WHEREAS by an Act passed in the fifteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "*An Act to make provision for the better administration of Justice in the colony of Victoria*," it is lawful for the Governor, by any orders to be by him, with the advice of the Executive Council, from time to time made and proclaimed, to define the times at which Circuit Courts shall be holden, and the said times to alter and vary as he shall, with the advice aforesaid, deem necessary: And whereas it is expedient to alter and vary the times at which the next Circuit Courts for Geelong, Ballaarat, Castlemaine and Sandhurst have been directed to be holden: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that the times appointed for holding the next Circuit Courts respectively at the several places hereinafter mentioned shall be postponed as follows, that is to say:—At Geelong, from Tuesday, the eighth day of June, to Friday, the eleventh day of June next; at Ballaarat, from Thursday, the seventeenth day of June, to Monday, the twenty-first day of June next; at Castlemaine, from Saturday, the twenty-sixth day of June, to Wednesday, the thirtieth day of June next; and at Sandhurst, from Monday, the fifth day of July, to Friday, the ninth day of July next.

And the Honorable Henry Samuel Chapman, Her Majesty's Attorney General for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

SECTIONS V. TO X. OF TOWN AND COUNTRY POLICE ACT EXTENDED TO THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF BRUNSWICK.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "*An Act to provide for the Management of Towns and*

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"other places in Victoria," it was amongst other things enacted, that so many of the provisions of the said Act as relate to the good order of towns and other populous places, being sections numbered V., VI., VII., VIII., IX. and X. in the said Act, should extend to and be in force in such cities, towns, districts, and places as the Lieutenant Governor might by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare to come under the operation of the same respectively, or any of them, and that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor to define the limits of such places: Now I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, with the advice of the Executive Council, declare and appoint that the sections of the said Act, being numbered V., VI., VII., VIII., IX. and X., shall extend to and be in force within the limits of the municipal district of Brunswick, in the county of Bourke.

MARYBOROUGH MUNICIPALITY.

SECOND HALF-YEARLY REPORT OF THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE MARYBOROUGH MUNICIPAL COUNCIL FOR THE HALF-YEAR ENDING 4TH OF MAY, 1858.

SINCE the publication of the first half-yearly report, the council, having used its best endeavors, with the limited funds at its disposal, to improve in every possible respect the more frequented portions of the streets, has great pleasure in congratulating the ratepayers on the marked improvement which has been effected in the town since the formation of the municipality, affording in all quarters increased confidence in the importance and stability of the place.

The delay in the permanent formation of the High street has arisen, in the first place, from the disinclination of the council to distress holders of property encroaching on the street by too peremptory an order for removal; and, in the second place, by the delay on the part of the Board of Land and Works in appropriating the money grant for this purpose.

In accordance with the bye-law of the council to that effect, the holders of property encroaching in any way on the street are compelled under a penalty to move back to the building line on or before the 1st of July next.

The council therefore only awaits the removal of obstructions and the completion of the roadway to properly make the footpaths, as well as to carry out an efficient mode of kerbing and channelling.

It has also been suggested by the council that the unexpended balance of the sum voted for the construction of the road through the town should be appropriated to the formation of additional culverts at points where they are most urgently needed. The matter has been referred to the district road surveyor for his report thereon.

The council not feeling satisfied with the original plan of the municipal boundaries (which comprised scarcely half the area permitted by the Act), and such limited boundaries proving extremely inconvenient to numbers of residents, an extended survey has been made, and a petition in accordance with the 3rd section of the Municipal Act forwarded, praying that the boundaries may be altered and fixed as follows:—

Commencing at the rear of the Camp Hotel, from thence bearing south 285 chains, from thence bearing north 45 degrees east 240 chains, from thence bearing north 45 degrees west 240 chains, from thence bearing south 45 degrees west 240 chains, and from thence bearing south 45 degrees east 240 chains.

MEETINGS.

There have been twenty-four meetings held during the half-year, two having lapsed, there being no quorum.

There were also two special meetings at which all the members of council attended.

BYE-LAWS.

The following bye-laws have been passed by the council:—
No. 2.—For regulating the deposit of night-soil, manure, offal, or other offensive refuse.

No. 8.—For the appropriation of the first moiety of the grant in aid.

No. 9.—To regulate the erection of shades or awnings, and prevent any obstructions upon, over, or across the public footpaths.

No. 10.—For licensing and regulating nightmen carters.

PUBLIC WORKS.

In the prosecution of public works, the council has confined improvements, in the first place, to those parts of the town more immediately central, and where the greatest amount of traffic exists.

The following works have either been completed or are now in progress, viz.:—

1. The formation of crossings and culverts over the leads forming the approaches to Hospital, Nolan, and Inkerman streets.

No. 71.—JUNE 1ST, 1858.—3.

2. The filling up and forming roads across the various leads in the direction of Amberst, Alma, Chinaman's Flat, McCullum's Creek, and the neighboring diggings.

3. Filling up holes and metalling roads where required, in the surrounding district.

4. Clearing Clarendon street of manure and other offensive refuse.

5. Grubbing stumps and forming Clarendon street, from Nightingale to Inkerman street, 20 chains.

6. The forming and metalling Nolan street, from the Main Lead to Clarendon street, 10½ chains.

7. Building three stone culverts in Clarendon street, together 114 yards.

8. Building stone culvert down Nolan street, chains from the High street to Alma street, 61 yards.

9. The erection of a Town-hall in Clarendon street (not yet completed).

The council has deemed it necessary on several occasions to send deputations to Melbourne, for the purpose of more urgently representing the claims and requirements of the town and district, and a reference to the above report will show that they have been eminently successful in their endeavors.

APPLICATIONS TO GOVERNMENT (GRANTED).

1. For the erection of a lock-up on the reserve for public purposes, in the centre of the town.

2. For building a court of petty sessions and court of mines.

3. For reserves for municipal chambers, literary institute, market, cemetery, manure depot, and other public purposes.

4. For an increased sum for the erection and maintenance the post office.

5. For the extension of the Dog Nuisance Act to Maryborough.

6. For a further sum out of the grant in aid of municipalities created during 1857.

7. For the withdrawal from sale and reserve of certain allotments of land in the parishes of Rodborough and Craigie, required by this district for the purpose of a water supply.

8. For the extension of the line of telegraph to Maryborough.

9. For the erection of county court and court of general sessions within the town.

10. For an enlarged lock-up to be built of stone instead of wood, as originally contemplated by the Government.

11. For the building a survey office.

12. For a complete survey of the town.

13. For the sale of town allotments in Alma street.

14. For the immediate expenditure of the money grant for roads in and about Maryborough.

The following public buildings are now being built, namely, survey office and guard room, while tenders have been called for the erection of court of general sessions, post office, and lock-up.

APPLICATIONS REFUSED OR NOT YET COMPLIED WITH.

1. To build municipal chambers on portion of town reserve fronting Clarendon street.—Refused.

2. For power to license and direct the working of stone quarries within the municipal district.

3. For a Government survey of the reserved land through which it is proposed to bring the water supply into Maryborough.—Deferred to await the report of the water supply commission.

4. For appropriation of balance of road grant to the formation of additional culverts in the High street.—Referred for report of district road surveyor.

5. For establishment of a direct mail to Ararat *via* Avoca.—Under the consideration of the Postmaster General.

6. That the reserve for public purposes might be under the supervision and control of the municipal council.

FINANCE.

On the 3rd day of March, 1858, the council received a further sum of £500, on account of the vote of 1857.

The Honorable the Treasurer having required a return of the amount of rates actually collected up to the 30th of April, the council applied for an extension of the time, in order that as much of the rate as possible might be got in.

It is to be regretted that this was refused, inasmuch as it is proposed to base the grants to municipalities for 1858 on the returns made.

MUNICIPAL CHAMBERS.

The town-hall and municipal offices are now in course of erection, and will be opened for public purposes in about a fortnight. The new building will afford increased accommodation both to the municipal council and the public; a great saving will also be effected in the item of rent.

CEMETERY.

In consequence of the shallow nature of the ground in the cemetery in common use, the council applied for a reserve for this purpose, and an eligible piece of ground has been determined on, and tenders called for enclosing same.

WATER SUPPLY.

This question has for some time occupied the attention of the council, who are fully impressed with the imperative necessity of procuring for the town and district, as speedily as possible, an ample supply of water both for domestic and mining purposes.

With this view, steps were taken to ascertain the quantity of water to be derived from certain springs distant about nine miles

from the town, and a survey having been made by Mr. English, that gentleman reported "that having gauged the springs, and taken the levels of the line by which the water would have to be brought into the town, he had arrived at the satisfactory conclusion, that the supply was ample for the requirements of the district, and that there was a sufficient declivity to carry the water without mechanical aid to within about two miles of the town."

An application was made to the Board of Land and Works that an engineer should be appointed to report on the matter, and a reply was received, "That it was proposed to appoint a commission to enquire into the question of supplying the gold fields generally with water."

In the meantime the chief difficulty in the way of taking immediate and active measures, arises from the inability of the council to proceed further without a grant from the general revenue, and a deputation is now in Melbourne for the purpose of urging the great importance of this question, with others, on the Government.

Mr. English's plans and report have been laid before the Commissioner of Public Works, who has promised to give the matter full consideration.

In conclusion, the council is desirous of expressing a sense of its obligations, and the thanks that are due to B. C. Aspinall, Esq., M.L.A., for his unremitting attention in bringing under the immediate notice of the Government and Assembly, all matters tending to the improvement of this town and district.

RICHMOND MUNICIPALITY.

THE FOURTH HALF-YEARLY REPORT OR STATEMENT OF THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF RICHMOND FOR SIX MONTHS, FROM THE 2ND DAY OF NOVEMBER, 1857, TO THE 2ND DAY OF MAY, 1858.

THE council have maintained a correspondence with the various departments of the Government on important public questions affecting the interests of the municipality, with the following results:—

Control and management of Bridge road.—Granted, with remnant of broken metal, £1050, and one-third of tolls receivable at Hawthorn Bridge from 1st January, 1858.

Permission to get gravel in Studley Park.—Granted.
Deed of grant of two acres in section 35, including court house and lock-up.—Ordered to issue.

Water to be laid on from the Yan Yean.—To be laid on in conjunction with Prahran and St. Kilda when funds granted by Government.

Extension of the western boundary so as to include Hoddle street.—Not settled.

Continuation of Swan street through Police Paddock.—Refused.

Approaches to Church street bridge too narrow and unnecessarily crooked.—To be enquired into.

MISCELLANEOUS.

Bye-law No. 8. For the appropriation of the sum of £6984 18s. 2d. granted out of the public revenue for the year 1857 to the municipal district of Richmond.—Adopted on the 20th November, 1857.

Twenty-one petitions and memorials have been presented to the council on various local subjects.

13th November, Mr. J. D. Hayward elected inspector of nuisances.

On 12th March, the Honorable Henry Miller resigned the office of chairman. Councillor P. Johnson elected.

Reward of £5 offered by the council to any person giving such information as would lead to the conviction of any party illegally removing metal from the quarries.

Deputations have waited on the Honorable the President of Land and Works, pointing out the necessity of proclaiming Church street Bridge free of all tolls, and on the Honorable the Postmaster General on the advisability of establishing a branch post office in the municipality.

At the annual election, holden the 19th day of April, Councillors Coppin, Egan and Burnley were elected to fill the vacancies caused by the retirement through fluxion of time of the Honorable Henry Miller, Councillors Burnley and Egan.

Councillor P. Johnson elected chairman for the current year.

The public works committee consists of D. S. Campbell, Esq., M.L.A., chairman; Councillors Coppin, Burnley, H. Johnson, Egan, and Lambert.

The finance and legislative committees consist of the Chairman, Councillors Campbell, Coppin, and H. Johnson.

The auditors to the council for the past half-year were Messrs. Caldicott and Laing.

BRUNSWICK MUNICIPALITY.

FIRST HALF-YEARLY REPORT OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF BRUNSWICK, ENDING 26TH APRIL, 1858, MADE IN PURSUANCE OF THE 43RD SEC. OF 18 VICTORIA No. 15.

THE INSTITUTION OF THE MUNICIPALITY.

A Petition, numerously signed by the householders in the district of Brunswick, having been duly presented to His Excellency the Governor, praying that the district might be formed into a municipality, His Excellency, by proclamation dated 29th day of September, 1857, proclaimed such district a municipal one, under the governance of the municipal council of Brunswick.

BOUNDARIES.

The boundaries of the municipal district of Brunswick were defined as follows:—Commencing at the north-western angle

of the Royal Park, on the eastern banks of the Moonee Ponds; thence east by the northern boundary of the Royal Park, and by a line bearing east, crossing the main road to Sydney to the Merri Creek; thence northwards by the Merri Creek to the north eastern angle of portion 127, parish of Jika Jika; thence west by the northern boundaries of portions 127 and 126, crossing the Sydney road, in the same parish, to the Moonee Ponds aforesaid; and thence southwards by the Moonee Ponds to the north-western angle of the Royal Park, the commencing point.

ELECTIONS.

The district having been thus determined and proclaimed, a public meeting of householders and residents, presided over by Richard Heales, Esq., M.L.A., was held at the Cornish Arms Hotel, Sydney road, on the 19th day of October, 1857, pursuant to the provisions of 18 Victoria No. 15, sec. 10, at which meeting it was decided—

1. That the municipal council should consist of seven members.
2. That the council should not receive any pecuniary remuneration.

Candidates were duly proposed and seconded, for whom on the 20th October a poll was taken at the same place, with the following result:—

The chairman declared the first seven gentlemen duly elected to serve in the council, and the first sitting took place on the 26th day of October, when Thomas Wilkinson, Esq., was elected chairman.

MUNICIPAL OFFICERS.

Candidates for the various municipal offices having been duly advertised for—

Mr. G. W. Frederick Grylls was elected town clerk, and Mr. Florence Anthony municipal surveyor.

The tenders of Messrs. Eckersall and Marsden, as valuers, and of Mr. Edward Ebenezer Hammond, as rate collector, were accepted.

ASSESSMENT.

After the final assessment of all appeals (of which there were 220), the total value of all properties in the municipality over which the council had control remained at £28,536, on which the shilling-rate, which is now being levied, will produce £1426 16s.

RESIGNATION AND RE-ELECTION OF COUNCILLORS.

The following councillors having resigned on the dates respectively placed against their names, viz.:—

Councillor De Carle, 29th January, 1858; Councillor Sloan, 2nd February, 1858; Councillor Rollo, 5th February, 1858,—were replaced at a poll taken on the 5th day of March last, by Messrs. Austin, who received 158 votes; Stranger, 136; and Miller, 130.

BYE-LAWS.

The following bye-laws, passed by the council, have been assented to by His Excellency the Governor:—

1. To regulate, by means of standing orders, the proceedings of the municipal council.
2. For the regulation of elections.
3. For making an assessment and imposing rate of 1s. in the pound for the year 1858.
