NOTICE is hereby given that under the fifth clause of the above cited Act the owner of every steam vessel employed as stated is bound to have the vessel and the whole of her machinery surveyed by the Engineer and Shipwright Surveyors appointed for that purpose by the Victoria Steam Navigation Board, in the manner and at the times following:—

Low Pressure.—Vessel and machinery—June and December.  
High Pressure.—Vessel—June and December.

Machinery—March, June, September, and December.

The owners and masters of steam vessels are requested to observe, that in future the Fees of both Surveyors are to be paid to the Secretary at the office of the Board before the Surveys are held, and no Fees whatever are to be paid to the Surveyors.

## MEMORIAL FOR A ROAD DISTRICT. BUNINYONG.

THE substance and prayer of a Memorial to His Excellency the Governor, adopted by the landholders and householders in and around Buninyong, in public meeting assembled, representing that it is desirable that their locality should be constituted a Road District, are published below for general information.

The memorialists state, that taking into consideration the bad condition of the cross-roads of Buninyong and other places in its vicinity, and the necessity that exists to make provision for the increasing and important traffic on them, it is most desirable that a Road District for Buninyong should be constituted.

The memorialists suggest the area to be enclosed in such district as marked on a plan which accompanied the memorial and circumscribed as follows:—"Commencing at the north-west corner of portion 1, section VIII., parish of Cardigan; thence in

a line fronting the southern boundary of the main road from Smythe's Creek to Ballaarat for a distance of five miles twenty chains or thereby, along the southern boundary of the Ballaarat Road District; thence by a line bearing due east along the southern boundary of the municipal district of Ballaarat East for a distance of three miles thirty-seven chains as far as the south-east corner of the said municipal district; thence by a line bearing due north along the eastern boundary of the said municipal district for a distance of one mile seventy-two chains or thereby till it reaches the main road from Ballaarat to Melbourne; thence along the main Ballaarat and Melbourne road for a distance of eleven miles forty chains or thereby; thence by a line bearing due south by the eastern boundary of Kerret Barret survey for a distance of eighteen miles twenty-five chains or thereby; thence by a line bearing due west along the northern boundary of Mr. Merce's pre-emptive right for a distance of eighteen miles twenty chains or thereby; thence by a line bearing due north for a distance of thirteen miles sixty chains to the point of commencement."

And the memorialists pray as follows:—

"Your memorialists humbly pray that it may please your Excellency to select, proclaim, declare and designate, for Buninyong, such a Road District as shall seem meet, as and to be a Road District for the purposes contained in the Acts relating thereto."

## MUNICIPALITY OF BALLAARAT EAST.

BYE-LAW No. 10.—FOR COMPELLING INHABITANTS OF THIS MUNICIPALITY TO KEEP THEIR PREMISES FREE FROM OFFENSIVE AND UNWHOLESOME MATTER, AND FOR RESTRAINING NOISOME, OFFENSIVE AND UNHEALTHY TRADES, AND FOR OTHERWISE PRESERVING THE PUBLIC HEALTH.

WHEREAS the health and comfort of the inhabitants of this municipality generally demand that all premises therein should be kept free from obnoxious and offensive matters, and also that offensive trades should be restrained: Be it and it is hereby ordered and directed by the municipal council of Ballaarat East, That any person who shall from the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor of this Colony, allow any animal, vegetable, or other matter, or any skins or hides, or any rubbish whatever, to accumulate upon or in front of their premises, or in the rights-of-way or lanes bordering or abutting thereon, or who shall burn any bones, rubbish, or animal or vegetable matter, or melt tallow or render down fat, offal or refuse of any kind, or for any purpose soever, so as in any of the cases aforesaid to be a nuisance to the neighborhood, or who shall throw upon any street, road, lane, or path in the municipality, any bones, rubbish, or any animal or vegetable matter, or who shall carry on any manufacture, business, or calling whatsoever which shall be deemed by the municipal council, or their appointed officer, to be offensive to the surrounding neighborhood or injurious to the public health, shall, upon conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds, excepting only such cases of offensive trades as are being carried on under a special permission from the said municipal council.

For the purposes of this bye-law the occupiers of premises shall be deemed liable to the penalty herein set forth.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 10, made by the municipal council of Ballaarat East, has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

## ARARAT MINING DISTRICT.

## No. II.—BYE-LAW RELATING TO BLOCK CLAIMS IN WET SINKINGS.—[19th May, 1858.]

AT a meeting of the Mining Board of the mining district of Ararat, begun and holden at the Mount William Hotel, Cathcart, in the said district, on the 19th day of May, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

1. The term "wet sinkings" shall be understood to mean that class of alluvial gold mining where water occurs below the surface drift or gravel in quantities sufficient to render the slabbing of the shaft necessary.

2. All claims in wet sinkings shall be of one uniform size, except in cases where specially provided for otherwise; said size shall not exceed eighty feet by eighty feet, and the boundary lines of all such claims shall be marked out parallel to and at right angles with each other, as near as possible.

3. Each extreme corner of all such claims shall be indicated by a peg firmly fixed in the ground and not less than two feet above the surface of the same, said pegs to remain visible until such claim be abandoned; and any person wilfully or maliciously removing said pegs, or any one thereof, whilst the owners of such claim are in lawful possession of the same, shall be liable to be summoned before the police magistrate, and on conviction be fined in any sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

4. Five feet of neutral ground shall be left between adjoining claims by the last party marking out; said neutral ground may be worked by either or both of the adjoining claimholders, provided always that those who work the ground do securely prop the same; but on no account shall any party not holding an adjoining claim be allowed to work such ground.

5. When more than six feet of neutral ground shall have been left between adjoining claims, such ground shall be regarded as any other unoccupied crown lands, and may be taken possession of by any duly authorised miner or miners.

6. Any duly authorised miner or miners may at any time during any lawful day measure the area of any claim or claims held under this bye-law, and in the event of any such claim or claims being larger than the size herein specified, that is to say, eighty feet by eighty feet, it shall be lawful for such miner or miners to reduce such claim or claims to the proper size by measuring from any side or sides thereof which he or they may prefer, and to take possession of such extra quantity of ground as though such ground were unoccupied: Provided always that such ground so taken possession of in no case exceeds eighty feet measured from boundary to boundary, whether in length or breadth.

7. Eight duly authorised miners shall constitute a party qualified to hold a claim under this bye-law.

8. Within twenty-four hours after any claim has been taken possession of by any miner, such miner shall post a notice on such claim, containing the names of the whole party, together with date of occupation and date and number of the miner's right of each member thereof; and in the event of any such party being deficient in the number of shareholders qualified to hold a claim under this bye-law, such deficiency may be filled up by any duly authorised miner or miners, who shall at once enter his or their name or names on such notice until the number be completed; but any individual filling up any such notice with any fictitious name or names shall on conviction thereof be subject to any penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

9. Three days shall be allowed each party for the purpose of preparation, but on the fourth day from the date of marking out, the sinking shall commence, and the party shall continue to sink all and every lawful day until water is struck, when the work shall be proceeded with all and every lawful day and night until the "well" is completed or the ground abandoned, excepting in cases where the water to be contended with proves too heavy for the party to manage, and work is struck with the general consent of surrounding claimholders.

10. On the completion of the "well" in any claim held under this bye-law, the owners of such claim shall in no case allow the water to rise above the top of such "well," unless it can be proved that continual baling will not effect that object.

11. In the event of any shareholder absenting himself from his work when it is his duty to attend, it shall be lawful for the remaining portion of the party, or any individual member thereof, to employ a competent miner to work in the place of such absentee, and such absentee shall be responsible for the wages paid or to be paid to any individual so employed.

12. Should the owners of any claim held under this bye-law neglect or refuse to bale their fair proportion of water, to the injury of surrounding claimholders, whether such neglect or refusal occur during the sinking of the shaft or after such shaft has been bottomed, such party so neglecting or refusing shall be liable to such adjoining claimholders for injury sustained in consequence of such neglect or refusal.

13. Any claim which may have been left unworked for the space of forty-eight hours after commencing to sink the shaft thereof, shall be deemed to be abandoned, and shall be regarded as any other portion of unoccupied crown lands, excepting always those cases where special permission to hold such claim in reserve shall have been granted by the warden.

14. In all cases when there are difficulties to be contended, which cannot be surmounted by the ordinary method of working claims, it shall be lawful for the warden to grant a suspension of this bye-law, so far as such claim or claims are concerned.

15. Any party drawing the slabs out of any shaft where water has been struck shall fill up such shaft level, with the surface;

and in the event of any party leaving the slabs in the shaft for a longer period than one month, such party shall forfeit all right and title to said slabs; but if such shaft should be taken possession of by any other party within the time above specified, such party so taking possession shall pay to the previous occupants or owners of such shaft a reasonable valuation for the same.

16. In all cases where the right to any share or shares held or supposed to be held by any miner or miners is disputed by any other miner or miners, it shall be considered to be the duty of the "jumper" or party disputing the aforesaid right or supposed right to apply to the warden of the division in which such dispute arises for the necessary authority to take possession of such share or shares, and any other method of obtaining possession of such share or shares shall be deemed to be illegal.

## ARARAT MINING DISTRICT.

## No. III.—BYE-LAW RELATING TO FRONTAGE LEADS.—[19th May, 1858.]

AT a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Ararat, begun and holden at the Mount William Hotel, Cathcart, in the said district, on the 19th day of May, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

1. Whenever it shall appear to the miners working on any wet lead to be expedient to place such lead under the frontage system, it shall be lawful for such miners to call a public meeting, by advertising at least twice in any newspaper circulating in the district, in order that such public meeting may take into consideration the desirability of placing such lead under the frontage system.

2. Any public meeting called in manner aforesaid shall be holden on the lead in question, and between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m., and the chairman of such public meeting shall be chosen on the spot and from amongst the miners.

3. It shall be considered the duty of the parties calling such public meeting to state to such meeting the reason why it is desirable to place such lead under the frontage system; and in the event of such meeting deciding by a clear majority that it is necessary or expedient so to do, the chairman of such meeting shall at once post a notice on some conspicuous part of such lead in the following form; that is to say:—

We, the miners and others in public meeting assembled on [name of lead] lead, do hereby declare this [name of lead] lead to be under the frontage system, and subject to the bye-laws relating thereto, from and after the date hereof.

(And six of the persons present at such meeting)

4. A copy of the above notice shall be forwarded to the warden of the division, within twenty-four hours after the dissolution of such meeting, either by the chairman or by one of the persons signing such notice.

5. Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore enacted, the existing rights of any claimowners enjoyed on any lead at the time when such lead is placed under the frontage system shall in no way be disturbed or interfered with.

6. Any claim or share in any claim held under this bye-law shall be held and worked subject to the following conditions, excepting in cases where specially provided for otherwise, that is to say:—

7. All claims, except as aforesaid, shall be of one uniform length of eighty feet along the course of the lead or gutter by a breadth across such lead or gutter, or from reef to reef, not exceeding two hundred feet, except in cases where two separate leads unite, when the width of claims shall be determined and indicated by an authorised surveyor.

8. Six feet of neutral ground shall be left between the boundaries of adjoining claims, which may be worked by either or both of the adjoining claimholders: Provided always that those who work such neutral ground do securely prop the same.

9. Eight duly authorised miners shall constitute a party qualified to hold a claim under this bye-law.

10. Every shareholder or representative of any share in any such claim shall register his name, together with date and number of his miner's right, with the surveyor appointed for that purpose; and a copy of such registration ticket, containing the names of the whole party, shall be posted in some conspicuous

part of the claim, and remain so posted until the claim be worked out or the ground abandoned.

11. Any miner or miners may at any time take possession of any unoccupied share or shares in any claim or claims, on registering himself or themselves for any vacant share or shares on such lead, except in cases where there are two or more applicants for such share or shares, in which case the preference shall be decided by lot.

12. Seven days shall be allowed from the date of the completion of any party or company for the purpose of preparation, at the expiration of which time the party shall commence to sink their shaft, and shall continue to sink all and every lawful day until water is struck, when the work shall be proceeded with all and every lawful day and night until the "well" is completed or the ground abandoned, excepting in cases where the water to be contended with proves too heavy for the party to manage, and work is struck with the general consent of adjoining claimholders.

13. On the completion of the "well" in any claim, the owners of such claim shall in no case allow the water to rise above the top of such "well," unless it can be proved that continual bailing will not effect that object.

14. In the event of any shareholder absenting himself from his work when it is his duty to attend, it shall be lawful for the remaining portion of the party, or any individual thereof, to employ a competent miner to work in the place of such absentee, and such absentee shall be responsible for the wages paid or to be paid to any individual so employed.

15. Any party or company of miners, or of miners and capitalists, who may be unable to proceed with the work in the manner specified in this bye-law, owing to the non-arrival or non-completion of the necessary machinery, or from any other reasonable cause, it shall be lawful for the warden to grant such extension of time as he may deem necessary: Provided always that the causes of such inability to proceed be clearly set forth in writing, and forwarded to such warden at least seven days prior to any departure from the provisions of this bye-law.

16. In the event of the owners of any claim held under this bye-law neglecting or refusing to bail their fair proportion of water to the injury of adjoining claimholders, whether such neglect or refusal occur during the sinking of the shaft or after such shaft has been "bottomed," such parties so neglecting or refusing shall be liable to such adjoining claimholders for injury sustained in consequence of such neglect or refusal.

17. Any claim which may have been left unworked for the space of forty-eight hours after commencing to sink the shaft thereof shall be deemed to be abandoned, and shall be regarded as any other unoccupied crown lands, excepting always those cases where permission to hold such claim in reserve shall have been granted by the warden.

18. In all cases where machinery is introduced to assist or supersede manual labor, the claim or claims on which such machinery is at work shall be deemed to be legally held by the number of miners and in the proportion specified in the seventh clause of the bye-law relating to the amalgamation of claims.

19. Any party drawing the slabs out of any shaft where water has been struck shall fill up such shaft level with the surface; and in the event of any party leaving the slabs in the shaft after the claim has been abandoned for a longer period than one month, such party shall forfeit all right and title to said slabs; but if such shaft should be taken possession of by any other party within the time above specified, such party so taking possession shall pay the previous occupants or owners of such shaft a reasonable valuation for the same.

20. It shall be lawful for the mining board, on the application of any party or company of miners, or of miners and capitalists, or of any mining co-operative association, to grant to such party, company or association, more extended areas of ground than any named in this bye-law, on the compliance of said companies with the tenth and eleventh clauses of the bye-law relating to mining partnerships.

21. In all cases where the right to any share or shares held or supposed to be held by any miner or miners is disputed by any other miner or miners, it shall be considered to be the duty of the "juniper," or party disputing the aforesaid right or supposed right, to apply to the warden of the division in which such dispute arises for the necessary authority to take possession of such share or shares, and any other method of obtaining possession of such share or shares shall be deemed to be illegal.

## ARARAT MINING DISTRICT.

### No. IV.—BYE-LAW REGULATING THE AMALGAMATION OF CLAIMS [19th May, 1858.]

**A**T a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Ararat, begun and holden at the Mount William Hotel, Cathcart, in the said district, on the 19th day of May. One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

1. That all amalgamated claims, whether in dry sinkings, quartz mining, wet sinkings, or frontage leads, shall be held and worked in the manner specified in the bye-laws relating to the class or division of mining to which they respectively belong, excepting in cases for which special provisions are otherwise made.

2. That all parties holding claims in accordance with the bye-laws of this district may amalgamate the same to the following extent and under the following conditions, namely:—

3. Each of the extreme corners of every amalgamated square claim, and each boundary of every amalgamated frontage or quartz claim, shall be indicated by a post firmly fixed in the ground not less than three feet above the surface of the same, and such posts shall be not less than three inches square or four inches in diameter, and must be erected as soon as parties have agreed to amalgamate in dry sinkings or quartz mining, and before application is made to the warden in all other classes of mining; such posts to be kept visible until the claims so amalgamated be abandoned.

4. The holders of any two claims in dry sinkings may amalgamate the same, provided always that they sink their shaft in the centre of such amalgamated claim, and that the work be carried on night and day by two different shifts until their shaft be bottomed or the ground abandoned.

5. The holders of any two claims in quartz mining may amalgamate without observing any other conditions than that of erecting posts and of posting the requisite notice.

6. If claimholders, whether in block or frontage leads, wishing to amalgamate, can prove to the satisfaction of the warden that their claims can be worked more efficiently and to better advantage by being united than separately, and also that under the proposed amalgamation, either by means of machinery or otherwise, a greater quantity of water will be raised and ejected in a given time than could be done by such claims being worked in the ordinary way, he may grant them permission to amalgamate, if satisfied such arrangements will not be to the disadvantage of adjoining claimholders.

7. In order to encourage the introduction of machinery, any party who will erect an engine of the requisite horse power on any wet lead in this district shall be allowed to hold possession of their claims with one-half the specified number of men; but such allowance shall in no single case extend over six claims in length on any lead for every engine so erected: Provided that after a reasonable time has been allowed for their erection, they be kept bailing water night and day until the lead or ground on which they have been erected has become dry or abandoned—reasonable allowances of time always to be made for breakages and repairs.

8. Application for permission to amalgamate shall be made in writing, and addressed to the warden, and lodged at his office at least eight days prior to the granting of any such application.

9. Each application shall contain a statement of the reasons why the applicants desire to amalgamate, the obstacles, if any, sought to be overcome, and also the nature and power of machinery to be employed, specifying whether the same be steam, horse or other power, and must in all cases be accompanied with a plan of the ground applied for.

10. Before applying for permission to amalgamate, parties shall post and keep posted on some conspicuous part of their claim a notice to the following effect, namely:—We, the undersigned miners, do hereby give notice that we intend to apply to the warden for permission to amalgamate our claims. Any person having any objection to the application being granted, must lodge the same in writing, addressed to the warden at his office, on or before the (here state the day and date on which the eight days' notice expire). Such notice must be signed by all the applicants, and kept posted on the ground eight days prior to the application being granted or refused.

11. Any duly authorised miner or miners objecting to any proposed amalgamation on any lead on which he or they may have an interest, must submit such objections in writing to the warden, in accordance with the above notice, and before the expiration of the time specified in the notice posted on any claim to the amalgamation of which he or they may object; and should such objections appear valid or otherwise, the warden will have it in his power to grant or refuse such application, as it may appear to him just or expedient.

12. After amalgamation has been effected in accordance with this bye-law, parties shall at once post and keep posted on some conspicuous part of their claim a notice to the following effect, namely:—

We, the undersigned miners, being in legal possession of this ground, do hereby give notice that we have amalgamated our claims in accordance with the bye-laws of this district. [Here must follow the holders' names in full, also the date and number of their miners' rights.]

In wet sinkings all such notices must be certified and signed by the warden.

13. In order to facilitate the discovery of any lead, gutter or tract of gold, it shall be lawful for any ten miners holding

claims adjoining any amalgamated claim to appoint a competent miner to inspect the drives thereof: Provided such inspection be made in the presence of at least two of the holders or owners, and between the hours of Eight a.m. and Five p.m., and not oftener than once each day, and that only till the gold or gutter is discovered beyond the boundaries of such claim.

14. Any person appointed by and on behalf of the miners to inspect the drives of any claim shall in no case remain in such claim longer than is necessary for the inspection thereof, and the owners shall not offer any obstruction to such inspection, under any penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

15. As the Gold Fields Act does not empower the warden or any one else to discharge the duties named in this bye-law: Be it therefore enacted that any person or persons appointed to discharge them shall do so legally, notwithstanding anything herein contained.

#### ARARAT MINING DISTRICT.

No. V.—BYE-LAW REGULATING MINING PARTNERSHIPS.—[19th May, 1858.]

**A**T a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Ararat, begun and holden at the Mount William Hotel, Cathcart, in the said district, on the 19th day of May. One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

1. That whenever two or more miners join together for the purpose of obtaining gold from Crown lands, they shall be deemed to be partners, and each member of such partnership shall be protected in any share or interest he may lawfully hold or enjoy in any claim they may jointly occupy, subject to the bye-laws of the mining board of this district, until such partnership be dissolved by mutual consent, or by some other act that may make such partnership null and void, such as forfeiture of shares, &c.

2. The fact of two or more miners jointly marking out a claim with the knowledge and consent of each other, shall constitute a partnership as far as such claim is concerned.

3. But it shall not be necessary for all partners to be present at the marking out of claims, or at the commencement of any other work that may be deemed to be to the interest of such partnership, the fact of their being associated for the purposes of mining previous to such marking out, unless notice of dissolution has been given, shall entitle each member of every partnership to a full share in any claim marked out by any of its members, or in any other benefit or right that may be legally held or enjoyed under a miner's right, unless a mutual agreement has been entered into for the unequal distribution of shares or otherwise.

4. In the event of any miner or miners forfeiting his or their share or shares in any claim, only the share or shares so forfeited shall become jumpable, and his or their former partner or partners shall remain as legally possessed of his or their share or shares as if the partnership had remained unbroken.

5. All partners must be on the ground and in working possession of their shares within twenty-four hours of the time of marking out in surfacing and dry sinkings, three days in wet sinkings, four days in quartz mining, and seven days in frontage leads.

6. Any partner absenting himself from his claim, after taking possession of the same, beyond twenty-four hours in surfacing and dry sinkings, and forty-eight hours in all other classes of mining, shall forfeit his share, unless a competent miner is put in his place, and a full complement of men in legal possession to represent the number of shares in such claim.

7. Any capitalist or storekeeper assisting any miner or party of miners, by supplying him or them with money or rations, or by furnishing him or them with working tools or materials necessary for mining operations, shall be protected in any claim or share or shares or fractional part of a share he may make such advances on, provided he can produce a registered certificate representing his share therein.

8. In the event of any share or shares becoming forfeited or abandoned by the party or parties to whom any such advance may have been made, the person so advancing shall have it in his option to supply his or their place, by hiring men to work such share or otherwise; provided such vacancy be filled up within forty-eight hours from the time of abandonment.

9. But should any such claim become wholly abandoned, the party who may have made any advance thereon shall remain fully possessed of his interest therein for the space of one week from the time of abandonment, and during that time such claim or share can only be taken possession of subject to his interest therein.

10. Any number of miners joined or assisted by capitalists forming themselves into a company, for the purpose of erecting machinery with the intention of extracting gold from Crown lands, shall be empowered under this bye-law to enter into a deed of agreement or partnership, specifying under what terms the said partnership shall exist or co-operate, the Crown lands they seek or intend to occupy, and under what conditions they seek to hold the same; likewise on what conditions or default the same or any share or fractional share therein shall become forfeited and open for the selection of the public; likewise stating the number of working partners or representatives of working shareholders that such company shall consist of, and clearly defining what relation each member of such company stands in towards each other, whether as capitalist, sleeping partners, sharemen, fractional sharemen, &c., &c.

11. On a copy of such a deed or agreement, accompanied with an application for an extended claim, being forwarded to the chairman of the mining board of this district, he shall as soon as convenient call a meeting of the board, and if at such meeting a majority of the members present be in favor of granting such application, the chairman will be empowered to do so or otherwise as the board may by vote determine.

12. Any company receiving an extended claim under the two preceding clauses, shall at all times be subject to the bye-laws the mining board may deem necessary to enact for the protection of miners holding claims adjoining or in the vicinity of any such extended claim.

13. Any claim or share which may have been unoccupied for a longer time than allowed by this bye-law, shall be deemed forfeited to all intents and purposes, and any person may take possession of the same except in cases where the previous occupants shall be able to establish his or their title to the claim in question under the following exemptions, namely:—Any miner or miners who may be unable to work from any accident or illness, or who shall be in attendance on any such person, or court of justice, or whose absence from his or their claim has been caused by some urgent business, the proof of which shall be upon him or them, shall be entitled to hold such claim in reserve or unworked for any reasonable length of time.

The undersigned members of the said mining board concurred in making the foregoing bye-law.
