## THE MINING DISTRICTS.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the fourth day of January, 1858.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "An Act for amending the Laws relative to the Gold Fields," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, from time to time, to erect any portion of the colony into a mining district, and to give to such district some distinguishing name, and to define the limits and boundaries thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present order erect the portions of the colony hereinafter described into mining districts, and give to such districts the distinguishing names of "The Mining District of Ballaarat," "The Mining District of Castlemaine," "The Mining District of Sandhurst," "The Mining District of Maryborough," "The Mining District of Ararat," and "The Mining District of Beechworth," respectively, and define the limits and boundaries thereof as follows (that is to say):—

### THE MINING DISTRICT OF BALLAARAT.

Commencing at the source of the Emu Creek; thence southwards by the Emu Creek and a line south to the source of the Gnarket Ponds; thence by the Gnarket Ponds to the Main road to Sheldford; thence eastward by that road to the River Yarrowee; thence by a line north-easterly to a point on the River Moorabool one mile north of the town of Lethbridge; thence east six miles; thence north to the Anyche Young Hills; thence by the range to the Little River; thence by the Little River to its junction with its main tributary; thence by a line north-easterly to the junction of the Djerriwarrh Creek and the River Werribee; thence by the Djerriwarrh Creek to its source near Mount Bullancrook; thence by the Bullancrook range to the main dividing range; thence by the main dividing range, westerly, to the source of the Bullarook Creek; thence by the range dividing the Bullarook and Joyce's Creek to a point due east of the junction of the Bullarook and Tullaroop Creeks; thence by a line bearing west to the Mount Greenock Creek; thence by the Mount Greenock Creek to its source; and thence by the main dividing range westerly to the commencing point aforesaid.

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### THE MINING DISTRICT OF CASTLEMAINE.

Commencing at the junction of the Deep Creek and the River Loddon; thence by a line easterly to the south-western angle of the parish of Lockwood; thence by a line bearing south five miles; thence by a line bearing east to the parish of Harcourt; thence by the northern boundary of that parish and the Mount Alexander range to the Myrtle Creek; thence by the Myrtle Creek and the River Coliban to the River Campaspe; thence southward by the River Campaspe to its source; thence westwards by the dividing range to the source of the Bullarook Creek; thence by the range separating the Bullarook and Joyce's Creek and a line west to the junction of the Tullaroop and Bullarook Creeks; thence northwards by the Deep Creek to the parish of Carisbrook; thence by the southern, eastern and northern boundaries of that parish, and again by the Deep Creek to the commencing point aforesaid.

Commencing again at the junction of the Kooyong-koot Creek with the River Yarra Yarra; thence by that creek to its source in the dividing range, forming the southern basin of the River Yarra Yarra; thence by that range to the source of the Woori Yaloak Creek; thence by that creek to the River Yarra Yarra; thence by the River Yarra Yarra to Watts' Creek; thence by Watts' Creek to the great dividing range; thence by the great dividing range to the source of the River Plenty; and thence by the River Plenty and Yarra Yarra to the commencing point last aforesaid.

### THE MINING DISTRICT OF SANDHURST.

Commencing at the south-western angle of the parish of Lockwood; thence west four miles; thence north thirty-two miles; thence east to the Bendigo Creek; thence southwards by that creek and a line east to a point on the River Campaspe due west of Barrow's Inn; thence southwards by the River Campaspe to a point due west of Mount Camel; thence by a line east to the Corinella Creek; thence northwards by that creek to Lake Cooper; thence by the eastern shores of that lake to the most northern point thereof; thence by a line east to the River Goulburn; thence southwards by the River Goulburn to Hughes's Creek; thence by a line south-westerly to the source of the McIvor or Patterson's Creek; thence by a line north-westerly to the junction of the Rivers Coliban and Campaspe; thence westward by the River Coliban, the Myrtle Creek and the Mount Alexander range to the northern boundary of the parish of Harcourt; thence west seven miles and sixty-four chains; and thence north to the commencing point last aforesaid.

Commencing again at the source of Mollison's Creek; thence by that creek to the Kurucuruc Creek; thence by a line east to the Dabyminga Creek; thence southwards by that creek to the main dividing range; and thence by the main dividing range to the commencing point last aforesaid.

### THE MINING DISTRICT OF MARYBOROUGH.

Commencing at a point on the River Loddon due east of the southern shores of Lake Hindmarsh; thence by a line bearing west to the Yarriambiack Creek; thence southwards by the Yarriambiack Creek to the bifurcations of the Wimmera; thence eastwards by the main road to the town of Navarre; thence by the western boundary of the town of Navarre and a line bearing south to the main dividing range; thence by the main dividing range to the source of the Mount Greenock Creek; thence northwards by the Mount Greenock Creek, and thence by a line east to the junction of the Bullarook and Tullaroop Creeks; thence northwards by the Deep

Creek to the parish of Carisbrook; thence by the southern, eastern and northern boundaries of that parish and again by the Deep Creek to the River Loddon; and thence northwards by the River Loddon to the commencing point aforesaid.

#### THE MINING DISTRICT OF ARARAT.

Commencing at the bifurcation of the River Wimmera; thence by the River Wimmera and a line south-west to Brigg's Bluff; thence by the Grampians and the Serra range to the southern boundary of the county of Ripon; thence eastwards by that boundary to the Emu Creek; thence northward by the Emu Creek to the main dividing range; thence westward by the main dividing range to a point due south of the western boundary of the town of Navarre; thence by a line bearing north to Navarre; and thence westwards by the main road to the commencing point aforesaid.

#### THE MINING DISTRICT OF BEECHWORTH.

Commencing at the junction of the River Owens with the River Murray; thence by a line westerly to the range dividing the waters of the River Owens and Broken Creek; thence by that range southwards to the source of the Fifteen-mile Creek; thence by a line south-easterly, crossing the River King, to the dividing range at the source of the River Whorouly; thence by that range to the great dividing range; thence by the great dividing range to the source of the Indi or Limestone River; and thence by part of the eastern and northern boundaries of this colony to the commencing point aforesaid.

And the Honorable William Clark Haines, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "*An Act for amending the Laws relative to the Gold Fields*," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, to split any mining district into any number of divisions and to define the limits and boundaries thereof respectively, and also to determine the number of members of the mining board of such district which shall be elected within and for every such division; but so that the total number of members elected for such district shall in no case exceed or be less than ten: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order split the several mining districts named in the first column of the schedule hereunto annexed, into the number of divisions set opposite thereto in the second column of the same schedule, and define the limits and boundaries of every such division to be those set forth in the last column of the same schedule, and determine that the number of members of the mining board of every such district which shall be elected within and for every such division, shall be that set immediately under the name of every such division respectively, in the third column of the said schedule.

		BUNINYONG... <i>Two members</i>	Commencing at a point about three and a half miles north of the south-west angle of the Buninyong Race-course, county of Grenville; thence easterly about two and a half miles to a point on the main line of road between the township of Buninyong and Sebastopol; thence north-easterly about two miles to a point on the main line of road between the township of Buninyong and Ballaarat, about two and a half miles north-westerly from the northern boundary of the township of Buninyong; thence by a line bearing east about seven and a half miles to the Lal-lal rivulet; thence southerly by the Lal-lal rivulet and a line bearing south about three and a half miles to Williamson's Creek; thence southerly by Williamson's Creek and the river Yarrowee to the town of Shelford; thence by the main road to Cressy to the Woody Yaloak Creek; and thence by the Woody Yaloak Creek and a line northerly to the commencing point aforesaid.
		CRESWICK... <i>One member</i>	Commencing at the source of the Mount Greenock Creek, in the great dividing range; thence by the great dividing range easterly to Mount Pisgal; thence east by a road passing over Mount Pisgal about one and a half miles to the eastern side of the main Ballaarat and Creswick road; thence southerly by the Ballaarat and Creswick main road about two miles to the southern boundary of allotment forty-two, parish of Ballaarat; thence by the said boundary and a line bearing east about three miles to the great dividing range; thence by the great dividing range easterly to the source of the Bullarook Creek; thence north-westerly by the range dividing Joyce's Creek and the Bullarook Creek, and by a line west to the junction of the Tullaroop and Bullarook Creeks; thence by a line bearing west to the Mount Greenock Creek; and thence southerly by the Mount Greenock Creek to its source in the great dividing range, the commencing point aforesaid.

## RULES AND REGULATIONS.

## Construction of the Regiment.

THE regiment shall be open to all respectable persons, subject to the approval of the bench of magistrates; each candidate for admission to be passed by a committee of seven, and four to form a quorum.

## Subscription Fee.

2. The subscription fee, amounting to One pound, is to be paid as follows:—Ten shillings to the adjutant, and Ten shillings to the treasurer, previous to any candidate being sworn in.

## Promotion.

3. That on all occasions of promotion, three candidates shall be chosen by ballot by the whole regiment, each member to name three, otherwise the vote to be null and void. The election from these three to be made by the commanding officer after an examination open to all the members.

## Qualification for Promotion.

4. No member shall be qualified for promotion until he has served twelve months in the corps, providing always that the commanding officer shall be empowered to appoint acting grades when necessary.

## Changing Address.

5. All members changing their address must give notice of the same in writing to the adjutant within fourteen days, under a penalty of five shillings.

## Members responsible for all Government Property.

6. Members will be responsible for the good and serviceable order of their arms, accoutrements and clothing, and any damage done thereto shall be made good by the members causing the same.

## Alteration of Uniform.

7. No change whatever shall be made in the dress of the regiment, unless in accordance with a regimental order.

## Bi-Annual Meetings.

8. A general meeting of the regiment shall be held in the first week of March and September, of which one week's notice is to be given by circular.

## The Officer commanding may convene a Special General Meeting.

9. The officer commanding the regiment shall have power at any time to convene a special general meeting.

## Members calling a Special General Meeting.

10. That on a requisition signed by not less than one-fourth of the members, the commanding officer must call a special general meeting, giving not less than seven days' notice. No business to be entertained unless one-half are present.

## Order to be observed at General Meetings.

11. That at every general meeting the senior officer present shall be chairman; that no person shall be permitted to speak to any question more than once (unless in explanation), except the mover, who will be entitled to a reply; that all motions be delivered to the chairman in writing, and be decided by the holding up of hands, unless a division be demanded by two or more members; that no protest be received; that no meeting be adjourned or dissolved without a question for that purpose.

## Members wishing to resign.

12. Members wishing to resign must give at least twenty-eight days' notice in writing to the adjutant.

## No Resignation accepted until all Claims are satisfied.

13. No resignation will be accepted until the member resigning shall have satisfied all regimental claims against him.

## Persons ceasing to be Members must return all Government Property.

14. All persons ceasing to be members of the regiment must forward uniform and other regimental property to the adjutant. Neglect of this rule will entail prosecution according to law.

Members permitted to resign to pay certain Rates for Uniform.  
15. Any member permitted to resign within twelve months from receipt of new uniform must pay for the same according to the following scale:—

Retiring under 6 months, full price of uniform.

Retiring at the end of 7 months, 5-6 of ditto.

" " 8 months, 4-6 of ditto.

" " 9 months, 3-6 of ditto.

" " 10 months, 2-6 of ditto.

" " 11 months, 1-6 of ditto.

Members expelled the Regiment to pay full Contract Price of Uniform.

16. Any member expelled the regiment within twelve months from receipt of new uniform will be required to defray full contract price of same.

## Liability to be placed in Arrest.

17. Members of the regiment are liable to be placed in arrest under the following circumstances:—

1st. By order of the officer commanding the regiment, pending investigation of any charge.

2nd. By the senior officer present, for any misconduct in uniform, in which case the person so placed in arrest must, without remark or altercation, proceed immediately to change his dress.

No person placed under arrest may wear his uniform until released.

Non-compliance with any part of this rule will entail a penalty of Five pounds.

## Courts Martial.

18. That the commanding officer may at any time order a court martial.

That a court martial have power to censure, fine, or expel. Any member feeling himself aggrieved may demand a court martial.

That all courts martial shall consist of four of the same rank as the member accused, and two from each of the other ranks, to be taken from a roster.

That a list of the members of the court be given to the member accused, who, on showing sufficient cause, may object to any of the members, provided always the commanding officer confirms the same.

That the order to be observed on courts martial to be as nearly as possible in accordance with those in Her Majesty's army.

That the decision of a court martial, subject to the confirmation of His Excellency the Governor, shall be final.

## Mode to be observed for Alteration, &amp;c., of any Rule or Regulation.

19. Any member desirous of altering, rescinding, or adding any rule or regulation of the regiment, must give fourteen days' notice of the same in writing to the adjutant, who shall cause a copy of such alteration, rescission, or addition to be hung up in his office.

No Alteration, &c., of Rules and Regulations to be recommended, unless agreed to by a Majority.

20. It shall not be competent to recommend to His Excellency the Governor, any alteration, rescission, or addition to the existing rules of the regiment, unless such has been agreed to by an absolute majority of the regiment.

## RULES AND REGULATIONS.

## Construction of the Regiment.

THE regiment shall be open to all respectable persons, subject to the approval of the bench of magistrates; each candidate for admission to be proposed and seconded in writing by members of the corps.

The names of all candidates for enrolment shall be hung up in the adjutant's office, and read at the commanding officer's parade, to give an opportunity to any member to object to their entrance.

## Entrance Fee and Subscriptions.

2. The entrance fee, amounting to one guinea, to be paid to the adjutant previous to being sworn in.

The annual fee of one guinea, falling due the 1st of January of each year, to be paid to the adjutant.

All moneys hereby received to be handed over intact to the honorary treasurer.

### Promotions.

3. That on all occasions of promotion three candidates shall be chosen by ballot, each member present to name three, or the vote to be null and void.

The election from these three to be made by the commanding officer after an examination open to all members, and forwarded for the approval of His Excellency the Governor.

### Qualification for Promotion.

4. No member shall be qualified for promotion until he has served twelve months in the corps; providing always that the commanding officer shall be empowered to appoint acting grades when necessary.

### Changing Address.

5. All members changing their permanent address must give notice of the same in writing to the adjutant, within fourteen days, under a penalty of five shillings.

*Fine for Absence from his usual Address more than Thirty Days without giving Notice.*

6. Any member of the corps intending to be absent from his usual address for a period of more than thirty days, must give notice of the same in writing to the adjutant, and deposit his arms and accoutrements in the regimental store, under a penalty of ten shillings.

### Drill for Members on joining.

7. All members on joining shall attend recruit drill twice a week, and shall not be supplied with uniform until dismissed the same.

8. That the adjutant's drill take place every Friday, at such hour as may be appointed in regimental orders, and must be attended by all members dismissed drill, at least once a month, and all others twice a month, under a penalty of two shillings and sixpence for each offence. On the parade falling in, the roll shall be called, and any member not answering to his name shall be deemed absent, unless an excuse has been previously forwarded to the adjutant. Any member coming late may report himself to the adjutant, assigning a reason for so doing, which, if deemed sufficient by the commanding officer, he shall be considered as having been present at that parade.

### Commanding Officer's Parade.

9. That the commanding officer's parade shall take place on the first Saturday of each month, or such other day instead as may be appointed by the commanding officer, and to be compulsory on all members unless a sufficient written excuse be forwarded to the adjutant not later than noon that day, under a penalty of ten shillings and sixpence for officers, five shillings for non-commissioned officers, and two shillings and sixpence for privates.

### Members liable to be sent to Instruction Drill.

10. All members will be liable to be sent to instruction drill for want of knowledge occasioned by absence or other cause.

### Members responsible for all Government Property.

11. Members will be responsible for the good and serviceable order of their arms, accoutrements, and clothing, and any damage done thereto shall be made good by the persons causing the same.

### Alteration of Uniform.

12. No changes whatever shall be made in the dress of the regiment unless published in regimental orders.

### Bi-Annual Meetings.

13. A general meeting of the regiment shall be held in the first week of March and September, of which one week's notice is to be given by circular.

### The Officer commanding may convene Special General Meeting.

14. The officer commanding the regiment shall be empowered at any time to convene a special general meeting.

### Members calling a Special General Meeting.

15. That on a requisition being signed by not less than one-fourth of the members, the commanding officer must call a special general meeting, giving not less than seven days' notice. No business to be transacted unless a majority of the division are present.

### Order to be observed at General Meetings.

16. That at every general meeting the senior officer present shall be chairman. That no person shall be permitted to speak to any question more than once (unless in explanation) except the mover, who will be entitled to a reply. That all motions be delivered to the chairman in writing, and be decided by the holding up of hands, unless a division be demanded by two or more members. That no protest be received. That no meeting be adjourned or dissolved without a question for that purpose.

### Members wishing to resign.

17. Members wishing to resign must give at least twenty-eight days' notice in writing to the adjutant.

### No Resignation accepted until all Claims are satisfied.

18. No resignation will be accepted until the member resigning shall have settled all regimental claims against him.

### Persons ceasing to be Members must return all Government Property.

19. All persons ceasing to be members of the regiment must forward uniform and other regimental property to the adjutant, in default of which they will be prosecuted according to law.

### Members permitted to resign to pay certain Rates for Uniform.

20. Any member permitted to resign within twelve months of receipt of new uniform, must pay for the same, according to the following scale:—

Retiring under 6 months, full price of uniform.	
At the end of 7 "	five-sixths of ditto.
" " 8 "	four-sixths of ditto.
" " 9 "	three-sixths of ditto.
" " 10 "	two-sixths of ditto.
" " 11 "	one-sixth of ditto.

### Members expelled the Regiment to pay full Contract Price of uniform.

21. Any member expelled the regiment within twelve months from receipt of new uniform, will be required to defray full contract price of the same.

### List of all claims against Members to be kept at the Adjutant's Office.

22. That a list of all claims against members of the corps be made weekly, and kept in view at the adjutant's office. On the first of each month a list of all claims more than thirty days overdue be made out, and all such defaulters to have a communication addressed to them in writing. That all persons who shall not have paid all claims in full within fourteen days from service of such communication be expelled the regiment, notice of such expulsion being published in the *Government Gazette* and such other public papers as the commanding officer may think fit.

### Liability to be placed in Arrest.

23. Members of the regiment are liable to be placed in arrest under the following circumstances:—

- 1st. By order of the officer commanding the regiment, pending investigation of any charge.
- 2nd. By the senior officer present, for any misconduct in uniform, in which case the person so placed in arrest must, without remark or altercation, proceed immediately and change his dress.

No person placed under arrest may wear his uniform until released. Non-compliance with any part of this rule will entail a penalty of five pounds.

### Courts Martial.

24. The commanding officer may at any time order a court martial.

That a court martial have power to censure, fine or expel.

Any member feeling himself aggrieved may demand a court martial.

That all courts martial shall consist of four of the same rank as the members accused, and two from each of the other ranks, to be taken from a roster.

That a list of the members of the court be given to the member accused, who, on shewing sufficient cause, may object to any of the members; providing always the commanding officer confirms the same.

That the order to be observed on courts martial to be as nearly as possible in accordance with those in Her Majesty's army.

That the decision of a court martial, subject to the confirmation of His Excellency the Governor, or the inspecting field officer, shall be final.

### Mode to be observed for alteration of any Rule or Regulation.

25. Any member desirous of altering, rescinding or adding any rule or regulation of the regiment must give fourteen days' notice of the same in writing to the adjutant, who shall cause a copy of such alteration, rescission or addition to be hung up in his office.

No alteration, &c., of Rules to be recommended, unless agreed to by a Majority.

26. It shall not be competent to recommend to His Excellency the Governor any alteration, rescission or addition to the existing rules of the regiment, unless such has been agreed to by an absolute majority of the division.

#### PRISON BOUNDARIES OF THE HULKS "LYSANDER" AND "SACRAMENTO."

##### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the hand of the then Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twenty-third day of July, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, the positions of the several hulks or floating prisons called respectively the *President*, *Deborah*, *Success*, *Sacramento*, and *Lysander*, were specified and proclaimed: And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the eighth day of December, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, the positions of the hulks *President* and *Success* were altered and defined: And whereas it has been deemed expedient to remove the *Lysander* and *Sacramento* beforementioned to new positions: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation proclaim and direct that the said hulks or floating prisons called respectively the *Lysander* and *Sacramento* are, and shall be moored, one hundred yards apart in the north-west angle of Hobson's Bay (the said hulk *Lysander* being distant one hundred yards from the said hulk *President*), with the magnetic bearings specified in the schedule hereunto annexed, and that the limits and boundaries around the said hulks or floating prisons *Lysander* and *Sacramento* are marked by four buoys painted yellow and placed at right angles to each other one hundred yards apart, and moored within one hundred yards of each of the said hulks *Lysander* and *Sacramento*, between which buoys and the said hulks no person shall come.
