## LOCAL COURT DISTRICTS OF AVOCA AND ARARAT.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the fifth day of January, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, it was declared and appointed that the districts therein respectively named should be local court districts within the meaning of an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "*An Act to amend the Laws relating to the Gold Fields*," and amongst other things the boundaries of the local court district of Avoca were in the said Proclamation defined: And whereas it has been deemed expedient to alter the said local court district of Avoca and to appoint the districts hereinafter described to be the districts of separate local courts respectively: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation, in pursuance of the authority vested in me by the said Act, with the advice of the Executive Council, revoke so much of the said Proclamation as defines the boundaries of the said local court district of Avoca; and with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby declare and appoint that the districts, the boundaries whereof are hereinafter described, shall be the districts of separate local courts within the meaning of the said Act, and shall be called by the names respectively prefixed thereto, that is to say:—

**LOCAL COURT DISTRICT OF AVOCA.**—Commencing at the north-east angle of the town reserve of Navarre; thence by a line bearing east to McNeil's Creek; thence by McNeil's Creek to the River Loddon; thence by the River Loddon to the Deep Creek; thence by the Deep Creek and by the northern, eastern, and southern boundaries of the town reserve of Carisbrook to the Mount Greenock Creek; thence by that creek to its source; thence in a westerly direction by the main dividing range to a point due south of the south-west angle of the town reserve of Navarre aforesaid; thence by a line bearing north, and by the western and northern boundary lines of the said town reserve to the commencing point.

**LOCAL COURT DISTRICT OF ARARAT.**—Commencing at a point on the western frontier of the province, due west of the southern shores of Lake Hindmarsh; thence by a line bearing east to the Yarriambiack Creek; thence by the Yarriambiack Creek and a road bearing easterly to the town reserve of Navarre; thence by a line bearing south to the main dividing range; thence by the main dividing range to the most eastern branch of the River Hopkins; thence by the range dividing the waters of the River Hopkins and Fiery Creek, and a line south to Lake Boloke; thence by the western shores of Lake Boloke and by the northern boundary of the county of Hampden to the county of Villiers; thence by the northern boundaries of the counties of Villiers, Dundas, and Follett, to the western frontier; and thence northwards by the western frontier to the commencing point aforesaid.

## EXEMPTION OF THE MECHANICS' INSTITUTE AT CASTLEMAINE.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "*An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*," it was among other things enacted, that nothing in the said Act contained should authorise the interference, by any municipal council constituted under the said Act, with any public place or building, of what description soever, not erected or constructed by such municipal council, that might be excepted from the jurisdiction of such municipal council by any Proclamation made or to be made by the Lieutenant Governor: And whereas it is deemed expedient to exempt a certain building called and known as the "*Mechanics' Institute*" from the jurisdiction of the council of the municipal district of Castlemaine: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this my Proclamation, except from the jurisdiction of the municipal council of Castlemaine the following public building, situate and being within the said municipal district, that is to say:—

The Mechanics' Institute.

**PETITION FOR MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS.**  
KYNETON.

**I**N pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition to His Excellency hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and fifty-six householders of the town of Kyneton, in the county of Dalhousie.

The petitioners state that the town of Kyneton has of late vastly increased in population and importance, and may now be classed among the most flourishing inland towns in Victoria.

That it is contained within an area of nine square miles, and comprises a population of householders of one hundred and fifty and upwards, and that no one point in such area is distant more than six miles from any other point.

That several local improvements and institutions are being introduced into the said town, as lighting it with gas, and the petitioners believe that it would tend materially to the stability, progress and improvement of the town if it were constituted a municipal district.

That a considerable portion of the roads and streets of the town are still unformed, and owing to the rich alluvial soil are almost impassable in the wet season, and the petitioners are desirous of metalling, lighting and draining the same.

And the petitioners pray as follows :—

"Your petitioners therefore humbly pray that Your Excellency may be pleased to take into your favorable consideration the subject matter of this petition, and to declare by Your Excellency's proclamation the town a municipal district, according to the proclaimed boundary of the town of Kyneton, under the name of 'The Kyneton Municipal District,' pursuant to the provisions of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15."

#### RICHMOND MUNICIPALITY.

##### SECOND PETITION FOR ALTERATION OF BOUNDARIES.

**I**N pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition as hereinafter set forth, signed by two hundred and eight householders resident within the municipal district of Richmond.

The petitioners state that by a Proclamation bearing date 18th February, 1857, the boundaries of the municipal district of Richmond were declared to be as follow:—"Commencing at a point in the centre of Victoria street due north of the eastern boundary of Hoddle street; thence by a line passing through the centre of Victoria street, and produced thence due east to the River Yarra; thence by the western and northern banks of the River Yarra to the Punt road; and thence by the eastern side of the Punt road and Hoddle street to the commencing point."

That the Punt road and Hoddle street from the Yarra to Victoria street are at present within the city of Melbourne, but have hitherto been under the control and management of the Central Road Board.

That several of the petitioners represented to the municipal council of Richmond the impassable condition of Hoddle street, and were informed that that street being beyond the municipal limits, the council could not legally expend its funds in making it.

That applications have also been made to the Central Road Board and the Government by the municipal council and by the inhabitants of the district respecting the state of Hoddle street, and the petitioners are informed that it has been arranged between the Government and the municipal council to place the control and management of the Punt road and Hoddle street, and also of the Richmond punt, in the hands of the municipal council.

That they are desirous that such arrangement should be at once carried into effect, Hoddle street being impassable, and access to the premises adjoining it nearly impracticable, and all the residents on the eastern side of that street being rated in the municipal district.

That in order to enable the municipal council to apply its funds to making or repairing the said road and street, they are informed the municipal boundaries will require to be altered so as to include such road and street; and in order to give the council the proper control and management of the punt, a por-

tion of the road on the south side of the Yarra opposite the punt should also be included within the municipal boundary.

Lastly, that the area of the municipal district, if extended as proposed, will still not be nine square miles.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners therefore humbly pray that the limits and boundaries of the municipal district of Richmond may be extended to the western side of the Punt road and Hoddle street, between the north side of the River Yarra Yarra and the south side of Victoria street, and thence further north across Victoria street to a point parallel with the commencing point referred to in the before-mentioned Proclamation of 18th February, 1857, and thence east to such commencing point, and that the boundary may be extended to the south side of the river, so as to include so much of the road there opposite the punt as may be necessary (say one square chain) for the proper working the punt and collecting the tolls."

THE THIRD HALF-YEARLY REPORT OF THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF BALLAARAT, FOR THE HALF-YEAR ENDING THE 16TH JULY, 1857:—

## PUBLIC WORKS.

- THE formation, pitching and metalling of eighteen (18) chains of road, in Armstrong and Lydiard streets, and 64½ lineal yards of culvert.
2. The formation, pitching and metalling of ten (10) chains of road in Dana street.
3. The formation, pitching and metalling of twelve (12) chains of road on the south of the cemetery.
4. The formation of 33 yards of roadway in Mair street.
5. 1044½ yards of maintenance metal.
6. Cutting drains—4678 lineal yards.
7. The construction of 21 wooden bridges, crossing the drains at the intersection of the various streets.
8. Repairing the White Flat road.
9. Widening the weighbridge.
10. The municipal council have found it necessary to employ under the superintendence of the town surveyor, hired labor for cleansing and keeping the streets in repair.

## BYE-LAWS.

No. 12. For the regulation and government of licensed public carriers, carters and water drawers.—Gazetted on the 31st January, 1857.

No. 13. To prevent fires in chimney flues, and to cause water drawers to give prompt aid at fires.—Not yet assented to.

No. 14. For imposing a rate of one shilling and sixpence in the pound on the assessable property within the municipal district of Ballaarat, for the year ending the 16th January, 1858. Gazetted on the 8th day of May.

No. 15. For the better prevention of fires, and to guard against accidents from the careless or improper use of fires in the open or public places within the township of Ballaarat.—Granted on the 5th day of June.

## MARKET.

The municipal council have decided on the erection of a vegetable and produce market, and they have applied to the Central Road Board for the land in the centre of Sturt street, for that purpose; and as soon as a difficulty, which has been raised by the road engineer, is settled, premiums will be offered for the most approved designs for a market.

## MISCELLANEOUS.

## WATER SUPPLY.

The municipal council, on the 12th July, 1856, forwarded to the Honorable the Chief Secretary, a report on the proposed water supply from Yuille's Swamp to the township, and applied for a sum of money to be either granted or advanced at the lowest rate of interest, or that the Government would guarantee the payment of the interest of the sum required. The subject was referred to the Commissioner of Public Works, and, after a period of three months, an officer from that department visited Ballaarat for the purpose of reporting on the supply of water that could be obtained from the swamp. The deputation from this council, in February last, were informed it was the intention of the Government to insert a clause in the Municipal Act, to enable municipal councils to borrow money for works similar to the one proposed, but in consequence of the session drawing to a close, the Government would not be able to bring in the amended Bill until the re-assembling of the Assembly, the municipal council were recommended to draw up a bye-law for the purpose of borrowing the money, which has been done and forwarded to the Government, but without receiving any attention.

The municipal council of Ballaarat had a conference with the municipal council of Ballaarat East, to receive their proposals on a joint water supply from Yuille's Swamp, but as the supply from that source was considered not sufficiently permanent as a basis, for a great water supply, the rain fall cannot be calculated upon with any certainty, the area of drainage into the swamp being also very limited, and considering the large amount of evaporation during the summer months from such an extensive surface, this council was of opinion it would be very injudicious for the two municipalities to be dependant upon the swamp for their supply, and on that account they declined to enter into combination with the municipal council of Ballaarat East, in a joint water supply from the swamp.
