## ARARAT MINING DISTRICT.

No. I.—BYE-LAW REGULATING DRY SINKINGS.—[25th March, 1858.]

At a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Ararat, begun and holden at the Camp Hotel, Oxford street, in the said district, on the 25th day of March, 1858, it was ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

1. All parties marking out claims in dry sinkings shall do so by firmly fixing four pegs in the ground, one at each extreme corner, which must be kept visible during the working of such claim or claims.

2. The extent allowed for two men shall be thirty-four feet by thirty-four feet, and no larger sized claim shall be protected under this bye-law excepting where specially provided for in bye-laws relating to hard and difficult sinkings.

3. All claims shall be marked at right angles with the supposed course of the lead, and the side of the square must in all cases run as near parallel with said course as is practicable.

4. Two feet of neutral ground shall be left between adjoining claims by the last party marking out, which may be worked by either of the adjoining parties, provided they securely prop the same so as neither to endanger life nor property.

5. When more than three feet of neutral ground has been left between any two claims, contrary to the spirit and provisions of this bye-law, it shall be lawful for any person so desiring to take possession of the same as free of annoyance as if the ground had not been marked out at all.

6. Parties wishing to measure the area of claims may do so at any time on giving notice to the owners, and in the event of their having too much ground, the claimant, or "jumper," shall have the preference as to which side or sides of the claim the spare ground, if any, shall be taken off.

7. Parties shall commence to sink their shafts within twenty-four hours of the time of marking out of their claims, and shall continue to do so every lawful day until the same is "bottomed" or abandoned.

8. Any person wilfully removing the pegs of any claim while the owners are in lawful possession of the same, shall be liable to the pains and penalties provided for breaches of by-laws and specified in the Gold Fields Act.

9. Any party sinking their shaft so near the boundary of their claim as to injure or weaken adjoining claims, shall be amenable to such claimholders for injury sustained.

10. Any claim which may have been unoccupied for the space of twenty-four hours shall be deemed forfeited to all intents and purposes, and any person may take possession of the same, except in cases where the previous occupants shall be able to establish his or their title to the claim in question under the following exemptions, namely:—Any miner or miners who may be unable to work from any accident or illness, or who shall be in attendance on any sick person or court of justice, or whose absence from his of their claim has been caused by some urgent business, the proof of which shall be upon him or them, shall be entitled to hold such claim in reserve or unworked for any reasonable length of time.
