MUNICIPALITY OF BALLAARAT EAST.

BYE-LAW No. 9.—TO COMPEL OWNERS AND OCCUPIERS TO KEEP THE WATER-CHANNELS AND FOOTPATHS AND RIGHTS-OF-WAY BOUNDING THEIR PREMISES FREE FROM SWEEPINGS, RUBBISH, OFFAL, OR ANY OFFENSIVE MATTER.

WHEREAS by an Act 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, "An Act for the Establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," it is amongst other things enacted that the council of any municipal district established under the provisions of the said Act shall have the care and management of the roads, public streets and public thoroughfares, and shall and may make such bye-laws for carrying out their objects as to

such council shall seem fit: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council for the district of Ballarat East, from and after this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria as required by the provisions of the said Act, that the occupiers, or in cases where there are no occupiers, the owners of buildings and lands abutting upon the streets, rights-of-way, or other thoroughfares within the said municipal district of Ballarat East, shall cause to be cleansed daily before Nine o'clock a.m., and kept free from sweepings, rubbish, offal, or any offensive matter, the footways and water-channels in front and at the sides of their buildings or lands aforesaid; and where the backs of any buildings or lands abut upon any public thoroughfares or lanes, the regulations shall apply in like manner as if the said thoroughfares ran in front or on the side; the said regulation to apply equally to formed and unformed footways and water-channels, the distance in the latter case to be at least nine feet from the fronts, sides, or backs of the buildings or lands aforesaid: And every such occupier or owner failing to comply with this regulation, or allowing any sweepings, rubbish, offal, or other offensive matter whatsoever to accumulate or remain in or upon such footways, or water-channels, or rights-of-way as aforesaid, shall on conviction thereof forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Five pounds, and for the purpose of this bye-law when any house shall be let in separate apartments the tenants occupying these apartments may be jointly and severally proceeded against.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 9, made by the municipal council of Ballarat East, has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

MUNICIPALITY OF CASTLEMAINE.

BYE-LAW No. 32.—FOR REGULATING THE MARKET.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council, 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, "An Act for the Establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," the council of any municipal district is empowered to pass bye-laws for the regulation of markets, market dues, &c.:

And whereas by Proclamation dated 29th March, and gazetted 1st April, 1858, His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of the establishment of a market within the municipal district of Castlemaine, and did by the said Proclamation determine the boundaries, that is to say, "Commencing at a point on the southern side of Mostyn street intersected by the western side of Hargrave street; thence west by the southern side of Mostyn street 10 chains; thence south by the eastern side of Barker street 5 chains; and thence by a line bearing east 10 chains; and thence north by the western side of Hargraves street 5 chains to the commencing point."

And whereas it is expedient and necessary to erect suitable buildings and conveniences in the said market-place for the sale of produce or other articles sanctioned to be there sold, or which may from time to time be permitted by the municipal council to be there sold; and that rates, tolls, rents, and dues should be fixed, levied, and collected for the use of the said buildings, and other conveniences, and in respect of articles and things brought or taken into the said market for sale; and that such rules, regulations, fines and penalties, should be made, imposed and inflicted by the said municipal council as are proper and necessary for the due regulation and government of the said market, and of the persons using and frequenting the same; and that an officer or officers should be appointed to collect the said rates, tolls, rents and dues, and to enforce the said rules and regulations of the said market, and to keep due order therein:

Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the municipal council of Castlemaine, that from and after the sanction of the Executive to this bye-law, the following regulations shall be observed:—

1. That the said market shall be open every Saturday from sunrise till Eleven o'clock p.m., and on every Wednesday from sunrise to sunset (Christmas day excepted), for the supply and sale of provisions, that is to say:—Butchers meat, pork, fish, poultry, rabbits, wild fowl, fresh butter, cheese, eggs, vegetables, fruit, roots, shrubs, plants, bulbs, seeds, hay, straw, grain, green fodder, and all garden and farm produce, with such other articles as the municipal council may allow to be sold in the said market; and it shall not be lawful for any person to expose or offer for sale or to sell in the said market any other article or thing than is herein enumerated or referred to.

2. That it shall be lawful for the said council to let for any period not exceeding the current municipal year, at such rent as they may affix thereon, any shed, shop, stall, standing, or other convenience within the market, and to relet the same as often as the periods of such lettings shall expire or be otherwise determined; and for the good regulation of the said market, each or every lease or arrangement shall contain a clause setting forth the class of articles for the sale of which such shed, shop or other convenience has been let, and that no other class of articles shall be exposed or offered for sale, or be sold in or on the said shed, shop, stall, site, or other convenience, than is named or referred to in the said agreements, except with the consent in writing of the said council.

3. That it shall be lawful for the said council, and they are hereby empowered to impose and collect all such rents, rates, tolls and dues in respect of and on all such articles, which are enumerated in table A in the schedule appended to this bye-law, which may be brought into the said market or be sold therein.

4. That any person wishing his or her name or business affixed to any shed, stall, &c., or to have the shed or stall, &c., enclosed in any particular way, shall apply to the market inspector, under whose direction the same may be done at the cost of the applicant.

5. That any person guilty of any of the following offences, omissions, or neglect, shall on conviction thereof for every such offence or omission pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds:—

A. Selling or exposing for sale in the said market any marketable commodity before the times appointed for opening and closing such market, or on other days than those named for holding the market.

B. Selling or offering for sale in the said market any commodity not named in and allowed by this bye-law to be sold there.

C. Refusing or neglecting to pay on demand being made by the officer appointed by the council to collect the same, any rate, rent, toll or due which may be due for any shed, stall or convenience, or for any article sold or exposed for sale in the market.

D. Placing any matter or thing so as to cause an obstruction, and refusing or neglecting to remove the same on being required to do so by the market inspector.

E. Placing or keeping any cart, carriage, barrow, or other vehicle in any part of the said market contrary to the direction of the market inspector.

F. Placing any hook, nail or peg, or otherwise injuring or defacing any part of the market building, or fitting up or enclosing any part of it without the consent or contrary to the directions of the inspector, or refusing to remove any hook, nail, peg or fittings, when required to do so by the inspector.

G. Sweeping, or causing to be swept, or placing any dirt or rubbish into or upon any of the paths, gutters, roads, &c., of the said market, and allowing the same to remain.

H. Being in the market in a drunken or disorderly state, or exciting any riot or disturbance, or cursing or swearing, or using any gross indecent or abusive language, or being guilty of any gross or indecent conduct therein.

I. In any way obstructing the market inspector in the discharge of his duties.

J. In any other manner than those specified interfering with the proper regulation and good management of the market.

6. That the council shall appoint an officer, to be called the Market Inspector, whose duties shall be generally as described in appendix B.

7. That the said council shall from time to time, as they may see fit, repeal any of the rules and conditions contained in this bye-law, and substitute others for those repealed, or alter and amend all or any of the said rules, conditions, tables, and forms in this bye-law or in the schedule or appendix attached; and such substitutions, alterations and amendments shall, when sanctioned by His Excellency the Governor, have the same force and effect as they would have had had they been in the original.

APPENDIX B.

DUTIES OF THE MARKET INSPECTOR.

To see that the Market Regulations, as provided in this bye-law, are duly observed.

To preserve order and regularity in the market, and to cause to be apprehended all persons causing a riot or disturbance, or offending against decency, or in any manner or way provoking to a breach of the peace within the precincts of such market.

To inspect all articles exposed for sale in the market, and to seize such as are bad or unwholesome, and on such being

examined by any two members of the municipal council and declared by them in writing to be bad or unwholesome to cause the same to be destroyed, and to prohibit the sale of any articles in such market which he may consider noisome or offensive.

To inspect all scales, weights and measures used in the market, and to seize such as are found fraudulent or defective.

To collect all rates, rents, tolls and dues connected with the market, according to the table in Schedule A.

BYE-LAW No. 14.—A BYE-LAW TO REGULATE AND FIX THE MAXIMUM RATES OF CHARGE FOR THE CARRIAGE OF PRODUCE, MERCHANDISE, ETC., FROM THE EASTERN END OF THE NEW JETTY TO THE WESTERN SIDE OF THE SAND HUMMOCKS, AND VICE VERSA.

WHEREAS by the Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, "An Act for the Establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," it is amongst other things enacted that every such municipal council shall have the care and management of the roads, public streets, paths, wharves, jetties, piers, and public thoroughfares; and it shall be competent for every such municipal council, whenever it shall appear necessary, to establish tolls, rates and dues upon any road, market, wharf, or jetty, within the jurisdiction or under the control of such council, and to erect toll gates, toll bars, or other works necessary for the collection of such tolls, rates, or dues, and to make such bye-laws for the proper collection and management of such tolls, rates and dues as to such municipal council shall seem fit: And whereas by the Act of the officer administering the Government of Victoria, and the Legislative Council thereof, 19 Victoria No. 16, intituled, "An Act to amend an Act intituled 'An Act for the Establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria,'" it is amongst other things enacted that no toll, rate, or due shall be imposed by the council of any municipal district save by bye-law, subject to the assent of the Governor, as in the first recited Act mentioned: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the council of the municipal district of Warrnambool, that from and after the date of the Governor's assent hereto the following shall be the maximum rates of tolls or charges for conveyance of produce or other merchandise on the jetty aforesaid, viz.:—For grain, three farthings per bushel; and for other produce not specified, and merchandise, one shilling and ninepence per ton; and for parcels not exceeding fifty-six pounds in weight, sixpence each, and threepence for every additional fifty-six pounds up to five hundred weight.

MUNICIPALITY OF WILLIAMSTOWN.

BYE-LAW No. 31.—TO ENABLE THE COUNCIL TO CAUSE ALL THE BUILDINGS WITHIN THE DISTRICT TO BE NUMBERED.

That upon fourteen days' notice having been given by advertisement in the *Williamstown Chronicle*, or other local newspaper, of the provisions of this bye-law, the owner or occupier of any building within the district upon which a number shall not have been placed shall be liable to a penalty of not exceeding Forty shillings, recoverable by the said council on conviction before any two or more justices of the peace acting in and for the said district.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, in titled, "An Act to make provision for the Sale of Fermented and "Spirituuous Liquors, and of Refreshments, in certain Districts," it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time to proclaim any part or portion of the said colony to be a district subject to the provisions of the said Act, to be called a Special Licensing District, and to define the boundaries of such district: Now I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do, by this my Proclamation, declare the following part or portion of the said colony to be a district subject to the provisions of the said Act, to be called "The Special Licensing District of Mansfield," the boundaries whereof are hereby defined as follow, that is to say:—

Commencing at a point on the dividing range between the Seven Creeks and the Upper Goulburn River, three miles west of the north angle of the town reserve of Merton; thence by a line in a southerly direction to a point on the Upper Goulburn River, one mile south of the north-west angle of the township of Molesworth; thence by the Goulburn River to its source in the main dividing range; thence by the main dividing range to the source of the Broken River; thence by the Broken River to a point seven miles north of Barjarg Station; thence to Mount Separation; and thence along the main dividing range between the Seven Creeks and the Upper Goulburn River to the commencing point.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this tenth day of June, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, and in the twenty-first year of Her Majesty's Reign.

EPPING PUBLIC CEMETERY.

REGULATIONS made by the Trustees of the Public Cemetery established at Epping:—

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.
2. By the 7th section of the Act, any person making a vault or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees under these rules, and upon the payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tomb-stone according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons, and his or their heirs or near relations for ever.
3. Application for such permission to be made at the office of the trustees. A certificate of permission, in the form set forth in the schedule, will be granted to the party on applying for such permission, on payment of the charges in the schedule.
4. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery, on a certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the trustees, that such person was a pauper, or that the relations and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.
5. Orders for interment to be given at the offices of the trustees; such notice to be given between the hours of Ten and Twelve a.m. the previous day, if not an extra charge will be made.
6. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the trustees, and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the con-

sent (in writing) of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.

7. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased, must be stated at the time of giving the order.

8. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

9. Until otherwise ordered the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten a.m. to Six o'clock p.m., in the months of September to April inclusive, and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m., in the other four months, except on Sundays, when the usual and only hours for funerals will be from Two to Five o'clock p.m. throughout the year.

10. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones and fencings to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

11. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.

12. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every monument, wooden palisade, or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who are required by the 8th section of the Act to determine and fix the position of any unobjectionable monument, according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets, copper cramps must be used.

13. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

14. The ground will be open daily to the public from Eight a.m. to Five p.m.

15. The keeper has orders to turn out, or take into custody (as the case may require), any person who shall behave indecorously, or commit any trespass or injury to the trees, flowers, erections, or otherwise infringe the Act of Council relating to the cemetery, or the regulations for protection of the same, and such person will be proceeded against according to the provisions of the 9th, 12th and 13th sections of the Act.

16. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.
