DIVISIONS OF MINING DISTRICT OF MARYBOROUGH.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the first day of February, 1858.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "An Act for amending "the Laws relative to the Gold Fields," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to split any mining district into any number of divisions and to define the limits and boundaries thereof respectively, and also to determine the number of members of the mining board of such district which shall be elected within and for every such division; and from time to time to alter any such division and the limits and boundaries thereof, and to vary the number of members which should be elected within and for every such division, but so that the total number of members elected for such district shall in no case exceed or be less than ten: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order alter the limits and boundaries of the divisions of the mining district of Maryborough, and vary the number of members which shall be elected within and for every such division, and doth split the said mining district into five divisions, and define the limits and boundaries of every such division to be those set opposite thereto in the last column of the schedule hereunto annexed, and determine that the number of members of the mining board of such district which shall be elected within and for every such division, shall be that set immediately under the name of every such division respectively in the first column of the said schedule.

THE SCHEDULE.

Names of Divisions.	Limits and Boundaries of Divisions.	
Korong One member	Commencing at a point on the River Loddon due cast of the southern shores of Lake Hindmarsh; thence by a line bearing west to the River Avoca; thence southwards by the River Avoca to a point south 67 degrees 30 minutes west of Mount Moliagul; thence by a line bearing north 67 degrees 30 minutes east passing over Mount Moliagul to the River Loddon; and thence northward by the River Loddon to the commencing point aforesaid.	
DUNOLLY Three members.	Commencing at a point on the River Avoca south 67 degrees 30 minutes west of Mount Moliagul; thence southward by the Avoca River to Natte Yaloak; thence by a line south-easterly to Joyce's pre-emptive section; thence by the northern and eastern boundaries of that section and by the Bet-bet Creek to the River Loddon; thence northwards by the River Loddon to a point north 67 degrees 30 minutes east of Mount Moliagul; thence by a line bearing south 67 degrees 30 minutes west, passing over Mount Moliagul to the commencing point aforesaid.	
Maryborough Four members	Commencing at a point on the Bet-bet Creek due west of the southern boundary of the parish of Carisbrook; thence by the Bet-bet Creek to the River Loddon; thence by the River Loddon and the Deep Creek to the northern boundary of the parish of Carisbrook; and thence by the northern, eastern, and southern boundaries of the parish of Carisbrook, and a line bearing west to the commencing point aforesaid.

Names of Divisions.	Limits and Boundaries of Divisions.	
AMHERST One member	Commencing at a point on the Bet-bet Creek due west of the southern boundary of the parish of Carisbrook; thence by the Bet-bet Creek to the Burnbank Creek; thence by the Burnbank Creek to its source; thence by the main dividing range to the source of the Mount Greenock Creek; thence by the Mount Greenock Creek and a line east to the junction of the Bullarook and Tullaroop Creeks; and thence northwards by the Deep Creek to the southern boundary of the parish of Carisbrook; and thence by a line bearing west to the commencing point aforesaid.	
Avoca One member	Commencing at a point on the Yarriambiack Creek due east of the southern shores of Lake Hindmarsh; thence by the Yarriambiack Creek to the bifurcations of the Wimmers; thence eastwards by the main road to the town of Navarre; thence by the western boundary of the town of Navarre, and a line bearing south to the main dividing range; thence by the main dividing range to the source of the Burnbank Creek; thence by the Burnbank and Bet-bet Creeks to Joyce's pre-emptive section; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries of that section and a line north-westerly to Natte Yaloak, on the River Avoca; and thence northwards by the River Avoca to a point due east of the southern shores of Lake Hindmarsh; and thence by a line bearing west to the commencing point aforesaid.
