WATER FRONTAGES.

IT is hereby notified that in all future land sales a continuous reserve of not less than 100 feet in width will be made along the sea coast, the banks of all navigable rivers and creeks, and also along the banks of such rivers and creeks as may appear to be capable of being hereafter rendered available for water carriage.

Also that along the course of all minor rivers and creeks detached water reserves will be made at an average distance of one mile asunder, measured in a straight line.

ADMISSION OF INSANE PERSONS INTO THE LUNATIC ASYLUM.

HIS Excellency the Governor has approved of the subjoined regulations respecting the admission of Insane Persons into the Lunatic Asylum, under the 13th clause of the Act 7 Victoria No. 14, at the instance of relatives or friends; in lieu of former regulations on the same subject, to take effect from the 1st of June next, viz.:

A petition is to be signed by some relative or friend of the lunatic, and appended to a certificate of insanity, signed by two legally qualified medical practitioners. The papers are then to be submitted for the approval of one of the Judges of the Supreme Court, and, when thus completed, forwarded to the Chief Medical Officer, Melbourne, from whom information can be obtained as to when the patient can be admitted to the Asylum.

In the case of pay patients, the charges for maintenance are—
1st class £2 per week.
2nd class 25s. per week

payable quarterly to the Surgeon Superintendent of the Lunatic Asylum, and a bond for the regular payment of that sum is to be entered into by two responsible persons, and deposited with the superintendent.

In the case of those patients whose friends are unable to pay for their maintenance in the Asylum, a certificate to that effect, signed by some respectable person acquainted with the circumstances of the lunatic, is to be annexed to the petition.

The forms of petition, certificate, and bond can be obtained from the Chief Medical Officer, or the Surgeon Superintendent of the Asylum.

SUNKEN REEF OFF APOLLO BAY.

WITH reference to the notice of 23rd October, 1857, respecting the Sunken Reef off Apollo Bay, the following notification is now published for the information of mariners, describing certain beacons which have been erected to mark the position of the reef in question.

By His Excellency's Command,
HENRY MILLER.

1. Commanders of vessels navigating between Cape Otway and Port Phillip Heads are hereby informed that Four Pillar Beacons, each surmounted with a Ball, have been erected on the coast, to mark the position of a sunken danger, now known as Henry's Reef, lying eleven miles north 54° 30' east from Cape Otway Lighthouse, and about two miles south 40° 30' east from Cape Bunbury, which forms the south-east point of Apollo Bay. This reef has not more than eighteen feet of water over it, is steep too, having ten fathoms all round within a cable's length of its shoalest part, and as the sea only breaks on the reef occasionally in bad weather, vessels must give it a good berth in passing.

2. The abovementioned beacons are erected, two on Point Hayley, situated about nine miles north-east from Cape Otway, and two on Cape Bunbury, situated about eleven miles north-east from Cape Otway.

3. The Point Hayley beacons are painted, the inshore one white, the seaward one black; they are six hundred feet apart, and bear from each other east a quarter north, and west a quarter south.

4. The Cape Bunbury Beacons are painted, the inshore one white, the seaward one red; they are six hundred feet apart, and bear from each other south-east half south, and north-west half north.

5. The position of the reef is marked by the intersection of two lines, the one drawn through the beacons on Point Hayley, the other through the beacons on Cape Bunbury.

6. Vessels bound to the north-east must keep the black beacon on point Hayley well open to the northward of the white one until the white beacon on Cape Bunbury opens well out to the north-east of the red beacon.

7. Vessels bound to the south-west must keep the red beacon on Cape Bunbury well open to the southward of the white one until the white beacon on Point Hayley opens out well to the south-west of the black beacon.

Commanders of vessels can have the position of this reef marked on their charts at the Office of Ports and Harbors, Williamstown.

The depths are at low-water spring tides; bearings are by compass.

PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "An Act for the Establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," it was amongst other things enacted that nothing in the said Act contained should authorise the interference by any municipal council constituted under the said Act, with any public place or building, of what description soever, not erected or constructed by such municipal council, that might be excepted from the jurisdiction of such municipal council by any Proclamation made or to be made by the Lieutenant Governor: And whereas it is deemed expedient to exempt the places and buildings hereinafter mentioned from the jurisdiction of the council of the municipal district of Beechworth: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do, by this my Proclamation, with the advice of the Executive Council, except from the jurisdiction of the municipal council of Beechworth the following public places and buildings situate and being within the said municipal district, that is to say:—

The land occupied by the society known as "The Young Men's Association," situate in Lock street, Beechworth, and the buildings thereon.

The land and premises belonging to the society known as "The Mechanics' Institute," situate in Lock street, Beechworth.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this fourth day of May, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, and in the twenty-first year of Her Majesty's Reign.

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," it was amongst other things enacted that nothing in the said Act contained should authorise the interference, by any municipal council constituted under the said Act, with any public place or building, of what description soever, not erected or constructed by such municipal council, that might be excepted from the jurisdiction of such municipal council by any Proclamation made or to be made by the Lieutenant Governor: And whereas it is deemed expedient to exempt the place hereinafter mentioned from the jurisdiction of the council of the municipal district of East Collingwood: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do, by this my Proclamation, with the advice of the Executive Council, except from the jurisdiction of the municipal council of East Collingwood the following public place, situate and being within the said municipal district, that is to say:—

A piece of land situate on the east side of Smith street, East Collingwood, held in trust for the purpose of erecting upon it a Mechanics' Institute, and all erections and buildings now or hereafter thereon, so long as such land and premises are applied to the purposes of a Mechanics' Institute.

MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS.

FITZ ROY WARD, MELBOURNE.—SECOND PETITION.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by sixteen hundred and ninety householders and ratepayers of Fitz Roy Ward, in the city of Melbourne, praying for separation from the said city, and the erection of the said ward into a distinct municipality.

The petitioners state that after carefully considering the existing management and financial position of the corporation of Melbourne, they are fully convinced as to the necessity for immediate separation therefrom, and the erection of their ward into a separate municipality, for the following reasons, viz:—

1. The present revenue of the city is insufficient to meet current expenses and to keep the made streets in moderate repair, there remaining, according to the statement of the finance committee, after paying interest and the cost of management, and of cleansing streets, but £2000 for repairs throughout the city during the current year.

2. In addition to the Gabrielli loan, the corporation at present owe £20,000.

3. During 1857, a sum of over £5000 was contributed by Fitz Roy ward to the city funds, and a sum of less than £1500 was expended by the corporation on the ward.

4. During the present year the rates of Fitz Roy ward will exceed £7000, of which there is no probability that the corporation will expend more than £1500 on the ward; but, if the ward be detached from the city, there will remain, after deducting the interest on the ward's share of the Gabrielli loan, upwards of £5000 for the use of the separate municipality.

5. The ward is both politically and geographically separated from the city.

6. The ward, containing as it does, 13½ miles of streets and 12,000 inhabitants, is sufficiently important to require distinct local management. Its prosperity, too, will be greatly furthered by speedy and entire separation from the city.

7. Through the inability of the corporation to carry out the necessary works, large quantities of stagnant water have accumulated in the lower or northern parts of the ward, to the serious injury of the health and property of the inhabitants of the contiguous localities.

8. Fitz Roy ward is at present entirely destitute of market accommodation.

9. The want of a local police court and of a small debts court is felt to be a source of serious inconvenience, the Melbourne Courts being too remote.

10. The opposition formerly offered to separation from the city is now withdrawn, nearly the whole of the ratepayers and freeholders being unanimous in favor of separation.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners therefore pray that your Excellency would be pleased to take their case into your most favorable consideration, and cause the necessary steps to be taken to have the Fitz Roy ward district proclaimed a distinct municipality, with the following extension of its boundaries, to obviate objections from the city council of Melbourne, namely:— That its southern boundary be the centre of Victoria parade in lieu of the north side line of the same; its western boundary be the centre line of Nicholson street, continued to the centre of Reilly street northwards, in lieu of the east side line of the said street; that the eastern boundary be the centre of Smith street, continued in a straight line to the centre of Reilly street, and its northern boundary be the centre of Reilly street."

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by seven hundred and thirty-nine householders of Hotham ward, in the city of Melbourne, and praying that their ward may be erected into a separate municipality.

The petitioners recite a portion of the abovementioned Act, and solicit that the substance and prayer of their petition may be published with a view to the erection of the following district into a distinct municipality, viz:—Commencing at the north-western angle of the existing municipal boundaries of Melbourne; thence by the Moonee Moonee Ponds to the site of Main's bridge; thence by a line south of a point due west of the northern side of Victoria street; thence by a line east and by the northern side of Victoria street aforesaid to Elizabeth street; thence northwards by the western sides of Elizabeth street and the Sydney road to the northern boundary of the existing municipality; and thence west by the northern boundary of the existing municipality to the commencing point.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"May it therefore please your Excellency, with the advice of the Executive Council, to take the premises into your gracious consideration, and cause the advertisement of the substance and prayer of this petition to be made in the *Government Gazette*, as required by statute; and in due time thereafter, if there be no counter petition signed by a greater majority of householders of Hotham Ward, and delivered, then, in pursuance of the aforesaid statute, to proclaim the locality presently known as and called Hotham ward, to be a municipal district and township under such name as your Excellency shall adopt, all within the meaning of the said statute; or to do, order, and proclaim otherwise in the premises as it may seem meet to your Excellency, with the advice of the Executive Council."

ONE HUNDRED POUNDS REWARD.—FREE PARDON TO AN ACCOMPLICE.

WHEREAS the remains of a human skeleton, partly consumed by fire, have been recently found in the Jim Crow Forest, in the police district of Carlisle; and whereas the said remains are supposed to be those of Edward Fisher, carrier, who left Malmesbury (Columbine or Coliban), with a loaded dray and three horses, on the 9th day of June, 1855, with the intention of proceeding to Hepburn (or the Jim Crow gold fields), and has not since been heard of: Notice is hereby given that a reward of One hundred pounds will be paid to any person giving such information as will lead to the apprehension and conviction of the person or persons who murdered the said Edward Fisher, assuming that the said Edward Fisher has been murdered.

PARTICULARS.

The particulars furnished at the time when Edward Fisher was missed (in June, 1855), were as follow:—
"Edward Fisher, when last seen, wore a brown great coat, black south-wester, and yellow leather gaiters. His height was 5 feet 7 inches, complexion fair, hair sandy colored. The dray was a common wharf dray, marked on each side with the words and figures, 'Fisher, Prahran, 2284,' and drawn by three horses; one large brown horse, marked JP on near shoulder, & on off shoulder; a chesnut horse, marked W on near shoulder; and another chesnut horse, marked S on near shoulder."

MUNICIPALITY OF EMERALD HILL.

BYE-LAW No. 19.*—A BYE-LAW FOR THE CONDUCTING OF PUBLIC MEETINGS OF THE RATEPAYERS AND OF ELECTIONS OF MEMBERS OF COUNCIL, FOR DETERMINING THE VALIDITY OF DISPUTED ELECTIONS, AND ALSO FOR REGULATING THE PROCEEDINGS AT THE ELECTION OF CHAIRMAN.

A T all public meetings of the ratepayers convened by the council or the chairman for the election of councillors or other municipal business, the chairman, or in his absence the senior councillor then present, shall preside, and in case of an equality of votes shall have a casting vote.

2. When a poll is demanded at any nomination of members of council, the proceedings thenceforward, and the poll taken, shall be conducted, *mutatis mutandis*, in the manner prescribed in sections 34, 35, 36, 37, 38, 39, 41, 45, 49 and 50, of the Act of the Legislature 19th Victoria No. 12.

In the application of the provisions of the said Act, for the purposes of this bye-law, the following words and phrases in the Act shall have the meaning hereinafter mentioned, viz. :—

A. The "returning officer" shall mean the chairman of the council, or in the event of his illness, absence, or other inability to preside, any member of the council appointed by the council for the purpose.

B. The word "province" or "district" shall mean "municipality."

C. The words "roll" or "electoral roll" shall mean the "ratepayers' roll."

D. The words "legislative council" or "legislative assembly" shall mean "municipal council."

3. The chairman or deputy chairman shall, if requested, put the following questions to the voter before voting.—

(1.) Are you the person whose name appears on the ratepayers' roll numbered ?

(2.) Have you voted before at this election ?

4. At all elections, in case of equality of votes being recorded for two or more candidates, the chairman shall give the casting vote or votes.

5. For determining the validity of disputed elections, the whole council (the member or members whose election is disputed excepted) shall be a committee of elections and qualifications, four to form a quorum, at which the chairman of the council, or, if absent at the commencement of proceedings, the senior councillor present, shall preside, and in all cases of equality of votes shall have a casting vote.

6. The committee shall meet in the council chamber on days not appointed for the holding of council meetings, and be attended by the town clerk, who shall record the minutes of every such meeting.

7. The chairman of his own authority may, or on the written request of three members to him to that effect shall, convene meetings of committees of elections, &c.

8. The committee shall have power to regulate their proceedings and to adjourn their meetings, which shall be held with open doors, unless during special deliberations.

9. Each member of committee present shall be required to vote.

10. The ratepayers' roll shall be assumed to be correct, and the committee shall enquire into the identity of the electors, and whether the votes were *bona fide*. If proved to the satisfaction of the committee that persons by fraud, force, menace, or any undue influence by or on the part of any candidate or his agent, gave their votes, such votes shall be struck off.

11. The acts of authorized agents shall be regarded as those of the principal, if it be proved to the satisfaction of the committee that they were performed with his knowledge, power, or consent.

12. The person determined by the committee to be duly elected shall be declared so to be by the chairman.

13. All petitions complaining of an undue election must be signed by a candidate, or by not less than six ratepayers, and be presented within fourteen days after the election complained of.

14. Ratepayers may be admitted to defend the election or support the petition, if it be abandoned by the person or persons originally presenting it.

15. Written declarations of vacancies in the council, resulting from disqualification by absence or otherwise, may be made by the chairman and one or more councillors, and countersigned by the town clerk.

16. Resignation of membership of council shall be made in writing, addressed to the chairman of the council, and be presented by him to the council at the next meeting thereafter for their ordering on the same.

17. The chairman of the council shall be annually elected in the following manner.—At the first meeting of council after the annual election, which meeting shall be convened by the retiring chairman, or the person presiding at the annual election, the senior councillor then present shall take the chair at the hour mentioned in the notice calling the meeting, provided the whole council is present; otherwise, at the expiry of half an hour thereafter; and the council shall proceed by open voting, on motion as usual, to elect a chairman for the current year; and the councillor in whose favor the shew of hands shall be, shall be declared by the acting chairman to be chairman of the council for the current year, and shall take the chair accordingly.

18. If the result of voting for chairman should be that the highest number of votes is held equally by more than two councillors, then another voting shall take place for those councillors only holding such equality of votes until a majority is recorded, the chairman giving a casting vote in addition to his own in case of an equality of votes on the final division.

19. Upon the resignation or disqualification of the chairman of the council, at the next meeting of the council thereafter, the senior councillor then present shall take the chair *pro tem.*, and immediately after the confirmation of the minutes of the preceding meeting, shall proceed to the election of a chairman of council for the residue of the municipal year, in manner prescribed by this bye-law, and in the event of an equality of votes being recorded, shall have a casting vote in addition to his own.

20. In determining the seniority of councillors, for the purposes of this bye-law, it shall be understood to mean those councillors who shall have held office for the longest period without re-election, and having the greatest number of votes when elected.
