PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS it is expedient that a common and public highway should be created in the direction hereinafter described: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and order that the street or road hereinafter described, called and known as Albion street west, situate within the municipal district of Brunswick, shall at all times hereafter be a common and public highway or road for all the liege subjects of Her Majesty to go, return, pass and repass, on foot and on horseback, and with horses, carts and carriages, every year, at all times of the year, at their free will and pleasure, that is to say:—

Commencing at a point on the Sydney road, bearing north nine chains and seventy-five links, more or less, from the south-east angle of section cxxv., in the parish of Jika-jika; and thence by a line bearing west to the Moonce Ponds, the said line being the southern boundary of the street, which is of the following width, that is to say—width of carriage-way, twenty-nine feet and one inch nearly; the footways on each side, five feet and five inches; and the total width, thirty-nine feet and eleven inches nearly.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this eighth day of November, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, and in the twenty-second year of Her Majesty's Reign.

BEECHWORTH MINING DISTRICT.

BYE-LAWS Nos. 74-83.—[2nd November, 1858.]

AT a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Beechworth, begun and holden at Beechworth, in the said district, on the 2nd day of November, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

74. *Extent of ordinary claim at the Indigo, where the sinking exceeds fifty feet.*—The extent of an ordinary claim on the Indigo for one man, where the sinking exceeds fifty feet, shall be five yards in length by one hundred yards across any lead, flat, or gully, as the case may be; and no further extent in one block than twenty yards by one hundred yards shall be held by any party of men.

75. *Extent of ordinary claim at the Indigo, where the sinking exceeds twenty feet and not fifty feet.*—The extent of an ordinary claim on the Indigo for one man, where the sinking exceeds twenty feet and not fifty feet, shall be four yards in length by one hundred yards across any lead, flat, or gully, as the case may be; and no further extent in one block than sixteen yards by one hundred shall be held by any party of men.

76. *Extra area of claim allowed for prospecting half a mile from nearest shaft on the lead.*—Parties prospecting half a mile or more distant from the nearest shaft bottomed on an established lead, may be allowed an extent of two claims upon such lead, and such claims shall be under the head of frontage claims: Provided the lead be struck by such prospecting party, and the discovery made public before any other shaft shall have been bottomed on the lead within a quarter of a mile of such prospecting shaft.

77. *Regulating the occupation of business and residence sites.*—When business or residence sites front to any road or thoroughfare, they shall have four perches frontage thereto, leaving sixty

(60) feet for such road or thoroughfare, and spaces of ten feet between each site; and any site abandoned for the space of forty-eight hours shall be deemed forfeited.

78. *Repealing Bye-laws 12, 14, 33, 34, and 50.*—That Bye-laws Nos. 12, 14, 33, 34, and 50 of the Beechworth Mining Board, be and the same are hereby annulled and repealed, and the following substituted in lieu thereof:—

79. *Amalgamation of claims.*—In all claims other than ordinary claims, the holders of adjoining claims of the same class may, to the extent of two claims, unite for the economical working of the same: Provided the full number of men for two separate claims be kept constantly employed within the limits of the amalgamated claims.

80. *Time allowed for procuring machinery.*—Any person requiring the aid of steam or horse power on his claim, shall, where steam power is required, be allowed two months, and where horse power is required one month, for procuring the same: Provided that a notice, setting forth the name of the claimholder, the date of registration and miner's right under which the claim is held, be prominently posted upon such claim.

81. *Water for wheels.*—Miners may use water from creeks for the purpose of wheels, but subject nevertheless to the rights of persons requiring the water for washing purposes, either in or away from the creek; except in the Yackandandah and Buckland divisions, where the holders of rights of water using the same away from the creek are required to allow sufficient water for the purpose of water-wheels to pass down the natural channel, the person holding the junior right to be first called upon, and so on in the ascending scale. All persons using water for such purpose to have the same registered at the office of the warden; a certificate of registration to be given in the form at foot hereof:—

71. *Cross drives for ventilation to be made in tunnelling ground under Rule No. 32.*—In tunnelling under hills, when one or more openings or cross drives is or are required from one parallel tunnel to another for ventilation, it shall be lawful for the warden, with the assistance, when required by either party, of four assessors, to give the necessary order, decision, and direction for making such drives or openings; and also for the allocation of the work and distribution and division of all or any auriferous deposits that shall be contained therein or taken therefrom.

BYE-LAWS Nos. 39 AND 70.—[1st November, 1858.]

At a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Castlemaine, begun and holden at the Board Room, Castlemaine, in the said district, on the 1st day of November, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

39. *Claims when deemed relinquished.*—That Rule 39 be repealed, and the following rule substituted in its place:—If any party or parties in possession of quartz or alluvial claims shall leave the same unworked for more than three consecutive days, such claim or claims shall be considered abandoned; nevertheless, it shall be lawful for any miner, or company of miners, to leave his or their claim whilst engaged in the extraction of gold from any substance whatever, or in the erection of machinery, or procuring timber for the necessary working of such claim; provided always there be not any water in such claim or claims likely to be injurious to the claims adjoining thereto. And, moreover, no miner or party of miners, or any person or persons whomsoever, shall in anywise hold or keep forcible possession of any disputed claim; and in all cases whatsoever where the right or title to any claim shall be in dispute the last possessor, occupier, or claimant thereof shall make appeal to the warden of his division or district, with or without assessors. And, further, the warden is hereby empowered to grant protection to the owners of claims without notice thereof for and during a period not exceeding fourteen days, for the transaction by the applicant or applicants of urgent business, and also for and during the periods of public holidays or rejoicings.

70. *To encourage prospecting of auriferous quartz reefs or veins.*—1st. Any miner, or party of miners not exceeding four in number, sinking for or in and upon any new or abandoned quartz reef, shall be allowed to mark off and hold a claim double the extent authorised by Rule No. 2; any party also sinking on any reef at a distance of not less than three hundred yards from the nearest working shaft on the same line of reef, shall be entitled to mark off and hold a prospecting claim as above.

2nd. Any miner, or party of miners not exceeding four in number, discovering any deposit or lead of gold at the distance of not less than two hundred yards from any other alluvial shaft being worked, shall be entitled to mark off and hold a claim three times the extent allowed by Rules 20 and 21.

Printed forms of tender may be obtained from the Government Storekeeper, Melbourne, or the officer in charge of the police, at each station, by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

The tenders for each station must be separate, and will be accepted or rejected separately.

At stations where oats and bran cannot readily be procured, the tenders may be for hay or straw only. When all the supplies are included in one tender, it will, if advisable, be accepted for hay or straw, and not for the other articles.

Contractors will be allowed to deliver a quarter's supply on the 1st January; a six months' supply on the 1st April, for a winter's stock; and the remainder on the 1st October, subject to the provisions contained in clause 2, "Conditions of Contract."

The price must be per ton, for hay and straw, and per bushel for oats and bran, including delivery at the stations and all charges.

The net weight only, after deducting the tare, is to be charged.

No tender will be entertained unless accompanied by a certificate from two responsible persons that they are willing to become bound as sureties for the due fulfilment of the contract in one-third the estimated cost of the entire supply at

the station tendered for; and in the event of the tender being accepted, the bond must be executed within twenty days, failing which, the contract will be again advertised or another tender accepted.

The names and addresses of the tenderers and of their proposed sureties, must be stated at full length.

All tenders must be enclosed in a separate envelope, marked "Tender for —," as the case may be, and deposited in the tender box at the Government Stores, King street, or if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Government Storekeeper, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known on the 10th December, 1858.

CONDITIONS.

1. The hay to be eaten, good, sound and sweet; the straw to be wheaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats and bran also to be sound and sweet, and of the best description.

2. The supplies to be delivered on the requisition of the officer in charge of the district or station, the quantities stated in the schedule being, however, only approximative; and it must be understood that the Government will draw either more or less than stated. The excess over the estimate will however in no case exceed 50 per cent.

3. The contracts entered into under this notice, are not to be considered as being infringed or vitiated by any contracts made by the Military Commissariat.

4. The forage when delivered must be accompanied by an invoice of quantity, showing the gross weight, the tare, and the net weight (this should be on the back of the requisition or order), which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account monthly, in the prescribed form, and on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded through the Government Storekeeper, for payment at the Treasury Pay Office, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours, from a reasonable time, to be fixed by the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be competent for the department, should circumstances require it, to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage, as to quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of a department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.

8. If the board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which, it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when from some other cause injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage and supply good in its stead, failing which, it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of delay in delivering or replacing it, when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Government Storekeeper, to such mulct, not exceeding one-fourth the monthly account, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. It will be competent for the Government Storekeeper on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving in writing a notice of three full calendar months to the opposite party to that effect, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given by either party before the 30th April, 1859.

CONVEYANCE OF MAILS, 1859.

Persons tendering are requested to state whether they propose to convey the mails on horseback or in a carriage; in the latter case they are to state the description of vehicle they intend to use, and the number of horses by which it is to be drawn.

In the performance of the services numbered 13, 25, and 45, contractors will be required to provide free conveyance, by every journey, for a mail guard—an officer of the Post Office—who will have special custody of the mails in course of transit.

BEECHWORTH MUNICIPALITY.

FOURTH HALF-YEARLY REPORT OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF BEECHWORTH, TO THE 9TH OCTOBER, 1858, INCLUSIVE.

THE municipal council, at the termination of this, the second year of their institution, have to present to the ratepayers a fourth report, embodying their proceedings for the previous six months, which they are glad to believe will be found to compare favorably with those of former half-years.

ELECTIONS.

On the 29th September, Councillors G. B. Kerferd, F. Brown, and Eli Abbott, having retired from the council by rotation, the first named councillor was re-elected, and Messrs John Sitch Clark (by 164 votes) and Louis Chevalier (by 169 votes) were elected members in the room of the other two. And on the 1st October instant, the council unanimously elected Councillor G. B. Kerferd as their chairman for the current year (in the room of Councillor F. Brown, retired); and on the same day appointed him as their honorary treasurer of the same period.

MEETINGS.

During this half-year there have been thirty meetings of the council, nineteen of the public works committee, and fifteen of the finance committee, making a total of sixty-four meetings, the attendance at which has been as follows, viz:—

The hours of meeting are as hitherto, namely:—

The council, on Fridays, at Four p.m. weekly.

Public works committee, Wednesday, at Four p.m. weekly.

Finance committee, Fridays, at Three p.m. fortnightly.

SPECIAL COMMITTEES.

A market committee was appointed, upon whose advice By-law No. 26 hereafter specified was passed by the council.

The council also appointed a public (or botanical) garden committee, for devising measures for rendering available to the inhabitants of Beechworth the garden reserve of about 18 acres granted by the Government, and extending from Kara street to the suburban allotments, and embracing the large rock to the north-east of the town beyond the camp; and upon their recommendation the council have entered into a contract for the fencing thereof, including the erection of a proper gate and turnstiles. And whilst on this subject the council desire to record their thanks for the efficient aid rendered them by the Central Board of Health at Melbourne, in obtaining the grant of this site, which, from its elevated and open position, they have every reason to hope will prove, as a place of public resort, no inconsiderable an auxiliary to their efforts to promote the general health of the township; in furtherance of which aim the council have likewise appointed a health committee, to carry out the beneficial provisions of the Health of Towns Act, which, at the council's instance, the Governor has, by Proclamation, extended

to Beechworth. And they are happy to say the working thereof under the committee's supervision, aided by the hearty co-operation of Mr. Superintendent R. O'Hara Burke, in granting them an extension of the services of their inspector of nuisances (Sergeant Lawrence Whelan), and in otherwise enforcing their bye-laws, has been found to answer admirably; and their endeavors in this direction have met with general acquiescence and assistance from the inhabitants of the township. And in this place the council would mention favorably the assiduity and discretion with which their inspector of nuisances has fulfilled the duties of his responsible and by no means agreeable office.

BYE-LAWS.

The following bye-laws have been passed by the council since their last report, and having also been duly gazetted as sanctioned by His Excellency the Governor, are now in force, viz:—

No. 17. For appropriating the second moiety of £3750 of the Government grant to this municipality for the municipal year 1856-7.

Gazetted 18th June, 1858.

No. 21. For compelling and regulating the formation across footpaths of proper paved, pitched, or planked cartways to private yards and premises, and for otherwise protecting the public footpaths and water-channels.

Gazetted 6th July, 1858.

No. 22. For licensing and regulating carters and others plying for hire within the municipal district.

Gazetted 9th July, 1858.

No. 23. For empowering the municipal council to close up any street, road, right-of-way, or footpath, during the progress of any work affecting the same.

Gazetted 6th August, 1858.

No. 24. For appropriating £3706, the first portion of the legislative grant for this municipality for the current municipal year (1857-8).

Gazetted 24th September, 1858.

No. 25. For regulating the elections of members of the municipal council.

Gazetted 17th September, 1858.

No. 26. For regulating the public market of the municipality, and for determining and levying rates, tolls, rents, and dues in respect thereof, and of the commodities exposed for sale therein.

Gazetted 21st September, 1858.

And to the end that not only these and their other bye-laws, but also the provisions of various Acts now in force in this district, may be thoroughly known to the inhabitants of the same, the council have compiled and extensively distributed in a large placard a summary thereof; and a full copy of the whole can be seen by any ratepayer, free of charge, at the town clerk's office.

WATER SUPPLY.

The measures for obtaining a present temporary supply of water—more especially with a view to the prevention of fire in the municipality—are on the eve of completion; the large tank having been erected as originally intended in the position mentioned in the council's last report. But the council are sorry to have to state, that, notwithstanding that the selection of that site was notified (in a most definite manner) in such their report, and was consequently advertised in the local as well as the Melbourne and Government journals, and was otherwise before the public, not only since the publication and dissemination of that report, but for a period of ten months past, certain ratepayers residing in its vicinity have, since the contracts for the work were entered into, and the council consequently pledged to the necessary outlay for its completion, commenced a suit at equity to endeavor to compel the council to remove the tank, by which proceedings not only will a considerable expense fall upon the ratepayers, but should the parties to the suit prove successful in their present endeavors, the benefit of so advantageous a site as the present will be lost to the town, there not being another so eligible in every respect.

The council having been unanimous throughout their proceedings with respect to the same, and no objection having been raised to their intentions during the whole of the above ten months they have been so prominently before the public, have taken counsel's opinion upon the matter, which having been favorable to the council's position not only in equity but also at law, they have unanimously decided to resist the suit, but at the same time they are willing to remove the said tank (whatever may be the issue of the suit) whenever it can be proved to be actually a nuisance to the public.

PUBLIC WORKS.

In their expenditure under this head the council have endeavored to give every portion of the municipality a share in the benefits accruing therefrom; and although some little discomfort has been felt from the council not having been able altogether to complete some works commenced under this plan, yet they have, by pursuing it, avoided incurring a charge of partiality towards any particular quarter of the district.

They have completed the primary clearance of such further portions of the streets whereon the lands abutting have been sold by the Government, and they are glad to observe that their desire thereby to promote the extension of the township has been fully realized.

The council's particular attention has also been directed to the formation of footpaths, not only as a means for obtaining, at a comparatively small outlay, a more than commensurate degree of comfort to the great majority of the residents in the town, but as a measure for facilitating the surface drainage of the streets,

and consequently effecting an economy in the item of repairs to the roadways thereof; and the council can congratulate the town upon the plan having proved eminently successful.

These works and others of less importance have been carried out by "day labor," under the supervision of the town surveyor, and are included under that head in the appended financial statement.

Portions of some of the streets the council (as an experiment) have had metalled with shingle (or large gravel) from the creek, as the expense is considerably less than metalling with the usual broken stone—and so far as they can see at present, the plan appears likely to work well; should their hopes in this respect be realized, the council will be able to effect an immense saving to the district in their future road works.

A portion of the west channel course in Ford street they have had pitched and kerbed; but whilst primary works were so much needed in other parts of the township, the council did not feel justified in incurring a larger expenditure on expensive finishing works of this nature.

The erection of the new municipal chambers referred to in their last report as commenced, the council are sorry to state is not yet complete, the contractor, after greatly neglecting the work, having at length gone into the Insolvent Court, and thereby caused a temporary suspension of the works, which however are now resumed under the directions of the official assignee, and the council hope to receive possession of the same complete in the course of a fortnight.

Owing to the council having discovered that although the contractor in this case received from them 75 per cent. on the value of each fortnight's work performed, the men and sub-contractors employed by him received little or nothing, whereby they consider a great injustice was committed; they, the council, have taken under their consideration the desirableness of framing some regulations to prevent the continuation of the evil.

The formation of High street from the Bridge to Short street, promised by the Government for the last two years, is at last commenced; together with the formation of the Main Sydney road through Bridge street, Newtown. And tenders are also called for the clearing portions of the Main Sydney road beyond the entrances to the town on either side. But with regard to the Government provision for public works in the Ovens district for 1859, the council are sorry to have to remark that the district is likely to suffer from the same injustice as in former years, a very much smaller share of the public funds being appropriated to a district acknowledged by the Government, in the memorandum appended to their estimates, to be actually in need of works indispensable for the ordinary business traffic, than is shown as intended for other localities not only already possessing the boon of thoroughly good roads, but on which a large expenditure on public works generally has been laid out in former years. This council have strongly remonstrated against this unjust mode of procedure, but without avail; the Government denying the right of the council to seek information relative to the expenditure of the public moneys in their district, thus impugning the consistency of their own assertion, that municipal councils were "the only true exponents of the wants of their respective localities."

The council, however, have a strong hope that through the able advocacy and kind assistance of J. D. Wood, Esq., the member for this district, and who has always shown a desire to advance its interests to the best of his ability, they may yet obtain an amelioration of the prospects which otherwise appear to await this gold field and its neighborhood.

APPLICATIONS TO GOVERNMENT.

The council have been unremitting in their endeavors to obtain from Government the formation of the roads leading from Beechworth to the surrounding townships and places with which there is a regular postal communication; and although not wholly successful, they have received an assurance from the Inspector General of Roads that some partial improvement in the same shall be made.

The application for the Suburban Water Reserve, referred to in the last report, has been granted, but the council have not as yet had funds or opportunity to bring the springs thereon into requisition.

An application from the council, that offices for the sheriff might, for the public convenience, be erected in connection with the New Court House, has been granted.

And in accordance with the council's request, provision has been likewise made by the Government in their estimates for the ensuing year, for the erection of a Powder Magazine, and also of a Court of Petty Sessions in this township distinct from the existing Supreme Court House, by which arrangement the council believe that much of the inconvenience hitherto experienced from the necessary transaction of the business of all the courts in one building will be for the future avoided.

The re-metalling of Ford street proper, the necessity of which has been continually urged upon the Government by this council, is not yet even granted, so little consideration do even the most pressing wants of the district receive at the hands of that department of the present Government which has been loudest in its promises.

FINANCE.

By an examination of the items of the appended balance sheet of the council's receipt and expenditure for the half-year, it will be seen that of their total expenditure of £6129 12s. 6d., £5400 has been laid out upon public works alone, including an outlay of

about £2226 in increasing the efficiency of their precautions against fire.

And as the remainder of the account (about £729) shows the council to have been as economical in their other necessary disbursements as a due regard to the efficient conduct of their officers would permit (the item for printing and advertising alone being £60 below that of last half-year, and most of the other items showing a similar retrenchment), they believe that their constituents will see no reason to view their proceedings for the past six months with a less favorable eye than they did those detailed in former half yearly reports, which the council are glad to know gave satisfaction on all sides.

THE FIRST HALF-YEARLY REPORT OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF NEWTOWN AND CHILWELL, ENDING 13TH OCTOBER, 1858.

THE municipality of Newtown and Chilwell was proclaimed on the 2nd day of March, 1858.

At the first election of municipal councillors, held on the 8th April, 1858, James Stevens Paul, William Fordham, Charles Nantes, Neville Butler Headland, Duncan Scott, William Siddall, and Sanders Trotman, were duly elected.

At the first meeting of the council, Charles Nantes, Esq., was elected chairman for the current year.

Mr. Sanders Trotman resigned on the 12th October, 1858.

The council have held during the last six months twenty-seven general meetings, at which

A special meeting was also held for the revision of the rate-payers' roll, which was attended by the whole council.

The finance committee, consisting of Councillors Scott, Fordham, and Headland, held fourteen meetings.

The public works committee, consisting of Councillors Paul, Fordham, and Headland, held nineteen meetings.

The total valuation of assessable property amounted to £43,902, upon which a rate of one shilling and sixpence in the pound was struck.

The following officers were appointed:—

Mr. Daniel Sherrin, town clerk, at a salary of £200 per annum.

Mr. Edward Prowse, surveyor, at a salary of £200 per annum.

Mr. William Whitfield, rate collector, inspector and messenger, at a salary of £150 per annum.

The following applications have been made to the Government:—

For the establishment of two receiving houses for letters.—Granted.

That a sum of £4000, supposed to be reserved on the Estimates for making the approaches to Geelong, may be expended on the Great Western Road.—The works are being proceeded with, and are nearly completed.

For supplementary aid.—£1000 granted.

For additional police protection.—Granted.

For a police station to be erected.—A small cottage has been rented, but is only a temporary arrangement pending the erection of a proper building.

For plan of municipal district.—Granted.

For extension of postal delivery.—In abeyance.

For a Court of Petty Sessions.—Will be considered before the commencement of next year.

For a larger plan of municipal district.—Granted.

For land for a quarry. 1 acre 2 roods 15 perches.—Granted.

For staging used in construction of new bridge when the same is completed, for the purpose of building a pile bridge within the district.—Refused.

The following bye-laws have been gazetted:—

Bye-law No. 1. To regulate by means of standing orders the proceedings of the council.

Bye-law No. 2. For levying a rate of one shilling and six pence in the pound.

Bye-law No. 5. For the prevention of nuisances arising from allowing offensive matters to remain exposed.

Bye-law No. 6. To prevent nuisances arising from suffering horses and other animals to be at large.

Two deputations attended the South Barwon municipal council, respecting the disposal of the pontoon bridge, when the bridge in course of construction across the River Barwon has been completed.

A deputation attended at the Town Hall, Geelong, respecting the collection of the rates due previous to the proclamation of the municipal district.

The chairman attended as delegate to the municipal conference.

Public works projected—Forming, metalling, pitching, and channelling portions of La Trobe terrace; a tender for performance of the same, amounting to the sum of £1337 16s. 6d., from Mr. Owen, was accepted.

The repairing, simultaneously with the Geelong Corporation, Aberdeen street, from La Trobe terrace to West Melbourne road.
