NOTICE TO EXPORTERS OF RAGS, BONES, ETC.

NOTICE is hereby given to intending shippers of Rags, Bones, Horns, Hoofs, &c., or any other articles which may be deleterious to the health or safety of persons on board passenger ships, as provided by the 29th section of the *Passenger Act*, 1855 (18 and 19 Victoria, cap. 119), that if it is intended to ship such articles in a vessel being a "passenger ship" within the meaning of the Act, it will be necessary to give notice to the Immigration Agent, or Assistant Immigration Agent (as the case may be), of such intended shipment, in order that the articles may be surveyed, and a certificate obtained from the Emigration Officer that they are fit for shipment, without which they cannot be allowed to be exported in a "passenger ship."

MUNICIPALITY OF BEECHWORTH.

BYE-LAW No. 24.—FOR APPROPRIATING £3706, THE FIRST PORTION OF THE LEGISLATIVE GRANT FOR THIS MUNICIPALITY FOR THE CURRENT YEAR.

WHEREAS the Legislature of this colony has made a grant-in-aid of the public works of this municipality, of which grant the sum of £3706 has been already received: Be it and it is hereby enacted by the municipal council of Beechworth, that such amount be expended as follows, viz.:—

1. In the primary clearing of portions of Loch, Finch, and Last streets.

2. In procuring an available supply of water for the use of the township, including the erection of a tank in Church street for supplying water carts, &c., and the laying down pipes and fixing fire plugs, as may be deemed necessary or advisable.

3. In the formation of footpaths where required.

4. In the general repair of the streets and roads already formed.

5. And in the erection of new municipal chambers.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 24, made by the municipal council of Beechworth, has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

MUNICIPALITY OF BRUNSWICK.

BYE-LAW No. 7.—FOR THE REGULATION OF CARRIAGES PASSING PLACES OF DIVINE WORSHIP DURING SERVICE.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No 15, 526, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is authorised to make bye-laws, amongst other things, for the regulation of carriages and public vehicles; and whereas it is expedient to prevent carriages and other vehicles from passing places of public worship during divine service at a fast pace: Be it therefore enacted by the council of the municipal district of Brunswick:—

"That the driver of every licensed carriage driving the same by any place of public worship during the hours of divine service therein on any Sunday, shall drive such carriage whilst passing such place of public worship at a walking pace.

"Any person offending against this bye-law shall, upon conviction before any two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds."

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 7, made by the municipal council of Brunswick, has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

AMHERST PETITION.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and seventy householders and landowners in the town and parish of Amherst, in the county of Talbot, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

By His Excellency's Command,

The petitioners state that they are householders and landowners in the town and parish of Amherst.

That the township has been established for upwards of five years, and that in addition to its gold fields it is situated in the centre of a rich agricultural district.

That all public works for improving the town and its vicinity have been neglected, the streets and roads remaining in a disgraceful state, whereby the value of property has become deteriorated, and the commercial and agricultural interests of the population have suffered greatly.

That the erection of the district into a municipality under the Act 18 Victoria No. 15, would conduce to health and cleanliness, and be the most certain mode of providing for its present and future requirements.

The petitioners suggest the following boundaries for the proposed district, viz.:—"Commencing at the north-west boundary of the township of Amherst; thence due east four miles to the north-east corner of allotment 18, section 4; thence in a south-westerly direction three miles to a point marked in the map as allotment 10, section 7; thence in a north-westerly direction three miles and five chains to the south-west boundary of the township; thence due north one mile to the commencing point."

They further state that the proposed district does not exceed nine square miles, that no one point therein is more than six miles distant from any other point, and that upwards of three hundred householders and landowners are resident within it.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners therefore humbly pray that your Excellency will be pleased to have the above district proclaimed a municipality under the provisions of the said Act, by the name of 'The Municipality of Amherst.'"

BRIGHTON PETITION.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by two hundred and twenty-four householders, resident at and near Brighton, in the county of Bourke, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

By His Excellency's Command,
H.7221. JOHN O'SHANASSY.

The petitioners state that the area they propose to be constituted a municipal district does not exceed nine square miles; that no one point therein is distant more than six miles from any other point, and that it contains a population of not less than three hundred householders.

The petitioners suggest that the limits and boundaries of the district shall be as follow:—"That portion of the Brighton special survey west and south-west of the main road from Melbourne to Frankston; commencing at the intersection of the said main road and the northern boundary of the special survey; thence west by the northern boundary of the said survey to the bay; thence southwards by the bay to the southern boundary of the said survey; thence east by the southern boundary of the said survey to the intersection of the main road from Melbourne to Frankston; and thence by that main road to the commencing point; and that the same may be called and known by the name of and as 'The Brighton Municipality.'"

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"That your Excellency will be pleased to proclaim and declare the same as a municipality by the name just mentioned," and "that, if your Excellency shall see fit to grant your petitioners' application, and to proclaim the said district a municipality, your Excellency will be also pleased to appoint some fit and proper person to preside as chairman at any meeting of the said householders which may be convened in consequence of or pursuant to such Proclamation."

MURDER.

FIFTY POUNDS REWARD.—FREE PARDON TO AN ACCESSORY.

WHEREAS on Tuesday, the 13th day of July now last past, the body of a man, who appears to have been murdered, was found in a hole about three feet deep, in a gully near Mr. Philip Russell's home-station, and about a quarter of a mile distant from the main road between the Carngum Gold Fields and the above-mentioned station: Notice is hereby given that a reward of Fifty Pounds will be paid to any person giving information which will lead to the apprehension and conviction of the person or persons who murdered the said man.

His Excellency the Governor will also extend Her Majesty's free pardon to any person implicated in the murder, who shall give the required information, provided such person was not the actual murderer.

PARTICULARS.

The deceased was apparently a young man about twenty-five years of age, and five feet eight inches in height; two of the front teeth in the upper jaw and three in the lower were wanting, and the skull was fractured.

The body, when found, appeared to have lain in the hole about six or eight months, being in a very advanced state of decomposition, and was partially covered over with burnt and other wood. It was found lying on its right side, the right arm under, and the left leg was detached from the thigh.

The clothing consisted of a flannel vest, white cotton shirt, and a pair of woollen drawers; a monkey-jacket was thrown over the upper part of the body, and a black satin vest and leather waist-belt were lying in the hole alongside the body.

Under his head was a light brown wideawake hat, and a green plaid scarf was tied round his eyes. An open razor lay on the ground beneath his right calf.

SPECIAL LICENSING DISTRICTS OF FRYER'S CREEK
AND TARADALE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intitled *An Act to make provision for the Sale of Fermented and Spirituous Liquors, and of Refreshments, in certain Districts*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time to proclaim any part or portion of the said colony to be a district subject to the provisions of the said Act, to be called a Special Licensing District, and to define the boundaries of such district: Now I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do, by this my Proclamation, with the advice of the Executive Council, declare the parts or portions of the said colony hereinafter named and described to be respectively Special Licensing Districts subject to the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

THE SPECIAL LICENSING DISTRICT OF FRYER'S CREEK.—Commencing at the junction of the Jim Crow Creek and the River Loddon; thence by the Jim Crow Creek to its junction with the Greenhill Creek; thence by a line south-easterly to the junction of the River Loddon and a creek unnamed near Halcombe; thence by the River Loddon to its source; thence northwards by the range separating the Rivers Loddon and Coliban to Elphinstone; thence by the main road to Castle-maine and a line bearing west to a hill known as the Monk; thence by a line south-westerly to the junction of Campbell's Creek and the River Loddon; and thence by the River Loddon to the commencing point aforesaid.

THE SPECIAL LICENSING DISTRICT OF TARADALE.—Commencing at the south-west angle of the township reserve of Elphinstone; thence by the western boundary of that reserve and by a line north-easterly to the junction of the Myrtle Creek and the River Coliban; thence southwards by the River Coliban to Stratford Lodge; thence by a line southerly to the north-east angle of the township of Malmesbury; thence by the northern boundary of that township and a line bearing west to the range separating the Rivers Loddon and Coliban; and thence northerly by that range to the commencing point.

MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF ARARAT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intitled *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that any district of the colony of Victoria, the area whereof should not exceed nine square miles, and which should contain a population of householders not less than three hundred, might, subject to the provisions of the said Act, be constituted a municipal district as thereinafter mentioned, provided that no one point in any such area should be distant more than six miles from any other point; and it was further enacted that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, on the receipt of a petition signed by not less than one hundred and fifty householders resident within any such district, praying that such district might be declared a municipal district under the said Act, to cause the substance and prayer of such petition to be published in the *Government Gazette*, and (if no counter petition, signed by an equal or greater number of householders resident within such locality, should have been delivered at the office of the Colonial Secretary within one month from the date of such publication) the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice aforesaid, might, if he should think fit, declare by Proclamation such locality a municipal district by a name to be mentioned in such Proclamation, and also by the same or any other Proclamation might define the limits and boundaries of such municipal district, and such limits and boundaries at any time thereafter in the same manner, on receipt of a similar petition, might vary and alter, but so as in no case save as thereinafter mentioned to include within the limits or boundaries of such municipal district an area of more than nine square miles; and upon the publication of any such Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, such locality so defined should be deemed and taken to be a municipal district

within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas a petition has been presented to His Excellency the Governor by the householders resident at Ararat, in the county of Ripon, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published as directed by the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do, by this my Proclamation, with the advice of the Executive Council, declare that the district hereinafter defined and named shall be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act, that is to say:—

THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF ARARAT.—Commencing at a point one hundred and twenty-one chains and fifty links, more or less, north of the north-eastern angle of allotment 2, section 2, parish of Burrumbidgee; thence by a line bearing north one mile and forty chains; thence by a line bearing east four miles; thence by a line bearing south one mile and forty chains; and thence by a line bearing west four miles to the commencing point aforesaid.

And I do hereby, with the advice aforesaid, direct that the council of the said municipal district shall be called by the name and style of "The Municipal Council of Ararat."

PROPOSED ROAD DISTRICT.

GREENSBOROUGH.

IT is hereby notified that the occupiers and owners of land at and near Greensborough, Plenty River, have made application to the Governor to erect their locality into a road district, and have forwarded a copy of the following resolutions in support of their application, viz.:—

"At a numerously attended meeting convened by public notice, held at Greensborough, on Thursday, 2nd September, 1858, for the purpose of taking into consideration the best means of improving the state of the roads in that locality, the following resolutions were proposed and carried:—

No. 14 Bye-law—To authorise the municipal council of East Collingwood to apply the legislative grant of Three thousand pounds in the execution of specified public works, and in the purchase of road materials.

No. 15 Bye-law—To regulate by means of standing rules and orders the proceedings of the municipal council of East Collingwood.

The exaggerated opinions formed by tenderers of the magnitude and difficulty of this work (requiring to be cut to a great depth through bluestone), one tender for the same being upwards of £6000, induced the municipal council to attempt the work under active supervision, by the usually unsatisfactory mode of day labor. Particulars of the expenditure thereon are subjoined. It has since been let by contract.

SANITARY CONDITION OF EAST COLLINGWOOD.

The health officer, Dr. Livingstone, reports that the municipality continues to maintain its high character for health.

Mr. Samuel Allen, the deputy registrar of births and deaths for Collingwood, has opened an office (open from Ten to Four o'clock on business days) at the corner of Smith and Gertrude streets.

PETITIONS AND MEMORIALS FROM RATEPAYERS.

Fourteen petitions, with the aggregate number of 410 signatures, have been presented to the municipal council during the past half-year. In every case the municipal council have been solicitous to comply with the wishes of the petitioners whenever practicable.

ATTENDANCE OF MEMBERS OF COUNCIL FROM 21st APRIL TO 6th OCTOBER, 1857, BOTH INCLUSIVE.

There have been twenty-six meetings (including one adjourned) of the municipal council.

The chairman, T. T. A'Beckett, Esq., was present at sixteen meetings. Absent from several from illness and being at Sydney.

MISCELLANEOUS.

The municipal council, with a view to afford increased security to the ratepayers against fire, have been in communication with the Sewerage and Water Commission, and with Clement Hodgkinson, Esq., C.E., respecting the fixing in suitable places in the municipality fire plugs in the mains to be laid therein.

The preceding council having entered into a conditional agreement to lease or purchase a site in Wellington street for a market, the municipal council considered it desirable to cancel such agreement through the municipal solicitor, for the sum of Forty pounds.

The chairman of council having occasion to be absent from Victoria during the then ensuing municipal election, he appointed councillor Greenwood to conduct the same.

The nomination meeting was held in Vere street on the 7th of October, and the election in the council chamber on the 8th of that month. Councillor Greenwood appointed Mr. William Walker deputy returning officer.

The following gentlemen were proposed as candidates, the first three being elected councillors to supply the vacancies occasioned by the retirement of councillors Finlay, Coleman, and Owen.

FINANCE.

The municipal council being deeply impressed with the great advantages which would result to occupiers and owners of property in East Collingwood, by the forming and metalling simultaneously the streets now only laid out, earnestly endeavoured to effect a loan of £10,000 for such purposes, repayable with interest by annual instalments, extending over seven or ten years; but there being a defect in the Municipal Institutions Act, and the municipal council not being empowered to issue municipal debentures, could not succeed in obtaining a loan for the requisite term. The attention of the draughtsman of the Municipal Reform Bill will be directed to this defect in the Act.

A schedule of proposed public works, contingent on obtaining this loan, was carefully prepared.

The municipal council received an instalment of £3000 of the legislative grant of £66,000 to eleven municipalities, and a subsequent final payment of £4416 2s. 5d., such grant being apportioned to each municipality according to the amount of rates collected in each for the municipal year.

THE FIFTH HALF-YEARLY REPORT OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF EAST COLLINGWOOD.

The council have to report the following:—

MUNICIPAL OFFICERS.

The overseer, H. Morrison, having resigned, the municipal surveyor undertook to provide the requisite superintendence by himself and others at an increase of salary of £150 per annum.

The town clerk's salary was increased £25 per annum, making it equal to that of town clerks of other municipalities.

An additional salary of £40 per annum to the rate collector for performing duties of valuator, was offered to that officer, but declined.

BYE-LAWS.

No. 17.—To impose a rate of one shilling in the pound, in two equal moieties upon the rateable property of the municipality, valued at £84,576, for 1858.

PUBLIC WORKS BY THE GOVERNMENT.

The works on the approaches to Collingwood Bridge have been resumed after a long interval of suspension, and an attempt made by trial levels to find a better gradient than that previously decided upon, but without any improvement being attainable.

The additional works on Reilly street drain, so essential to the health, comfort and convenience of numerous ratepayers in East Collingwood, were delayed several weeks after tenders had been received, on the alleged grounds of the desire of the inhabitants of Fitz Roy Ward to participate in the grant, towards which the city council had not contributed anything, though the municipal council of East Collingwood had contributed £350, and also to an excess of amount of tender beyond that of grant. The work in part has now been let.

Public Works projected, in progress, and completed.

PUBLIC WORKS PROJECTED.

Forming and metalling Raphael, Cambridge, and Oxford streets, and Victoria parade in part.

Forming Sydney, Cromwell, Stafford, Yarra, Campbell, Lithgow, and Mollison streets.

PUBLIC WORKS COMPLETED.

Forming, metalling, pitching, and kerbing Upper Gipps street.

Pitching and kerbing Victoria street.

Forming and metalling Victoria street, jointly with the Municipal Council of Richmond.

Kerbing and channelling and forming footways of Victoria parade.

Forming Lower Gipps street in part, and Liverpool, Park, and Byron streets.

Re-forming, pitching, and metalling Hoddle street in part, north of Johnston street.

Forming north and south channels, and metalling Ramsden street.

Repairing and painting twenty-three lamp pillars and lanterns. Gum kerbing and pitching west side of Wellington street.

Metalling Sackville, Easey, and Burlington streets.

Making numerous pitched crossings in all parts of the municipality.

The sanitary condition of the municipality continues to be favorably distinguished.

There is, however, great necessity for recording deaths under scientific classifications, and for dividing the municipality into sanitary districts, so that the local seats of disease may be promptly discovered by medical men. An application to the Registrar General on the former point was unsuccessful.

PETITIONS AND MEMORIALS FROM RATEPAYERS.

Eight petitions, with the aggregate number of 307 signatures, have been presented to the municipal council during the past half-year. In every case the municipal council have been anxious to comply with the attainable wishes of the petitioners.

MISCELLANEOUS.

The council having tried, on a large scale, the employment of labor by the day, but from experience thereof have been compelled to resort to letting works by tender, which system they have acted upon since 1st November last.

The council have had correspondence with the Sewerage and Water Commission, on supplying stand pipes, mains, and fire plugs, the latter amounting to nearly £4000. They proposed that the commission should supply them and receive payment of principal and interest by annual instalments, which the commission could not comply with. Only one stand pipe has been placed in Wellington street.

An improvement committee was appointed, but the indisposition of the Legislative Assembly to legislate upon any but pressing constitutional questions, prevented any advantageous effort being made on this and the preceding question. The council hope to prosecute their labors upon this subject with a better prospect of success the ensuing session.

Mr. Charles Le Cren's tender to value the municipality for assessment was accepted. A portion of the members of the council considered hotels and some special properties ought to be valued higher than had been done by Mr. Charles Le Cren, and that a per centage ought to be added to his entire valuation, but it was ultimately adopted without alteration.

But few appeals were made against the valuation, and the revising bench made but little alteration in individual or aggregate amount.

Twenty-three lamp pillars and lanterns have been fixed in different parts of the municipality, and are now regularly lighted.

An application having been made by the secretary of the mechanics' institution that the council would use its influence to raise such an institution for Collingwood, the council resolved that pecuniary aid could only be given to an institution open to all the ratepayers free from charge, such as a public library.

From considerations of public usefulness and a desire to afford efficient protection to the inhabitants from fire, the council have agreed to contribute quarterly £12 10s. towards the Collingwood Fire Brigade.

The fearful and distressing accounts of the outrages committed by the mutinous Sepoys in India, induced the council to convene a public meeting thereon, when several gentlemen offered their valuable services to collect subscriptions for the sufferers. The municipality was divided into eleven districts, a general committee was appointed, the chairman and town clerk being respectively chairman and secretary thereof, gentlemen appointed to collect subscriptions, which gentlemen, with few exceptions (some having subsequently declined), have zealously and efficiently performed this duty. The sum of £236 12s. 2d., less £11 11s. for expenses, was collected.

The honorary consulting engineer, C. Hodgkinson, Esq., having been appointed Acting Surveyor General, the municipal councils of Emerald Hill, East Collingwood, and Richmond, respectively, contributed towards a testimonial—a silver tea service—which was presented to Mr. Hodgkinson as a slight acknowledgment of the eminent services he had rendered to these municipalities.

FINANCE.

The council collected from rates for 1857 the sum of £3364 19s. 7d., and the first instalment of the legislative grant of £100,000 to about nineteen municipalities was £5067,* being the portion of such grant in proportion to amount of rates collected. The remaining instalment is anticipated to be paid in June or July ensuing.

To augment the amount of claim upon legislative grant, additional aid was employed to collect rates, the commencing to do which was much later than usual from circumstances the rate collector could not control.
