     RULES and Regulations of the Castlemaine General Cemetery:—
           tory:—
1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before
    1. All charges must be para when orders are $1.50.50.

2. By the 8th section of the Act, "Any person making a vault, or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery by and with the permission of the trustees under these rules, and upon the payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled
    upon the payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain and keep a vault, monument or tombstone, according to the tenor of such person or persons, and his or their heirs or near relations for ever.

3. Applications for such permission to be made at the office of the trustees. A certificate of permission, in the form set out in the schedule, will be granted to the party applying for such permission, on payment of the charges in the schedule.

4. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery, on a certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence, proving to the satisfaction of the
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trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relations and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and

and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.

5. Orders for interment to be given either to the keeper at the lodge, or at the office of the trustees on the previous day.

6 The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the surveyor; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent (in writing) of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.

7. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

8. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from 10 a.m. to 6 p m., in the months of September to April inclusive, and from 10 a.m. to 4 p m. throughout the rest of the year.

9. All monuments, vaults, graves and grave stones, to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

10. Every ceffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, comented, and covered by a slab of freestone, slate or iron.

- 11. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who are required by the 8th section of the Act to determine and fix the position of any unobjectionable monument according to the description, size and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said centerry in an appropriate manner. In the crection of tablets copper cramps must be used.
- 12. No catacombs or any wooden fencing allowed without first submitting a plan for the approval of the trustees.
- 13. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.
- 14. The ground will be open daily to the public from sunrise
- 15. A plan of the cemetery, shewing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office, and may be inspected at the charge set out in the schedule, and registers of all grants are kept by the secretary.
- 16. Any person who shall wantonly or wilfully destroy, or do or cause to be done any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, recetion, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant, will be proceeded against as directed by the 14th section of the Act of Council.
- 17. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these rules and regulations.

On the 9th December a petition was presented from various ratepayers requesting the council would previde a race-course as a place of public amusement. The course having been given this year by the proprietor, the difficulty was temporarily avoided, but the council are taking steps to provide a place for public amusement for the inhabitants.

PUBLIC WORKS

The contracts in hand at the end of the last half-year for the performance of works on the Rosebrook road, Belfast East, Yambuk road, and in the town, have since been satisfactorily completed, and the contractors paid.

A contract of Lee and Hagerty to do certain town works for £1200 has been also satisfactorily completed.

Contracts have been taken by Gorringe and Brittain for repairs to the bridge over the Moyne for £40.

Messrs. Lee and Hagerty have taken a contract for works, on the Rosebrook road for £870, and for supplying 250 cubic yards of blue stone metal at 13s. 6d. per yard.

The council has during this half-year expended £1461 14s. 9d. in day labor, under the superintendence of the surveyor. £515 6d. of which has been expended in Belfast East, and £946 8s. 9d. in town improvements.

The council regret to report that while material suitable for the purpose of road making exists in abundance within the boundaries of the municipality, the defective state of the Municipal Act prevents their availing themselves of its advantages. A long correspondence with Mr. Woodward, the agent of the proprietor, was entered into for the purpose of submitting the valuation of the material to arbitration, which was agreed upon, but the whole matter was ultimately upset by Mr. Woodward having repudiated this arrangement, though originally proposed by himself.

MISCELLANDOUS.

The council have had communications with the Solicitor General, and suggested various alterations in the Municipalities Act, which it is very desirable should be amended during the present session of the Legislature.

On the 6th October, a conference was held with the Warnambool Municipal Council and the Belfast District Road Board, on the subject of the application to Government to place money on the Estimates for a road to the gold fields, and it was agreed that application should be made for £100,000 for the purpose.

A committee has been appointed to enquire into and report upon the best site for the establishment of a public bathing place, and the probable expense thereof.
