TOLLS AT THE BRUNSWICK AND PENTRIDGE TOLL-GATES, ON THE SYDNEY MAIN ROAD.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twentieth day of August, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, certain rates of tolls therein specified were authorised to be collected at all toll-bars, toll-gates and toll-houses then erected or thereafter to be erected on main roads by the Central Road Board of the said colony, under the provisions of an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the said colony, passed in the seventeenth year of Her present Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to amend an Act intituled 'An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria.'" Now I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, in pursuance of the said Act, do hereby alter the rates of tolls specified in the said Proclamation, so far as the same are payable at the toll-gates or toll-houses situated on the line of road called the Sydney Main Road, at Brunswick and Pentridge respectively, in the county of Bourke, erected by the said Central Road Board or Board of Land and Works under the provisions of the said Act, and I do hereby declare and direct that the tolls hereinafter stated, and no greater, shall be payable and collected at the said toll-gates or toll-houses at Brunswick and Pentridge aforesaid, in lieu and instead of the rates of tolls specified in the said Proclamation, that is to say:—

Tolls payable one way only for going and returning on the same day.

Carts laden with firewood, coming towards Melbourne, shall pass free of toll at Pentridge, and going outwards from Melbourne shall pass free of toll at Brunswick.

Traffic paying at either gate shall be entitled to receive a check or ticket, which shall pass such traffic free of toll at the other or second gate.

Such check or ticket shall be available as well for the day next following as for that on which it was issued.

PETITION FOR MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS.

DUNOLLY.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council, 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency, as hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and fifty-one householders resident in the district of Dunolly.

The petitioners state that they are deeply impressed by the conviction that necessity exists for the erection of Dunolly into a municipal district, and that its incorporation will tend to the improvement and good government thereof; and they suggest that the boundary line should commence at the Junction Hotel, Burnt Creek, and be continued thence due north five miles and 1298 yards, so as to include the property in the occupation of William Fenwick, Esquire, the warden of the district; the other boundaries to be such as to enclose an area not exceeding nine square miles, within which no spot shall be distant six miles from any other spot. In the proposed area they state that there are more than three hundred householders.

And they pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners therefore humbly pray that Dunolly may be proclaimed a municipal district according to the provisions of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15."

MUNICIPALITY OF CARISBROOK.

BYE-LAW No. 2 (amended).—TO REGULATE THE ERECTION OF SHADES OR AWNINGS OVER OR ACROSS THE PUBLIC FOOTPATHS.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, "An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," the council of any municipal district have the care and management of the roads, public streets, paths, &c., within such district: And whereas it is expedient to regulate and control the erection of shades or awnings over or across the public footpaths, in the front of shops, dwelling-houses, or other premises within the municipality of Carisbrook, so as to prevent such erections becoming public nuisances: Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the council of the municipal district of Carisbrook, That from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Officer administering the Government, pursuant to 18 Victoria No. 15, section 33, any person or persons who shall erect or cause to be erected any shade or awning over or across any public footpath within the municipality without having first obtained in writing the consent of the said municipal council to such erections, shall on conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace for the said district forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum or penalty not exceeding Ten pounds; and be it further ordered and enacted, by the authority aforesaid, that every such shade or awning, when such consent to the erection of the same shall have been obtained, shall be erected with the upright post or pillars thereof ten feet from the building line in front of any shop, dwelling-house, or other premises to which such shade or awning shall be attached, and that no plate, rafter, or tie of any such shade or awning shall be of a less height above the surface of such path than seven feet in the clear to the under side of such plate, rafter, or tie. And be it further ordered and directed, that it shall be lawful for the said council to direct and require the removal of any shade or awning erected across or over any public footpath of the said municipality, except the same be in strict accordance with the foregoing directions, whether such shade or awning shall have been erected prior to the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Officer administering the Government, or subsequently thereto, and it shall be further lawful for the said council to give notice to remove any such shade or awning by means of the surveyor or other officer of such council to any owner or occupier by whom or for whom such shade or awning shall have been erected, and any such owner or occupier who shall refuse or neglect to remove any such shade or awning within forty-eight hours of the time of such notice of removal being given, shall on conviction thereof before any two or more of the justices of the peace for the said district forfeit and pay for every such offence, refusal, or neglect, a sum or penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

The Amendment of the foregoing Bye-law, No. 2 (as shewn in italics), made by the municipal council of Carisbrook, has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

MUNICIPALITY OF MARYBOROUGH.

BYE-LAW No. 2.—FOR REGULATING THE DEPOSIT OF NIGHT-SOIL, MANURE, OFFAL, OR OTHER OFFENSIVE REFUSE.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, "An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," the council of any municipal district is authorised to pass bye-laws for the suppression of nuisances and the preservation of the public health: Be it therefore enacted by the municipal council of Maryborough, That no person shall deposit, place, or put any night-soil, manure, offal, or other offensive refuse or matter whatsoever, upon any of the unenclosed lands, or upon any public road or way within the municipality, except the public depot appointed as hereinafter directed to be the receptacle of such night-soil, offal, manure, or other offensive refuse, and any person so offending shall upon conviction forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Ten pounds: And that there shall be reserved and used for such manure depot as aforesaid, that piece or portion of land containing five acres, situate from a line commencing at the south-east corner of the second Camp Reserve, from thence bearing north by east 76 degrees 30 minutes 52 chains 40 links. And it is further ordered and directed that the publication of this bye-law in the Government Gazette, and in three successive

numbers of some public local newspaper, shall be deemed a sufficient proclamation of such dépôt for night-soil, manure, offal, or other offensive refuse.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 2, made by the municipal council of Maryborough, has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.
