POSTPONEMENT OF THE NEXT PORTLAND GENERAL SESSIONS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the sixteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "*An Act to make provision for the better administration of Justice in Courts of General Sessions in the Colony of Victoria*," it is lawful for the Governor, from time to time, to define and appoint by Proclamation the times at which such courts shall be holden, and such times to alter and vary as the said Governor shall think fit: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the ninth day of March in the present year, certain times were appointed at which the several Courts of General Sessions are to be holden: And whereas it is expedient to alter the time appointed for holding the next Court of General Sessions of and for the district of Portland: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do hereby alter the time appointed for holding the next Court of General Sessions at Portland, aforesaid, from Saturday, the tenth day of July instant, to Monday, the twelfth day of the same month of July.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this eighth day of July, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, and in the twenty-second year of Her Majesty's Reign.
