W HEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, An Act for the Establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria, it was amongst other things enacted, that nothing in the said Act contained should authorise the interference by any municipal council constituted under the said Act, with any public place or building, of what description soever, not erocted or constructed by such municipal council, that might be excepted from the jurisdiction of such municipal council by any Proclamation made or to be made by the Lieutenant Governor: And whereas it is deemed expedient to except the building hereinafter mentioned from the jurisdiction of the council of the municipal district of Newtown and Chilwell: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do, by this my Proclamation, with the advice of the Executive Council, except from the jurisdiction of the municipal council of Newtown and Chilwell the following building, situate and being within the said municipal district, that is to say:—

The house or building used as a National School, situate in Aphrasia street.

If at any election a poll shall be demanded in the manner and form required by the said Act, the chairman shall cause to be provided at the polling place or places a sufficient number of stalls or compartments, together with ink and pens, or pencils, for the purpose of enabling the elector to mark the voting papers as hereinafter provided, in any which polling place no person other than the chairman, the town clerk or his deputy, the scrutineers, and the electors who shall for the time being be tendering their votes, shall be entitled to be present, and any person other than such chairman, town clerk or his deputy, scrutineers, and electors who may be tendering their votes, who shall intrude behind the barrier, and on being required to withdraw by the chairman shall refuse so to do shall be deemed guilty of an offence within the provisions of this byc-law, and upon being convicted thereof before any two or more justices of the peace acting in and for the district, shall forfeit and pay a sum or penalty of not exceeding Twenty pounds.

The chairman in each polling place shall cause to be provided for the purpose of such election a locked up hox (of which he shall keep the key), with a cleft or opening the ein capable of receiving the voting papers, and which box shall stand upon the table in front of the chairman, and each elector shall receive from the chairman a voting paper in the form in the schedule hereunto annexed, and shall thereupon retire to a stall or compartment provided for that purpose, and there strike out the name or names of such candidates as he does not intend to vote for, and deposit the same in the ballot box in the presence of the chairman, town clork, or his deputy, and scrutineers, and in case such elector shall be unable to read, or be blind, he shall signify the same to the chairman who shall thereupon mark or strike out the names of such candidates as such elector shall designate, and no elector shall take out of such polling place any such voting paper, either before or after he has marked the same; and any person wilfully infringing any of the provisions of this clause, or obstructing the polling by any unnecessary delay in performing any act within the meaning of this by elaw, and on being convicted thereof before any two or more justices of the peace acting in and for the district, shall forficit and pay a sum or penalty of not exceeding Twenty pounds.

4. Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint, by writing under his hand, to be delivered to the chairman at any time before Eight o'clock in the noruing of the polling day, one scrutineer to put to any person before he shall have received his voting paper the following questions only:

1. What is your Christian and surname?

2. Are you of the age of twenty-one years?

3. Are you a ratepayer on the ratepay
