## THE PHENIX GOLD MINING COMPANY.

NOTICES AND RULES OF THE PHENIX GOLD MINING COMPANY.  
 (Gazetted pursuant to 18 Victoria No. 42.)

To the Clerk of Petty Sessions for the district of Taradale.  
 WE, the several persons whose names and addresses are set forth in the schedule hereunder written, being desirous of forming a company under the provisions of the "Act for the better regulation of Mining Companies," 18 Victoria No. 42, for the purpose of working a certain reef situated at Taradale, commonly known as Taradale reef, in the district of Taradale, hereby give notice as follows, viz.:—  
 1st. That this company be styled, "The Phoenix Gold Mining Company."  
 2nd. The reef proposed to be worked by the said company is situated at Taradale, and is commonly known as Taradale reef, aforesaid.  
 3rd. The names and residences of the shareholders for the time being, and the number of shares held by each, are respectively set forth in the second schedule hereto.

4th. The capital already subscribed amounts to Five thousand one hundred and ninety-three pounds, and the proposed amount of capital is Five thousand seven hundred and seventy pounds.

5th. The names and addresses of the manager, accountant, treasurer, machinist, and foreman of mines, are respectively set forth in the first schedule hereto.

6th. This company is formed for the purpose of working an auriferous reef on the system of a joint stock company, and, for the better security of shareholders, is proposed to be registered under the provisions of an Act of Council of the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, No. 42, intituled, "*An Act for the better regulation of Mining Companies.*"

7th. The company is formed for the purpose of working mines on the cost-book system, under the provisions of the "*Act for the better regulation of Mining Companies.*" The following are the rules of the said company:—

#### RULES.

1. That there shall be a general meeting of shareholders once every two months, the first meeting to be held on the 1st day of May ensuing. The 1st day of May, 1st day of July, 1st day of September, 1st day of November, 1st day of January, and the 1st day of March, shall be the days for holding the meetings of this company, and in the event of the 1st day of the above-mentioned months falling on a Sunday, the meeting to be held on the following day, to be summoned by advertisement in any one of the local papers circulating in the district.

2. That the manager be empowered to call special general meetings, on the requisition in writing of the holders of one-fourth of the whole shares of the company being presented to him, and each shareholder must hold not less than one share.

3. That each shareholder be allowed to exercise votes in the following manner:—2 shares, 1 vote; 5 shares, 2 votes; 8 shares, 3 votes; 12 shares, 4 votes; 17 shares, 5 votes; 21 shares, 6 votes; 26 shares, 7 votes; 30 shares, 8 votes; 35 shares, 9 votes; 40 shares, 10 votes; 45 shares, 11 votes; 50 shares, 12 votes; 55 shares, 13 votes; 60 shares, 14 votes; 65 shares, 15 votes; 70 shares, 16 votes; 76 shares, 17 votes; 82 shares, 18 votes; 87 shares, 19 votes; 93 shares, 20 votes; 99 shares, 21 votes; 104 shares, 22 votes; 110 shares, 23 votes; 116 shares, 24 votes; 121 shares, 25 votes; 127 shares, 26 votes; 132 shares, 27 votes; 138 shares, 28 votes; 144 shares, 29 votes; 149 shares, 30 votes; 155 shares, 31 votes; 160 shares, 32 votes; and no shareholder to be allowed to record more than 32 votes, and shareholders to be allowed to vote by proxy, provided such proxies be in writing, and deposited with the manager of the company.

4. That one-half of the shareholders form a quorum at any general or special general meeting, for inspecting and passing the accounts of the manager, and transacting the ordinary business of the company, and for removing or appointing a manager, an accountant, a treasurer, a machinist, or a foreman of mines, and for making calls or declaring dividends, and reviewing the acts and proceedings of the board of management.

5. That the officers of this company consist of a manager, an accountant, a treasurer, a machinist, and foreman of mines; these five to form the board of management. The duties of such board shall be to meet semi-monthly, for the purpose of making bye-laws, to be approved or rejected at the next general meeting, for making provision for the working of the mines and machinery for the ensuing two weeks, and for reviewing the acts and proceedings of the manager for the past two weeks; and the manager shall have power to call a meeting of the board, by circular, at any time.

6. That the form of transfer of shares in this company be as in the Act 18 Victoria No. 42, "*An Act for the better regulation of Mining Companies,*" as set forth in the abovenamed Act in the schedule marked A, but no share or shares shall be so transferred unless all calls and dues are paid on any such share or shares.

7. The duty of the manager shall be to keep or cause to be kept in the company's office, a book, in which shall be entered the name and place of business of the company, the capital of the company, the number of shares into which it is divided, the names and residences of the shareholders, the number of shares held by each shareholder, and the account of each with the company; all transfers of shares, the minutes of all general and special general meetings of the shareholders, and a debtor and creditor account of all disbursements and receipts of the company, and of all sums owing to the company or by the company, which book may be inspected by shareholders every lawful day from Ten o'clock a.m. to Four o'clock p.m.

8. The manager shall keep or cause to be kept a monthly list, containing the names and addresses of all shareholders for the time being, which shall be kept at the company's office, and may be inspected by any person on the payment of Two shillings and sixpence.

9. The manager shall make or cause to be made out, once in every two months, a balance-sheet of the accounts of the mines, and also a report of the works, which balance-sheet and report shall be submitted to the general meetings of the shareholders.

10. That in the event of any shareholder or shareholders neglecting or refusing to pay up any call on his or their share or shares, the manager shall give him or them notices in writing, and if payment is not made within ten days, the manager shall proceed against him or them, as set forth in the Act 18 Victoria No. 42, "*An Act for the better regulation of Mining Companies.*"

11. That the Phoenix Gold Mining Company be a company

for the space of seven years, and not to be dissolved before the expiration of that period, unless three-fourths of the shareholders of the company are of the opinion that the ground on which the company is working is wrought out. The mode of dissolution in either case to be:—The company's whole effects to be sold by public auction, and the proceeds of such sale to be divided among the shareholders in proportion to the interest held by them in the company.

12. The rules of this company may be altered at any general meeting of the shareholders, the holders of the majority of all the shares in the company voting in favor of such alteration.

6. Requesting that the railway jetty erected at Greenwich might be purchased for the use of the inhabitants of North Williamstown.—Declined for want of funds.
7. For a portion of land at North Williamstown for a park.—Second application acceded to.
8. For a site for a cemetery.—Granted.
9. Requesting that Williamstown might be gazetted as a place for the establishment of a Court for the recovery of small debts.—Not necessary, the 22nd clause of the County Court Act having given the jurisdiction sought.
10. For a cricket ground.—Refused.
11. For a portion of the grant in aid for 1858.—£1750 has been received on account of the grant.
12. Enclosing a plan of Williamstown, and requesting that certain streets might be gazetted.—Complied with.

#### BYE-LAWS.

The following bye-laws have been passed by the council, of which four have received the assent of His Excellency the Governor:—

No. 20. For regulating the market for the sale of garden and farm produce, &c.—Gazetted 23rd February, 1858.

No. 25. To regulate the erection of buildings so as to prevent the crowding of dwellings in narrow rights-of-way, courts, or alleys.—Returned as being *ultra vires*.

No. 26. To authorise the enclosing of the footpath, or road, or street, in front of any building in course of erection.—Gazetted 27th November, 1857.

No. 27. To authorise the council to lay trunks or pipes, and make drains to carry off water from unoccupied lands, or from premises where the owner, occupier, or agent refuse to drain the same.—Returned with the intimation that further legislation is necessary before it could be assented to.

No. 28. To provide for the construction and maintenance of streets, common rights-of-way, courts and alleys in or through private property, and for the cleansing and draining of the same.—Returned as being illegal.

No. 29. To enable the council to borrow not exceeding £2000 for the purpose of enclosing the market ground and erecting stalls and sheds thereon.—Gazetted 31st December, 1857.

No. 30. For regulating bathing on or near the shores of Port Phillip and Hobson's Bays, in or adjacent to the municipal district of Williamstown, and for the conservation of public decency.—Returned as being *ultra vires*.

No. 31. To authorise the council to place numbers on the doors of all dwellings within the municipal district.—Returned as being *ultra vires*.

No. 33. For the establishment and regulation of a fire brigade.—Returned as being *ultra vires*.

No. 34. For regulating the slaughter of cattle, and for preventing the accumulation of offal and other offensive matter in and about slaughter-houses, yards, &c.—Under the consideration of the law officers of the Crown.

The rules and regulations for the management of the New Cemetery were gazetted on the 9th March, 1858.

#### PUBLIC WORKS.

The length of path works formed and partly metalled during the last half-year is upwards of one mile and a half, as follows:—

1. West side of the Strand, from Ferguson street to Yarra street.
2. Cecil street north, west side.
3. Electra street, west side.
4. John street, from Douglas parade to Dover road, both sides.

5. Part of Pasco street, both sides.

6. Part of Dover place.

Making the total length of pathways now formed eleven miles and fourteen chains.

The following road works have been executed during the half-year, viz.:—

1. Ann street, from Nelson place to Hammer street.
2. Cecil street, from Morris street to Ferguson street.
3. Nelson place and Ferguson street, from the Bank of Australasia to James street.
4. Ferguson street, from Douglas parade to the railway.
5. Dover road, from Stevedore street to John street.

The council, impressed with the necessity which exists for carrying on additional works before the winter sets in, has called for tenders for the formation of the following, viz.:-

## FINANCE.

A sum of £1750 on account of the first half-yearly instalment of the legislative grant has been received; the remaining portion of it the council expect to obtain during the present month.

The second half-yearly instalment of £500 was duly paid to the English, Scottish and Australian Chartered Bank, on the 11th March, being in part repayment of the £5000 loan.

## CEMETERY.

A grant of fifteen acres to the westward of the Ferguson street railway crossing has been received from the Government for a cemetery, and a sum of money amounting to £340 advanced for enclosing and laying it out. A contract has been accepted for fencing it in, which is now nearly completed. Six interments have already been made.

## PUBLIC GARDEN.

The reserve for a public garden, on the south side of the railway, has been fenced in at a cost of £220, defrayed by the Government, and steps will be taken as early as possible for planting it with trees and shrubs.

## MARKET.

The site for a market has been proclaimed, and a bye-law has been assented to for regulating it; another bye-law has also been gazetted, to enable the council to borrow money for the erection of stalls and sheds.

## EXTENSION OF PIERS.

The Ann street Jetty has been carried out with stone a distance of about 150 feet, and a contract has just been accepted for extending it with piles 150 feet, into 18 feet of water. The Railway Pier at the Point is in an advanced state of completion—the American ship *Wellfleet* having already hauled alongside to discharge her cargo. The Steamboat Wharf is in a very dilapidated condition, but steps have been taken to induce the Government to repair and extend it.

## POLICE COURTS.

Municipal and district courts have been erected during the half-year, in Thompson street, where the public business is now conducted.

## PETITIONS.

The following petitions have been forwarded by and through the council since the publication of the last report, viz.:-

1. To the Legislative Assembly, praying that Williamstown might not be annexed to Sandridge and Emerald Hill in one electoral district.
2. To His Excellency the Governor, praying that Crawford A. D. Pasco, R.N., might be retained as police magistrate for the district.
3. To the Postmaster-General in England, praying that a separate mail might be made up for this place.

With reference to the last petition, a reply has been received, stating that there is not a sufficient number of letters directed to Williamstown to warrant a compliance with the prayer.

## ELECTIONS.

Councillor Verdon having resigned his seat on the 24th December, 1857, the nomination to fill the vacancy was held at the Athenæum on the 21st January, 1858, when Messrs. Gallpen, La Roche, and Barnes were nominated; a poll having been demanded, resulted as follows—Mr. La Roche, 119 votes; Mr. Gallpen, 97 votes; Mr. Barnes, 0, he having withdrawn from the contest immediately after the nomination. The nomination of candidates to fill the vacancies at the last general election, took place at the Athenæum on the 5th April, when Messrs. Mason, Verdon, La Roche, Moxham, White, and Knight were duly proposed. A poll having been demanded, the following was the result:—For Mr. Mason, 255 votes; Mr. Verdon, 232; Mr. Moxham, 206; Mr. La Roche, 170; Mr. White, 114; Mr. Knight, 44. The declaration of the poll was made on the evening of the same day at the Athenæum, when the three first-named gentlemen were declared duly elected to serve in the place of the three retiring candidates, and the fourth in the place of Councillor Jones, resigned.

## CHAIRMAN OF THE COUNCIL.

The first meeting of the council, after the general election, was held on the 7th April, when Councillor Thomas Stewart,

J.P., was duly elected chairman of the council for the current municipal year.

## MUNICIPAL OFFICES.

The council, as stated in its last report, being desirous of reducing the cost of its establishment, has taken possession of the Municipal Court with the offices attached to it; the Court House answering the purpose of a Council Chamber, and one of the offices has been converted into a Town Clerk's office. A contract has also been accepted for the erection of a Town Surveyor's office on the Town-hall reserve, at a cost of £145.

The council is gratified at being able to acknowledge the prompt willingness with which the ratepayers have paid the rates for the last half-year. The cordial assistance and support which has at all times been afforded to the council by the people, is accepted as additional evidence not only of the good feeling existing between the council and its constituents, but as a most satisfactory proof of the general well working of municipal institutions, and of the public esteem in which they are held.
