NOTICE is hereby given to intending shippers of Rags, Bones, Horns, Hoofs, &c., or any other articles which may be deleterious to the health or safety of persons on board passenger ships, as provided by the 29th section of the *Passengers Act, 1855* (18 and 19 Victoria, cap. 119), that if it is intended to ship such articles in a vessel being a "passenger ship" within the meaning of the Act, it will be necessary to give notice to the Immigration Agent, or Assistant Immigration Agent (as the case may be), of such intended shipment, in order that the articles may be surveyed, and a certificate obtained from the Emigration Officer that they are fit for shipment, without which they cannot be allowed to be exported in a "passenger ship."

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS a certain building has been erected at Pleasant Creek, in the colony of Victoria, at the public expense, as and for a lock-up for police purposes: And whereas it is expedient to proclaim such building to be a gaol, prison and house of correction, within the meaning of an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the said colony, passed in sixteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to make provision for the better control and disposal of Offenders*: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the said building, called and known as the Police Lock-up, situated at Pleasant Creek aforesaid, as and to be a public gaol, prison and house of correction, within the meaning of the said Act.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, this seventeenth day of September, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, and in the twenty-second year of Her Majesty's Reign.

MURDER.

FIFTY POUNDS REWARD.—FREE PARDON TO AN ACCESSORY.

WHEREAS on Tuesday, the 13th day of July now last past, the body of a man, who appears to have been murdered, was found in a hole about three feet deep, in a gully near Mr. Philip Russell's home-station, and about a quarter of a mile distant from the main road between the Carngnam Gold Fields and the above-mentioned station: Notice is hereby given that a reward of Fifty Pounds will be paid to any person giving information which will lead to the apprehension and conviction of the person or persons who murdered the said man.

His Excellency the Governor will also extend Her Majesty's free pardon to any person implicated in the murder, who shall give the required information, provided such person was not the actual murderer.

PARTICULARS.

The deceased was apparently a young man about twenty-five years of age, and five feet eight inches in height; two of the front teeth in the upper jaw and three in the lower were wanting, and the skull was fractured.

The body, when found, appeared to have lain in the hole about six or eight months, being in a very advanced state of decomposition, and was partially covered over with burnt and other wood. It was found lying on its right side, the right arm under, and the left leg was detached from the thigh.

The clothing consisted of a flannel vest, white cotton shirt, and a pair of woollen drawers; a monkey-jacket was thrown over the upper part of the body, and a black satin vest and leather waist-belt were lying in the hole alongside the body.

The deceased, when found, appeared to have been dead about ten days. The only garment he had on was a Scotch twill shirt. Other garments lay near his head, and consisted of a dark tweed shooting coat, a pair of Bedford cord trousers of a light brown color, a pair of Napoleon boots, a Scotch plaid vest of a greyish color having a border round it, a blue worsted sock and a white one; there was also a swag rolled up in half a coarse bag with two new leather saddle straps round it. Under his head was a light brown wideawake hat, and a green plaid scarf was tied round his eyes. An open razor lay on the ground beneath his right calf.

The petitioners state that they are householders and landowners in the town and parish of Amherst.

That the township has been established for upwards of five years, and that in addition to its gold fields it is situated in the centre of a rich agricultural district.

That all public works for improving the town and its vicinity have been neglected, the streets and roads remaining in a disgraceful state, whereby the value of property has become deteriorated, and the commercial and agricultural interests of the population have suffered greatly.

That the erection of the district into a municipality under the Act 18 Victoria No. 15, would conduce to health and cleanliness, and be the most certain mode of providing for its present and future requirements.

WALLAN-WALLAN PUBLIC CEMETERY.

REGULATIONS made by the Trustees of the Public Cemetery established at Wallan-Wallan:—

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.

2. By the 8th section of the Act, any person making a vault or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery by and with the permission of the trustees, under these rules, and upon the payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons, and his or their representatives for ever.

3. Application for such permission to be made at the office of trustees. A certificate of permission, in the form set out in the schedule, will be granted to the party applying for such permission, on payment of the charges in the schedule.

4. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery, on the certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence, proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relatives and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.

5. Order for interment will be received by the sexton or by any of the trustees.

6. The trustees will cause all graves to be dug, but parties requiring brick graves will be requested to construct them under the direction of the trustees.

7. A form of application for burial, containing the name, age, late place of residence of the deceased, will be provided, and must be filled up, where practicable, and entered in the interment book in same form.

8. The time fixed for the funeral must be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

9. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten a.m. to Six o'clock p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from Ten o'clock a.m. to Four o'clock p.m. in the other four months, except on Sundays, when the usual and only hours for funerals will be from Two to Five o'clock p.m. throughout the year.

10. All monuments, vaults, graves and gravestones, to be kept in repair and proper condition, at the expense of the owners.

11. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in and cemented closely, or covered by a slab of stone or iron.

12. A plan of every monument and a copy of every inscription to be submitted to the trustees for their approval.

13. The plans of all fences to be submitted to the trustees; all wooden fencing must be after a model to be seen on application.

14. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

15. The ground will be open daily to the public from sunrise to sunset.

16. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office, and may be inspected at the charge set out in the schedule. A register of all grounds is kept by the secretary.

17. The keeper has orders to turn out or take into custody, as the case may require, any person who shall be intoxicated, behave indecorously, or commit any trespass or injury to the trees, flowers, or erections, or otherwise infringe the Act of Council relating to the cemetery, or the regulations for the protection of the same, and such person will be proceeded against according to the provisions of the 14th section of the Act.

18. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations, from time to time, in these charges and regulations.

19. No dogs will be allowed to enter the cemetery.

MUNICIPALITY OF BEECHWORTH.
BYE-LAW No. 25.—FOR REGULATING THE ELECTIONS OF MEMBERS OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

WHEREAS the Municipal Act empowers councils established thereunder to frame bye-laws for (*inter alia*) the regulation of the elections of their members: Be it and it is hereby enacted by the municipal council of Beechworth, That from and after the assent of His Excellency the Governor of this colony being accorded to this bye-law, the following regulations shall be in force touching municipal elections in this district, viz.:—

1. That if at any municipal election the then chairman of the council shall be a candidate for re-election as a member of the council, or shall be incapacitated or otherwise prevented from presiding at such election by reason of illness, absence from the district, or any other cause whatever, it shall be competent for a quorum of the other remaining members of the council to elect one of themselves to officiate as chairman at such election for all the purposes thereof, and until after the declaration of the poll consequent thereon.

2. That at every contested election for supplying a vacancy or vacancies in the municipal council, the chairman of council or chairman for the occasion (as the case may be) may appoint such deputy chairman or deputy chairmen as to him may seem necessary, and shall also appoint a poll clerk or poll clerks as he may deem expedient (whose duties shall be as hereinafter mentioned), and shall provide a proper poll book or proper poll books, and all other requisite stationery, and shall make all such arrangements as to him may seem desirable for effectually and properly carrying out the purposes of such election.

3. That each candidate at any such election shall be entitled to appoint (if he so desire) by writing under his hand, to be delivered to the chairman at any time before Eight o'clock in the evening of the day previous to the polling day, one inspector or scrutineer to be present on his behalf at each polling place during the election.

4. That at any election for supplying a vacancy or vacancies in such council, cards or papers of the form to this bye-law appended, shall be provided by the council, having the names of all the candidates at such election distinctly printed thereon, and on an elector presenting himself for the purpose of recording his vote, the chairman for the time being, or some person duly authorized by him, shall hand to such elector one of such forms, from which he shall then (at such stall, room, or table, or other place as may on the occasion be provided for the purpose) strike out the name of that candidate or the names of those candidates for whom he does not intend to vote, taking care not to leave uncanceled more names than the number of vacancies in the council to be supplied at such election, which paper shall be then signed by such elector and returned to the chairman, who shall cause it to be at once numbered, and such number and the vote or votes given in such paper to be entered, together with the name of the elector recording it or them, by the poll clerk (appointed as aforesaid) in the poll book provided for the occasion as beforementioned, after which all such voting papers shall be retained by the chairman, and immediately after the close of the poll, shall be enclosed in a wrapper or envelope, which shall be then sealed by such chairman, or his deputy, or the said poll clerk, and lodged with the town clerk of the municipality for future reference in case of the election being disputed.

5. That at every such election as aforesaid it shall be the duty of the town clerk (or some one appointed by him and approved by the chairman) to attend at the appointed polling place with the ratepayers' (or electoral) roll, or a copy thereof, and as each person representing himself to be an elector presents himself to vote (but before he receives the necessary voting card or paper), to ascertain whether his name appears upon such roll as a ratepayer within the meaning of the Act, and as each elector returns such voting paper, duly signed, to mark off from such roll that elector's name as having voted at that election.

6. That in case the voting paper as of any person shall have been received, and any other person shall afterwards demand his voting paper as of the same person, the chairman, when such person shall return same to him duly signed, shall refuse to allow the vote contained therein to be recorded, but shall keep such paper apart, and at the close of the election decide whether such person has already voted or not; and for the purpose of arriving at such decision it shall be lawful for the chairman, if he see fit, to take evidence on oath or affirmation, and such decision shall be final and conclusive on all parties; and if it shall appear to the chairman that such elector has not already voted at such election, such vote shall be added to the number already polled, but if otherwise such vote shall not be allowed.

7. That it shall be the duty of the poll clerk to record faithfully in the poll book to be provided for the purpose, the name and vote of each elector, ascertained from the respective voting cards or papers immediately upon their being handed in, as before provided, duly signed, and immediately after the close of the poll to deliver the said poll book to the chairman or town clerk for preservation with the municipal records, &c.; and upon any such poll clerk being convicted before any two or more justices of the peace of wilfully omitting to enter any such vote, or of wilfully entering any such vote in an erroneous manner, with a view to influence the result of the election, he

shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum or penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

8. That immediately upon the close of the poll, or so soon after as conveniently may be, the chairman for the time being, in the presence of the scrutineers (if any), shall (having first decided concerning any disputed votes as hereinbefore provided) count up the number of votes polled for each candidate, and announce the numbers to the electors in such way as he may think fit; and if on the state of the poll being so announced the number of votes shall have been found to have been equal for any two or more candidates, one or more of whom, but not all, shall by the state of the poll and the number of members to be elected, be entitled to be declared to be elected, the chairman shall, at the time of making such announcement, by a casting vote or votes, as the case may be, decide which of the candidates for which such equal number of votes were polled shall be elected.

9. And it is hereby further enacted by the said municipal council, that any person convicted before any two or more justices of the peace of a breach of this bye-law, or of any of its regulations or provisions, to which breach no particular penalty is hereinbefore attached, shall, for every such offence, forfeit and pay a sum or penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

BYE-LAWS.

The following bye-laws have received the assent of His Excellency the Governor since the publication of the last report, viz.:—

Bye-law No. 12.—To prevent danger from fire, arising from the erection of inflammable agricultural produce within the municipality.

Bye-law No. 13.—To regulate and fix the rates of tolls and dues to be taken for weighing at the Kilmore weighbridge, Sydney street.

PUBLIC WORKS FINISHED OR IN PROGRESS.

The contract for the formation, making, and metalling of Union street, from Sydney street to the Episcopal Church, has been completed in a most satisfactory manner, and also a contract for the supply of road metal for repairs.

A substantial culvert has been erected at the junction of Powlett and Allan streets. Contracts have been entered into for the kerbing and channelling of Sydney street, from Foot street to Mitchell street, and for forming, pitching, metalling, and making that portion of Foot street between Church and John streets. This latter will complete the metalled road to the General Cemetery. It is in contemplation to reconstruct the water channels and to metal a portion of Mitchell street, between Chapel and Sydney streets.

WEIGHBRIDGE.

The want of a weighbridge had long been felt and complained of. To meet the wishes of the public, and to keep pace with the increasing trade of the town, the council accepted the offer of Messrs. Cairns, Wilson and Amos, of Melbourne, "to supply, transport, and guarantee for six months a seven tons weighing machine." It has been erected in a most accessible position, at the junction of Sydney and Mill streets.

FIRE-ENGINE.

The inhabitants have long desired that the town should possess a fire-engine. In compliance with that desire, a fire-engine has been purchased, which it is hoped will be found to answer, if, unfortunately, any casualty should arise requiring its being brought into use.

ELECTION.

The annual election to fill the vacancies occasioned by the retirement by rotation of councillors Reay Clarke, John McPherson, and Edward Leahy, took place on the 9th August last, when Messrs. James Thomas, Thomas De Courcy Meade, and Thomas Bossence were duly elected by polled votes to fill

the vacant seats at the first meeting, on the 10th ultimo. Councillor Frederick Williams Cadwallader Beavan was unanimously re-elected chairman for the ensuing municipal year.

CORRESPONDENCE.

An active correspondence has been maintained with the Government, and with the various municipalities throughout the colony, in reference to municipal matters.

The chairman attended three meetings of the Municipal Conference held in Melbourne in May and June last.
