SECTIONS V. TO X. OF TOWN AND COUNTRY POLICE ACT EXTENDED TO THE TOWNSHIP OF CROWLANDS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c. &c. &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eighteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty (Number 14), intituled, *An Act to provide for the Management of Towns and other places in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that so many of the provisions of the said Act as relate to the good order of towns and other populous places, being sections numbered V., VI., VII., VIII., IX. and X., in the said Act, should extend to and be in force in such cities, towns, districts, and places as the Lieutenant Governor might by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare to come under the operation of the same respectively, or any of them, and it should be lawful for the

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Lieutenant Governor to define the limits of such places, and to vary and alter such limits and revoke any such Proclamation; and all the other provisions of the said Act except the last (being numbered XXXIX.) should extend to and be in operation throughout Victoria and its dependencies from and after the passing thereof: Now I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the township of Crowlands, the limits whereof are hereinafter defined, shall come under the operation of the sections of the said Act numbered respectively V., VI., VII., VIII., IX. and X.

And I do hereby define the limits of the said township of Crowlands to be the following, viz.:-Commencing at a point one chain west from the north-west angle of allotment one, section four, in the parish of Crowlands; thence by a line bearing south eighty chains; thence by a line bearing west eighty chains; thence by a line bearing north eighty chains; and thence by a line bearing east eighty chains to the commencing point.

Given under my Hand the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this nineteenth day of October, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, and in the twenty-second year of Her Majesty's Reign.

GUANO ON THE KOORIA MOORIA ISLANDS.

INTIMATION having been received from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, that Her Majesty's Government had been pleased to grant a license to Messrs. Ord, Hindson and Hayes, for the shipment of guano from three of the Kooria Moorla Islands, named Jibleen, Haski, and Ghurzoud, to any port in Her Majesty's dominions, the accompanying copy of the license in question is published for general information, in which are set forth the conditions and regulations under which guano may be obtained.

COPY OF LICENSE REFERRED TO IN THE FOREGOING NOTICE.

This indenture, made the Twenty-fourth day of July, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, between Her Most Gracious Majesty Queen Victoria of the first part: John Ord, of Litherland, near Liverpool, in the county of Lancaster, late master mariner, and Joseph Hindson and James Henshall Hayes, both of Liverpool aforesaid, merchants and brokers, of the second part: Whereas His Highness the Imam of Muscat hath ceded to Her said Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors, in full property and dominion, certain islands, being part of His said Highness's dominions and situate in or near the Bay of Kooria Moorla, on the south coast of Arabia, three of which islands are denominated respectively Jibleen, Haski, and Ghurzoud: And whereas it hath been represented to Her said Majesty that the three last mentioned islands contain certain deposits of guano and other substances capable of being used for the manuring of land (all which substances are hereinafter included under the term guano): And whereas by an indenture bearing date the twentieth day of February, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, and made by Thomas William Clinton Murdoch, Charles Alexander Wood, and Frederick Rogers, Her said Majesty's Emigration Commissioners, on behalf of Her said Majesty, of the first part; and the said John Ord, Joseph Hindson, and James Henshall Hayes, of the second part, Her said Majesty did grant to the said John Ord, Joseph Hindson, and James Henshall Hayes the right to raise and take away guano from the said three islands in manner therein mentioned: Now this indenture witnesseth that the said indenture of the twentieth day of February, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, and everything therein contained, shall, from the date of the execution hereof, be deemed to be null and void: And this indenture further witnesseth that, subject to the provisions hereinafter contained, Her said Majesty hath granted and doth hereby grant to the said John Ord, Joseph Hindson, and James Henshall Hayes, their executors, administrators, and assigns (hereinafter called the parties of the second part), the sole and exclusive right, from the execution of these presents to the twentieth day of February, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, to raise and take away the said guano from the said three islands, Jibleen, Haski, and Ghurzoud, with permission to construct on the said islands all such sheds, huts, stores, jetties, or other works or buildings as may be requisite for that purpose; and this indenture further witnesseth that the said parties of the second part do covenant and agree with and to Her said Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors, as follows, that is to say:—

1. The said parties of the second part will pay to Her said Majesty a royalty of Two shillings sterling for every ton of guano which shall be exported from any of the said islands from the date of these presents to the twentieth day of February, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, inclusive, and a royalty of Four shillings sterling on every ton which shall be so exported after that date.

2. The said parties of the second part will send in to Her Majesty's Secretary of State for the Colonies half-yearly statements (commencing from the twentieth of February, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven), specifying the names and tonnage of all the vessels which shall have shipped guano in the said islands during the half-year to which such statement shall relate, and the quantity of guano shipped in each vessel, so as to ensure (as far as may be practicable) that every such statement shall reach the Secretary of State within eight calendar months of the expiration of every such half-year.

3. The said parties of the second part shall, within the same eight months, pay to any person who may be authorised by the said Secretary of State to receive the same, the amount of royalty which shall be due to Her Majesty in respect of the shipments made during such half-year.

4. Subject to such regulations as may be necessary for preserving order and regularity in the shipments, and to the provisions hereinafter contained, the said parties of the second part shall allow all British vessels whatever, and the vessels of such foreign states as shall be designated by the Secretary of State for the Colonies to the said licensees to load guano at any of the abovementioned islands, receiving from the person shipping such guano the amount of royalty payable to Her said Majesty on the same, and a further net

payment of One pound for every ton so shipped. The said parties of the second part shall not be obliged to allow any such ship to load guano unless the master thereof shall satisfy Captain Ord, one of the licensees, or the agent of the said parties, that he has in his possession cash or approved credit on some known bank within the possessions of Her Majesty of sufficient value to pay all sums which may become due to the said parties of the second part in respect of the said guano, nor unless he shall deposit with the said licensee or agent the ship's register, to be retained until either all the last mentioned sums are duly paid in such cash, or through such credit as aforesaid, or bills of lading as drawn by the said licensee or agent, shall have been executed by the master of the ship. The parties of the second part shall not allow any ship to load guano unless the master thereof shall have first executed a bond in the following form, to be witnessed by the said licensee or agent:—
"Know all men by these presents, that I, _____, master of the ship _____, am held and firmly bound unto the President of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade for the time being in the sum of One thousand pounds of good and lawful money of Great Britain, to be paid to the said President and his successors in office; to which payment, well and truly to be made, I bind myself, my heirs, executors, and administrators firmly by these presents. Sealed with my seal. Dated this _____ day of _____, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-_____."

Now the condition of this obligation is such, that if the above mentioned ship _____ shall proceed direct to the port of _____ (or to one of the following ports, viz.: _____), being in Her Majesty's dominions, and shall there land the whole of the guano now on board, or hereafter to be taken on board, from the Kooria Moorla Islands; or if the said ship shall be prevented from so doing by any inevitable accident, then this obligation is to be void, but otherwise is to remain in full force and virtue. Signed, sealed, and delivered by the above bounden _____ in the presence of us (insert names and occupation of witnesses).

5. The parties of the second part shall forward every such bond by the next opportunity after the execution thereof to such person in office in England as the Secretary of State for the Colonies shall designate to the said licensees.

6. The parties of the second part shall transmit by the master of every such vessel as aforesaid to the Secretary of State for the Colonies and to the custom house officer at the port of unloading, a statement of the quantity of guano shipped in such vessel, signed by the said master and by the principal agent or other person acting in Kooria Moorla Islands on behalf of the said parties of the second part: And this indenture further witnesseth that in case any of the above covenants shall be broken or left unfulfilled, it shall be lawful for Her said Majesty, by notice under the hand of one of Her Majesty's principal Secretaries of State to be forwarded by post to any of the said parties of the second part at his last known place of business in England, and to be published in the *London Gazette* within one week of the date thereof, to declare that on a day to be named in such notice, not being less than three calendar months after the date thereof, the license and authority hereby granted to the said parties of the second part to raise and remove guano as aforesaid shall cease and determine; and it is hereby further agreed that on the determination of such license, either by efflux of time or on such breach of condition as aforesaid, all sheds, huts, stores, jetties, and other works and buildings made by the said parties of the second part, or any of the said islands and all guano being thereon, and also all guano shipped therefrom after such determination as aforesaid, shall be and become the property of Her Majesty; and it is hereby further agreed that all expenses incurred or to be incurred in the preparation and execution of this indenture, or in carrying out the provisions thereof, shall be borne by the said parties of the second part, and that the opinion of the Solicitor of Her Majesty's Treasury as to the amount of such expenses shall in all respects be final. In witness whereof we, Thomas William Clinton Murdoch, and Frederick Rogers, Her Majesty's Emigration Commissioners, have hereunto set our hands and seals, for and on behalf of Her Majesty; and the said John Ord, Joseph Hindson, and James Henshall Hayes have respectively hereto set our hands and seals the day and year first above written.

PETITION FOR ANNEXATION.

IT is hereby notified that a petition, signed by thirty-two landowners and householders in the parish of Conewarre, in public meeting assembled, has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, praying that the bounds of the Conewarre road district may be altered "so as to take in the half of the Mount Duneed road running north and south;" and also praying that no other portion of their road district be joined to the Barrabool Hills Road District, such proposed union being contrary to the wishes of the ratepayers of the petitioners' district.

CONEWARRE ROAD DISTRICT.

PETITION FOR SEVERANCE.

IT is hereby notified that a petition, signed by thirteen proprietors, landholders and residents upon the eastern side of the Geelong and Mount Duneed road, within an area marked on a tracing which accompanied the petition, has been presented to the Governor, and that the substance and prayer of such petition are as follow:—

The petitioners state that they are much interested in the Mount Duneed road (which lies immediately within the western boundary of the Conewarre Road District), and that it is much used by wood carriers coming from Geelong, and also by residents in the adjoining parish of Duneed (which forms part of the Barrabool Road District).

That the Mount Duneed road for two years and upwards has been in a condition perilous to human life and to the safety of the cattle and vehicles passing over it.

That the Conewarre Road Board have, during the two years that this road has been in its charge, expended only £250 thereon for the purpose of making good two small portions.

That the petitioners have paid the highest rate of assessment allowed by law, and have failed to obtain any relief from the Conewarre Board in answer to their application, on the ground, as alleged, of insufficient funds.

The petitioners despair of relief from the Conewarre Road Board owing to the poverty of the district. They conceive that their interests and those of the residents on the eastern side of Duneed are identical in the road which passes between them, and believe that were their locality and road included within the Barrabool Road District, the assessment levied in the neighborhood of the road would be expended thereon; that their interests generally would receive better attention, and that they themselves would be relieved from the risks and loss at present occasioned by the very bad condition of the road.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—"Your petitioners therefore respectfully pray that your Excellency in Council will be pleased, after enquiry into the complaints set forth, to proclaim the addition of their lands as shown upon the marginal map [annexed to the petition] to the Barrabool Road District."

At stations where oats and bran cannot readily be procured, the tenders may be for hay or straw only. When all the supplies are included in one tender, it will, if advisable, be accepted for hay or straw, and not for the other articles.
