James street, part of Stevedore street, part of Douglas parade, and part of Cole street—in all, two miles and five chains in length. A fifty feet road has been granted by Government out of one hundred feet beach reserve.

The following materials have been contracted for, viz:— 35,600 pitching stones, 500 lineal feet of kerb stones, and 3000 cubic yards broken metal.

**FINANCE.**

A loan has been negotiated with the bankers of the council for £5000, at 6 per cent. per annum on the cash credit principal, the interest being payable only on such amounts as are actually employed. The term over which the loan extends is five years, and the amount is repayable in half-yearly instalments of £500.

An instalment of the Government grant for the current year, amounting to £3000, has been obtained.

**THISTLES.**

The thistles growing upon public land within the municipal district have been destroyed in terms of the Act

**OLD PIER.**

Steps for the purpose of landing, and an improved lamp at the end of the pier, have been erected by the Government, at the request of the council.

**SURVEYS.**

A survey has been made of a site for a bathing place on the south shore, and the surveyor has prepared a draft of a plan for the same.

**NAMES OF STREETS.**

The names of the streets have been ordered to be affixed in conspicuous places therein.

**FIRE BRIGADE.**

Measures have been taken for the better organization of the fire brigade and the equipment of its members, the engine having been fitted with additional gear, and rendered thoroughly effective.

**WEIGHBRIDGE.**

It has been resolved that a weighing machine shall be placed in the market reserve.

**RAILWAY BRIDGE.**

The attention of the railway commissioners has been called to the approaches to the bridges in Thompson and Cole streets, with a view to the alteration of the gradients. Replies have been received to the effect that the matter is under consideration.

**NEW STREETS.**

Application has been made to Government for the proclamation of sundry new streets.

**KERBING AND CHANNELLING.**

Kerbing and channelling has been effected when the parties in front of whose premises it has been ordered have contributed one moiety of the expense.

**LICENSE RATES AND FARES.**

An amended scale of licenses, rates and fares for carters, water-carriers and boatmen, has been adopted.

**APPLICATIONS TO GOVERNMENT.**

The following, amongst other applications, have been made to Government, viz:—For a grant in aid of fencing and planting the public gardens; for a grant of £1000 for a mechanics' institution; for a grant of £2000 for a post-office—this amount having been voted in 1855 and withdrawn; for the extension of the old pier; for the fines inflicted in the district under 9

George IV., chapter 3, section 27; for exemption of members of council and municipal officers from juries; and for the supply of fresh water to the town from the Yan Yean reservoir.

**PETITIONS.**

Eight petitions have been received by the council during the half-year, five of them being for the extension of road and pathworks, which have been acceded to.

**TOWN HALL.**

The inconvenience and cost of the present municipal offices have induced the council to cause plans to be prepared for the part erection of a town hall on the land granted by the Government for the purpose.

**ADDRESSES.**

Addresses have been presented to His Excellency the Governor—the first on his arrival in the colony, the second one of condolence on his recent bereavement.

**BYE-LAWS.**

The following bye-laws have been framed by the council, viz.:—No. 12. To prevent nuisance of cattle straying in the streets and other unenclosed places; No. 14. To regulate the fares of water-carriers and carters; No. 15. To enable the council to form sundry streets by mortgage of rates; No. 16. To enable the council to borrow £5000 on mortgage of rates; No. 17. To prevent nuisances of goats at large; No. 19. To alter and amend licenses of carters and boatmen.

**OFFICER OF HEALTH.**

John Wilkins, Esq., M.D., has been appointed health officer to the municipality.

**PAYMENT OF RATES.**

The refusal of some of the ratepayers to contribute their just proportion of the money required to carry on the works has entailed a large amount of trouble and expense on the council. It is considered however that in justice to those who pay their rates willingly, and to prevent the establishment of a bad precedent, it is the imperative duty of the council to take such measures as will compel the payment of rates illegally and unjustly withheld. The council, considering that to the imperfection of the Municipal Institutions Act the difficulties experienced in enforcing the payment of rates is mainly attributable, desire to reiterate the opinion so generally entertained and so frequently expressed in every municipal district in the colony, that the present working and future prosperity of municipal institutions materially depend upon the speedy amendment of the Act under which they are established.
