PETITION FOR MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS.

MALDON.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and sixty-eight householders resident at and near Maldon, praying for the erection of the said township into a municipality.

The petitioners state that at a public meeting held at Maldon, on the 19th of May last, a resolution to the effect that it is desirable to erect Maldon into a municipality, was carried; and that they are impressed with the conviction that such a step is advisable, for the better government and improvement of Maldon and its vicinity.

The petitioners suggest that the proposed municipal district should be circumscribed as follows, viz.:—Commencing at a point one chain and a half west from the north-west corner of allotment 12, section 2, suburban lots, north of Maldon (i.e., allowing for a road on the west side of allotment 12); thence north one mile; thence east two miles and a quarter; thence south four miles; thence west two miles and a quarter thence north three miles to the commencing point.

They further state that the area of the proposed district does not exceed nine square miles; that it contains more than three hundred householders; and that no one point therein is distant more than six miles from any other point.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners therefore humbly pray that your Excellency may declare the said district a municipal district, under the name of 'The Maldon Municipality,' pursuant to the provisions of the Act 18 Victoria No. 15, &c."

The petitioners refer to the proclaimed boundaries of the municipal district of Maryborough, the limited area of which they state is found to be extremely inconvenient.

They express themselves desirous of being brought within the municipal jurisdiction.

They add, that if the municipal district is extended as proposed, it will still not include a greater area than the Act allows, and no one point thereof will be distant more than six miles from any other point.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners therefore humbly pray that the limits and boundaries of the municipal district of Maryborough may be altered and extended as follows:—Commencing at the rear of the Camp Hotel; from thence bearing south 285 chains; from thence bearing north 45 degrees east, 240 chains; from thence bearing north 45 degrees west, 240 chains; from thence bearing south 45 degrees west, 240 chains; and from thence bearing south 45 degrees east, 240 chains."

BYE-LAW FOR STANDING ORDERS OF THE MINING BOARD OF MARYBOROUGH.—[9th April, 1858.]

AT a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Maryborough, begun and holden at Maryborough, in the said district, on the 9th day of April, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

The Order of Proceedings of the Mining Board of Maryborough.

1. That the following shall be the order of business—
 - 1st. Correspondence.
 - 2nd. Motions, of which notice has been given.
 - 3rd. Fresh notices of motions and incidental business.
2. That all motions and amendments to motions must be in writing.
3. That the same be not brought forward more than once at the same meeting.
4. That not less than one week's notice of motion on all subjects referring to the rules and regulations be given previous to its being moved, and that such motion be merely read at the time of giving such notice, and that such motion be discussed and legislated upon at the next meeting of the board.
5. That any member speaking must rise and address the chair.
6. That no member interrupt another while speaking.
7. That in every case where an amendment is proposed to a motion, the chairman shall first put the amendment; if the amendment is carried, the original motion shall lapse, but if negatived, the original motion shall be put. If more than one amendment, the last amendment shall be put first.
8. That no member be allowed to speak except to a motion or question before the board.

MARYBOROUGH MINING DISTRICT.

AT a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Maryborough, begun and holden at the Old Court House, Maryborough, in the said district, on the 31st day of May, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

CLAUSE D.—AMALGAMATION OF CLAIMS.

41. *Amalgamation of claims.*—Whenever it can be proved that two or more parties can, by combining, overcome any difficulty which may exist in working their claims separately, or can by the application of machinery in any way facilitate the working of the same, such combination shall be authorised, and the claims of parties so combining shall be termed amalgamated claims, and shall be subject to the following regulations:

Permission for amalgamated claims.—Parties wishing to amalgamate their claims only can do so by applying to the warden or other authorised person for permission.

Parties desirous of amalgamating more than three claims must send to the warden or other authorised person a written application eight days previously to such application being granted.

Application to state particulars.—In all cases the applicant shall state—

1st, date of application; 2nd, situation or plan of the ground; 3rd, whether on worked or unworked ground or quartz reef; 4th, name or title of each company or firm; 5th, names in full, also date of miner's right of each shareholder; 6th, a description of machinery, if any, proposed to be employed in working the ground.

Notice of application.—A notice of such application as described above shall be kept posted on some conspicuous portion of the ground applied for at least eight days previous to the granting of such application.

Objections to be made to the warden or other authorised person.—Any objection to an application for amalgamation must be made to the warden or other authorised person, in writing, on or before the day such application is to be considered. In such case the warden or other authorised person shall forthwith proceed to the ground applied for and investigate the matter; but in case of no objection, the warden or other authorised person shall, at the expiration of the time abovenamed, grant the application.

CLASS E.—WATER PRIVILEGES.

42. Permission to erect puddling machines, water-dams, steam engines, &c., will be granted by the warden or other authorised person, subject to the following regulations:—

Notice to be posted.—Parties intending to apply to the warden or other authorised person for permission to erect a puddling machine, steam engine, or water-dam, must put up a written notice on the site such machine, engine or dam, is proposed to be erected or constructed upon, stating the nature of such machine, engine or dam, with the names of the intended applicants; such notice shall be posted at least seven days previous to making the application to the warden or other authorised person for permission to erect such machine, engine or dam. Also, at the time of posting such notice, a copy of such notice shall be sent to the warden or other authorised person, with a statement that such notice has been posted, and setting forth the locality, the nature of the proposed erection or construction, with the names in full of the intended applicants.

43. *Objections to be made.*—Objections to the erection of any puddling machine or water privilege of any kind must be made to the warden or other authorised person, in writing, stating the nature of the objection, with the names and occupations of all parties objecting; and if such objection shall be made, the warden or other authorised person shall investigate the matter at the place applied for. If no objection shall be made to the erection of any machine or water privilege, the warden or other authorised person shall, at the expiration of the time named in bye-law 42, give the parties applying a written authority to erect such machine or hold such water privileges.

44. *Transfer of water privileges.*—In the event of any person or persons disposing of his or their interest in any machine, dam, or engine, the party purchasing shall make application for a transfer of the grant.

45. *Excavation of water-dams.*—Parties receiving permission to construct a water-dam shall, on the higher side of each dam, excavate to the bed rock, provided such rock shall not be more than ten feet from the surface.

46. *Must give publicity if gold be found.*—In excavating for the bed rock, should a payable lead of gold be struck, the party striking the same shall, without unnecessary delay, give information thereof to the warden or other authorised person, and shall be entitled to a prospecting claim. Should any party so excavating strike payable gold and not make his discovery known, such party shall forfeit all right to their water-dam, and the area hereinafter described may be mined upon by any person.

47. *Disposing of sludge.*—Parties working a puddling machine shall in all cases prevent their sludge from running into old workings either by banking out the sludge from old workings, or by excavating a drain of sufficient length to allow the sludge to run into the natural water-course of the gully or flat in which their puddling machine is erected.

48. *Roads to be bridged.*—When it may be found necessary to make a sludge or water-drain across any road, the party making such drain shall construct a substantial bridge over such drain across the road, which bridge shall be kept in repair by the owner of the drain.

49. *Protection to drains.*—When any person or persons shall, for his or their convenience or advantage, make any water or sludge-drain under or over any other drain previously made, he or they shall also provide a good and proper trough-bridge for the conveyance of water or sludge, as the case may be, across the drain beneath, and such trough-bridge shall be kept always clear and properly secure from leakage; and in no case shall any person make any water-drain upon drainage ground already claimed by or assigned to others, or cut across or divert any drain previously existing and owned by some other person or persons, with a view of appropriating to himself or themselves a portion of such drainage water, unless the consent of the owner or owners has been first obtained, or the special sanction of the warden or other authorised person has been given to such measure, on investigation into the matter.

50. *Further protection of drains.*—No miner or miners, or other persons shall, on any pretence whatever, dig upon or into, divert, undermine, or cast into any sludge or water-channel anything which may tend to stop up any such sludge or water-channel, whether the same shall be a public or private channel, unless the neighbours, or any other person or persons working in the adjoining ground and liable to be damaged thereby, shall have previously consented to such being done, or unless on examination into the matter on the spot the warden or authorised person has specially authorised him or them to do so.

51. *Area for puddling machine.*—The owners of a puddling machine shall be entitled to have the following area of ground: Fifty (50) yards square of any gully or flat on which their machine is erected, the point of measurement to be taken from a point five yards below the centre of the machine.

52. *Land to be occupied for residence.*—Any miner shall be allowed to hold and occupy, by virtue of his miner's right, twenty (20) perches of land or seventy-three (73) feet square, for the purpose of residence and cultivation, provided that such land is not situated on any lead of gold.

53. *Land to be occupied by virtue of a business license.*—Each business license shall entitle the holder to occupy an allotment

of land having a frontage of forty-five (45) feet by a depth of one hundred and twenty (120) feet; a space of ten (10) feet wide shall be left between each place of business available for mining purposes, and the stores and premises may be undermined.

54. *Notice to be posted on discovery of gold.*—Any miner or miners entitled to any prospecting claim on any gold field or other crown lands, shall, provided always that if there be not a resident warden within seven miles of such prospecting claim on any said gold field or other crown lands, the said miner or miners shall be entitled to mark off and hold the full extent of any such prospecting claim on making the discovery known forthwith, by calling upon six miners as witnesses and taking them to the place of such discovery, and stating the quantity of gold or gold and quartz taken from such claim; and upon posting a notice of the same, written in a legible hand, upon the outside of the Post Office, and if no Post Office on the outside of any store on any such gold field, with the prospectors and the said six miners as attesting witnesses to the said discovery, and a copy of the notice as posted shall be sent to the office of the nearest warden, by post or otherwise, within seven days of the posting of the same.

MARYBOROUGH MINING DISTRICT.

At a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Maryborough, begun and holden at Maryborough, in the said district, on the 12th day of June, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

CLASS E.—FRONTAGE RULES.

55. It shall be competent for the mining board, on its being satisfactorily proved that any wet lead or deep lead cannot be worked without the aid of machinery, and also that the majority of miners actually holding claims on the said lead require it, to declare the lead under the following regulations to be generally known as the frontage rules.

56. *Frontage system.*—To mean indefinite width until the lead or gutter is defined; or when they commence working or blocking out the ground, the width shall not exceed two hundred (200) feet, measuring one hundred (100) feet on each side of such gutter or lead.

57. *Extent and position of claims.*—The extent of ground for every six (6) miners shall be ninety-six (96) feet along the course of the lead, and shall be marked at right angles with the supposed course of the lead; a wall of four (4) feet shall be left between adjoining claims, and may be worked by either of the adjoining parties; such party who may take out the wall, or any portion of it, must secure the ground sufficiently with timber.

58. *Extended ground for steam machinery.*—Any party who can give a sufficient guarantee to the mining board of their providing steam machinery shall have an extension of frontage to twenty (20) feet per man, or one hundred and twenty (120) feet a claim for six (6) men, and unless they provide such steam machinery in three months from application they shall forfeit their extended claim.

59. *Proceeding to work.*—Within four (4) days after the marking out of a claim the holders of the same shall commence to sink their shaft, and continue to do so all and every lawful day; and when such parties shall strike the water, they shall, if necessary, sink their shaft all and every lawful day and night until their well is complete, after which they shall continue to bale the water all and every lawful day and night until the claim is abandoned; except in special cases, such as breakage of machinery or otherwise, when a special sanction must be obtained from the warden or other authorised person.

60. *Marking of miners' rights.*—Upon any miner presenting his miner's right to the warden or other authorised person for the purpose of registration, he shall mark upon the back of the miner's right the date of registration, number of the claim, and name of the lead for which the applicant may desire to be registered; and the same miner's right shall not be used for registration of any share until such marks or endorsement be cancelled by the warden or other authorised person.

61. *Transfer of shares or portions of shares.*—The warden or other authorised person must register the same before such transfer shall be legal, and give a duplicate of such registration to the transferee, with the conditions under which such transfer is made.

62. *Registration of claims, shares, or sleeping interest.*—That all shares shall be the *bona fide* property of the men registered for such shares, who shall be at liberty to transfer such shares,

or any portion thereof, and the persons to whom such transfers are made shall to all intents be partners in the claim or claims in which such share or shares have been transferred, and shall be entitled to receive their share of all gold obtained from such claim or claims on presentation of their transfer tickets.

63. *Absence from claim a forfeiture.*—That if any miner is absent from his work for more than four (4) working days, unless from illness or other unavoidable cause, the share or interest belonging to such absentee shall be forfeited unless he shall have sent a proper representative to work his share in his absence, and in all cases of absence or neglect from whatever cause, the working party shall have power to hire a man in the place of such absentee for such consecutive watches; such hired man to work and hold possession of such share until his wages (which must be at the current rate) shall be paid.

64. *Forfeiture of shares or portions thereof.*—That in case the interest held by any shareholder shall be forfeited, such forfeiture shall only include the portion then the legal property of the person incurring such forfeiture, and not relate to any portion previously disposed of by transfer; in such cases the person to whom such portions of shares have been transferred shall be allowed precedence of all other persons for the remaining or untransferred part of such share, but if the other shareholders in the claim have been to any expense or loss in consequence of neglect of such absentee whose interest has become forfeited, such loss must be made good to the shareholders by the person to whom such forfeited share is transferred.

65. *Names of claimholders shall be posted.*—As soon as any party or company have legal possession of their claims, such party or company shall post the names in full of each shareholder on the most conspicuous part of their claim, and the names of the shareholders of such party or company must continue to be posted and kept legible until the claim is abandoned.

66. *Provisional transfer.*—It shall be competent for the warden or other authorised person, on information being made to him by two qualified miners that any share or number of shares are neglected or abandoned, to make a provisional transfer of such share or shares to applicants for vacant, neglected, or abandoned shares; such transfers shall be entered in a book by the warden or other authorised person, and a duplicate of such entry shall be given to the person or persons who are thus entered; the holder or holders of such provisional transfer shall hold and be the legal owners of such share or shares, unless within the space of eight days the original holder or holders of such share or shares establish his or their right to such share or shares.

67. *Posting a notice.*—When the warden or other authorised person has made a provisional transfer of any share, the transferee shall forthwith post a notice of the same, which shall continue to be posted and kept legible on some conspicuous part of the claim in which such share is said to be forfeited, and also at the warden's or other authorised person's office or place of business, for the space of eight (8) days.

68. *Discovering lead, or gutter, or payable ground.*—As soon as the lead, or gutter, or payable ground is discovered in any claim, the shareholders must forthwith report the same to the warden or other authorised person, and they shall within a reasonable time put one main drive along the course of the lead or gutter to the boundaries of the claim.

69. *Position of claim in case of deviation of lead.*—In cases where the lead or gutter changes its course from the original supposed one, the position of the claim shall be changed accordingly, taking precedence as before according to their number.

70. *Abandoned frontage leads.*—Previously worked or abandoned ground shall embrace where shafts have been bottomed or worked within two hundred (200) feet of new ground, and it shall be lawful for the warden or other authorised person to grant a double claim of such ground upon application.

71. *The surveyor or any authorised person's books.*—The mining board shall issue books in such form as it shall from time to time decide, such books to be the property, and to be deemed to be records of the board, and the custodian of the book shall at any and all times deliver the same into the custody of the board on an order being made to that effect in writing, or otherwise, through the chairman of the board.





