PETITION FOR MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS.

DUNOLLY.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council, 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency, as hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and fifty-one householders resident in the district of Dunolly.

The petitioners state that they are deeply impressed by the conviction that necessity exists for the crection of Dunolly into a municipal district, and that its incorporation will tend to the improvement and good government thereof; and they suggest that the boundary line should commence at the Junction Hotel, Burnt Creek, and be continued thence due north five miles and 1998 yards, so as to include the property in the occupation of William Fenwick, Esquire, the warden of the district; the other boundaries to be such as to enclose an area not exceeding nine sourare miles, within which no spot shall not exceeding nine square miles, within which no spot shall be distant six miles from any other spot. In the proposed area they state that there are more than three hundred house-

area they state that there are more shall what holders.

And they pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners therefore humbly pray that Dunolly may be proclaimed a municipal district according to the provisions of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15."

For the guidance of shipping frequenting King George's Sound, a lighthouse has been erected on the summit of Breaksea Island at the entrance of the Sound, and another at the entrance to Princess Royal Harbor.

A light is exhibited in both between sunset and survise.
That on Breaksea Island is a good catadioptric light of the second order, white, fixed, and elevated 383 feet above sea level. It may consequently be seen in clear weather at the distance of 9 leagues, from an elevation of 12 feet above the water.

The octagonal iron tower which carries this light is erected near the centre of the island, which is 12 miles in length E. by S. and W. by N., with an average width of nearly a quarter of a mile. From Breaksea light the extremity of Bald Head bears south 40 degrees west 3 miles, Cape Vancouver at the foot of Mount Gardner east 15 degrees north 7 miles, and the light at the entrance of Princess Royal Harbor west 20 degrees north 6½ miles. By a vessel from the westward the light may first be seen round the steep slope of Bald Head on the bearing of N.E. ‡ E., just open to the south of the Eclipse Islands. These bearings are magnetic.

N.E. \(\frac{1}{4}\) E., just open to the south of the Lemps such bearings are magnetic.

The light at Princess Royal Harbor is on Point King, the north point of its narrow entrance. It is a fixed white light of the same description as that on libreaksea, but smaller, and is elevated 37 feet above high water. From the mid-channel between Breaksea and Michaelmas Islands this light bears W. by N. \(\frac{1}{2}\) N., and from the N.E. extremity of Bald Head N.W. \(\frac{1}{4}\) W. It is carried by a wooden square tower 17 feet in height, and 37 feet from the water's edge. All bearings magnetic.
