## MUNICIPALITY OF PRAHRAN.

BYE-LAW No. 51.—A BYE-LAW FOR THE APPROPRIATION OF THE SUM OF £4587 0s. 9d. GRANTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY FOR THE YEAR 1857.

WHEREAS by an Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, "An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," it is amongst other things enacted that all funds raised by aid from Government, whether by endowment or otherwise, shall be subject to a distinct and separate bye-law: And whereas the sum of Four thousand five hundred and eighty-seven pounds and ninepence has been granted by the Legislative Assembly to the municipal council of Prahran: Be it therefore enacted by the said municipal council of Prahran, that the sum of Four thousand five hundred and eighty-seven pounds and ninepence be expended in forming, pitching and metalling York street, Union street and High street, within the said municipal district of Prahran.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 51, made by the municipal council of Prahran, has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

## MUNICIPALITY OF EMERALD HILL.

## REPORT OF THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE COUNCIL FOR THE HALF-YEAR ENDING 31ST DECEMBER, 1857.

## PUBLIC WORKS.

THE following works have been completed during the half-year:—

1. The formation, kerbing and channelling of portion of York street west.
2. The formation, kerbing and partial channelling of Coventry place.
3. The completion, metalling, kerbing and channelling of Clarendon street, between York street and the Sandridge road.
4. The completion, metalling, kerbing and channelling of Cecil street, between Dorcas street and the Sandridge road.
5. The metalling, partial kerbing and channelling of Ferrars street, between Bank street and the Sandridge road. Also, the formation of Ferrars street, between Park and Bank streets.
6. The completion, kerbing, channelling and metalling of Coventry street, between Cecil and Clarendon streets.
7. The completion, metalling, kerbing and channelling of Market street, between Cecil and Clarendon streets.
8. The completion, kerbing and metalling of Dorcas street, between Cecil street and the railway bridge.
9. The formation of approaches to the crossing over the St. Kilda Railway, in the line of Bridport street.

The following works are in progress:—

1. The formation of Yarra street.
2. The formation of Coventry street, between Clarendon and Yarra streets.
3. The partial formation of York street east, between Clarendon and Moray streets.
4. The formation of portion of Moray street.
5. The formation of Park street east, between Clarendon and Moray streets.

A considerable quantity of bluestone metal has been purchased during the half-year, and tenders are now being invited for a further supply of 3000 yards.

Orders have been transmitted to Great Britain for 10,000 square feet of flagging, which is now daily expected to arrive.

Sixteen thousand feet of blue gum kerbing has been contracted for, and the timber is in course of delivery.

Boards inscribed with names of streets have been affixed, as far as practicable, at the corners of all the streets within the township. Crossings over the swamp near the sea shore have been constructed for the convenience of bathers, and also three screen fences on the ladies' bathing ground.

## SANDRIDGE ROAD.

The toll on the Sandridge road has been leased for the year 1858, for the sum of £3877. A quantity of metal is now being laid down, and extensive improvements are about being made on the road.

## BRIDGE ACROSS THE FALLS.

At the instance of the council, a sum of £5000 for the erection of a bridge across the River Yarra at the Falls was placed on the Estimates, and the amount has been voted by the Legislature.

## ASSESSMENT.

An assessment has been duly made, and a rate of one shilling in the pound struck for the municipal year 1857-8, the places of worship and other public buildings being exempted by proclamation of His Excellency.

## GOVERNMENT GRANT IN AID.

The second moiety of the Government grant in aid, amounting to £3242 0s 8d., has been received by the council during the last half-year.

## TOWN RATES.

The sum of £3362 19s. 4d. (town rates) has been collected during the year 1857.

## WATER SUPPLY.

The council have been energetic in moving the Government and Commissioners of Sewers and Water Supply to extend the benefits of the Yan Yean scheme to Emerald Hill, and confidently expect that their efforts in this particular will be successful.

## INTRAMURAL SLAUGHTERING OF CATTLE.

The slaughtering of animals within the township having been found very injurious to the health and comfort of the inhabitants, the council are endeavoring to effect a simultaneous action among the various municipalities and the city of Melbourne, for the compulsory removal of slaughter-houses to suitable sites outside the limits set apart for building purposes.

## SANITARY CONDITION.

For the more effectual carrying out of sanitary regulations, the council have appointed the district sergeant of police as assistant inspector of nuisances, and existing nuisances are in active course of being suppressed.

## MECHANICS' INSTITUTE.

The bye-law passed for the grant of £300 towards the building fund of the Emerald Hill Mechanics' Institute having been found *ultra vires* of the council, that amount has been passed to the trustees by a vote of the council in consideration of obtaining the use of the hall of the institute for a period of two years for all public and private meetings required by the council.
