POLLING PLACES FOR THE MARYBOROUGH MINING DISTRICT.

W HEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, An Act for amending the Laws relative to the Gold Fields, it is enacted that a poll shall be taken for the election of members for each division of every mining district, at such places within such division as the Governor in Council, shall from time to time direct: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council, bearing even date herewith, certain alterations have been made in the divisions of the mining district of Maryborough, and it is expedient to re-arrange the polling places for taking the poll at any election of members of the Mining Board of the said district: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that in lieu of all places previously appointed for taking the poll at elections for the several divisions of the mining district of Maryborough, the poll shall be taken for the said elections at the several places named in the last column of the schedule hereunto annexed, within and for the divisions respectively set opposite thereto in the second column of the same schedule, that is to say:—
