### QUARTERLY SURVEY FOR HIGH PRESSURE STEAM VESSELS.

NOTICE is hereby given that under the fifth clause of the above-cited Act the owner of every High Pressure steam vessel employed as stated is bound to have the whole of her machinery surveyed by the Engineer Surveyor appointed for that purpose by the Victoria Steam Navigation Board, in the manner and at the times following:—

*High Pressure.*—Vessel—June and December.

„ Machinery—March, June, September, and December.

The owners and masters of steam vessels are requested to observe, that in future the fees are to be paid to the Secretary, at the Office of the Board, before the Surveys are held, and no fees whatever are to be paid to the Surveyors.

The declaration of the surveyor having been obtained, the owner is to transmit it within fourteen days from the date thereof to the Secretary of the Board, addressed to the Office of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, Melbourne. A penalty of £5 is fixed by the Act for every day that the sending of any such declaration is delayed beyond fourteen days.

## REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED BY MASTERS OF VESSELS TRADING TO THE PORT OF CRONSTADT.

THE accompanying notices respecting the regulations at present in force in the port of Cronstadt, which it is incumbent on the masters of vessels entering that port to observe, have been received in this Department, and are, at the request of the Russian Government, published for general information.

### NOTICE.

In order to facilitate the commercial intercourse between St. Petersburg and foreign ports, the following regulations have been made, and are now in force, viz.:—

It is hereby notified that the usual examination and signing of ships' papers, together with the observance of the Health and Customs regulations, will take place at the small anchorage within the inner Customs water police station, instead of, as heretofore, at the outer guard ship. Notice is also given that the Customs examination by the guard ship, at the entrance of the mouth of the Neva, has been abolished.

It is further notified that the quarantine regulations require the hoisting of a red flag on one of the masts upon the arrival of any vessel in the port of Cronstadt, to signify to the water police that the ship is provided with the necessary bill of health, furnished by the Russian Consul at the port of its

departure: Vessels arriving without such certificate are to lie off the outer water police station, and to remain within sight of same until the directions of the proper authorities be given.

It is also enacted that when the pilot flag is seen hoisted on one of the masts of the outer guard ship, vessels are not to proceed; the signal indicating that the entrance to the inner mole is for the time being unauthorised, either from the crowded state of the same or other causes.

### BEKANNTMACHUNG.

Zur Erleichterung der auswärtigen schiffahrt am hiesigen Hafen, ist die Anordnung getroffen, dass die Revision und unterzeichnung der Schiffs-Documente, die besichtigung der Schiffs-Equipage in gesundheitlicher beziehung und alle Zoll-Gebräuche beim Ein- und absegeln der schiffe, anstatt bei der äussern Kronstädter-Brandwacht, auf der Kleinen Kronstädter Rhede bei der innern Zollbrandwacht vorgenommen werden sollen; auch ist die Zollbesichtigung der schiffe bei der Newa-Brandwacht aufgehoben worden. Hierbei ist behufs Vorsicht in Bezug auf Quarantaine Maassregeln bestimmt worden, der äussern dass die aus dem Auslande einlaufenden Schiffe durch Aufhissen einer rothen flagge an einem ihrer Masten Brandwacht ein Signal darüber zu geben haben, dass sie mit den zeugnissen der Consulu über den guten Gesundheitszustand der orte, aus denen sie kommen, versehen sind; die Schiffe aber, welche solche zeugnisse nicht haben, müssen an der äussern Brandwacht Halt machen, und in sicht derselben bleibend, die verfügungen der See-obrigkeit abwarten Gleichmaassen müssen die Schiffe auf der äussern Brandwacht auch dann anhalten, wenn auf derselben die Lootsmanns-flagge aufgezogen ist, da solches zu bedeuten hat, dass man auf der kleinen Kronstädter Rhede um engen Raumes willen oder wegen anderer umstände nicht segeln kann.

### AVIS.

Pour faciliter la navigation entre St. Pétersbourg et les ports étrangers, il vient d'être ordonné, que les formalités douanières à l'arrivée et au départ des vaisseaux, ainsi que la vérification et le visa de leurs documents et l'examen hygiénique des équipages, doivent désormais s'effectuer dans la petite rade de Cronstadt, près du vaisseau de garde de la douane, et non près du vaisseau de garde de la grande rade de ce port. En même tems on vient de supprimer la visite douanière des bâtimens près du vaisseau de garde aux embouchures de la Néva, et de stipuler comme mesure sanitaire, que tous les navires venant de l'étranger sont tenus de hisser sur un de leurs mâts un pavillon rouge pour signaler au vaisseau de garde de la grande rade de Cronstadt qu'ils sont munis d'un certificat de santé, délivré par le Consul russe du lieu de leur départ. Par contre, les navires non munis de certificats susmentionnés doivent s'arrêter près du dit vaisseau, et y attendre les dispositions des autorités maritimes. En outre tous les navires sans exception sont obligés de s'arrêter près de ce vaisseau en cas qu'ils apercevront sur un de ses mâts le pavillon de pilote, ce qui signifiera que l'entrée dans la petite rade de Cronstadt n'est pas autorisée, à cause de l'encombrement ou par d'autres motifs.
