NOTICE.

WITH the view of affording every possible facility to the public for obtaining payment of accounts at the Treasury, the Hon. the Treasurer has directed the following extracts from the Regulations respecting Public Accounts to be notified for general information:—

1. Persons having claims upon any department of the public service must make their claims upon a proper form of account, signed by them, and certified by the officer who incurred the expense, as well as by the head of his department. The following are to be the forms used:—

- When the claim is for services performed, exact dates and period of service and rate of remuneration must be set out. When it is for articles supplied, the dates and places of delivery and quantities and prices of the goods must be stated.
 - All accounts must be signed by the claimant himself. His signature is to be written against the total of his claim. The only case in which an account not signed by a claimant can be entertained is when the claimant has left the colony. In that case an agent acting under a power of attorney, which must first be registered in the offices of the Treasurer and the Commissioners of Audit, may claim for him, but the account should be in the name of the agent as such attorney.
 - Accounts transmitted for payment in an incomplete state or vitiated in any essential particular,—by erasure, interlineations, or otherwise,—will be returned to the department from which they were received in order that they may be completed or made out anew.
 - If the claimant cannot write, his mark must be attached to the account and properly witnessed.
 - Although an agent may not prefer a claim on behalf of another, he may, when an account is passed for payment, receive the amount due thereon, on the presentation of an order or authority signed by the claimant in either of the following forms, in which the amount must be written in words at full length:—

7. The transferable form of order is adopted for convenience of merchants, bankers and others, who can thus authorise their clerks to receive the amount for them. But it is not to be understood that this or any other form of order passes any property in the claim upon the Treasury. That continues in the original claimant, who is at liberty to cancel any such order, and appear personally to receive the amount thereof.

8. After an account has passed into the Pay Office for payment, the first order which may be presented will, if not previously cancelled, be acknowledged.

9. Orders cannot be noted, registered, accepted, or in any way acknowledged with reference to accounts not ready for payment.

10. If it is wished that an account should be paid at any other Pay Office than that at Melbourne; the name of the Pay Office at which it is required to be made payable must be written distinctly on the face of the document.

BYE-LAWS.—[27th July, 1858.]

At a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Beechworth, begun and holden at Beechworth, in the said district, on the 27th day of July, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

That bye-law No. 8 shall be and the same is hereby annulled and repealed, and the following substituted in lieu thereof:—

57. *Claims on quartz reefs.*—The extent of claim on quartz reefs to which any claimholder shall be entitled, shall not exceed eighty yards in length on the reef, with the width of the vein: Provided that such claimholder keep employed not less than ten men on such claim, except during the four months immediately subsequent upon the registration of the claim, which period is allowed for prospecting the claim, and during which the number of men necessary to hold the claim may be reduced to two.

That Bye-law No. 40 shall be and the same is hereby annulled and repealed.

CASTLEMAINE MINING DISTRICT.

BYE-LAWS.—[14th August, 1858.]

At a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Castlemaine, begun and holden at the Board Room, Camp, Castlemaine, in the said district, on the 14th day of August, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

67. *Surveyor's duties and scale of fees.*—That a competent practical mining surveyor be appointed to each division of the Castlemaine district, whose duty it shall be to make, when required, engineering plans and reports of ground or privileges applied for under these bye-laws, measure and mark off claims, survey in all cases of encroachment or alleged encroachment, see that the mining regulations of the division under his charge are strictly carried out, and furnish to the chairman and members of the mining board a monthly report of the progress and condition of mining operations within his division. 68. *Sludge.*—The owner or occupier of any machine which discharges sludge or water shall make for the proper conveyance of such sludge or water to the main drain of the gully or flat in which such machine is situate a good and sufficient drain, and every such private drain shall be cut and made nearly as possible to the same depth as that of the main drain into which it shall fall and join; and when in any branch gully there shall be no main drain, then such private drain shall be made to unite with the private drain of any other machine situate in the same gully or flat, and the owner of such private drain shall be compelled to maintain the same in good order and free from obstruction; and further, the owner of any such machine shall not on any pretence whatever allow any sludge or water to run upon or spread over any road or crossing-place in common use in this district: Provided that nothing in this bye-law be taken to apply to any road within the jurisdiction of the Road Board; and it is hereby further ordained that every main drain situated in any gully or flat shall in all cases be carried to the main channel or creek.

69. *Drains may be ordered to be made.*—It shall be competent for the surveyor to direct the making, repairing, or cleansing of any drain which may be necessary for the more effectual carrying off of sludge or superfluous water from any gully or flat, or any branch of either; and it shall be competent for the warden or surveyor, after due notice has been given to all concerned and an examination made in the matter, to give directions relative to the course and position of such drain, its depth and width in different places, the inclination of the bottom, the slope to be given to the sides, the making, raising, or removing of any bridge over such drain, the removal of all obstructions whatsoever, the allotment of the work among the owners of the machines situated in such gully or flat, or branch of either, the time when such work shall be commenced and when it shall be completed, the stoppage, if necessary, of any machine while such drain is being made, repaired or cleansed, and any other additional directions which may be necessary for the more effectual working of such machines.

MUNICIPALITY OF BALLAARAT EAST.

BYE-LAW No. 5.—FOR REGULATING AND LICENSING PUBLIC VEHICLES, PUBLIC CARTERS, WATER DRAWERS, AND NIGHTMEN.

WHEREAS by an Act of 18 Victoria No 15, intitled, "An Act for the Establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district established under the provisions of the said Act, to make bye-laws for the regulation and licensing of public carriers, carters, water drawers, and public vehicles, the restraining noisome and offensive trades, and the general good rule and government of such municipal district: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Ballarat East, from and after this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria:—

1. That no vehicle of any description whatsoever, excepting stage coaches running long distances, shall carry passengers for hire within this municipality unless the same be duly licensed.

2. That the owner or owners of every public vehicle carrying passengers for hire within this municipality shall register their names and addresses, and the names and addresses of their drivers, at the town clerk's office, and shall submit the vehicle, horses and harness required to be licensed, to the inspection of the council or their inspector, and the council shall thereupon determine the number of passengers to be carried at any one time in or upon the said vehicle, and after satisfying

themselves as to the good character of the person who shall be registered as the driver thereof, may grant a license in the annexed form (marked A); and the owner or owners of every licensed vehicle shall cause to be conspicuously and legibly printed thereon the number of his or their license, and the number of passengers that such vehicle has been licensed to carry; and any owner of a licensed vehicle changing his place of abode, or selling such vehicle, shall give notice thereof in writing to the town clerk within three days of such change of residence or sale, or in default, shall be liable to the penalty imposed by this bye-law; and any purchaser of such vehicle using the same for hire before having had his name endorsed on the license of such vehicle by the town clerk, shall be deemed and taken to be the owner of an unlicensed vehicle, and be subject to the penalty imposed by this bye-law.

3. Be it further ordered and directed that the owner of every cart, dray, or other vehicle plying for hire within the said municipal district shall register his name and place of abode in the town clerk's office, and shall thereupon receive a license, on which shall be written or printed his name and place of abode, and the number of his license; and the owner of every cart or dray plying for hire shall have the number of his license with his name legibly painted and conspicuously fixed to the right or off side of the dray or cart: Provided always that in case the owner shall have more than one cart or dray plying for hire, he shall take out a license for each and every such cart or dray in the same manner as though they belonged to different owners.

4. Be it further ordered and directed that every public water-carter plying within the said municipal district shall register his name and place of abode in the town clerk's office, and shall thereupon receive a license on which shall be written or printed his name and place of abode, the number of the license, and also the reward and amounts which the council hold themselves bound to pay to water carters supplying water under their direction in cases of fire; and the owner of every such water cart shall have the number of his license with his name legibly painted and conspicuously affixed to the right or left side of such water cart; and further, every such public water cart shall have the words "water cart," and the number of his license legibly painted and fixed in a conspicuous manner on the outside of his residence, or the premises where the said water cart is placed at night; and further, be it ordered, the better to guard against accidents by fire, that the owners of all public water carts shall keep them constantly loaded with water during the night, and also if called upon by the council, or any officer duly authorised by them, shall, with all due diligence, and to the best of their ability, supply water for the extinguishing of any fire that may occur on property within the municipal boundary, and any water carter who shall fail, without reasonable cause, to keep his water cart so loaded, or refuse or neglect to supply water to fires when called upon as aforesaid, or fail to comply with the conditions herein imposed, shall be liable to the penalty hereinafter imposed.

5. Be it further ordered and directed that the owner of any cart or dray engaged for hire in carting night-soil, offal, or offensive refuse, shall register his name and abode, and also satisfy the council that he is a fit and proper person to carry on the trade of nightman, and shall find two sureties who shall be jointly and severally bound in the sum of One hundred pounds for the due performance of the conditions imposed by this bye-law. The name and address of every nightman, together with the number of his license, and the words "licensed cart or dray," as the case may be, shall be legibly painted and affixed in a conspicuous position upon the cart or dray with which he shall ply for hire; and every such cart or dray shall have affixed thereto, when employed in the removal of night-soil, two colored lights (bulls' eyes), that on the off side to be green, and that on the near side to be red.

6. Any person who shall deposit night-soil in any other place than such as has been assigned for that purpose by the council, or who shall be engaged in the removal of night-soil before Ten o'clock p.m., or who shall be found with any cart or dray with night-soil therein within any part of the municipality after Five o'clock a.m. of any day, shall be liable to the penalty hereinafter named.

7. Any person committing any act against the provisions of this bye-law, or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions or regulations contained herein, shall on conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace, pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds sterling.

MUNICIPALITY OF BALLAARAT EAST.

BYE-LAW No. 6.—FOR REGULATING THE KILLING AND SALE OF BUTCHERS' MEAT, AND THE ESTABLISHMENT OF SLAUGHTER-HOUSES, UNDER CERTAIN RESTRICTIONS, WITHIN THE MUNICIPALITY OF BALLAARAT EAST.

WHEREAS by an Act of 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, "An Act for the Establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district established under the provisions of the said Act, to make bye-laws for the regulating the killing and sale of butchers' meat, and the establishment of slaughter-houses, the restraining noisome and offensive trades, and the general good rule and government of such municipal district: Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the municipal council of Ballarat East, from and after this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria:—

That before any premises within this municipal district shall be licensed as a place where butchers' meat may lawfully be slaughtered and sold, the owner or occupier shall produce to the council a certificate, under the hand of the health officer, declaring the premises to be so situate as not injuriously to affect the health of the neighbourhood, and shall further satisfy the council that the premises proposed to be licensed have been properly paved and fitted up.

That every premises licensed as a place where butchers' meat may be slaughtered or sold, shall be provided with tubs, bins, or other vessels in which shall be deposited all blood, offal, skins, or other offensive matter; and every such premises shall be cleared of such blood, offal, or other offensive matter, and the yard, floors, implements, and utensils thereof, be washed and cleansed at least once in every twenty-four hours, and be at all times open to the inspection of the council or any person authorised by them.

That no animal weighing more than 200 lbs. shall be slaughtered on any premises where butchers' meat is sold in less quantities than sides or quarters of an animal.

That henceforth any person found slaughtering or selling butchers' meat on unlicensed premises, or who shall sell any tainted or unwholesome butchers' meat for human food, or who knowingly shall commit a breach of any of the provisions of this bye-law shall, on conviction thereof before two justices of the peace, be fined in any sum not exceeding Twenty pounds sterling.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 6, made by the municipal council of Ballarat East, has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

MUNICIPALITY OF BRUNSWICK.

MUNICIPALITY OF BRUNSWICK.

BYE-LAW No. 6.—FOR THE FORMATION AND MAINTENANCE OF CROSSING-PLACES FOR WHEELED VEHICLES OVER FOOTPATHS AND DRAINS, AND FOR THE PRESERVATION THEREOF.

WHEREAS it is expedient and necessary to preserve the drains and footpaths that are or may be formed by order of the council out of the public moneys: Be it therefore enacted by the Brunswick Municipal Council, that all persons having, or who may have, roadways for carts or other wheeled vehicles across the the footpaths or drains now formed, or which may hereafter be formed by the council within this municipality, shall at their own cost provide, construct, and maintain a crossing-place over the water-channel and footpath in manner following:—In streets where a stone or wood kerb is now or may hereafter be laid, the crossing shall be paved with stone or broken metal the whole width of the footpath from the building line to the water-channel, and shall be enclosed on both sides with a stone or wood kerb of the same size and description as the street kerbing, which it must join with a curve closely; the water-channel must not in any way be altered or obstructed, but must be maintained at all times in good repair by the persons having the crossing. In streets where a footpath and channel are or may hereafter be formed, and where no kerbing is laid, suitable wooden bridges shall be provided of wood plank or scantlings and fixed over the water-channel so as to leave a free passage for the water underneath; such bridges to project into the public roadway not less than four feet nor more than five feet from the outer edge of the footpath, and the crossing-places over the footpath shall be paved, metalled, or gravelled in such manner as to be always as clean and as dry as the adjoining footpath itself, or the water-channel may be pitched with large metal to its proper level.

The materials used for such crossings and kerbing, and the manner of laying the same, shall be subject to the approval of the municipal council or their officer or surveyor: and in cases where such work in any respect whatever shall be deemed objectionable by the said council or their surveyor or other officer, it shall be lawful for the said council, and after seven days from the day of giving notice of objection to the person or persons forming or causing to be formed any such crossing-place, to proceed as hereinafter provided against any party or parties refusing or neglecting to comply with the provisions of this bye-law.

All persons about forming crossing-places over footpaths or water-channels shall give notice thereof in writing, and submit a specification of the work to the council or their surveyor or other officer, who shall give permission for the same to be proceeded with, provided the specified manner be not objectionable.

Any person passing over any formed water-channel (except the channel in the carriage-way at the intersection of the public streets) or footpath, or causing such to be passed over by or with any cart, dray, or other wheeled vehicle, unless over and by means of a crossing-place formed in one of the modes hereinbefore described, or otherwise refusing or neglecting to comply with any of the provisions of this bye-law, shall, on conviction before any two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, in conformity with the Statute 18 Victoria No. 15, sec. 35.

IN accordance with the 43rd clause of the Municipal Act 18 Victoria No. 15, the following report is submitted. The period of this report extends from the 28th January to the 27th July, 1858, both days inclusive:—

CHANGES IN MEMBERS AND OFFICERS.

On the 9th February, Councillor Smith resigned his seat, and on the 5th March Mr. Henry Christophers was elected in his stead.

On the 16th February, Councillor Hitchcock resigned his seat, and on the 19th March Mr. William Hay was elected in his stead, and on the 18th July Councillor Hay resigned his seat as councillor, and measures are being taken to supply his place.

On the 9th March Councillor Andrews resigned his seat, and on the 9th April Mr. E. W. Bagshawe was elected in his stead.

MEMORIALS AND APPLICATIONS.

Memorials have been sent to the Government for the formation of Barker street; for the continuation of Barker street across Forest Creek; and for the granting of the Camp Reserve to the council for botanical garden and park purposes; for the formation of the main roads through this town; and for the repair of the roads leading from Montgomery Hill to Eureka Reef, and Argus Hill to Specimen Hill; and for raising the level of the road on Campbell's Creek; which are still under consideration.

Bye-law No. 28, for the expenditure of the second moiety of the grant in aid for 1857.

Bye-law No. 32, for regulating the market and fixing the tolls and dues thereof.

Bye-law No. 34, for the assessment of house and land property within the municipal district for 1858.

Bye-law No. 35, for levying a rate of one shilling in the pound for the current year.

The following bye-laws have been passed in council, but refused the assent of His Excellency:—

Bye-law No. 29, for imposing a fine on members resigning their seats.

Bye-law No. 30, for preventing members of the council being interested directly or indirectly in works being done for or by the council.

Bye-law No. 31, for licensing and regulating hackney carriages, and the owners and drivers thereof.

The following bye-laws have been passed in council, but not yet assented to:—

Bye-law No. 36, for licensing and regulating the blasting of rocks with gunpowder.

Bye-law No. 37, for fixing the rates of tolls and dues to be charged for weighing at the weighbridge, Market square.

Bye-law No. 38, for regulating and introducing the ballot at elections; and

Bye-law No. 39, for the expenditure of £2175 portion of grant in aid for 1858.

ASSESSMENT RATES AND APPEALS.

A Court of Petty Sessions was held on the 16th April, when 16 appeals were heard against the assessment, and the amount was reduced by £140. The total assessment after the appeal being £79,471, which was afterwards confirmed by bye-law.

On the 27th April a rate of one shilling in the pound was struck, and assented to by the Executive (as per bye-law No. 35).

GOVERNMENT GRANT.

The Government grant in aid amounts to £3657, 11s. 11d., of which £2175 has been received.

PUBLIC WORKS.

The following contracts have been completed:—

For repairs to bridge across Barker's Creek.

Erection of market shed.

Erection of fire bell and tower.

Cutting drains in Campbell street and Urquhart street.

Cutting drain and forming embankment in Shaftforth street.

The following works are now in operation and will shortly be completed:—

For forming, metalling, channelling, and kerbing with granite, Mostyn street from Barker street to Urquhart street, and Hargreave street from Mostyn street to Lyttleton street.

For the formation, metalling, channelling, and kerbing with granite of Hargreave street from Mostyn to Forest street, as well as the kerbing and channelling with the same material of Forest street from Hargreave street to Urquhart street.

For building bridge and repairing road across Forest Creek, leading to Moonlight Flat, and

For the erection of a substantial brick market house, to contain 52 stalls.

The council has procured an excellent fire bell and erected the same on the reserve belonging to the Castlemaine Fire Brigade. Fire hooks, ladders, grapnels, &c., have also been provided.

MISCELLANEOUS.

A Court of revision on the ratepayers' roll was held on the 5th May.

A grant of £300 was made to the Mechanics' Institute, on condition that the committee would collect in subscriptions the sum of £150 in three months, and a further sum of £150 in six months after, and that the municipal council would have the use of the hall for two years, for public meetings, &c., from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m.

A grant of £60 was made to the Castlemaine Fire Brigade.

A meeting of delegates from Maryborough, Carisbrook, and Kyneton took place in Castlemaine on the 1st of March, to consider the propriety of memorialising the Government to endow the municipalities with land instead of money grants.

A premium of £10 was awarded to Mr. George Anderson for his treatise on the best method of supplying Castlemaine with a pure and abundant supply of water.

A deputation consisting of the chairman and Councillor Gingell was appointed to wait on the Honorable the President of the Board of Land and Works, relative to the extension of Barker street.

The chairman has attended two sessions of the municipal conference in Melbourne.

A sum of £11 15s. 3d. was paid to Matthews and Saint for an advertising account against the railway committee.
