COUNTY COURT DISTRICTS OF VILLIERS, PORTLAND AND WARRNAMBOOL, ALTERED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the hand of the Lieutenant Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twenty-first day of December, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-three, it was declared and appointed that certain county courts should be established and holden in and for the portions of the said colony, including certain counties and parts of counties respectively therein described: And whereas by another Proclamation bearing date the twelfth day of September, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, the limits within which the county court of Warrnambool should have jurisdiction were altered as therein mentioned: And whereas it is deemed expedient to alter the districts of the county courts of Villiers and Portland as set forth in the first recited Proclamation, and the district of the county court of Warrnambool as set forth in the last recited Proclamation, and the places and districts in and for which the same shall have jurisdiction, and the limits thereof, as hereinafter mentioned: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, by virtue of the powers vested in me in that behalf, do hereby alter the districts within which the said county courts of Villiers, Portland and Warrnambool, shall have jurisdiction, and the limits thereof, and I do hereby declare and appoint that the said county courts shall have jurisdiction and be holden in and for the respective portions of the said Colony, including counties and parts of counties hereinafter described, that is to say:—

The county court of VILLIERS, having jurisdiction and to be holden in and for all that portion of Victoria, hereby described, viz.:—That portion of the county of Hampden north of the main road from Hexham to Darlington, and west of the Mount Emu Creek, and that portion of the county of Villiers the boundaries whereof are herein described as follows:—Commencing at the mouth of the River Shaw, thence northwards by the western branch of the River Shaw to a point due west of the south-west angle of the aboriginal reserve at Mount Rouse, thence by a line bearing east to the said south-west angle; thence by the western and northern boundaries of the said reserve, and a line north to the northern boundary of the county of Villiers; thence by the northern and eastern boundaries of that county to the town of Hexham; thence by the main line of road to the town of Woolsthorpe; thence by the northern, western and southern boundary lines of that town and the main line of road southwards to Tower Hill Lake; thence by the main road to Belfast to the southern boundary of Rutledge's special survey; thence by the southern boundary of the said special survey to its intersection by the northern margin of the Reedy Swamp; thence by a line south to the sea coast; and thence by the sea coast to the commencing point.

The county court of PORTLAND, having jurisdiction and to be holden in and for all that portion of Victoria hereby described, viz.:—The county of Follett, and that portion of the county of Normanby south of a line drawn from the junction of the Koroite and the River Wannon to Mount Napier, and produced thence due west to the River Eumeralla.

The county court of WARRNAMBOOL, having jurisdiction and to be holden in and for all that portion of Victoria of

which the boundaries are hereby defined as follows, viz.: Commencing at a point on the sea coast due south of the intersection of the southern boundary of William Rutledge's special survey and the northern margin of the Reedy Swamp; thence north by a line to the said point of intersection; thence by the southern boundary of the special survey to its intersection by the main road to Belfast; thence by that line of road to Tower Hill Lake; thence by the main line of road crossing Murray's Creek to the town of Woolsthorpe; thence by the southern, western, and northern boundary lines of the said town, and by the main line of road to the town of Hexham; thence by the boundary lines of that town and by the River Hopkins southerly to its embouchure in Warrnambool Bay; and thence by the sea coast to the commencing point; and in and for the county of Hampden, except that portion thereof north of the main line of road from Hexham to Darlington, and west of the Mount Emu Creek; and in and for the county of Heytesbury.

GENERAL SESSIONS DISTRICTS OF BELFAST, PORTLAND AND WARRNAMBOOL, ALTERED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the hand of the Lieutenant Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the sixth day of December, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-three, it was declared and appointed that courts of general sessions of the peace should be established and holden in and for the several places and districts therein mentioned: And whereas by another Proclamation bearing date the twenty-ninth day of August, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, the limits within which the court of general sessions of and for the district of Warrnambool should be holden were altered: And whereas it is deemed expedient to alter the districts in and for which the courts of general sessions of the peace of Belfast, Portland, and Warrnambool should have jurisdiction, and the limits thereof: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, by virtue of the powers vested in me in that behalf, do hereby alter the districts within which the said courts of general sessions of the peace for Belfast, Portland and Warrnambool, shall have jurisdiction, and the limits thereof as hereinafter mentioned, and I do hereby declare and appoint that courts of general sessions of the peace shall be holden in and for the following places and districts, that is to say:—

The court of general sessions for BELFAST, having jurisdiction and to be holden in and for all that portion of Victoria hereinafter described, viz.: That portion of the county of Hampden north of the main road from Hexham to Darlington, and west of the Mount Emu Creek, and that portion of the county of Villiers, the boundaries whereof are herein described as follows: Commencing at the mouth of the River Shaw, thence northwards by the western branch of the River Shaw to a point due west of the south-west angle of the aboriginal reserve at Mount Rouse; thence by a line bearing east to the said south-west angle; thence by the western and northern boundaries of the said reserve and a line north to the northern boundary of the county of Villiers; thence by the northern and eastern boundaries of that county to the town of Hexham; thence by the main line of road to the town of Woolsthorpe; thence by the northern, western, and southern boundary lines of that town and the main line of road southwards to Tower Hill Lake; thence by the main road to Belfast to the southern boundary of Rutledge's special survey; thence by the southern boundary of the said special survey to its intersection by the northern margin of the Reedy Swamp; thence by a line south to the sea coast; and thence by the sea coast to the commencing point.

The court of general sessions for PORTLAND, having jurisdiction and to be holden in and for all that portion of Victoria hereinafter described, viz.: The county of Follett and that portion of the county of Normanby south of a line drawn from the junction of the Korote and the River Wannon to Mount Napier, and produced thence due west to the River Eumeralla.

The court of general sessions for WARRNAMBOOL, having jurisdiction and to be holden in and for all that portion of Victoria, of which the boundaries are hereby described as follows, viz.: Commencing at a point on the sea coast due south of the intersection of the southern boundary of William Rutledge's special survey and the northern margin of the Reedy Swamp; thence north by a line to the said point of intersection; thence

by the southern boundary of the special survey to its intersection by the main road to Belfast; thence by that line of road to Tower Hill Lake; thence by the main line of road crossing Murray's Creek to the town of Woolsthorpe; thence by the southern, western, and northern boundary lines of the said town, and by the main line of road to the town of Hexham; thence by the boundary lines of that town and by the River Hopkins southerly to its embouchure in Warrnambool Bay; and thence by the sea coast to the commencing point; and in and for the county of Hampden, except that portion thereof north of the main line of road from Hexham to Darlington, and west of the Mount Emu Creek; and in and for the county of Heytesbury.

PORTLAND ROAD DISTRICT ALTERED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the hand of the then Acting Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of January, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, a road district to be called "The Portland Road District," was proclaimed, and the boundaries thereof were defined in accordance with an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the said colony, passed in the sixteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "*An Act for making and improving Roads in the colony of Victoria.*" And whereas it is deemed expedient to alter the boundaries of the said road district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, in pursuance of the authority vested in me by the said Act, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as defines the boundaries of the Portland road district, and I do hereby proclaim and declare that from henceforth the said Portland road district shall consist of the portion of the said colony comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say:—Commencing on the sea coast, at the mouth of the Glenelg River; thence by that river northwards to its junction with the Wannon River; thence by that river easterly to its point of junction with the Muddy Creek; thence in a straight line to Mount Pierrepont; thence due north to the northern boundary of the county of Normanby; thence by the northern and eastern boundaries of the said county to the sea coast; thence by the sea coast westerly to the commencing point; excepting the municipal district of Portland.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's Reign, intituled, "*An Act for making and improving Roads in the colony of Victoria.*" it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim and declare any such portion of the said colony as to him should seem meet, as and to be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, and also to define the boundaries of every road district thereby proclaimed and declared, and to give a specific name or designation to every such road district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, in pursuance of the power so vested in me by the said Act, and of every other

power and authority enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the district hereinafter defined shall be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, that is to say:—Commencing at the junction of the Glenelg and Wannon Rivers, and bearing easterly by the River Wannon to a point where the Muddy Creek empties itself into the said river; thence in a straight line to Mount Pierrepont; thence due north to the south boundary of the county of Dundas; thence by the eastern, northern, and western boundaries of the said county to the commencing point.

And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that the specific name or designation of such road district shall be, "The Dundas Road District."

MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS.

COUNTER-PETITION, FITZ ROY WARD.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a counter-petition (presented to His Excellency on the 16th instant) as hereinafter set forth, and signed by thirteen hundred and eight resident householders and owners of property situate in Fitz Roy ward, in the city of Melbourne, such counter-petition being in opposition to a petition previously presented from the same ward, and gazetted on the 19th ultimo.

The counter-petitioners state that they are resident householders and owners of property in Fitz Roy ward, Melbourne, and have learned with deep regret that a portion of the ratepayers have taken steps to obtain its separation from the city, and its formation into a municipality.

That they are of opinion that the arguments and accounts adduced in favor of separation are erroneous and calculated to mislead, separation not being advisable.

That instead of the corporate revenue being insufficient by £36,000 to meet current expenses and keep in moderate repair the made streets, as calculated with questionable care by the advocates for separation, they estimate the revenue for the current year at £55,000, and the interest on the Gabrielli loan at £27,000, thus leaving £28,000 to meet the cost of management, repairs, scavenging, &c.

That they believe that the proposition made in the City Council to raise a further loan of £300,000, dwelt upon as impolitic, will not be carried out.

That in quoting from official returns the heavy charges for the staff and management of the city corporation for the year ending 31st August, 1856, the petitioners for separation concealed the fact that the same returns indicate an expenditure in that year of upwards of £130,000 of the Gabrielli loan for public works and special improvements whereby extended and professional supervision was necessitated. The counter-petitioners estimate the cost of management for the present year at less than £9000.

That the plea of the unequal representation of Fitz Roy ward rests merely on proportional acreage, and cannot be sustained, for while the assessed annual value of property in the ward for the year 1857 is £102,950, that of the city is £672,560.

That they are unwilling to relinquish their interest as citizens in the valuable city markets and buildings, or in the flagging (worth £10,000), which the corporation offers to the citizens on liberal terms.

That they feel convinced that the separation of the ward would be prejudicial to its interests, and expose it to influences operating in other municipalities, where (the counter-petitioners state) it is unfortunately known that public interests are sacrificed to party feeling; and that their interests and the interests of the ward generally will be safer in the hands of the experienced council of the city (of whose shortcomings they are fully aware) rather than in the management of a new council, under whose care they fear a repetition of the jobbery and self-seeking which are happily now being eradicated from the corporation of Melbourne.

And the counter-petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners therefore most humbly and urgently pray that your Excellency will take their case into your most serious consideration, and that your Excellency will be pleased to favorably entertain our petition by refusing to grant a separation from the city of Melbourne."

PETITION FOR MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS.

SOUTH YARRA.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition to His Excellency, hereinafter set forth, signed by three hundred and six householders and ratepayers of South Yarra, in the county of Bourke.

The petitioners state that the locality of South Yarra is within the municipal district of Prahran, and that but a small portion of the municipal rates levied on the property in South Yarra has been applied to local improvements; in short, that the municipal council have almost ignored it, not having metalled or formed the roads, nor removed the rubbish from them, and that horses, cattle, pigs, goats, &c., are allowed to roam at large and commit depredations.

That South Yarra is too remote from Prahran to admit of the petitioners sharing the benefits attending municipal institutions, such as a Post Office, facilities for extinguishing fires, a Mechanics' Institute, &c., &c., and that the requirements of South Yarra, differing from those of Prahran, will be better fulfilled by residents than by strangers' interested only in the improvement of distant localities contiguous to their own properties.

That the municipal council of Prahran are about to borrow £8000 on mortgage of the rates, that the properties of the petitioners have been rated for 1857 at 1s. in the pound on a rack rental, and they fear that it will be necessary to levy a yearly rate of 2s. in the pound until such loan be repaid.

That the only improvement by aid of such loan contemplated in South Yarra will consist in making and metalling a short piece of road called Yarra street, a work of little if any benefit to the petitioners, but serviceable to the Prahran municipal council for hauling stones over to make roads distant from South Yarra, and that the formation of the Melbourne and Suburban Railway will obviate the necessity for such a road.

That the majority of the petitioners consented to be included within the municipal district of Prahran upon the distinct understanding that the lowest possible rate only would be assessed, and that the council should not borrow money except with the approval of the ratepayers, signified at a public meeting convened for the purpose, which meeting has not been convened.

That the present rateable property within South Yarra is nearly, if not quite, as valuable as that of the whole municipal district was at the time of its constitution.

Lastly, the petitioners state that the area of the proposed municipal district does not exceed nine square miles, that it contains more than three hundred householders or ratepayers, and that it is bounded on the north by the River Yarra Yarra, on the east by the Kooyong road, on the south by the centre of the Commercial road, and on the west by the centre of the Punt road, as delineated on a plan which accompanies the petition.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners therefore most humbly pray that Your Excellency will be pleased to declare the locality comprised within the boundaries hereinbefore defined a municipal district, by the name of the South Yarra Municipality, or by such other name as Your Excellency may think fit, under the Act of the 18th Victoria No. 15, intitled, "An Act for the Establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," and that for such purpose Your Excellency will, if necessary, vary and alter the present boundaries of the municipal district of Prahran: And that Your Excellency will not consent to the borrowing of eight thousand pounds by the municipality of Prahran, until the locality in which your petitioners reside has been proclaimed a separate municipality."

LOCAL COURT REGULATIONS.

BALLAARAT.

SPECIAL Regulations made by the Local Court of the district of Ballarat, exclusively applicable to the lead known as the "Caledonian Lead":—

i. Registration of reef claims, prior rights of frontage shareholders.—Any party of miners taking up, or being now in possession of, any reef claim on the Caledonian Lead shall be entitled, on becoming registered, to hold the same in reserve till the gutter is found. Should it be found that the extent of ground to which the frontage registered shareholders are entitled, shall include any portion of a reef claim for which a reef party has been so registered, such claim, or portion of claim, shall cease to be the property of the reef party, the original frontage registered shareholders being entitled in all cases to the full extent of claims allowed (when the gutter has been discovered) by virtue of their registration.

ii. Shafts to be sunk in reef claims on the parallel in which the gutter is defined.—Whenever the gutter has been defined in any claim, the surveyor of the lead shall post a notice on his office and at the claim, intimating to all the parties who have been registered for reef claims on the parallel in which the gutter has been defined that they are to proceed forthwith to sink their shafts, and that any party so failing to work within forty-eight (48) hours after the posting of such notice, shall forfeit their claims or shares as the case may be, and that the claims or shares so forfeited may be taken up by any parties on their becoming registered for the same.

iii. Registration for frontage claims to be forfeited for neglect to drive for the gutter.—Should any party registered for a

frontage claim be proved to have worked out since the gazetting of these rules any portion of a reef claim instead of driving to ascertain the position of the gutter, then such party shall forfeit their registration to the frontage claim for which they have been registered, and be only entitled to the size of a block claim, on the ground which they were found to be working or to have worked.

iv. Removal of shaft in frontage claims.—Should any party registered for a frontage claim, having bottomed a shaft and driven for the gutter, desire to draw their timber or remove their shaft to another portion of their parallel, such party must first inform the surveyor of the lead of their intention to remove, and the surveyor shall, with two disinterested miners, forthwith descend the shaft of such party (who shall be required to afford them every assistance) and ascertain whether the gutter has been discovered or not. And should the surveyor be of opinion that the party desiring to remove have already discovered the gutter, then such party shall not be entitled to change the position of their shaft to any other portion of their parallel than that in which the gutter has been discovered.

v. Reef claims to be numbered, &c.—All reef claims must be numbered consecutively, and the surveyor shall mark on the face of the miner's right of each applicant for registration the number of the claim for which he is registered.

vi. Reef claims to be forfeited if worked before the gutter is defined.—No party shall be permitted to work any reef claim or mine therein until the gutter in the parallel on which such claim is selected has been defined. Any violation of this rule will incur a forfeiture of the right to hold such reef claim, and the registration for the same shall become null and void.

vii. Reef claims to be pegged out and ownership proved before registration.—Previous to any party becoming registered, as provided in rule No. 1, they must fix four (4) pegs not less than two (2) feet in height, defining the boundaries of such claims, and in cases where any dispute is found to exist as to the parties entitled to such claim, the surveyor shall not register the applicants until the real owners of such claims have established their right before a justice of the peace, as prescribed in the 10th and 11th sections of the Gold Fields Act.

viii. Surveyor's fee.—The only fees which the surveyor may receive for performing the duties set forth in the foregoing rules so far as they affect reef claims shall be One shilling from each miner when he becomes registered.

ix. Duty of surveyor.—It shall be the duty of the surveyor to see that every party registered for a frontage claim shall, when they have bottomed their shaft (if not then in the gutter), drive, with all reasonable despatch, till they discover the gutter, and that before driving out any other portion of their claim such party shall put in a drive to the boundary of each end of their claim, such drive not to exceed five (5) feet in width, inclusive of props, and should the surveyor find any party neglecting or refusing to comply with this rule it shall be the duty of such surveyor to summon the party so neglecting or refusing to the local court for a breach of the regulations.

The foregoing Special Regulations, Nos. i. to ix., have been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

SANDHURST MUNICIPALITY.

REPORT OF THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF SANDHURST, FOR THE HALF-YEAR ENDING 10TH JULY, 1857.

PUBLIC WORKS.

THE Council have made every exertion in their power to carry out the greatest possible amount of street work during the half-year, prior to the setting in of the wet weather, and, in doing so, have to some extent anticipated their funds. Upwards of forty (40) different contracts have been made during the term, the principal works being footpaths, and kerbing and channelling, in High street and Bridge street; forming the ends of streets abutting on High street; gravelling and earthwork in McIvor road, Mundy street, Hargraves street, Oak street, McCrae street, Mitchell street, Lyttleton terrace, and Williamson street; making earthen footpaths and drains round sections 24 and 25, portion B, in Raglan street, White Hills, and on the whole length of portion A from Golden square bridge to municipal boundary, and in Forest street; repairing Camp road and making footpath; making bridge and road in continuation of Plumridge street, White Hills; providing lamps, bridges over new creek cut, wells, and a public clock, and a continuation of new creek cut from near King's bridge to boundary.

The council have also granted two hundred pounds (£200) to the Sandhurst Fire Brigade, it being understood that the tanks constructed by that body shall in future be the property of the municipality. A large fire bell has also been procured.

APPLICATIONS TO GOVERNMENT.

The following applications have been made to the Government during the past half-year, and acceded to:—

The establishment of a night mail.

Repairs to the White Hills road.

Repairs to the Mount Korong road.

Alteration in original plan of creek cut through the centre of the town.

The erection of a new post office.

The delivery of letters in the town.

Answers to the following have been deferred:—

Petition for direct line of railway to Sandhurst, and its immediate commencement.

Extension of telegraph to the Murray.

Immediate removal of Junction Camp.

Grant of land for reservoir at Golden square.

Standard weights and measures.

New site for hospital.

The following have been refused:—

An application made in March for the Government to ask the opinion of the council before selecting a site for public buildings.

Repairs to McIvor road. (This the council are now doing under protest).

MARKET.

The council having concluded to establish a public market in the open space known as Market square, have had the same duly proclaimed, have prepared a tariff of dues, &c. The market will be opened as soon as other requisite regulations can be completed. A first-class weighbridge for market use has been ordered from England, it having been found impossible to obtain a suitable one either in Melbourne or Sydney.

ELECTION OF COUNCILLORS, &c.

The annual election took place in January last, when Councillors W. H. Neale, W. V. Simons and D. Macdougall were elected by polled votes to serve in the places of Messrs. Bell, Simons and Neale, retiring in rotation.

Councillor J. F. Sullivan was elected chairman for the current year.

In May Mr. E. N. Emmett resigned his seat, and in June Councillor J. Cahill was elected by polled votes to serve in his room.

In reference to a change in the plan of the new creek cut, work in Mount Korong road, and other matters, it was found necessary for the council to send a deputation from their body to wait upon the Government authorities in Melbourne, and the gentlemen engaged succeeded in obtaining the desired result.

To secure a more efficient performance of the duty, the council have found it necessary to make a change in the arrangements for the collection of the rates, and Mr. James Jamieson has been appointed to perform the duty for the current year, to be paid by a commission on the amount collected.

The council have entrusted the valuation for assessment to their own officer, Mr. Fletcher, feeling assured that they could not place it in better hands. He has undertaken the duty without any extra emolument, Mr. Townsend, the town inspector, performing part of Mr. F.'s duties whilst he is engaged in the work.

PUBLIC WORKS.

The length of pathways formed, or in progress, during the half-year, is two miles and two chains, making the total length of pathways now formed eight miles and forty-two chains. The following works have been recommended by the committee of public works, and have been contracted for, viz.:—

East end of Stevedore street, one side of Macquarie street, part of Hammer street, one side of Electra street, northern part of Cecil street; Cox's buildings, Dover street; part of Douglas parade, part of Ferguson street, part of Cole street, and part of Pasco street.

The following road works have been contracted for, viz.:—Part of Nelson place, Little Nelson street, part of Ferguson street, James street, part of Stevedore street, part of Douglas parade, and part of Cole street—in all, two miles and five chains in length. A fifty feet road has been granted by Government out of one hundred feet beach reserve.

The following materials have been contracted for, viz.:—35,600 pitching stones, 500 lineal feet of kerb stone, and 3000 cubic yards broken metal.

FINANCE.

A loan has been negotiated with the bankers of the council for £5000, at 6 per cent. per annum on the cash credit principal, the interest being payable only on such amounts as are actually employed. The term over which the loan extends is five years, and the amount is repayable in half-yearly instalments of £500.

An instalment of the Government grant for the current year, amounting to £3000, has been obtained.

THISTLES.

The thistles growing upon public land within the municipal district have been destroyed in terms of the Act.

OLD PIER.

Steps for the purpose of landing, and an improved lamp at the end of the pier, have been erected by the Government, at the request of the council.

SURVEYS.

A survey has been made of a site for a bathing place on the south shore, and the surveyor has prepared a draft of a plan for the same.

NAMES OF STREETS.

The names of the streets have been ordered to be affixed in conspicuous places therein.

FIRE BRIGADE.

Measures have been taken for the better organization of the fire brigade and the equipment of its members, the engine having been fitted with additional gear, and rendered thoroughly effective.

WEIGHBRIDGE.

It has been resolved that a weighing machine shall be placed in the market reserve.

RAILWAY BRIDGE.

The attention of the railway commissioners has been called to the approaches to the bridges in Thompson and Cole streets, with a view to the alteration of the gradients. Replies have been received to the effect that the matter is under consideration.

NEW STREETS.

Application has been made to Government for the proclamation of sundry new streets.

KERBING AND CHANNELLING.

Kerbing and channelling has been effected when the parties in front of whose premises it has been ordered have contributed one moiety of the expense.

LICENSE RATES AND FARES.

An amended scale of licenses, rates and fares for carters, water-carriers and boatmen, has been adopted.

APPLICATIONS TO GOVERNMENT.

The following, amongst other applications, have been made to Government, viz.:—For a grant in aid of fencing and planting the public gardens; for a grant of £1000 for a mechanics' institution; for a grant of £2000 for a post-office—this amount having been voted in 1855 and withdrawn; for the extension of the old pier; for the fines inflicted in the district under 9 George IV., chapter 3, section 27; for exemption of members of council and municipal officers from juries; and for the supply of fresh water to the town from the Yan Yean reservoir.

PETITIONS.

Eight petitions have been received by the council during the half-year, five of them being for the extension of road and pathworks, which have been acceded to.

TOWN HALL.

The inconvenience and cost of the present municipal offices have induced the council to cause plans to be prepared for the part erection of a town hall on the land granted by the Government for the purpose.

ADDRESSES.

Addresses have been presented to His Excellency the Governor—the first on his arrival in the colony, the second one of condolence on his recent bereavement.

BYE-LAWS.

The following bye-laws have been framed by the council, viz.:—No. 12. To prevent nuisance of cattle straying in the streets and other unenclosed places; No. 14. To regulate the fares of water-carriers and carters; No. 15. To enable the council to form sundry streets by mortgage of rates; No. 16. To enable the council to borrow £5000 on mortgage of rates; No. 17. To prevent nuisances of goats at large; No. 19. To alter and amend licenses of carters and boatmen.

OFFICER OF HEALTH.

John Wilkins, Esq., M.D., has been appointed health officer to the municipality.

PAYMENT OF RATES.

The refusal of some of the ratepayers to contribute their just proportion of the money required to carry on the works has entailed a large amount of trouble and expense on the council. It is considered however that in justice to those who pay their rates willingly, and to prevent the establishment of a bad precedent, it is the imperative duty of the council to take such measures as will compel the payment of rates illegally and unjustly withheld. The council, considering that to the imperfection of the Municipal Institutions Act the difficulties experienced in enforcing the payment of rates is mainly attributable, desire to reiterate the opinion so generally entertained and so frequently expressed in every municipal district in the colony, that the present working and future prosperity of municipal institutions materially depend upon the speedy amendment of the Act under which they are established.
