MEMORIAL FOR A ROAD DISTRICT, GREAT BRIGHTON.

THE substance and prayer of a Memorial to His Excellency the Governor, containing resolutions agreed to at a public meeting of the landholders and householders of Great Brighton, held at the Devonshire Inn, on Saturday, the 20th ultimo, and representing the expediency of constituting their locality a road district, to be styled "The Great Brighton Road District," are published below for general information.

The memorialists represent that considering the present bad condition of many of the public roads in and about Brighton, the numbers and position of its inhabitants, &c., it is highly important that a road district be formed, and they suggest that the boundaries thereof be as follow:—"Starting from the Elsterwick Hotel, proceed along the right hand side of the red metal road to the Plough and Harrow; thence at a right angle by the boundary road to the beach; thence along the beach to the boundary of the St. Kilda Municipality; and thence in a direct line to the starting point."

And the memorialists pray as follows:—
"In accordance with the contents of the said resolutions, we beg most respectfully to solicit your Excellency to proclaim the limits and boundaries therein mentioned as 'The Great Brighton Road District.'"

THE FOURTH HALF-YEARLY REPORT OF THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF BALLAARAT, HALF-YEAR ENDING 16TH JANUARY, 1858.

PUBLIC WORKS.

1. The formation, pitching and metalling of 22 chains 80 links of road in Webster street.
2. The formation, pitching and metalling of 15 chains of road in Dana street.
3. The formation, pitching and metalling of 6 chains of road in Eyre street.
4. Fencing in the reserve for Market square.
5. Grubbing trees in the unformed streets and roads of the district.
6. Removing the embankment from the junction of Sturt and Lydiard streets.
7. Repairing road and bridge to the manure depot.
8. Repairing road to Soldiers' Hill.
9. Paved crossings in Lydiard and Armstrong streets.
10. Cutting drains in the unformed streets.
11. Forming footpath in Doveton street.

13. The municipal council have employed labor under the superintendence of the town surveyor for cleansing and keeping the streets in repair.

MARKET.

The municipal council applied to the Government for powers to lease the ground in the centre of Sturt street, for a period of ten (10) years, in order to induce capitalists to erect the proposed vegetable market thereon, but legal difficulties intervening, the Government could not grant the request, but offered to relinquish that portion of road applied for into the hands of the municipal council. The municipal council offered premiums for the three most approved designs for a market, which were awarded

1. To Mr. C. Porter, Geelong.
2. To Mr. James Robertson, Ballaarat.
3. To Messrs. Backhouse and Reynolds, Ballaarat.

The municipal council applied to the banks on Ballaarat for a loan of £5000, for the purpose of carrying out the design of Mr. Porter, but in consequence of the required loan extending over so long a period, and the bank charters not allowing of advances on mortgage, the application was declined. The municipal council have had the hay market reserve fenced in, and trust, with the co-operation of farmers and others interested in farm produce, that this important market may be soon established.

WATER SUPPLY.

The municipal council have accepted tenders for the supply of pipes for the purpose of conveying water from Yullo's Swamp to Sturt street, to be delivered there from stand-pipes, and anticipate their arrival on Ballaarat in the course of a few months.

The municipal council obtained from the Central Road Board the sum of five hundred pounds (£500) out of the four thousand promised for roads in the Ballaarat district, for the removal of the embankment at the junction of Sturt and Lydiard streets, which work is now completed. A correspondence was then commenced with the Central Road Board relative to the balance of £3500, and learning from the secretary's reply that the money promised had been absorbed in the Mount Alexander road, they had the subject brought forward in the Legislative Assembly, by the courtesy of John O'Shanassy, Esq., M.L.A., and they hope no further misappropriation of moneys promised for this district will be expended in more favored localities.

BALLAARAT RAILWAY.

A deputation from the council, consisting of the chairman and councillor R. Smith, in connection with other members of the various local bodies on Ballaarat, visited Melbourne, and had an interview with His Excellency Sir Henry Barkly and the Honorable the Chief Secretary, to urge the claims of the western district having the Ballaarat and Geelong Railway commenced at the same time as the Mount Alexander Railway. His Excellency promised, in the event of the Government having funds, that they should be simultaneously proceeded with.

ELECTIONS.

On the 28th day of September, Mr. Robert McNiece was elected without opposition in the place of Councillor Robert Muir, resigned.

On the 14th day of January, the following gentlemen were proposed as members in the place of Councillors Stewart, Tulloch, and McNiece, who retired by rotation, but were eligible for re-election—Councillors Stewart and Tulloch, Messrs. M. H. Baird, Robert Holmes, J. A. Doane, and John Smith Carver. The election took place on the 14th day of January, 1858, and the following votes were polled, for
