The petitioners state that they are convinced that necessity exists for the erection of Ararat into a municipal district, and that its incorporation will tend to the improvement and good government thereof; and they suggest the following boundary line, viz: —"Commencing at a point 12,150 links, more or less, north from the north-east corner of allotment 2, section 2, parish of Burrembeep, to be continued thence by a line bearing north 12,000 links; thence by a line bearing east 32,000 links; thence by a line bearing south 12,000 links; and thence by a line bearing west 32,000 links to the point of commencement, containing an area of about six square miles, within which no spot shall be distant six miles from any other spot," and a population of more than 300 householders.
