ALL Government advertisements which are required for publication in the local journals in Melbourne are to be forwarded for insertion by the Head of the Department concerned; in other parts of the colony advertisements intended for the country papers are to be forwarded for insertion by the officer authorised for that purpose.

Accounts for advertising must in the first instance be sent for certificate to the Head of the Department, or to the officer from whom the order to insert the advertisement was received, who will be held responsible for the correctness of the account so far as regards the number of insertions charged for.

The accounts are then to be forwarded to the Government Printer, who will examine them and ascertain that the number of advertisements charged for have been inserted, that the computations are correct, that the rates charged, &c., are in accordance with the tender, and that the amount is due. If found correct the accounts are at once to be forwarded to the Treasury for payment; but if errors are discovered the Printer will forward the account with his report thereon to the Treasurer.

PROPOSED ROAD DISTRICT.

GREENSBOROUGH.

IT is hereby notified that the occupiers and owners of land at and near Greensborough, Plenty River, have made application to the Governor to erect their locality into a road district, and have forwarded a copy of the following resolutions in support of their application, viz. :—

“ At a numerously attended meeting convened by public notice, held at Greensborough, on Thursday, 2nd September, 1858, for the purpose of taking into consideration the best

means of improving the state of the roads in that locality, the following resolutions were proposed and carried :—

“ 1. That the roads in this locality having become almost impassable, it is highly necessary that immediate steps be taken to put them in proper repair.

“ 2. That this meeting is of opinion that the best way of effecting this is by means of the formation of a district road board, in accordance with the provisions of the Road Act, 16 Victoria No. 40.

“ 3. That this meeting therefore instruct their chairman to communicate with His Excellency, earnestly requesting him to exercise the powers vested in him by the 9th clause of the abovenamed Act in behalf of this district, that is to say, by

proclaiming and declaring this portion of the colony to be a road district.

"4. That this meeting respectfully suggest that the said road district be designated the Greensborough Road District, and that the boundaries thereof be as follows:—

"Commencing at a point where the southern boundary of section 17, parish of Keelbundora, intersects the River Plenty; thence due west to Upper Plenty Road; thence northward along the said road to the dividing boundary of sections 19 and 28; thence due east to the Plenty River; thence northerly along the said river to the north boundary of section 20, parish of Morang; thence due east to the north-east corner of the parish of Morang; thence in a straight line to the confluence of the Back and Diamond Creeks; and thence southerly along the western boundary of the Eltham Road District to the commencing point.

PORTARLINGTON ROAD DISTRICT.

APPLICATION FOR ENLARGEMENT.

IT is hereby notified that the inhabitants of the parishes of Bellarine and Paywit, in the county of Grant, in public meeting assembled, have agreed to the subjoined resolutions, having for their object the annexation to the Portarlington Road District of the portion of the parish of Paywit comprised within the following boundaries, viz.:—

"Commencing at the south-east angle of portion D, section 4, block 2, Paywit; and bounded by a line bearing thence east about two miles to the western shore of Swan Bay; thence by Swan Bay and Port Phillip Bay to the north-western angle of the said parish; thence by part of the western boundary of the said parish south about six and a half miles, and further south about one mile along the western boundary of section 4, block No. 2, of the said parish, to the point of commencement."

Resolutions agreed to at a meeting of the inhabitants of the parishes of Bellarine and Paywit, held at the Road Board Office, Bellarine, on 15th September, 1858:—

"That it is the opinion of this meeting that in consequence of the increasing traffic on the roads of this district, and of the necessity that exists for further provision being made for the formation and repairs of such roads, that that portion of the parish of Paywit shown on the survey now before the meeting [described above] should be annexed to the Portarlington Road District.

"That a deputation from this meeting, consisting of the chairman (Mr. J. G. Macdonald), and Mr. S. L. Curlewis, J.P., be appointed to wait upon the Honorable the President of the Board of Land and Works to request that he will advise His Excellency to proclaim the northern portion of the said parish of Paywit as being within the Portarlington Road District.

AMHERST PETITION.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and seventy householders and landowners in the town and parish of Amherst, in the county of Talbot, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

The petitioners state that they are householders and landowners in the town and parish of Amherst.

That the township has been established for upwards of five years, and that in addition to its gold fields it is situated in the centre of a rich agricultural district.

That all public works for improving the town and its vicinity have been neglected, the streets and roads remaining in a disgraceful state, whereby the value of property has become deteriorated, and the commercial and agricultural interests of the population have suffered greatly.

That the erection of the district into a municipality under the Act 18 Victoria No. 15, would conduce to health and cleanliness, and be the most certain mode of providing for its present and future requirements.

The petitioners suggest the following boundaries for the proposed district, viz.:—Commencing at the north-west boundary of the township of Amherst; thence due east four miles to the north-east corner of allotment 18, section 4; thence in a south-westerly direction three miles to a point marked in the map as allotment 10, section 7; thence in a north-westerly direction three miles and five chains to the south-west boundary of the township; thence due north one mile to the commencing point."

They further state that the proposed district does not exceed nine square miles, that no one point therein is more than six miles distant from any other point, and that upwards of three hundred householders and landowners are resident within it.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners therefore humbly pray that your Excellency will be pleased to have the above district proclaimed a municipality under the provisions of the said Act, by the name of 'The Municipality of Amherst.'"
