MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF CRESWICK.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that any district of the colony of Victoria, the area whereof should not exceed nine square miles, and which should contain a population of householders not less than three hundred, might, subject to the provisions of the said Act, be constituted a municipal district as thereafter mentioned, provided that no one point in any such area should be distant more than six miles from any other point; and it was further enacted that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, on the receipt of a petition signed by not less than one hundred and fifty householders resident within any such district, praying that such district might be declared a municipal district under the said Act, to cause the substance and prayer of such petition to be published in the *Government Gazette*, and

(if no counter petition, signed by an equal or greater number of householders resident within such locality, should have been delivered at the office of the Colonial Secretary within one month from the date of such publication) the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice aforesaid, might, if he should think fit, declare by Proclamation such locality a municipal district by a name to be mentioned in such Proclamation, and also by the same or any other Proclamation might define the limits and boundaries of such municipal district, and such limits and boundaries at any time thereafter in the same manner, on receipt of a similar petition, might vary and alter, but so as in no case save as thereafter mentioned to include within the limits or boundaries of such municipal district an area of more than nine square miles; and upon the publication of any such Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, such locality so defined should be deemed and taken to be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas a petition has been presented to His Excellency the Governor by certain householders and landowners in and near the town of Creswick, in the county of Talbot, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published as directed by the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do, by this my Proclamation, with the advice of the Executive Council, declare that the district hereinafter named and defined shall be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act, that is to say:—

The MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF CRESWICK—Commencing at a point twenty-five chains north from the south-east angle of portion seventy-five, in the parish of Ascot; thence by a line bearing north two miles and ten chains; thence by a line bearing east three miles and forty chains; thence by a line bearing south two miles and ten chains; and thence by a line bearing west three miles and forty chains to the commencing point.

And I do hereby, with the advice aforesaid, direct that the council of the said municipal district shall be called by the name and style of "The Municipal Council of Creswick."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this fifteenth day of November, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, and in the twenty-second year of Her Majesty's Reign.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!

BYE-LAWS OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF SEWERS AND WATER SUPPLY.

WHEREAS by an Act of Council passed in the sixteenth year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, No. 39, intitled, *An Act to establish a board of commissioners, for the better sewerage and drainage of the city of Melbourne, and for supplying water thereto, and to the suburbs thereof*, the said commissioners are authorised (section 13) from time to time to make, alter, and repeal bye-laws for the following amongst other purposes, viz., for regulating the amount of assessment and collection of rates, charges and contributions, the forms of rates, and the mode and period of and for appeal from rates and charges for default, and to impose such penalties as they may think fit, not exceeding Twenty pounds for each breach thereof: Provided that no bye-law shall be of any force or effect until the same be submitted to and approved of by His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, and published in three consecutive numbers of the *Government Gazette*.

And whereas by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the twenty-first year of the Reign of Her said Majesty Queen Victoria, No. 59, intituled, *An Act to amend An Act intituled An Act to establish a board of commissioners, for the better sewerage and drainage of the city of Melbourne, and for supplying water thereto, and to the suburbs thereof.*

The said commissioners are authorized under section 13, in addition to the purposes directed by and under the provisions of the said *Melbourne Sewerage and Water Act, &c.*, to make, alter, and repeat bye-laws for regulating the mode, form, strength, material, construction and arrangement of pipes and other works, supplying water from the pipes of the board to adjacent premises, and regulating the time of doing the same, and the notices to be given, the superintending thereof, the making good ground which may be displaced thereby, and for inspecting all services whether within or without any buildings, at all reasonable times, and to regulate the construction, disposition, custody, and inspection of meters, and for classifying the several tenements to be supplied with water, and determining the rate to be paid by each class, either according to the annual value, or the number of rooms in such tenements or otherwise, and for making and levying such rate, and for regulating the passage of carriages and traffic upon and over the tramway, and for preventing and removing nuisances and obstructions thereon, and for preventing the waste or misuse of water supplied by the board, and for causing persons using the same to keep their pipes and other apparatus in proper repair, and for preventing any tampering with or altering such pipes without notice to the board, and for repairing such pipes and apparatus so as to prevent the waste of water and recovering the cost of such repairs, and for preventing any person from allowing any other person not having agreed to be supplied by the board to use the water, and for preventing such person from using the same, and for preventing any person from wilfully or carelessly breaking, injuring or opening any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work or engine belonging to the board, and from doing any other wilful act whereby such water may be wasted, and for imposing penalties for breaches of such bye-laws: Provided the surveyor or other person appointed for that purpose by the board may, between the hours of Nine o'clock in the forenoon and Four o'clock in the afternoon, enter into any house or premises supplied with water by the board, in order to examine if there be any waste or misuse of such water, and if such surveyor or other person at any such time be refused admittance into such dwelling-house or premises for the purpose aforesaid, or be prevented from making such examination as aforesaid, the board may turn off the water supplied by them from such house or other premises; and provided no penalty shall be imposed for the breach of any such bye-law, greater than the penalty specified in the said Act.

Now in execution of the said powers the said commissioners do make the bye-laws following:—

1. A valuation shall be made from time to time if the commissioners think fit, of the annual value of all houses and tenements opposite or convenient to which pipes for the conveyance of water shall have been laid by the said commissioners.

2. Notice of the amount of such valuation shall be given to the person liable to pay water rate for the same.

3. Such persons may appeal to the commissioners against such valuation, on giving notice, in writing, of such appeal to the secretary of the commissioners within fourteen days of the service of such notice.

4. The commissioners may either confirm the valuation or make a new one, and in the event of the parties not acquiescing in the award of the commissioners, they may appeal to two justices of the peace, by whom the same shall be determined.

5. All persons applying for and receiving water from the said commissioners shall pay for the same, until further notice be given by the said commissioners of any alteration in their rates, at the following rates, viz:—

1. On houses of £50 annual value and under, a rate of Five pounds per centum on the valuation.

2. On houses above £50 and under £300 annual value, a rate of Four pounds ten shillings per centum on the valuation.

3. On houses of £300 annual value and upwards, a rate of Four pounds per centum on the valuation.

4. Houses, stores, manufactories, or premises in which the quantity of water consumed, or likely so to be, would be greater or less than the average consumption of private houses of equal value, shall be subject to such special rate on the annual value as the said commissioners may think fit to impose, and as may be agreed to by the owners, in addition to or in deduction from the abovenamed rating at their annual value.

6. All such rates shall be paid in advance, by equal quarterly payments, at Christmas-day, Lady-day, Midsummer-day, and Michaelmas-day in every year; but the first payment for any portion of a quarter shall be made at the time when the pipe by which water is supplied is made to communicate with the pipes of the commissioners, or at the time when the agreement to take water from the commissioners is made.

7. Any person receiving water from the commissioners who shall supply any other house or premises with water than that for which he is himself liable, or who shall allow any person not subject to water rate to be supplied, or who shall allow

water to be taken from his premises to be consumed elsewhere, shall be liable to a rate in respect of the premises so supplied, or to a penalty of Five pounds for each case in which water shall be so supplied by him, as to the said commissioners may seem most fit.

8. If any person shall neglect to pay such rate as may be chargeable against him, the commissioners may stop the water from flowing into his premises by cutting off the pipe to such premises, or by such means as the commissioners may think fit; and any person from whose premises such supply shall have been cut off by reason of neglect to pay such rate as may be chargeable against him, shall be liable to a penalty of Five pounds.

9. Any person who shall open any ground so as to uncover a pipe of the commissioners, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with any such pipe, without giving to the commissioners fourteen days' notice of his intention so to do, or who shall make any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the commissioners without giving to them two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipe of the commissioners, or who shall make such communication without the superintendence, or contrary to the directions of the officer appointed by the commissioners, unless he shall fail to attend at the time mentioned in such notice, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipes of the commissioners of a strength and material not approved of by the commissioners, shall forfeit for each offence a sum not exceeding Twenty pounds.

10. In all cases where a stand pipe is erected for the supply of the houses and tenements in any right-of-way, lane, or other place, any person not occupying a house in any such right-of-way, lane, or other place who shall take water from such stand pipe shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Four pounds, unless he or she shall have received a written permission from the commissioners to take water from any such stand pipe.

11. Any person supplied with water who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

12. All persons requiring to remove or alter the position of any meter, shall give six days' notice, in writing, to that effect to the secretary of the commissioners, in order that the registration of the quantity of water used may be taken; and any person who shall remove or alter the position of any such meter without giving such notice as aforesaid, shall forfeit to the commissioners a sum not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence, over and above the damage which he may be found liable to pay in any action at law at the suit of the commissioners.

13. All owners and occupiers shall, at their own expense, keep and maintain their meters in good working condition, to the satisfaction of such officer as may be appointed by the board; and in the event of any repair being required, notice, in writing shall be immediately given to the secretary of the board, and a registration taken before such repair shall be effected.

14. And any person who shall neglect to comply with these conditions shall, for every offence, be liable to a penalty of not less than Twenty pounds.

ARARAT MINING DISTRICT.

No. XIII.—BYE-LAW REGULATING WATER RIGHTS AND PRIVILEGES FOR SLUICING PURPOSES.—[9th November, 1858.]

At a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Ararat, begun and holden at the Shamrock Hotel, Barkly street, Ararat, in the said district, on the 9th day of November, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

1. *Extent of hill and surfacing claims for sluicing purposes.*—The extent of hill and surfacing claims in worked or partially worked ground, or in unworked ground where opened and prospected by a sluicing party, shall be, irrespective of its depth—
Forty (40) yards frontage.
One hundred and sixty (160) yards in depth.

Three (3) men, at least, to be employed at each claim.

2. *Extent of claims in gullies.*—The extent of claim in gullies in worked or partially worked ground, or in unworked ground where opened and prospected by a sluicing party, shall be—
Thirty (30) yards wide.
Two hundred and sixty (260) in length.

Three (3) men, at least, to be employed at each claim.

3. *Size of extended claims.*—Claimholders having to cut an extensive tail-race, or using expensive machinery, may be granted an extended claim by the warden, such claim not to exceed in extent four (4) ordinary claims.

4. *Claims to be marked by pegs.*—A conspicuous peg two (2) feet at least above the surface, shall be kept exposed at each corner of the claim.

5. *Registration of claims.*—A written application must be made to the warden for all claims, ordinary and extended, at whose office a registration of such claims shall be kept, a copy of which, with the claimholders' names inserted, and signed by the warden, shall be kept at all times posted on a conspicuous part of the claim.

6. *Protection to claims during work.*—Claimholders employed procuring timber or any work necessary in any way for forwarding work connected with a claim, shall be held in lawful occupation of such claim; where employed in cutting or extending a race, they shall have protection for one claim only.

7. *Protection to claims during draught.*—During failure of the requisite supply of water the warden may, upon application, grant protection to claimholders for (2) two months' suspension of work, which may be afterwards extended from time to time, at his discretion, and in accordance with the necessity of the case.

8. *Forfeiture of claim.*—Notwithstanding anything heretofore enacted in bye-law No. 5 regulating mining partnerships, claims unoccupied or abandoned for seventy-two (72) hours shall be held forfeited, except in cases of sickness, attendance at courts of justice, public holidays, or any urgent business, which in cases of dispute must be proven to the satisfaction of the warden; where partially unoccupied, that portion of the claim unrepresented only to be held forfeited. The original holders of the claim shall determine which portion of the claim shall be held forfeited.

9. *Responsible parties.*—The person or persons in whose name a claim is registered shall be held responsible for the fulfilment of all conditions under which such claim is held, and for all and any damage resulting to other parties by the working of such claim.

10. *Granting water rights.*—The warden of the division may grant water rights where not injurious to public interests.

11. *Notice of application for water rights.*—A written application for water rights, confirmation of rights, or for permission to shift the head of a race, shall be left with the warden, and a copy posted and kept exposed for fourteen (14) clear days at his office before such application can be granted. Any person intending to object to such application shall leave a written notice stating reasons for such objections with the warden, and the warden shall keep a copy posted and exposed at his office seven (7) clear days before the time appointed for consideration of such applications.

12. *Gauge.*—Each water right shall entitle the holder or holders thereof to a column of water $\frac{1}{2}$ of an inch by 12 inches—running without intermission—gauged in the following manner, that is to say:—A box six (6) feet in length and twelve (12) inches in width with a scale of $\frac{1}{4}$ inches marked on the inner side at the lower end shall be placed at the head of the race with a fall or inclination of one (1) foot in the entire length of it, and the gauge of water as above specified. $\frac{1}{4}$ inch by 12 inches, shall be taken at the mouth of the box where the water is discharged.

13. *Priority of rights.*—In case of failure of water, the junior right shall give way to the next preceding senior right, and so on in rotation as the supply diminishes, and six (6) clear working days after notice from the warden, such junior rightholder shall turn sufficient water down the creek from the head of his race to make up the deficiency in the gauge of the preceding right, and without further notice shall continue or increase the quantity of water so diverted, as the case may require, to make up the gauge.

14. *Protection to races during drought.*—The race and the right to the water shall not be held forfeited by the proprietors working on other claims when the supply of water is insufficient.

15. *Protection to tail-races.*—No person taking up a claim shall approach, either by sinking or driving, within six (6) feet of any tail-race.

16. *Distance between races.*—Any person cutting a race too close to an existing race, or to the properly surveyed line of an intended race in actual and bona fide course of formation, thereby causing drainage or any other damage to it, shall be responsible to the proprietors for such damage.

17. *Damage to races.*—No person shall cut or damage any race, tail-race, dam or reservoir constructed for sluicing purposes, or obstruct the flow of water in them, or sink or approach within six (6) feet of them without first securing them to the satisfaction of the proprietors.

18. *Keeping races in repair and making bridges.*—Proprietors of races must keep them in good repair, and make efficient bridges where necessary, fourteen (14) feet, at least, in width, in places where the race crosses roads in ordinary use.

19. *Abandoned races.*—Races abandoned for two (2) months during sufficient supply of water, shall be held forfeited, except in case of the sickness of the proprietors.

20. *Heads of races not to be shifted.*—All races shall have a given point specified for the head. Permission to shift the head may be granted by the warden, provided such shift be not above or below the head of an existing right, or to its injury or prejudice.

21. *Construction of dams, &c.*—The warden may grant permission to erect dams or reservoirs for sluicing purposes where not injurious to general mining interests. Any person wishing to work the ground on which a dam or reservoir is situate may remove it, provided he previously, at his own expense, erect one.

of equal size and value, and as available for the supply of water and the convenience of using it as in the one to be removed.

22. *Tail water.*—All right or control over the water shall cease upon its leaving the sluice of any water right holder, except in cases where the length is fifteen (15) miles or upwards along the course of the race from its head, when the right or control shall remain with the rightholder, so long as he conducts the water in a proper channel.

ARARAT MINING DISTRICT.

NO. XIV.—BYE-LAW SUPPLEMENTARY TO THE BYE-LAW RELATING TO BLOCK CLAIMS IN WET SINKINGS, BEING A BYE-LAW FOR INTERMEDIATE WET SINKINGS.—[9th November, 1858].

AT a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Ararat, begun and holden at the Shamrock Hotel, Barkly street, Ararat, in the said district, on the 9th day of November, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

1. In sinkings where water occurs, but where continuous bailing is not necessary, it shall be lawful for miners to form themselves into parties and to occupy ground as follows, that is to say: Into parties of (4) four miners who shall be entitled to (57) fifty-seven feet by (57) fifty-seven feet; and into parties of (6) six miners who shall be entitled to (70) seventy feet by (70) seventy feet; and into parties of (8) eight miners who shall be entitled to (80) eighty feet by (80) eighty feet, and in each case a wall of (5) five feet shall be left between adjoining claims; but the latter sized claim only shall be subject to the bye-law relating to the amalgamation of claims.

2. This bye-law shall in no case be applicable to or interfere with the bye-law relating to frontage leads or block claims in wet sinkings, where a uniform size of (80) eighty feet each claim is necessary, and in the event of any dispute arising as to the class of mining effected or governed by this bye-law the settlement of such dispute shall be left to the warden of the division, and any decision so given as aforesaid on any lead within the mining district of Ararat shall be considered to regulate the whole of such lead, or at least so far as the warden for the time being may determine.

3. All claims held under this bye-law shall be held and worked in the manner provided in the bye-law relating to block claims in wet sinkings, excepting always those portions of the aforesaid bye-law which refer to the number of miners in the party, the quantity of ground occupied by such party, and also those portions which refer to compulsory night work.

AVOCA PETITION.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and sixty-six householders and landholders resident at Avoca, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

By His Excellency's Command,
G. 9393. JOHN O'SHANASSY.

The petitioners state that Avoca is one of the oldest townships on the gold fields; that in addition to its gold field, it is in the centre of a rich agricultural district; that it is well watered and wooded; that it has always been the head-quarters of the district, and that it is on the main road to Adelaide, and sixteen miles distant from any other town of importance.

That in the absence of a recognized or municipal body to watch over its affairs, its interests have suffered seriously, all property being thereby deteriorated in value, and its mineral resources scarcely developed.

That the creation of a municipality would be a certain means of remedying the evils before stated, and rendering Avoca one of the first townships on the gold fields.

The petitioners suggest that the proposed municipal district be as follows, viz.:— from a point at the south-west corner of allotment 137 of country allotments south-west of Avoca; thence north three miles; thence east three miles; thence south three miles; thence west three miles to the point of commencement:— such area not containing more than nine square miles, in which no one point is distant more than six miles from any other point, and there being three hundred house and land holders therein.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your memorialists therefore pray your Excellency may be pleased to cause the above district to be proclaimed a municipality under the provisions of the 18th Victoria No. 15, by the name of the Avoca Municipality."

Printed forms of tender may be obtained from the Government Storekeeper, Melbourne, or the officer in charge of the police, at each station, by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

The tenders for each station must be separate, and will be accepted or rejected separately.

At stations where oats and bran cannot readily be procured, the tenders may be for hay or straw only. When all the supplies are included in one tender, it will, if advisable, be accepted for hay or straw, and not for the other articles.

Contractors will be allowed to deliver a quarter's supply on the 1st January; a six months' supply on the 1st April, for a winter's stock; and the remainder on the 1st October, subject to the provisions contained in clause 2, "Conditions of Contract."

The price must be per ton, for hay and straw, and per bushel for oats and bran, including delivery at the stations and all charges.

The net weight only, after deducting the tare, is to be charged.

No tender will be entertained unless accompanied by a certificate from two responsible persons that they are willing to become bound as sureties for the due fulfilment of the contract in one-third the estimated cost of the entire supply at

the station tendered for; and in the event of the tender being accepted, the bond must be executed within twenty days, failing which, the contract will be again advertised or another tender accepted.

The names and addresses of the tenderers and of their proposed sureties, must be stated at full length.

All tenders must be enclosed in a separate envelope, marked "Tender for —," as the case may be, and deposited in the tender box at the Government Stores, King street, or if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Government Storekeeper, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known on the 10th December, 1858.

CONDITIONS.

1. The hay to be eaten, good, sound and sweet; the straw to be wheaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats and bran also to be sound and sweet, and of the best description.

2. The supplies to be delivered on the requisition of the officer in charge of the district or station, the quantities stated in the schedule being, however, only approximative; and it must be understood that the Government will draw either more or less than stated. The excess over the estimate will however in no case exceed 50 per cent.

3. The contracts entered into under this notice, are not to be considered as being infringing or vitiated by any contracts made by the Military Commissariat.

4. The forage when delivered must be accompanied by an invoice of quantity, showing the gross weight, the tare, and the net weight (this should be on the back of the requisition or order), which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account monthly, in the prescribed form, and on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded through the Government Storekeeper, for payment at the Treasury Pay Office, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours, from a reasonable time, to be fixed by the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be competent for the department, should circumstances require it, to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage, as to quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of a department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.

8. If the board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which, it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when from some other cause injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage and supply good in its stead, failing which, it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of delay in delivering or replacing it, when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Government Storekeeper, to such mulct, not exceeding one-fourth the monthly account, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. It will be competent for the Government Storekeeper on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving in writing a notice of three full calendar months to the opposite party to that effect, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given by either party before the 30th April, 1859.
