REGULATIONS FOR THE ISSUE AND PAYMENT OF POST OFFICE
MONEY ORDERS.

HIS Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the
Executive Council, has been pleased to direct the
publication of the following Regulations for the issue and payment of Post Office Money Orders in the colony of Victoria;
and the public are hereby informed that in conformity with
these Regulations, Post Office Money Orders may be obtained
and be made payable at the undermentioned places, on and

1. Places and times of issue, and payment.—Money orders may be obtained and be made payable at the following places,

Limit of amount, and number to be issued or paid — Money orders may be issued for any sum not exceeding Ten pounds (£10); but no person will be entitled to demand or receive more than one money order, payable to any one person, upon the same day, at any one of the places hereinbefore mentioned.

3. Rates of commission.—The following are the rates of commission chargeable upon the issue of money orders, viz.:—

For any money order not exceeding Five pounds (£5),
Sixpence (6d).

Sixpence (6d).

Above Five pounds (£5) and not exceeding Ten pounds

(£10), One shilling (1s.).

4. Advices may be forwarded by Electric Telegraph.—Persons may have advices of money orders forwarded by Electric Telegraph to any place where money orders are payable, and to which communication by Electric Telegraph has been opened, upon making special application on the form provided for that purpose, and paying the charges for the transmission of mes-

5. Cost of transmission to be paid by sender.—Persons obtaining money orders will be required to forward them to the persons to whom they are made payable, and to pay all costs and charges for their transmission.

6. Payable at sight.—Money orders, upon being presented at the Post Office at the place upon which they are drawn, will be payable at sight; but the postmaster, or other person acting in his behalf, will be allowed a reasonable time before payment to make any enquiry he may deem necessary to establish the identity of the person presenting the order with the payee, as advised.

7. Period of currency.—No money order will be navable after

7. Period of currency.—No money order will be payable after a period of six months from the date of issue, and it a money order is not duly presented within the above time, it will

become void.

become void.

8. Money orders lost, &c.—Should it be proved to the satisfaction of the Postmaster General that a money order has been lost or destroyed, or that the person in whose favor a money order is drawn has died, or cannot be found, the Postmaster General may direct that the money be refunded to the person who obtained the order.

9. Failure of postmasters to pay orders.—In case any postmaster on whom a money order is drawn shall, from illness, want of funds, or any other cause, be unable or fail to pay the amount required upon such order being presented, the Post-

amount required upon such order being presented, the Post-master General shall not be liable to be sued for or on account

of such inability or failure.

10. Non-liability of Postmaster General.—The Postmaster General shall not be liable for any claim whatsoever in respect to any money order that has been presented and paid.

# NOTICE TO MARINERS, VICTORIA.

LIGHTS, BEACONS, BUOYS, AND LIFE BOATS.

Various alterations having from time to time been made in the Lights, Beacons, and Buoys, on the coast and within the ports of Victoria, the following revised lists are published for general information:—

The buoys are divided into three classes: the first class are cone-shaped, built of pine, sixteen feet long, nine feet at broad end, and sixteen inches at small end; the second class are cone-shaped, built of pine, fourteen feet long, seven feet at broad end, eighteen inches at small end; the third class are three hundred gallon casks.

These buoys are all secured with chain moorings and mushroom anchors.

Entering from sea, white buoys, with even numbers, to be left on the starboard hand; black buoys, with odd numbers, on the port hand.

MALDON.

In pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and sixty-eight householders resident at and near Maldon, praying for the erection of the said township into a municipality.

By His Excellency's Command, JOHN O'SHANASSY.

The petitioners state that at a public meeting held at Maldon, on the 19th of May last, a resolution to the effect that it is desirable to erect Maldon into a municipality, was carried; and that they are impressed with the conviction that such a step is advisable, for the better government and improvement of Maldon and its vicinity.!
