MUNICIPALITY OF CASTLEMAINE.

BYE-LAW No. 38.—FOR CONDUCTING ELECTIONS OF MEMBERS OF THE COUNCIL, AND FOR ELECTING THE CHAIRMAN OR A SUBSTITUTE PRO TEM.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the Establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district has the power to regulate their own elections, the conduct of public meetings, and to elect their chairman as and in manner they may deem expedient, and in his absence or inability to act, to elect another to preside as such: Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the municipal council of Castlemaine, with the assent of His Excellency the Governor:

1. That the chairman shall appoint some public place or booth for the holding of meetings for the nominations at elections, and also one or more rooms or booths as polling places, being within the municipality, and not being at any hotel, tavern, or inn.

2. That at the nomination the chairman shall have the power to adjourn the meeting to some hour of the day which shall be more convenient for the assembling of the ratepayers, and thereat any ratepayer being on the ratepayers' roll may present himself as a candidate, or any two ratepayers on the roll may propose and second a candidate; that in case of a poll being demanded each candidate shall demand the same for himself, or it shall be demanded for each separately by six ratepayers: Provided always that the chairman shall not declare any one to be elected a member of the council who is not then a ratepayer on the roll, nor admit such person to be a candidate, nor unless he be then a resident in the colony.

3. The chairman shall appoint one or more poll clerks for each and all of the polling rooms or booths, and shall furnish to every such poll clerk a copy of the ratepayers' roll, certified by the town clerk to be a true copy; and there shall be at least one booth for every eight hundred ratepayers; and there shall be affixed over the entrance to each booth certain letters, the entire letters of the alphabet being comprised and divided accordingly, and no person shall be permitted to poll in any booth or room unless his surname shall begin with one of the letters so affixed over such entrance.

4. At every polling booth or room there shall be one or more compartments provided with ink, pens and blotting paper, for the purpose of enabling the ratepayer to mark the voting paper as hereinafter provided, in which booth or room no person other than the chairman, deputy chairman, poll clerks and the scrutineers of the candidates, and the ratepayers who shall then be tendering their votes, shall be entitled to be present.

5. The chairman or deputy chairman shall have a locked box of which he shall keep the key, with a cleft or opening in such box capable of receiving the voting papers, which box shall be on the table at which the chairman, deputy chairman, poll clerk and scrutineers are present; and each ratepayer after having satisfied as herein provided the chairman or deputy chairman that he is entitled to vote, shall then receive a voting paper in the form of the schedule annexed, marked A, and which voting paper shall be signed on the back by the chairman or deputy chairman, and such ratepayer shall in such compartment provided for the purpose, strike out the names of such candidates as he does not vote for, and shall forthwith fold up the same so as to conceal the names of the candidates, and deposit it in the box aforesaid.

6. After the nomination of the candidates for the municipality shall have taken place, the chairman shall cause to be printed a number of voting papers in the form A, which he shall have in his own custody, and shall deliver to each deputy chairman such number thereof as shall be sufficient for the number of ratepayers who may poll at the booth or room within such deputy's division, taking a receipt for the exact number so delivered, and shall keep a sufficient number of voting papers for the ratepayers who may poll at the place where he himself shall preside, and he shall sign his name on the back of every such voting paper before it shall be delivered to any ratepayer about to vote, and in like manner each deputy chairman shall sign his name on every voting paper within the division whereat he shall preside, and it shall be the duty of the chairman and each deputy chairman to keep an exact account of all such voting papers.

7. Upon delivering of the voting papers to any ratepayer, the chairman, deputy chairman, or poll clerk, shall check or mark off upon a certified copy of the ratepayers' roll such voter's name as having voted, which marking off shall be *prima facie* evidence that such voters whose names shall thus appear on such ratepayers' roll have voted at the election at which such voting papers were delivered.

8. The chairman shall preside at one polling place, and he shall appoint by writing under his hand the respective polling places at which any deputy chairman shall preside, and in like manner for each polling place the clerk who shall assist him or either of the deputies, and who in case of need shall act for him or either of the deputies, and preside at any of such polling booths or rooms aforesaid respectively.

9. Each candidate may appoint one person to be a scrutineer at each polling booth or room, and every scrutineer so appointed shall, before entering on his duty as such, make and subscribe the following declaration before the chairman or any deputy, being a justice of the peace:—I,

scrutineer, appointed by _____ a candidate at the present election, do hereby solemnly declare that I will faithfully assist at the same, and that I will not attempt to ascertain for whom any ratepayer shall vote, neither will I by word or action, directly or indirectly, aid in the discovery of the same, unless in answer to any question which I am legally bound to answer.

10. No enquiry shall be permitted at the time of polling as to the right of any person to vote, except only as follows, that is to say, the chairman or deputy chairman shall, if he think fit, or if requested by the poll clerk, by any candidate or his scrutineer, or by any two ratepayers on the roll, put to any ratepayer before he has entered the voting compartment, and not after, the following questions:—

1st. Are you the person whose name appears on the ratepayers' roll as _____ numbered _____?

2nd. Have you voted before at this present election?

And no person so required to answer said question shall be qualified or entitled to vote until he shall have satisfactorily done so, and any person who shall wilfully make a false answer to any one of the said questions shall on conviction thereof be subject to a fine not exceeding Fifty pounds.

11. In case the voting paper as of any ratepayer has been received, and any other person shall tender his vote as the same person, the chairman or deputy shall receive his voting paper, but not allow such vote nor permit it to be put into the voting box, but shall write on the back thereof the word "disputed," with his signature, and shall keep the same apart in his custody, provided such person shall duly answer the questions hereby authorised to be put to him, and sign his name on the back of the voting paper; and any person personating or attempting to personate any ratepayer or deceased ratepayer, or who shall vote a second time on the same day at any election of members, shall upon conviction thereof forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Twenty pounds.

12. Each deputy chairman shall immediately, on the close of the poll, make out an account of the number of the votes polled for each candidate, which shall be verified by his signature and by the signatures of the poll clerks and scrutineers then present, and shall collect and seal up all the voting papers that have been taken, together with the certified copy of the ratepayers' roll, and signed by him and the poll clerk; also, separately, such voting papers as have not been used, and all disputed voting papers, with all books or papers kept by him or the poll clerk during the polling, and shall forthwith proceed and deliver or cause to be delivered the whole of the same to the chairman; and the chairman shall in like manner make out an account of the votes polled at his division, and shall seal up all the voting papers and books as aforesaid, and shall then make out another account containing the number of all the votes polled for each of the candidates at all the polling places, which shall be verified by his signature and the signatures of the poll clerks and scrutineers then present; and this account shall be the final act of the polling, and shall determine who are the candidates elected by the majority of such votes: Provided always, in case of equality of votes being given for two or more candidates, the chairman, who shall not otherwise vote at such election, shall give his casting vote or votes, which shall be recorded on the final account of the votes as aforesaid before being signed.

13. The chairman of the council shall be elected in the manner following:—At the first meeting of council after every annual election, the members shall choose one of their number to take the chair for the time being, at the hour of meeting given in the notice paper, or as soon after as all the members of the council be present, otherwise at the expiry of half an hour thereafter, and the council shall then proceed by ballot to elect the chairman for the current year; and the acting chairman, after reading over the ballot papers, and the town clerk taking down the names voted for, shall then declare the councillor who has the greatest number of votes to be the chairman of the council for the current year, who shall then take the chair accordingly; and if the highest number of votes be held by more than one member, then another voting shall take place for those holding such highest numbers, and so on to the third voting if there be not a majority recorded, when, if there be still an equality of votes, the acting chairman shall in addition to his own, give his casting vote, which shall be final.

14. In the absence of the chairman of the council, the members shall elect another to take the chair for the time being only, and upon the resignation or other disqualification of the chairman of the council, at the next meeting thereafter, the remaining members shall proceed in manner provided for in the last clause to elect a chairman for the residue of the current municipal year. In case the chairman of the council be a candidate for re-election at any election of members for the council, he shall not preside thereat, but the council shall proceed to elect a deputy chairman not being a candidate from their number, to preside and act in his place at said election, who shall perform all the duties thereof, and whose acts shall be binding and have full force and effect as if performed by the chairman himself; and the council shall also elect from among their number as many deputy chairmen as may be required to preside at the respective polling places, not being candidates at the said election; and in default thereof they shall elect one or more of the municipal magistrates to act as such deputy chairman; and all such elections of deputy chairman shall take place at the meet-

ing of the council next before the day of election, and shall be conducted in manner set forth in the preceding clause for the election of chairman.

PETITION FOR MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS.

ARARAT.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by Two hundred and twenty-five householders at Ararat, in the county of Ripon, praying for the erection of the said township into a municipal district.

The petitioners state that they are convinced that necessity exists for the erection of Ararat into a municipal district, and that its incorporation will tend to the improvement and good government thereof; and they suggest the following boundary line, viz.:—"Commencing at a point 12,150 links, more or less, north from the north-east corner of allotment 2, section 2, parish of Burrenbeep, to be continued thence by a line bearing north 12,000 links; thence by a line bearing east 32,000 links; thence by a line bearing south 12,000 links; and thence by a line bearing west 32,000 links to the point of commencement, containing an area of about six square miles, within which no spot shall be distant six miles from any other spot," and a population of more than 300 householders.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—
"Your petitioners therefore humbly pray that Ararat may be proclaimed a municipal district according to the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15."

AMHERST PETITION.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and seventy householders and landowners in the town and parish of Amherst, in the county of Talbot, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

By His Excellency's Command,
H.7317. JOHN O'SHANASSY.

The petitioners state that they are householders and landowners in the town and parish of Amherst.

That the township has been established for upwards of five years, and that in addition to its gold fields it is situated in the centre of a rich agricultural district.

That all public works for improving the town and its vicinity have been neglected, the streets and roads remaining in a disgraceful state, whereby the value of property has become deteriorated, and the commercial and agricultural interests of the population have suffered greatly.

That the erection of the district into a municipality under the Act 18 Victoria No. 15, would conduce to health and cleanliness, and be the most certain mode of providing for its present and future requirements.

The petitioners suggest the following boundaries for the proposed district, viz.:—"Commencing at the north-west boundary of the township of Amherst; thence due east four miles to the north-east corner of allotment 18, section 4; thence in a south-westerly direction three miles to a point marked in the map as allotment 10, section 7; thence in a north-westerly direction three miles and five chains to the south-west boundary of the township; thence due north one mile to the commencing point."

They further state that the proposed district does not exceed nine square miles, that no one point therein is more than six miles distant from any other point, and that upwards of three hundred householders and landowners are resident within it.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners therefore humbly pray that your Excellency will be pleased to have the above district proclaimed a municipality under the provisions of the said Act, by the name of 'The Municipality of Amherst.'"

BRIGHTON PETITION.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by two hundred and twenty-four householders, resident at and near Brighton, in the county of Bourke, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

By His Excellency's Command,
H.7221. JOHN O'SHANASSY.

The petitioners state that the area they propose to be constituted a municipal district does not exceed nine square miles; that no one point therein is distant more than six miles from any other point, and that it contains a population of not less than three hundred householders.

The petitioners suggest that the limits and boundaries of the district shall be as follow: "That portion of the Brighton special survey west and south-west of the main road from Melbourne to Frankston; commencing at the intersection of the said main road and the northern boundary of the special survey; thence west by the northern boundary of the said survey to the bay; thence southwards by the bay to the southern boundary of the said survey; thence east by the southern boundary of the said survey to the intersection of the main road from Melbourne to Frankston; and thence by that main road to the commencing point; and that the same may be called and known by the name of and as 'The Brighton Municipality.'"

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"That your Excellency will be pleased to proclaim and declare the same as a municipality by the name just mentioned;" and "that, if your Excellency shall see fit to grant your petitioners' application, and to proclaim the said district a municipality, your Excellency will be also pleased to appoint some fit and proper person to preside as chairman at any meeting of the said householders which may be convened in consequence of or pursuant to such Proclamation."

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, notwithstanding any Act, law, or statute to the contrary, to declare as a municipal district as therein mentioned, or to include within the limits and boundaries of any municipal district to be declared as aforesaid, any locality now included within the corporate limits of the corporation of the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, and upon the publication of any proclamation defining the limits of any such municipal district, the locality included within such limits shall cease to be a portion of or to be or be deemed to be within the corporate limits of either of the said corporations, or to be in any manner subject thereto, and shall belong solely to the municipal district described in such proclamation: And whereas a petition numerously signed by the ratepayers and householders of Fitz Roy Ward, situate within the corporate limits of the city of Melbourne, has been presented to the Governor, praying for the separation of the said ward from the city, and the erection thereof into a distinct municipal district, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published in accordance with the said Act: And whereas the Governor, with the advice aforesaid, has, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, determined the proportion of the entire liability to be borne by such municipal district for the loan contracted by the corporation of the said city: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do by this my proclamation, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, declare that the district hereinafter described and named shall be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act, that is to say:—

THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF FITZ ROY.—Commencing at a point in the centre of Victoria parade, due south of the centre of Nicholson street; thence north by a line passing through the centre of Nicholson street to Reilly street; thence east by a line passing through the centre of Reilly street to Smith street; thence south by a line passing through the centre of Smith street to Victoria parade aforesaid; and thence west by a line passing through the centre of Victoria parade to the commencing point.

And I do hereby, with the advice aforesaid, direct that the council of the said municipal district shall be called by the name and style of "The Municipal Council of Fitz Roy."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this ninth day of September, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, and in the twenty-second year of Her Majesty's Reign.

CRESWICK PUBLIC CEMETERY.

REGULATIONS made by the trustees of the Public Cemetery established at Creswick:—

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.
2. By the 8th section of the Act, "Any person making a vault or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery by and with the permission of the trustees, under these rules, and upon the payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons, and his or their heirs or near relations for ever."
3. Applications for such permission to be made at the office of the trustees. A certificate of permission, in the form set out in the schedule, will be granted to the party applying for such permission, on payment of the charges in the schedule.
4. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery, on a certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence, proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relations and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.
5. Orders for interment to be given to the secretary, at the office of the trustees; such notice to be given between the hours of Ten a.m. and Four p.m. the previous day.
6. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of a surveyor appointed by the trustees; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent (in writing) of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.
7. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased, must be stated at the time of giving the order.
8. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.
9. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. in the other four months.
10. All monuments, vaults, graves and gravestones, to be kept in repair and proper condition, at the expense of the owners.
11. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.
12. A plan or drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, monument, or tablet, proposed to be erected, to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who are required by the 8th section of the Act to determine and fix the position of any unobjectionable monument according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.
13. No catacombs, or any wooden fencing allowed, without first submitting a plan for the approval of the trustees.
14. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.
15. The ground will be open daily, from sunrise to sunset.
16. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office, and may be inspected at the charge set out in the schedule, and registers of all grants are kept by the secretary.
17. Any person who shall wantonly or wilfully destroy, or do or cause to be done any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant, will be proceeded against as directed by the 14th section of the Act of Council.
18. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations, from time to time, in these rules and regulations.

THE FIFTH HALF-YEARLY REPORT OF THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF BALLAARAT, ENDING THE 16TH JULY, 1858.

PUBLIC WORKS.

THE completion of the contracts for forming and metalling portions of Webster, Dana and Eyre streets.

BYE LAWS.

No. 16. To prevent the nuisance arising from exposing goods for sale, and blocking up the footpaths on the township of Ballaarat.

No. 17. For imposing a rate of one shilling and sixpence in the pound upon all assessable property within the municipal district of Ballaarat, for year ending 16th January, 1859.

GOVERNOR'S VISIT.

The municipal councils of Ballaarat have had the honor of entertaining His Excellency Sir Henry Barkly, on Ballaarat, during the early part of the present half-year, and they feel assured the greater attention the wants of the district has received from the Government during the past half-year has resulted from that visit.

STATISTICS.

This municipal council, in conjunction with the municipal council of Ballaarat East, collected all the statistical information that could be obtained with reference to the value of machinery employed in mining operations, and the amount of revenue paid into the Government treasury from the gold fields of Ballaarat, the particulars of which were published in the form of a pamphlet under the title of "Facts and Figures," but as the details of the work comprised the whole of the Ballaarat gold field without particularising the revenue and expenditure in each municipality, received and expended by the Government, it would be injudicious to make extracts from the pamphlet as "Statistics of the Municipality," but the municipal council would recommend the perusal of the work in question, as it contains much valuable information relating to the resources of the gold fields of Ballaarat and its vicinity.

WATER SUPPLY.

The municipal council of Ballaarat appointed a deputation to Melbourne to oppose the passing of bill in the Legislative Assembly, brought in by J. B. Humfray, Esq., M.L.A. to repeal the bye-law No. 7, and to give the municipal council of Ballaarat East power over the roads of this district to lay pipes from Yuille's Swamp to the Flat. 1st. On the grounds that the Swamp is not a sufficient source to rely upon for a supply of water for domestic and other purposes for a population such as is at present resident on Ballaarat and Ballaarat East. 2nd. The municipal council have determined to oppose any interference with the management and control of this district, and as they are empowered by the Municipal Act to make bye-laws for securing the necessary supply of water for domestic and irrigation purposes, and also for the general good rule and management of the district as such council may see fit, they consider any interference on the part of the Legislature would be a violation of the principles of the Act under which they are incorporated.

FINANCE.

According to the valuator's return (Messrs. Snelling and Farre) of the land and buildings in this district, irrespective of the churches, schools, hospital, &c., the net value of the property is £328,126. The annual value is arrived at by taking 12½ per centum giving £41,015 15s., upon which the rate was levied and made payable on the 15th May and the 15th November, 1858, up to the 16th July; of the first moiety the sum of £725 3s. has been collected.

BOTANICAL GARDENS.

The Government have granted to the municipal council of Ballaarat for the purposes of a botanical garden about 80 acres of land on the west side of Yuille's Swamp, previously occupied as a police paddock.

ELECTIONS.

On the 31st of March, Councillor Cummins resigned his office as member of the municipal council of Ballaarat.

At a public meeting of ratepayers held at the Council Chambers, Sturt street, on the 1st day of May, the chairman, James Stewart, Esq., M.D., in the chair, the following gentlemen were proposed as candidates:—Robert Lewis, Esq., and John Smith Carver, Esq. A poll was demanded, which took place on Monday, the 3rd day of May, when Councillor Lewis was returned as member of the municipal council of Ballaarat, in the place of Councillor Cummins, resigned.
