"MACDONNELL LIGHT," CAPE NORTHUMBERLAND.  
WITH reference to the notice, dated 15th September, respecting the establishment of the "MacDonnell Light," on Cape Northumberland, the accompanying notice is published for the general information of mariners and others interested therein.

SOUTH AUSTRALIA.—NOTICE TO MARINERS.

"MACDONNELL LIGHTHOUSE," CAPE NORTHUMBERLAND.

*The bearings are magnetic. Variation 5° east.*  
The master and wardens of the Trinity House, Port Adelaide, hereby give notice that the "MacDonnell Light," on Cape Northumberland, in lat. 38° 3' 0" S., long. 140° 37' 45" E., will be exhibited nightly on and after the 1st of January, 1859, from sunset to sunrise.

The lighthouse tower, which is 28 feet in height, stands on a rocky headland elevated 103 feet above high-water mark.

The light, which is catoptric and revolving, consists of three faces, and exhibits alternately every minute a white, red and green light, on an arc visible from seaward from N. 74° E. to N. 66° W. round by south (by compass).

The white light may be seen from the deck of a moderate sized vessel about 18 miles, and from aloft at a distance proportionate to the elevation attained.

The red light will not be seen, under the most favorable circumstances, at a greater distance than 15 miles.

The green light will not generally be distinguishable beyond a range of 8 miles.

During hot weather and N.E. winds, when there is often much refraction, the white light will frequently be observed at a great distance.

Vessels approaching from the eastward should not bring the white or red light to bear to the westward of W.N.W., and when the green light becomes visible on that bearing should steer more southerly, in order to give the reef, which stretches to the eastward of Cape Northumberland, a wide berth.

Vessels from the northward should never sight the white or red light on a bearing more southerly than E. ½ S., and on distinguishing the green light should immediately alter the course so as to give the outlying reefs, to the westward of the cape running parallel to the coast a mile from the shore, an offing.

In bad weather, with the wind hanging from the southward, it will be advisable to give the cape such an offing as will enable a ship to pass the lighthouse without sighting the green light; and should the weather, which is occasionally the case, be thick, or it be blowing hard, it will be prudent not to sight the red light, which, under such circumstances, would not be seen at the distance first given.

The coast to the north-westward of the cape soon becomes low, and owing to the heavy ocean swell, which sets directly on the shore, should be very carefully avoided.

To the eastward of the cape is a deep bight, which offers no shelter from the prevailing winds and swell, or inducement to enter.

The lightkeepers are provided with a nine-pounder carronade, and a code of Marryat's signals, which will be used to warn vessels if observed to be standing into danger.

## AVOCA PETITION.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and sixty-six householders and landholders resident at Avoca, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

By His Excellency's Command,

G.9393. JOHN O'SHANASSY.

The petitioners state that Avoca is one of the oldest townships on the gold fields; that in addition to its gold field, it is in the centre of a rich agricultural district; that it is well watered and wooded; that it has always been the head-quarters of the district, and that it is on the main road to Adelaide, and sixteen miles distant from any other town of importance.

That in the absence of a recognized or municipal body to watch over its affairs, its interests have suffered seriously, all property being thereby deteriorated in value, and its mineral resources scarcely developed.

That the creation of a municipality would be a certain means of remedying the evils before stated, and rendering Avoca one of the first townships on the gold fields.

The petitioners suggest that the proposed municipal district be as follows, viz.:-"From a point at the south-west corner of allotment 137 of country allotments south-west of Avoca; thence north three miles; thence east three miles; thence south three miles; thence west three miles to the point of commencement;" such area not containing more than nine square miles, in which no one point is distant more than six miles from any other point, and there being three hundred house and land holders therein.

And the petitioners pray as follows:-

"Your memorialists therefore pray your Excellency may be pleased to cause the above district to be proclaimed a municipality under the provisions of the 18th Victoria No. 15, by the name of the Avoca Municipality."

MUNICIPALITY OF NEWTOWN AND CHILWELL.

BYE-LAW No. 3.—FOR THE REGULATION AND LICENSING OF CARTS, WAGGONS, OR DRAYS WITHIN THE NEWTOWN AND CHILWELL MUNICIPAL DISTRICT.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be competent for municipal councils to frame such rules and regulations as may be necessary for the regulation and licensing of public vehicles within their respective boundaries: Be it therefore enacted by the council of the Newtown and Chilwell municipality, That so soon as the sanction of His Excellency the Governor in Council is obtained, all persons having carts, waggons, or drays plying for hire within the district, shall register the same annually with the town clerk (the first registration to be within one month after this bye-law shall come into operation), and that each cart, waggon, or dray so registered shall have the words "Newtown and Chilwell Municipality," written on the off side, with such number as may correspond with the number of their registration on the books of the municipality. Any person not complying with the aforesaid regulation shall, on conviction before any two justices of the peace, be subject to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

BYE-LAW No. 4.—FOR THE PREVENTION OF GOATS BEING AT LARGE WITHIN THE BOUNDARIES OF THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF NEWTOWN AND CHILWELL.

WHEREAS the streets and uninclosed places situate within the municipal district of Newtown and Chilwell are infested by a great number of goats, which are allowed to go at large at all hours of the day and night, to the great annoyance of the inhabitants, and very serious mischiefs have arisen and are likely to arise from such goats being allowed to go at large: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Newtown and Chilwell, That from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor, it shall not be lawful for any person to suffer or permit any goat or goats belonging to him or her, or under his or her charge, to be at large in any street or public place, or in any uninclosed place within the said municipal district, whether the same be or be not public property; and any person who shall so offend shall, on conviction before any two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings.

The foregoing Bye-laws, Nos. 13 and 14, made by the municipal council of Newtown and Chilwell, have been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

MUNICIPALITY OF NEWTOWN AND CHILWELL.

BYE-LAW No. 8.—FOR REGULATING THE LAYING OF DRAINS AND OPENING THE FOOTPATHS WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF NEWTOWN AND CHILWELL.

WHEREAS by the Act 18 Victoria No. 15, it is therein enacted that it shall be competent for municipal councils to make bye-laws for, *inter alia*, the general good rule and government of such municipal district: Be it therefore enacted by the municipal council of Newtown and Chilwell, from and after this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor, That any person requiring to take up or make any alteration in any footpath within the municipal district of Newtown and Chilwell, for the purpose of laying a drain or sewer across the same in order to carry off any storm or surface water, shall apply to this council for permission so to do, and if it shall appear to the satisfaction of the council that such alteration in any footpath for the purpose of laying a drain or sewer will be desirable, and that the water carried through such drain or sewer is not likely to stagnate, permission will be granted; such alterations to be performed to the satisfaction of the council; provided that no person shall use such drain or sewer for carrying off refuse water. And be it further enacted, That if any person shall, after the date of this bye-law coming into operation, take up or make any alteration in any footpath within the municipal district of Newtown and Chilwell, for the purpose of laying any drain or sewer across the same, without the consent in writing of the said council, then, upon conviction thereof before any two or more justices of the peace, such offender shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Forty shillings.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 8, made by the municipal council of Newtown and Chilwell, has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

The house or building used as a National School, situate in Aprhasia street.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this sixth day of December, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, and in the twenty-second year of Her Majesty's Reign.

## PARTICULARS.

Raphael Caro and Solomon Levy were last seen alive by one James Fleecroft, a shepherd, residing at the Lake Out-station, West Charlton, in the Avoca district, on the 24th of February, 1858. On the previous night they had camped close to the hut in which Fleecroft slept; also, three other men, known respectively as "Harry the Hutkeeper," "Joe," and "Walk-about-the-Murray." On the morning of the 24th of February, Fleecroft went out with his sheep, leaving the two deceased and the other three men in the hut. About two hours afterwards he met the deceased, and they asked him the way to Donald's Station, stating at the same time that they had been misdirected by the man "Joe." They then left for Donald's.

The deceased had with them a pony and a large Sydney built spring cart, painted green on the outside, and a dark slate color on the inside, with a strong iron axle. Both shafts had been broken, and were repaired with iron plates bound over with patent leather. A broken front panel had been repaired or replaced with a shingle.

It is believed that the man Caro had a considerable sum of money upon his person, and a stock of goods consisting of drapery and jewellery, the latter comprising wedding and signet rings, ear-rings, bracelets, and brooches of an inferior description, as well as a few watches.

Only a few articles of trifling value were found on the bodies of the deceased; the horse and spring cart, and the stock of goods, money, &c., are missing.
