FURTHER PROROGATION OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS the present Parliament stands prorogued to Thursday, the Eighth day of July instant: And whereas it is deemed expedient further to prorogue the said Parliament: Now therefore I, SIR HENRY BARKLY, the Governor of Victoria, do hereby further prorogue the said Parliament until Tuesday, the Tenth day of August now next ensuing.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this Fifth day of July, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, and in the twenty-second year of Her Majesty's Reign.
