MUNICIPAL EXEMPTION, NEWTOWN AND CHILWELL.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, *An Act for the Establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that nothing in the said Act contained should authorise the interference by any municipal council constituted under the said Act, with any public place or building, of what description soever, not erected or constructed by such municipal council, that might be excepted from the jurisdiction of such municipal council by any Proclamation made or to be made by the Lieutenant Governor: And whereas it is deemed expedient to except the building hereinafter mentioned from the jurisdiction of the council of the municipal district of Newtown and Chilwell: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do, by this my Proclamation, with the advice of the Executive Council, except from the jurisdiction of the municipal council of Newtown and Chilwell the following building, situate and being within the said municipal district, that is to say:—

The house or building used as a National School, situate in Aphrasia street.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this sixth day of December, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, and in the twenty-second year of Her Majesty's Reign.

MUNICIPALITY OF ARARAT.

BYE-LAW No. 2.—To COMPEL OBSERVANCE TO BE PAID TO THE SURVEYED LINE OF STREET IN THE FUTURE ERECTION OF BUILDINGS; ALSO, TO PROVIDE FOR THE REMOVAL OF HOUSES AND BUILDINGS NOW STANDING IN ANY WAY ON THE STREETS.

WHEREAS by an Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to pass bye-laws for the suppression of nuisances and the general good rule, &c.: Be it ordered and enacted by the municipal council of Ararat, That the owners or occupiers of any house or building encroaching in any way on the boundary line of any of the streets within the said municipality, shall be required to move such house or building back to the surveyed line of such street or streets before the expiration of the 15th day of December, 1858; and if any house or building shall, in the opinion of the council, or their authorised officer, encroach so far on any street as to prevent, interfere with, or hinder the making or repairing of any of the surveyed roads or streets within the said municipality, then it shall be lawful for the council, by notice in writing to the owner or occupier of any house or building so encroaching as aforesaid, to order the removal of such house or building within fourteen days from the date thereof: And it is further ordered and enacted as aforesaid, that any person failing or neglecting, or refusing to comply with the provisions of this bye-law, on the expiration of the time above specified in such notice as aforesaid, shall be liable and subject to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds for the first offence, and a sum not exceeding Fifty pounds for any second offence, and for any succeeding offence against this bye-law a sum not exceeding Fifty pounds—such penalty or penalties to be recovered and recoverable in the manner provided by the said Act.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 2, made by the municipal council of Ararat, has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council. Gazetted on the 17th day of December, 1858, pursuant to 18 Victoria No. 15, sec. 33.

MUNICIPALITY OF CARISBROOK.

BYE-LAW No. 12.—FOR AN ASSESSMENT OF HOUSE AND LAND PROPERTY WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT FOR THE YEAR 1858.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to make an annual assessment of all property in houses and lands within the limits of such municipal district according to its fair average annual value: Be it therefore enacted, That the assessment on the annual value of property within the municipality of Carisbrook, estimated at Nine thousand seven hundred and fifty-one pounds and ten shillings (£9751 10s.), as approved by the justices of the peace in petty sessions assembled shall be the value on which the rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound has been assessed, and shall be legal and in force for the municipal year, commencing the 8th day of September, 1858, and ending the 8th day of September, 1859.

BYE-LAW No. 13.—A BYE-LAW FOR LEVYING A RATE OF ONE SHILLING AND THREEPENCE IN THE POUND FOR THE CURRENT YEAR.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to impose a rate on all houses and lands within such district according to their fair average annual value, such rate not to exceed Two shillings in the pound: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Carisbrook that a rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound for the current year be levied on all property in houses and lands within this municipal district, one moiety to be collected on and after twenty days from the issue of the notices, and the other on and after the 5th day of March, 1859.

The foregoing Bye-laws, Nos. 12 and 13, made by the municipal council of Carisbrook, have been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council. Gazetted on the 17th day of December, 1858, pursuant to 18 Victoria No. 15, sec. 33.

MUNICIPALITY OF WARRNAMBOOL.

BYE-LAW No. 18.—TO REGULATE THE CONDUCTING OF THE ELECTION OF MEMBERS OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant-Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that the council of any municipal district established under the provisions of the said Act may make bye-laws for the conducting of elections: And whereas by a Proclamation of His Excellency the Officer administering the Government, dated the 6th day of

December, 1855, the district of Warrnambool was duly established a municipal district under the provisions and within the meaning of the said Act: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of the district of Warrnambool, That from and after this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor, as required by the provisions of the said Act:—

1. That if at any election the chairman of the municipal council for the time being shall be a candidate for re-election, or shall be incapacitated from presiding at such election, either from illness, absence from the district, or any other cause, it shall be competent for the remaining members of the municipal council (being a quorum) to appoint some one of themselves to act as chairman for the purpose of carrying out such election: And it shall be lawful for the chairman, upon a vote of the council, to appoint under his hand and seal such and so many persons as to the council may seem necessary to act as deputy chairman or chairmen, poll clerk or poll clerks, and to appoint such and so many places within the municipal district as may seem to the said council necessary to be the polling place or places.

2. If at any election a poll shall be demanded in the manner and form required by the said Act, the chairman shall cause to be provided at the polling place or places a sufficient number of stalls or compartments, together with ink and pens, or pencils, for the purpose of enabling the elector to mark the voting papers as hereinafter provided, in any which polling place no person other than the chairman, the town clerk or his deputy, the scrutineers, and the electors who shall for the time being be tendering their votes, shall be entitled to be present, and any person other than such chairman, town clerk or his deputy, scrutineers, and electors who may be tendering their votes, who shall intrude behind the barrier, and on being required to withdraw by the chairman shall refuse so to do shall be deemed guilty of an offence within the provisions of this bye-law, and upon being convicted thereof before any two or more justices of the peace acting in and for the district, shall forfeit and pay a sum or penalty of not exceeding Twenty pounds.

3. The chairman in each polling place shall cause to be provided for the purpose of such election a locked up box (of which he shall keep the key), with a cleft or opening the in capable of receiving the voting papers, and which box shall stand upon the table in front of the chairman, and each elector shall receive from the chairman a voting paper in the form in the schedule hereunto annexed, and shall thereupon retire to a stall or compartment provided for that purpose, and there strike out the name or names of such candidates as he does not intend to vote for, and deposit the same in the ballot box in the presence of the chairman, town clerk, or his deputy, and scrutineers, and in case such elector shall be unable to read, or be blind, he shall signify the same to the chairman who shall thereupon mark or strike out the names of such candidates as such elector shall designate, and no elector shall take out of such polling place any such voting paper, either before or after he has marked the same; and any person wilfully infringing any of the provisions of this clause, or obstructing the polling by any unnecessary delay in performing any act within the polling place, shall be deemed guilty of an offence within the meaning of this bye-law, and on being convicted thereof before any two or more justices of the peace acting in and for the district, shall forfeit and pay a sum or penalty of not exceeding Twenty pounds.

4. Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint, by writing under his hand, to be delivered to the chairman at any time before Eight o'clock in the morning of the polling day, one scrutineer to be present on his behalf in the polling place.

5. It shall be lawful for the chairman or for any candidate or scrutineer to put to any person before he shall have received his voting paper the following questions only:—

1. What is your Christian and surname?
2. Are you of the age of twenty-one years?
3. Are you a ratepayer on the ratepayers' roll of the municipal district of Warrnambool?
4. Have you already voted at this election?

And if any person shall wilfully give a false answer to any of the questions aforesaid, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence within the meaning of this bye-law, and on being convicted thereof before any two or more justices of the peace acting in and for the district, shall forfeit and pay a sum or penalty of not exceeding Fifty pounds.

6. At every election it shall be the duty of the town clerk, or his deputy, to provide himself with the ratepayers' roll, and as each elector comes forward to demand his voting paper, to see whether the name of such elector appears on the roll as a ratepayer within the meaning of the said Act, and as each elector deposits his voting paper within the ballot box to mark off such elector's name as having voted at such election.

7. In case the voting paper as of any person shall have been received, and any other person shall afterwards demand his voting paper as of the same person, the chairman when such person shall propose to deposit his voting paper in the ballot box shall refuse to allow the same to be put therein, but shall receive and keep the same apart, and at the close of the election decide whether such person has already voted or not; and for the purpose of such decision it shall be lawful for the chairman to take evidence on oath or affirmation, and such decision shall be final and conclusive on all parties; and if it shall appear to the chairman that such elector has not already voted at such

election, such vote shall be added to the number already polled but if otherwise such vote shall not be allowed.

8. At the close of the poll, or as soon after as conveniently may be, the chairman in the presence of the scrutineers shall count the number of votes polled for each candidate, and if on the state of the poll being announced the number of votes shall have been found to have been equal for any two or more candidates, one or more of whom, but not all, shall by the state of the poll and the number of members to be elected be entitled to be declared to be elected, the chairman shall by a casting vote or votes, as the case may be, decide which of the candidates for whom the votes may be equal shall be elected, but no chairman shall be entitled to vote at any election except in the case of an equality of votes, and the chairman shall then in the presence of the scrutineers seal up all the voting papers given during the election, and safely preserve them amongst the records of the council.

10. That all places within which polling is conducted shall be deemed public places.

The ballot paper so marked is to be dropped by him into the ballot box.

The voter is not to be permitted to take his ballot paper out of the polling place.
