MEETING OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir Henry Barkly, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS the present Parliament has been and now stands prorogued to Friday, the Tenth day of September instant: And whereas it is expedient further to prorogue the said Parliament: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Parliament until Thursday, the Seventh day of October now next ensuing; and I do hereby proclaim and direct that the said Parliament shall assemble on that day at the Parliament Houses, in the city of Melbourne, at Two of the clock in the afternoon, for the despatch of business: And the members of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly respectively are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this Sixth day of September, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, and in the twenty-second year of Her Majesty's Reign.
