LOCAL COURT REGULATIONS.

BEECHWORTH.

REGULATIONS made by the Local Court of the district of Beechworth:—

XLIX. *United claims upon the Eldorado Flat, Woolshed Creek.* Where steam power is required, permission may be granted to the holders of adjoining claims upon the Eldorado Flat, Woolshed Creek, to unite to the extent of four claims, for the more profitable working of the same, upon receiving the sanction of the local court; not less than ten (10) men, holders of miner's rights, to be employed in sinking the pump-hole on such united claim: but immediately upon the same being completed, it shall be imperative upon the holders of such united claims to keep constantly employed unitedly thereon the same number of men, holders of miner's rights, as would have been necessary had the same claims been severally occupied under existing regulations. A registration of all such united claims to be kept by the clerk of the court, and a certificate furnished to the claimholders.

L. *Interference with dams, &c., prohibited.*—No person may cut a dam, race, or tail-race, the property of another party, or otherwise interfere with the supply of water, under any pretence.

The Rules of the Beechworth Local Court, numbered **xii.** and **xxii.**, gazetted respectively on the 22nd November, 1855, and 18th March, 1856, are hereby cancelled.

The foregoing Regulations, Nos. XLIX. and L., have been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS.

COUNTER-PETITION, FITZ ROY WARD.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a counter-petition (presented to His Excellency on the 16th instant) as hereinafter set forth, and signed by thirteen hundred and eight resident householders and owners of property situate in Fitz Roy ward, in the city of Melbourne, such counter-petition being in opposition to a petition previously presented from the same ward, and gazetted on the 19th ultimo.

The counter-petitioners state that they are resident householders and owners of property in Fitz Roy ward, Melbourne, and have learned with deep regret that a portion of the ratepayers have taken steps to obtain its separation from the city, and its formation into a municipality.

That they are of opinion that the arguments and accounts adduced in favor of separation are erroneous and calculated to mislead, separation not being advisable.

That instead of the corporate revenue being insufficient by £36,000 to meet current expenses and keep in moderate repair the made streets, as calculated with questionable care by the advocates for separation, they estimate the revenue for the current year at £55,000, and the interest on the Gabrielli loan at £27,000, thus leaving £28,000 to meet the cost of management, repairs, scavenging, &c.

That they believe that the proposition made in the City Council to raise a further loan of £300,000, dwelt upon as impolitic, will not be carried out.

That in quoting from official returns the heavy charges for the staff and management of the city corporation for the year ending 31st August, 1856, the petitioners for separation concealed the fact that the same returns indicate an expenditure in that year of upwards of £130,000 of the Gabrielli loan for public works and special improvements whereby extended and professional supervision was necessitated. The counter-petitioners estimate the cost of management for the present year at less than £9000.

That the plea of the unequal representation of Fitz Roy ward rests merely on proportional acreage, and cannot be sustained, for while the assessed annual value of property in the ward for the year 1857 is £102,960, that of the city is £672,560.

That they are unwilling to relinquish their interest as citizens in the valuable city markets and buildings, or in the flagging (worth £10,000), which the corporation offers to the citizens on liberal terms.

That they feel convinced that the separation of the ward would be prejudicial to its interests, and expose it to influences operating in other municipalities, where (the counter-petitioners state) it is unfortunately known that public interests are sacrificed to party feeling; and that their interests and the

interests of the ward generally will be safer in the hands of the experienced council of the city (of whose shortcomings they are fully aware) rather than in the management of a new council, under whose care they fear a repetition of the jobbery and self-seeking which are happily now being eradicated from the corporation of Melbourne.

And the counter-petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners therefore most humbly and urgently pray that your Excellency will take their case into your most serious consideration, and that your Excellency will be pleased to favorably entertain our petition by refusing to grant a separation from the city of Melbourne."

RICHMOND MUNICIPALITY.

SECOND PETITION FOR ALTERATION OF BOUNDARIES.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition as hereinafter set forth, signed by two hundred and eight householders resident within the municipal district of Richmond.

The petitioners state that by a Proclamation bearing date 18th February, 1857, the boundaries of the municipal district of Richmond were declared to be as follow:—"Commencing at a point in the centre of Victoria street due north of the eastern boundary of Hoddle street; thence by a line passing through the centre of Victoria street, and produced thence due east to the River Yarra; thence by the western and northern banks of the River Yarra to the Punt road; and thence by the eastern side of the Punt road and Hoddle street to the commencing point."

That the Punt road and Hoddle street from the Yarra to Victoria street are at present within the city of Melbourne, but have hitherto been under the control and management of the Central Road Board.

That several of the petitioners represented to the municipal council of Richmond the impassable condition of Hoddle street, and were informed that that street being beyond the municipal limits, the council could not legally expend its funds in making it.

That applications have also been made to the Central Road Board and the Government by the municipal council and by the inhabitants of the district respecting the state of Hoddle street, and the petitioners are informed that it has been arranged between the Government and the municipal council to place the control and management of the Punt road and Hoddle street, and also of the Richmond punt, in the hands of the municipal council.

That they are desirous that such arrangement should be at once carried into effect, Hoddle street being impassable, and access to the premises adjoining it nearly impracticable, and all the residents on the eastern side of that street being rated in the municipal district.

That in order to enable the municipal council to apply its funds to making or repairing the said road and street, they are informed the municipal boundaries will require to be altered so as to include such road and street; and in order to give the council the proper control and management of the punt, a portion of the road on the south side of the Yarra opposite the punt should also be included within the municipal boundary.

Lastly, that the area of the municipal district, if extended as proposed, will still not be nine square miles.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners therefore humbly pray that the limits and boundaries of the municipal district of Richmond may be extended to the western side of the Punt road and Hoddle street, between the north side of the River Yarra and the south side of Victoria street, and thence further north across Victoria street to a point parallel with the commencing point referred to in the before-mentioned Proclamation of 18th February, 1857, and thence east to such commencing point, and that the boundary may be extended to the south side of the river, so as to include so much of the road there opposite the punt as may be necessary (say one square chain) for the proper working of the punt and collecting the tolls."

WARRNAMBOOL.

ELECTIONS.

IN consequence of the retirement, by rotation, of Councillors Bostock, Elliott and Hayes, a meeting was held at the court house, on the 2nd of January, for the nomination of candidates to fill the vacancies thus created, for which there were four candidates, viz.:—

Mr. John Elliott,
Mr. Joseph Dobson,
Mr. Thomas Denney,
Mr. John Davidson.

The show of hands being in favor of the three former, Mr. Davidson demanded a poll, which was held the following day at the court house, the chairman of the council presiding, and resulted as follows:—

and the returning officer declared Messrs. Elliott, Dobson and Denney duly elected members of the municipal council.

CHAIRMAN.

At the first meeting of the municipal council, Saml. Macgregor, Esq., was unanimously re-elected their chairman.

OFFICERS.

The office of town clerk being vacant, after due notice by advertisement, six applications were sent in—that of Mr. Haingill being accepted, he was duly elected to the office on the 28th January.

INSPECTOR.

The inspector of slaughter-houses, nuisances, &c., resigned his appointment on the 30th of April, and the office still remains vacant.

BYE-LAWS.

Bye-law No. 6.—For the preservation of the footways, water-courses, &c., of the public streets and thoroughfares, was passed by the council on the 18th of February, and though duly forwarded, has not yet received His Excellency's assent.

Bye-law No. 7.—To regulate the proceedings of committees and sub-committees, passed by the municipal council on the 14th of May, and rescinded 10th of June.

Bye-law No. 8.—To authorise the levy of a rate of One shilling in the pound, passed by the council on the 3rd of June; assented to 3rd July.

MEMORIALS.

The president and members of the Mechanics' Institute memorialised the municipal council to apply to the Government for a special grant in aid of the institution, which the council complied with; but the application being sent after the estimates were made up, the Chief Secretary recommended a renewal of the application next year.

At a meeting of the ratepayers convened to consider the subject of the transmission of the steamer's mails from the jetty to the post office, it was resolved that the chairman should forward minutes of the proceedings to the municipal council, with a request that the council would take steps for the conveyance of said mails until the Government grant for that purpose was available; but the municipal council not feeling themselves justified in incurring an expenditure necessary to carry out the object in view without the consent of a majority of the ratepayers, declined to accede to the application, but forwarded said minutes to the Government, with a letter from their own body, urging its importance. The Government have since authorised the Postmaster to take the necessary steps.

APPLICATIONS MADE BY THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

23rd January.—For the formation of a tramway from the town to the jetty, the cost of such works to be paid out of the unexpended balance of the vote for the year 1856.—Granted. On the 26th of March the tender of Mr. Barlow was accepted by the Government, and the works are now near completion.

7th February.—For a suitable portion of ground as a quarantine station.—No reply.

2nd April.—For a grant of five acres of land as a terminus for the tramway and the erection of receiving sheds.—30th April letter received from the district surveyor, stating that he had received instructions to mark off the land applied for.

16th April.—For a resident harbor master.—23rd May, reply from the Honorable the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, that the Government would take the subject under consideration in framing the Estimates. The Assembly subsequently voted sums for a harbor master and lighthouse.

22nd May.—To advertise all local public works in the local paper, in addition to the *Government Gazette*.—Assented to.

19th June.—For the grant of allotment No. 10 on the west bank of the Hopkins River as a reserve for ferry purposes.—No reply.

RATES.

A rate of One shilling in the pound was levied by the council, and a revision court held on the 13th of May, for the purpose of hearing appeals. There were several cases of appeal, in some of which a reduction was made. On the 21st May, a court of appeal to petty sessions was held at the court house, before the presiding magistrate and the chairman of the municipal council. There was only one case brought before the court in which a reduction was made.

IMPROVEMENTS.

Among the many improvements contemplated may be mentioned the formation of certain new streets, to afford better access to properties on blocks already laid out and built upon.

The diversion of the course of the Merri River through Lake Pertobe, and the construction of a breakwater on the reef at the entrance to Lady Bay, for the protection of vessels when at anchor; but these works, although of vast importance, are of too great magnitude for the limited means of a young municipality to cope with for the present.

PUBLIC WORKS.

The formation of portions of Timor and Banyan streets (commenced last year) have been completed, and though not yet metalled, much greater facilities are now afforded for the traffic along these streets. Some idea may be formed of the expense of road making in this municipality from the fact that in the formation of these two streets alone upwards of 30,000 cubic yards of earthwork have been removed in a length of 60 chains.

TUNNEL.

During the year a tunnel, 27 chains in length, has been cut at the east end of the town, which it is calculated will drain an area of 300 acres.

ROAD.

Ten chains of road have been formed and metalled, to continue the Allansford road within the municipality.

TRAMROAD.

A tramroad has been constructed for the more speedy and economical transit of merchandise from and to the jetty and town. When completed, with trucks and platform, the total cost will be about £2660.

JETTY.

The construction of a new jetty in Lady Bay, although a Government work, the supervision was latterly placed in the hands of the municipal council. This undertaking has been a vexed question from the commencement, the council thinking the site not so good as might have been selected, and the workmanship, prior to its superintendence by their own engineer, not according to specification, nor of a character to ensure stability.

COUNCIL CHAMBERS.

Since the formation of the municipality the council have suffered great inconvenience from the want of suitable offices; and after advertising for rooms, the offers were at such high rates, and the accommodation so inadequate, the council deemed it advisable to call for tenders for the erection of a building which they could occupy permanently, and on the 20th of May a tender was accepted to erect a stone building, containing three offices, for the sum of £443.
