SECTIONS V. TO X. OF TOWN AND COUNTRY POLICE ACT EXTENDED TO THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF MALDON.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eighteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty (Number 14), intituled, *An Act to provide for the Management of Towns and other places in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that so many of the provisions of the said Act as relate to the good order of towns and other populous places, being sections numbered V., VI., VII., VIII., IX. and X., in the said Act, should extend to and be in force in such cities, towns, districts, and places as the Lieutenant Governor might by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare to come under the operation of the same respectively, or any of them, and it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor to define the limits of such places, and to vary and alter such limits and revoke any such Proclamation; and all the other provisions of the said Act except the last (being numbered XXXIX.,) should extend to and be in operation throughout Victoria and its dependencies from and after the passing thereof: Now I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the municipal district of Maldon shall come under the operation of the sections of the said Act numbered respectively V., VI., VII., VIII., IX. and X.

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eighteenth year of Her present Majesty's Reign (number 13), intituled, *An Act for promoting the Public Health in populous places in the Colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that the said Act, or any clause or section thereof, should apply to such city, town, district, or place in Victoria as the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, might by Proclamation see fit to direct: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do, by this my Proclamation, declare and direct that the said Act shall apply to and be in force in the Municipal District of Maldon.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant-Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, *An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, to proclaim by notice in the *Government Gazette* the roads in the said colony which should be and be deemed Main Roads under the provisions of the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim that the roads hereinafter mentioned shall be and be deemed Main Roads under the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

THE MAIN SYDNEY ROAD, FROM MELBOURNE TO THE RIVER MURRAY, SO FAR AS BROADFORD.—Commencing at the northern boundary line of the city of Melbourne, at Brunswick, in the county of Bourke; thence through the townships of Donnybrook and Beveridge, in the said county; thence into the county of Dalhousie, to and through the town of Kilmore; thence through the Willowmavin Special Survey; and thence to the township of Broadford, in the said county.

THE MAIN CENTRAL ROAD, GIPPS LAND.—Commencing at the boundary of the township of Port Albert, and thence passing through the township of Tarraville, and crossing the La Trobe River, to Sale.

THE MAIN AVOCA ROAD.—Commencing at the boundary of the town of Castlemaine, in the county of (unproclaimed); thence to the township of Muckleford; thence to the township of Newstead; thence into the county of Talbot; thence to Joyce's Creek Bridge, crossing Joyce's Creek; thence to the town of Carisbrook; thence to the township of Maryborough, in the aforesaid county; thence into the county of (unproclaimed); thence to the town of Avoca, in the county of (unproclaimed).

- On the Castlemaine and Ballarat road, near the "Five Flags" Hotel, Campbell's Creek;
- On the Avoca road at Joyce's Creek Bridge;
- On the main Sydney road, near the Union Hotel, south of Kilmore; and also at Willowmavin;
- On the Ballarat and Buninyong road, near Canadian Gully;
- On the Upper Western road, at Shelford;
- On the Main Central road, Gipps Land, at La Trobe River Bridge;

PROPOSED ROAD DISTRICT.
UPPER PLENTY.

IT is hereby notified that the inhabitants of the Upper Plenty have, pursuant to a resolution adopted at a public meeting held at the Plough Inn, Janefield, on the 2nd instant, applied to His Excellency the Governor to erect their locality into a Road District within the meaning of the Act 16 Victoria No. 40, and they propose that the area and designation of the district be as stated in the following resolutions, viz.:—

"That the boundary commence at the south-east corner of the Epping Road District by an easterly line along the north side of the road from Pentridge to Warringal to its junction with Heidelberg Trust road; thence along the north side of Heidelberg Trust road to Plenty River; on the east side by the Plenty River to the north boundary of Toorourrong parish; on the north side by a west line along the north boundary of said parish; on the west side by a south line along the eastern boundary of the parish of Merriang to the Woodstock boundary; then by an east line along the north side of section 9 parish of Toorourrong to the north-west corner of section 10, same parish; thence by a south line along the Woodstock and Epping Road Districts to the commencing point.

"That the proposed district be designated 'The Upper Plenty Road District.'"

BEECHWORTH MINING DISTRICT.

BYE-LAWS No. LIX.—LXXIII.—[14th September, 1858.]

At a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Beechworth, begun and holden at Beechworth, in the said district, on the 14th day of September, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

59. *repealing No. 38.*—Bye-law No. 38 of the Beechworth mining board is hereby annulled and repealed.

60. *repealing Nos. 31, 35, 36 and 58.*—Bye-laws Nos. 31, 35, 36 and 58, of the Beechworth mining board, are hereby annulled and repealed.

61. *Diversion of surplus water permitted.*—All surplus water in any creek or river in excess of the mining requirements of persons using the same in its natural channel, or within the limits of a bed claim, may be diverted by the occupier of races according to priority of right.

62. *Defining priority in races already cut.*—In the event of there not being water sufficient to supply all the races cut from the same creek with the amount of water to the use of which the occupiers thereof are entitled, such occupier shall, except where specially excepted or provided for, be entitled to priority of supply of water according to the respective periods at which such races have been occupied; but in all cases where the occupier claims under a permit or authority in writing to cut the race granted by a commissioner of the gold fields or warden, the occupation of such race shall be taken to have commenced from the period at which such permit or authority in writing was granted; and in case the occupation of any race has been or shall be abandoned for the space of one calendar month after it shall

have been first occupied, then the occupation of such race shall be deemed to have commenced from the period at which the occupation thereof was or shall be resumed.

63. *Priority of supply of water to exist in person first registering race.*—Bye-law No. 44 of the Beechworth mining board is hereby annulled and repealed, and the following substituted in lieu thereof:—Any miner desirous of cutting a race for the purpose of diverting water, whether from creeks or springs, shall register the same with the warden of the division according to the form at foot hereof, setting forth in such registration the point at which it is proposed to head the race; and priority of right to a supply of water shall, subject to any existing bye-law, be taken to exist in the person first registering the same—a copy of such registration to be furnished to the person registering.

64. *Diversion of water from natural watershed.*—When the water of any unoccupied creek is not required within the watershed of such creek, or when the water of any occupied creek may happen to be in excess of the mining requirements of that creek, any person may, subject to any bye-laws regulating the supply of water, divert such water for mining purposes; but in the event of the water in either case being required within its natural watershed, it shall be imperative upon the person so diverting the water, upon receiving a notice in writing from any person

requiring the water for mining purposes within its natural watershed, within three days from the receipt of such notice, to cease such diversion or return the water at a point so as to be made available to the person giving the notice; but such temporary diversion of water shall in no way effect the priority of right (if any) of the holder of the race to a supply of water within the natural shed of such water, upon the cessation of such diversion.

65. *Notice to cease diversion so as to supply prior rights.*—Any person in the occupation of a race and entitled to priority, or in occupation of a bed claim, or who may require water for washing auriferous earth at a creek or river, may, in the event of his requiring the water in its natural channel for the use of a bed claim, or for washing auriferous earth conveyed to the creek, if in the Buckland, Three-mile, or Nine-mile divisions, give notice in writing to any other person not entitled to a prior supply, within twenty-four hours; and if in the Yackandandah, Spring Creek, Omeo, or Woolshed divisions, immediately upon the receipt of such notice forthwith to turn the water back into such creek or river, and in the case of hill or bank races for the purpose of diverting water for working claims other than bed-claims, the one as against the other, within three clear days after such notice to cease to divert the water, or so much thereof as may be necessary to enable the person giving such notice to be supplied with the amount of water to which he is entitled, and to permit the same to flow in the course in which, but for such diversion, it would have flowed; and any person who in either case shall not cease to divert such water, and permit the same to flow according to the notice, shall be deemed guilty of a breach of the bye-laws of the mining board, and shall be liable to a penalty imposed by the 126 section of the Gold Fields Act, 21 Victoria No. 32.

66. *Control over tail water prohibited.*—Bye-law No. 39 of the Beechworth mining board is hereby annulled and repealed, and the following substituted in lieu thereof:—All right or control over any water used for any mining purposes shall be taken to have ceased immediately upon the water having left the sluice of the person holding the same, and it shall be competent for any person other than the holder of the original right to register the use of such tail-water, in the same manner as though the supply of water was to be taken and diverted from its original source, subject always and without prejudice to existing rights and privileges of the person claiming the first right of using such water.

67. *Right of water to be taken to extend only to particular claim.*—Bye-law No. 32 of the Beechworth mining board is hereby annulled and repealed, and the following substituted in lieu thereof:—All right to the use of water granted with claims in the beds of creeks or rivers shall only be taken to extend to the claim with which originally granted; but in the division of the Yackandandah, the right of water shall be taken to extend only to the claim with which the same was granted, of what nature soever the claim may be; but the operation of this bye-law shall not be taken to apply in the Yackandandah division to races cut for the diversion of water to claims other than bed-claims, prior to the nineteenth day of February, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-six.

68. *Storage of water in beds of creeks in Three and Nine-mile divisions prohibited.*—The holders of bed-claims in the Three-mile Creek and Nine-mile Creek divisions shall be restricted to the use of the water as the same passes their respective claims, but the general right of using the water in the bed of the creek shall not be taken to extend to the storage of water for the purpose of working bed-claims.

69. *Registration of tail-races and tunnels.*—Any miner desirous of cutting a tail-race or tunnel for any mining purpose shall first register the same, showing the point from which it is proposed to cut or drive such tail-race or tunnel, also showing the claim or claims to which it is in the first place to be carried.

70. *Registration of assignment of races.*—In the event of the person in whose name any race is registered assigning his interest in such race, it shall be imperative upon the person claiming under such assignment to have his name and the date of transfer inserted in the register immediately opposite the original entry in the column reserved for that purpose.

71. *Supply of water; how gauged.*—Bye-law No. 51 of the Beechworth mining board is hereby annulled and repealed, and the following substituted in lieu thereof:—The occupier of a race shall be entitled to the use of the following quantity of water, namely, in the Spring Creek, Snake Valley, and Three-mile Creek divisions of the mining district of Beechworth, to a stream of water running for twelve consecutive hours in each day, to be gauged by a box six feet long, twelve inches wide and six inches deep in the inner measurement, with an opening of a uniform depth of one and one-eighth inch across the bottom; in the Woolshed, Buckland, Yackandandah and Omeo divisions, to a stream of water running continuously for the whole twenty-four hours, to be gauged in the Woolshed and Buckland divisions by a box of the same length, width and depth as before-mentioned, with an opening of a uniform depth of three inches across the bottom; in the Yackandandah and Omeo divisions, to be gauged by a box of the same length and width as before-mentioned, but only three inches and a half deep in the inner measurement, and with an opening of a uniform depth of three inches across the bottom. In all cases the box to be fixed on a dead level in the race immediately below the spot where the race receives its last supply; the race to be made perfectly level for a distance of not less than twelve feet immediately above the box, where an over-shot shall be formed extending one entire side of a corresponding

height with the sides of the box; and in races conveying more than one head of water, the box to be increased in width twelve inches for every additional head of water the race may be permitted to carry.

72. *Extension of time for prospecting quartz claims.*—If at the expiration of the period allowed for the prospecting of quartz claims the holder of any quartz claim shall not have sufficiently prospected the same, and shall require further time for that purpose, possession of the claim may be lawfully held by the occupier of such claim duly registering his intention of further prospecting the same, and the same shall be protected thereby for one month, and from month to month as often as such intention shall be registered, and during which periods it shall not be incumbent upon the occupier of the claim to employ thereon any greater number of men than that prescribed by the bye-law as necessary for holding possession of the same during the time allowed for prospecting the claim.

73. *Extended area of claim may be occupied by same number of men as original claim.*—Where any miner may have occupied an extended area of ground under any special bye-law in excess of the quantity allowed under the bye-law regulating the extent of ground of that particular nature that may be occupied under such bye-law, it shall not be imperative upon the occupier thereof to place any increased number of men upon such extended area, but the extended area in excess may be held by the same number of men as would have been sufficient to hold the original claim.

The undersigned members of the said mining board concurred in making the foregoing bye-laws.

MUNICIPALITY OF DUNOLLY.

BYE-LAW No. 1.—A BYE-LAW TO REGULATE BY MEANS OF STANDING ORDERS THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF DUNOLLY.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the Establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, section 26, it is enacted, "That it shall be lawful for the council of any municipal district to make bye-laws for the regulation of their own proceedings." And whereas by a Proclamation of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, dated the 21st day of May, 1858, the district of Dunolly was duly established a municipal district: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Dunolly, that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency Sir Henry Barkly, then administering the Government of Victoria, the proceedings and business of the said council shall be conducted according to the following regulations only, which shall be called the standing orders of the said council, that is to say:—

CHAP. I.—Order of Proceedings.

1. That the sittings of this council shall on all ordinary occasions be open to the public, but any councillor may require the exclusion of strangers while the sense of the council is taken as to whether the question proposed shall be discussed with closed doors.
2. That the council shall meet every Friday, at Seven o'clock p.m., and shall commence business at each meeting as soon as the legal quorum is present, but if at the expiration of thirty minutes after the appointed hour of meeting there is not a quorum present, the business of such meeting shall lapse, providing always that the names of such councillors present shall be taken down and recorded in the minutes.
3. The first business at each meeting of the council shall be to confirm the minutes of the preceding meeting, and no discussion shall take place thereupon except as to the accuracy thereof.
4. At all meetings the reading of the correspondence unconnected with the business of the meeting, the presentation of petitions, and the bringing up of reports, shall have the precedence of all motions.
5. No motion shall be discussed or decided on at any meeting unless notice in writing, signed by the councillor proposing

the same, shall have been given three clear days previous, or at the previous meeting of council, nor shall any report of committee be decided on unless similar notice be given, and the town clerk shall furnish each councillor with a list of notices of motion received two days before the meeting for which the same are given, and no motion so made shall be withdrawn without the leave of the council.

6. That the reports of committees appointed by the council shall be always brought up at the first meeting succeeding their appointment, unless some satisfactory reason be assigned for delay.

7. The order of the day shall include all business of which due notice has been given, and all matters arising out of former meetings of the council.

8. Any motion entered on the notice paper, and the councillor having given notice of the same being absent, and no other councillor deputed to bring forward such motion when the business is called in order, such motion shall be struck out.

9. No bye-law shall be decided on without due notice (as in the case of motions), and a copy of the proposed bye-law shall be open in the council chamber or town clerk's office for the inspection of all ratepayers, or of any person duly qualified to vote at elections under the Act, free of charge.

CHAP. II.—Order of Debate.

1. Any councillor proposing a motion or amendment must rise and address the chairman, and no councillor shall be interrupted unless by a call to order (when he shall sit down), the councillor calling to order shall then be heard, and the question of order decided before the subject is resumed, or any other business.

2. Any member proposing a motion or amendment shall put it in writing, sign and deliver it to the town clerk, who shall add thereto the name of the seconder, and no motion or amendment so made shall be withdrawn without leave of the council.

3. No motion or amendment shall be entertained or discussed unless it be seconded; any member may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the council, by simply noticing that such order is disobeyed.

4. No member shall speak more than once on the same subject, unless by way of explanation merely or in reply as the mover of the original motion, or upon any amendment, and after such explanation or reply the question shall be forthwith put to the vote; but members merely seconding any motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

5. If more than one councillor rise at one time, the chairman for the time being shall decide which is entitled to precedence.

6. Any member who shall use any expression capable of being applied offensively to any other member, shall (if required by a majority of the council) withdraw such expression and make a satisfactory apology, under a penalty in case he should refuse or neglect to do so before the rising of the council, of not more than Five pounds sterling, such penalty to be assessed by the chairman for the time being.

7. The chairman, when called upon to decide a point of order or practice, shall state the rule or precedent applicable to the case, without any argument or comment, and his decision, as to what is order or explanation, shall be final.

8. The chairman shall arise when addressing the council in discussion of any question.

9. Any councillor may demand the production of any of the documents of the council relating to the subject under discussion.

10. Only one amendment shall be discussed at one time, and upon the adoption of any amendment the original motion shall be deemed rejected, and the amendment so carried shall be acted upon as an original motion.

11. The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the meeting, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the names of the councillors voting for and against the question shall be recorded, and the votes of all councillors shall be entered on the minutes.

12. The council shall vote by show of hands, except in cases of election, when such shall be determined by ballot.

13. No proposition once brought before the council shall be withdrawn without leave of the council.

14. No motion, the effect of which, if carried, would be to rescind any motion which has already passed the council, shall be entertained during the same municipal year, unless a call of the whole council has been duly made for that purpose.

CHAP. III.—Elections.

1. No election to any office at the disposal of the council shall take place until four clear days' notice shall have been given in one or more of the local newspapers, inviting applications for the same, and the salary of such office shall in all cases be fixed for the municipal year, and inserted in the advertisement.

2. No councillor or officer belonging to the council shall be received as surety for any officer appointed by the council, or for the performance of any work to be done for the council; and in all cases in which security for the due and faithful performance of any duty or contract is required, the expense of preparing such surety shall be borne by the person or persons giving the same.

3. At all elections and on all occasions of accepting tenders or contracts the voting shall take place by ballot, if the majority of the council so direct.

CITAP. IV.—Miscellaneous Regulations.

1. For the consideration of any bye-law or for the raising and appropriating of money, or for the objects contemplated in the standing order No. 14, chap. II., it shall be competent for any councillor, without previous notice, to move for a call of the whole council for the consideration of any such subject at the next or any subsequent meeting, and upon such motion being carried, due notice shall be given in the notice paper for the day or notice of motion for which such call was made, and set down for consideration; and any member not in attendance when such order of the day or notice of motion comes under consideration, or not in attendance at the voting upon such question or any amendment thereof, whether of adjournment or otherwise, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five shillings, unless reasonable cause for such absence shall be shown to the satisfaction of the council.

2. The clerk shall have the charge of the common seal of the corporation, and shall be responsible for the safe custody and proper use of the same, each impression thereof being duly verified by the signature of that officer.

3. The clerk shall not affix the common seal to any corporate document without the express order of the council, nor unless such document bears the signature of the chairman.

4. Any one or more of the standing orders of the council, except No. 14, chap. II., and No. 1, chap. IV., may be suspended *pro tempore* in case of emergency, provided that the majority present deem it necessary.

MUNICIPALITY OF DUNOLLY.

BYE-LAW No. 3.—FOR PREVENTING THE KINDLING OF CHIMNEYS.

WHEREAS by an Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to make bye-laws for the prevention and extinguishing of fires, and for the general good rule, &c.: Be it ordered and enacted by the municipal council of Dunolly, that the owner or occupier of any building who shall allow his chimney to ignite may be summoned by any one having authority from the council before one or more justices, and fined in a sum not exceeding Five pounds sterling.

BYE-LAW No. 4.—TO PROVIDE FOR THE CLEANSING OF FOOTWAYS AND WATER CHANNELS.

WHEREAS by an Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to make bye-laws for the suppression of nuisances and the preservation of the public health: Be it therefore enacted by the municipal council of Dunolly, that the owners and occupiers of buildings and lands within and adjoining the streets, lanes, or other thoroughfares of the said municipality, shall cause to be cleansed and kept free from all filth or rubbish, or obstruction of any sort, the footpaths and water channels in front or at the side of their respective buildings and lands; and in those streets or thoroughfares where the footpaths have not yet been formed, this regulation shall apply to the distance of eighteen feet from the front or side of the building or lane as aforesaid; and every such owner or occupier failing to comply with this regulation, or allowing any filth or rubbish to accumulate or remain in or upon any such footway or water channel as aforesaid, shall, upon conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding Five pounds sterling; and for the purpose of this bye-law when any house shall be let in separate apartments, the person letting such apartments shall be deemed the occupier.

BYE-LAW No. 6.—TO COMPEL OBSERVANCE TO BE PAID TO THE SURVEYED LINE OF STREET IN THE FUTURE ERECTION OF BUILDINGS; ALSO, TO PROVIDE FOR THE REMOVAL OF HOUSES AND BUILDINGS NOW STANDING IN ANY WAY ON THE STREETS.

WHEREAS by an Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to pass bye-laws for the suppression of nuisances and the general good rule, &c.: Be it ordered and enacted by the municipal council of Dunolly, that the owners or occupiers of any house or building encroaching in any way on the boundary line of any of the streets within the said municipality, shall be required to move such house or building back to the

surveyed line of such street or streets before the expiration of the 1st of November, 1858; and if any house or building shall in the opinion of the council or their authorised officer encroach so far on any street as to prevent, interfere with, or hinder the making or repairing of any of the surveyed roads or streets within the said municipality, then it shall be lawful for the council, by notice in writing to the owner or occupier of any house or building so encroaching as aforesaid, to order the removal of such house or building within one month from the date thereof: And it is further ordered and enacted as aforesaid, that any person failing, or neglecting, or refusing to comply with the provisions of this bye-law, on the expiration of the time above specified in such notice as aforesaid, shall be liable and subject to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds for the first offence, and a sum not exceeding Fifty pounds for any second offence, and for any succeeding offence against this bye-law, a sum not exceeding Fifty pounds—such penalty or penalties to be recovered and recoverable in the manner provided by the said Act.

For a reserve of land for the purpose of taking loam.—Ten acres granted.

For the erection of a court house.—Granted.

For a grant of land for a town hall.—Granted.

For the repair of the present bridge.—Promised.

For declaring this a market town.—Not yet granted.

For the telegraph to pass through the town.—Granted.

For the division of the cemetery.—Granted.

For a post office.—Declined at present.
