**NUNAWADING ROAD DISTRICT.**

**PROCLAMATION**

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's Reign, intituled, "*An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria*," it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim and declare any such portion of the said colony as to him should seem meet, as and to be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, and also to define the boundaries of every road district thereby proclaimed and declared, and to give a specific name or designation to every such road district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, in pursuance of the power so vested in me by the said Act, and of every other power and authority enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the district hereinafter defined shall be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, that is to say:—Commencing at the south-west angle of portion LVIII, parish of Nunawading; thence by a line bearing north to the Koonung Koonung Creek; thence easterly by that creek to the south-east angle of section VII, parish of Bulleen; thence north to Mullum Mullum Creek; thence south-easterly by the said Mullum Mullum Creek to the south-east angle of section XXVI, parish of Warrandyte; thence due south to the Dandenong Creek; thence by that creek to the south-east angle of reserved portion 110, parish of Nunawading; thence by a line bearing west to the commencing point.

And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that the specific name or designation of such road district shall be, "*The Nunawading Road District*."

**FURTHER EXEMPTION OF BUILDINGS, ETC., AT  
ST. KILDA.**

**PROCLAMATION**

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "*An Act for the Establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*," it was among other things enacted, that nothing in the said Act contained should authorise the interference, by any municipal council constituted under the said Act, with any public place or building, of what description soever, not erected or constructed by such municipal council, that might be excepted from the jurisdiction of such municipal council by any Proclamation made or to be made by the Lieutenant Governor: And whereas it is deemed expedient to exempt certain places and buildings from the jurisdiction of the council of the municipal district of St. Kilda: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this my Proclamation, except from the jurisdiction of the municipal council of St. Kilda the following public places and buildings, situate and being within the said municipal district, that is to say:—

The Wesleyan Church and Land, Fitz Roy street.  
The Presbyterian Church, Inkermann road.  
The Presbyterian Church, Alma road.  
The Independent Church, Alma road.  
The Roman Catholic School, Great Dandenong road.  
The National School, Brighton road.  
The National School, Punt road.

## MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF CARISBROOK.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," it was amongst other things enacted, that any district of the colony of Victoria, the area whereof should not exceed nine square miles, and which should contain a population of householders not less than three hundred, might, subject to the provisions of the said Act, be constituted a municipal district as thereinafter mentioned, provided that no one point in any such area should be distant more than six miles from any other point; and it was further enacted that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, on the receipt of a petition signed by not less than one hundred and fifty householders resident within any such district, praying that such district might be declared a municipal district under the said Act, to cause the substance and prayer of such petition to be published in the *Government Gazette*, and (if no counter petition, signed by an equal or greater number of householders resident within such locality, should have been delivered at the office of the Colonial Secretary within one month from the date of such publication) the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice aforesaid, might, if he should think fit, declare by Proclamation such locality a municipal district by a name to be mentioned in such Proclamation, and also by the same or any other Proclamation might define the limits and boundaries of such municipal district, and such limits and boundaries at any time thereafter in the same manner, on receipt of a similar petition, might vary and alter, but so as in no case save as thereinafter mentioned to include within the limits or boundaries of such municipal district an area of more than nine square miles, and upon the publication of any such Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, such locality so defined should be deemed and taken to be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas a petition has been presented to His Excellency the Governor by the householders and landowners in the town and parish of Carisbrook, in the county of Talbot, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published as directed by the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, with the advice of the Executive Council, declare that the district hereinafter described and named shall be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act, that is to say:—

MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF CARISBROOK. — Commencing at the north-east angle of section 24, in the parish of Carisbrook; thence west by the northern boundary of sections 24 and 4, in the said parish, and by a line west to the western side of a Government road forming the eastern boundary of sections 5 and 6, in the said parish; thence south by the western side of that road one mile; thence west sixty chains; thence south three miles and forty-six chains; thence east one mile and ten chains, more or less, to the Mount Greenock Creek; thence northwards by the Mount Greenock Creek to the south-west angle of section 15, in the parish aforesaid; thence east by the southern boundary of the said section 15 to the south-eastern angle thereof; and thence by a line bearing north, being the eastern boundary of sections 15, 16, 17, the town reserve of Carisbrook, and sections 22, 23, and 24, to the commencing point aforesaid.

And I do hereby, with the advice aforesaid, direct that the council of the said municipal district shall be called by the name and style of "The Municipal Council of Carisbrook."

## MUNICIPALITY OF MARYBOROUGH.

BYE-LAW No. 5.—To provide for the cleansing of Footways and Water Channels.

WHEREAS by an Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, "An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," the council of any municipal district is empowered to pass bye-laws for the suppression of nuisances, &c.: Be it ordered and enacted by the municipal district of Maryborough, That the owners and occupiers of buildings and lands within and adjoining the streets, lanes, or other thoroughfares of the said municipality, shall cause to be cleansed and kept free from all filth or rubbish, or obstruction of any sort, the footpaths and water channels in front or at the side of their respective buildings and lands; and in those streets or thoroughfares where the footpaths have not yet been formed, this regulation shall apply to a distance of twelve feet from the front

or side of the building and land as aforesaid; and every such owner or occupier failing to comply with this regulation, or allowing any filth or rubbish to accumulate or remain in or upon any such footway or water channel as aforesaid, shall upon conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding Five pounds; and for the purpose of this bye-law, when any house shall be let in separate apartments, the person letting such apartments shall be deemed the occupier.

## MUNICIPALITY OF BEECHWORTH.

BYE-LAW No. 11.—FOR COMPELLING INHABITANTS OF THE MUNICIPALITY TO KEEP CLEAN THEIR CHIMNEYS AND FLUES.

WHEREAS property is greatly endangered by the ignition of chimneys from their not being kept properly cleansed: Be it and it is hereby enacted by the municipal council of Beechworth, that the occupier of any premises within this municipal district whereof any chimney or flue shall take fire from having been suffered to become foul, shall, for every such offence, forfeit and pay on conviction before two or more justices of the peace, a penalty not to exceed Five pounds. The ignition of chimney's shall be taken to have arisen from their being foul, unless satisfactory proof shall be given of their having been properly swept and cleansed within one calendar month previous to such ignition taking place.

## MUNICIPALITY OF PORTLAND.

BYE-LAW No. 4.—A BYE-LAW FOR IMPOSING A RATE OF ONE SHILLING IN THE POUND FOR THE CURRENT YEAR.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, "An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," the council of any municipal district is empowered to impose a rate on all houses and lands within the limits of such municipal district, according to the fair average annual value thereof, such rate not to exceed the sum of Two shillings in the pound:

Be it therefore enacted by the council of the municipal district of Portland, That a rate for the current year of One shilling in the pound on all rateable property within the limits of the municipal district be imposed and levied.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 4, made by the municipal council of Portland, has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council. Gazetted on the 7th day of August, 1857, pursuant to 18 Victoria No. 15, sec. 33.

## MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS.

## COUNTER-PETITION, FITZ ROY WARD.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a counter-petition (presented to His Excellency on the 16th instant) as hereinafter set forth, and signed by thirteen hundred and eight resident householders and owners of property situate in Fitz Roy ward, in the city of Melbourne, such counter-petition being in opposition to a petition previously presented from the same ward, and gazetted on the 19th ultimo.

The counter-petitioners state that they are resident householders and owners of property in Fitz Roy ward, Melbourne, and have learned with deep regret that a portion of the ratepayers have taken steps to obtain its separation from the city, and its formation into a municipality.

That they are of opinion that the arguments and accounts adduced in favor of separation are erroneous and calculated to mislead, separation not being advisable.

That instead of the corporate revenue being insufficient by £36,000 to meet current expenses and keep in moderate repair the made streets, as calculated with questionable care by the advocates for separation, they estimate the revenue for the current year at £55,000, and the interest on the Gabrielli loan

at £27,000, thus leaving £28,000 to meet the cost of management, repairs, scavenging, &c.

That they believe that the proposition made in the City Council to raise a further loan of £300,000, dwelt upon as impolitic, will not be carried out.

That in quoting from official returns the heavy charges for the staff and management of the city corporation for the year ending 31st August, 1856, the petitioners for separation concealed the fact that the same returns indicate an expenditure in that year of upwards of £130,000 of the Gabrielli loan for public works and special improvements whereby extended and professional supervision was necessitated. The counter-petitioners estimate the cost of management for the present year at less than £9000.

That the plea of the unequal representation of Fitz Roy ward rests merely on proportional acreage, and cannot be sustained, for while the assessed annual value of property in the ward for the year 1857 is £102,960, that of the city is £672,560.

That they are unwilling to relinquish their interest as citizens in the valuable city markets and buildings, or in the flagging (worth £10,000), which the corporation offers to the citizens on liberal terms.

That they feel convinced that the separation of the ward would be prejudicial to its interests, and expose it to influences operating in other municipalities, where (the counter-petitioners state) it is unfortunately known that public interests are sacrificed to party feeling; and that their interests and the interests of the ward generally will be safer in the hands of the experienced council of the city (of whose shortcomings they are fully aware) rather than in the management of a new council, under whose care they fear a repetition of the jobbery and self-seeking which are happily now being eradicated from the corporation of Melbourne.

And the counter-petitioners pray as follows:—

“Your petitioners therefore most humbly and urgently pray that your Excellency will take their case into your most serious consideration, and that your Excellency will be pleased to favorably entertain our petition by refusing to grant a separation from the city of Melbourne.”

#### LOCAL COURT REGULATIONS.

BEECHWORTH.

REGULATIONS made by the Local Court of the district of Beechworth:—

(The Rules of the Beechworth Local Court, numbered XII. and XXII., gazetted respectively on the 22nd November, 1855, and 18th March, 1856, are hereby cancelled.)

XLIX. *United claims upon the Eldorado Flat, Woolshed Creek.* Where steam power is required, permission may be granted to the holders of adjoining claims upon the Eldorado Flat, Woolshed Creek, to unite to the extent of four claims, for the more profitable working of the same, upon receiving the sanction of the local court; not less than ten (10) men, holders of miner's rights, to be employed in sinking the pump-hole on such united claim; but immediately upon the same being completed, it shall be imperative upon the holders of such united claims to keep constantly employed unitedly thereon the same number of men, holders of miner's rights, as would have been necessary had the same claims been severally occupied under existing regulations. A registration of all such united claims to be kept by the clerk of the court, and a certificate furnished to the claimholders.

L. *Interference with dams, &c., prohibited.*—No person may cut a dam, race, or tail-race, the property of another party, or otherwise interfere with the supply of water, under any pretence.

#### LOCAL COURT REGULATIONS.

DUNOLLY.

REGULATIONS made by the Local Court of the district of Dunolly:—

XXIX. *Applications for puddling and other privileges.*—Permissions to erect puddling machines, water dams for steam engines and sluicing purposes, shall only be given on special recommendation of the local court, and subject to the following regulations:—

1. Application must be made to the inspector appointed for that purpose by the local court, and such inspector shall visit the spot on which it is intended to erect such puddling machines, water dams, &c.

2. The inspector shall lay the application and a report on it before the court.

XXX. *Disposal of sludge from puddling machines.*—All puddling machines erected before the passing of this rule, and whose sludge is not confined according to the rule No. III. of

this court, shall make application to the inspector, and the inspector shall have power to arrange for the disposal of the sludge in a manner not detrimental to the individual miner, either by drains, sludge dams, or otherwise. For inspection the sum of One pound sterling (£1) shall be paid by every applicant to the inspector.

The rule No. III. of the Dunolly Local Court, gazetted on the 15th April, 1857, is hereby rescinded.

XXXI. *Holders of puddling machines to be registered.*—All parties holding puddling machines shall register their names with the inspector, and the inspector shall keep a register of such names, and shall be entitled to receive the sum of Two shillings and sixpence from each person so registering.

XXXII. *Puddling machines, &c., protected from encroachment.*—All puddling machines, water dams, &c., erected under the three preceding rules, shall be protected from encroachment by the public.

The foregoing Regulations, Nos. XXIX. to XXXII., have been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

## SANDHURST MUNICIPALITY.

REPORT OF THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF SANDHURST, FOR THE HALF-YEAR ENDING 10TH JULY, 1857.

## PUBLIC WORKS.

THE Council have made every exertion in their power to carry out the greatest possible amount of street work during the half-year, prior to the setting in of the wet weather, and, in doing so, have to some extent anticipated their funds. Upwards of forty (40) different contracts have been made during the term, the principal works being footpaths, and kerbing and channelling, in High street and Bridge street; forming the ends of streets abutting on High street; gravelling and earthwork in Melvor road, Mundy street, Hargraves street, Oak street, McCrae street, Mitchell street, Lyttleton terrace, and Williamson street; making earthen footpaths and drains round sections 24 and 25, portion B, in Raglan street, White Hills, and on the whole length of portion A from Golden square bridge to municipal boundary, and in Forest street; repairing Camp road and making footpath; making bridge and road in continuation of Plumridge street, White Hills; providing lamps, bridges over new creek cut, wells, and a public clock, and a continuation of new creek cut from near King's bridge to boundary.

No. 91.—August 7th, 1857.—4.

The council have also granted two hundred pounds (£200) to the Sandhurst Fire Brigade, it being understood that the tanks constructed by that body shall in future be the property of the municipality. A large fire bell has also been procured.

An application made in March for the Government to ask the opinion of the council before selecting a site for public buildings.  
Repairs to Melvor road. (This the council are now doing under protest).

## MARKET.

The council having concluded to establish a public market in the open space known as Market square, have had the same duly proclaimed, have prepared a tariff of dues, &c. The market will be opened as soon as other requisite regulations can be completed. A first-class weighbridge for market use has been ordered from England, it having been found impossible to obtain a suitable one either in Melbourne or Sydney.

## ELECTION OF COUNCILLORS, &amp;c.

The annual election took place in January last, when Councillors W. H. Neale, W. V. Simons and D. Macdougall were elected by polled votes to serve in the places of Messrs. Bell, Simons and Neale, retiring in rotation.

Councillor J. F. Sullivan was elected chairman for the current year.

In May Mr. E. N. Emmett resigned his seat, and in June Councillor J. Cahill was elected by polled votes to serve in his room.

In reference to a change in the plan of the new creek cut, work in Mount Korong road, and other matters, it was found necessary for the council to send a deputation from their body to wait upon the Government authorities in Melbourne, and the gentlemen engaged succeeded in obtaining the desired result.

To secure a more efficient performance of the duty, the council have found it necessary to make a change in the arrangements for the collection of the rates, and Mr. James Jamieson has been appointed to perform the duty for the current year, to be paid by a commission on the amount collected.

The council have entrusted the valuation for assessment to their own officer, Mr. Fletcher, feeling assured that they could not place it in better hands. He has undertaken the duty without any extra emolument. Mr. Townsend, the town inspector, performing part of Mr. F.'s duties whilst he is engaged in the work.
