## BUNINYONG ROAD DISTRICT.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria," it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim and declare any such portion of the said colony as to him should seem meet, as and to be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, and also to define the boundaries of every road district thereby proclaimed and declared, and to give a specific name or designation to every such road district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that the district hereinafter defined shall be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, that is to say:—Commencing at the north-west angle of portion 1. of section VIII., of the parish of Cardigan; thence by the southern side of the main road from Smyth's Creek to Ballaarat, being for a portion of the distance the northern boundary of sections VIII., VI. and V., in the parish of Cardigan, to the southern boundary of the municipal districts of Ballaarat; thence by the southern and eastern boundaries of the said municipal districts to the intersection of the main road from Ballaarat to Melbourne; thence easterly by that road eleven miles and forty chains more or less; thence by a line bearing south eighteen miles and twenty-five chains, more or less; thence by a line bearing west, forming, for a portion of the distance, the northern boundary of the Mount Mercer pre-emptive right, eighteen miles and twenty chains, more or less; and thence by a line bearing north thirteen miles and sixty chains, more or less, to the commencing point.

And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that the specific name or designation of such road district shall be, "The Buninyong Road District."

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria," it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim and declare any such portion of the said colony as to him should seem meet, as and to be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, and also to define the boundaries of every road district thereby proclaimed and declared, and to give a specific name or designation to every such road district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that the district hereinafter defined shall be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, that is to say:—That portion of the Brighton Special Survey west and south-west of the main road from Melbourne to Frankston: Commencing at the intersection of the said main road and the northern boundary of the Special Survey; thence west by the northern boundary of the said Survey to the Bay; thence southwards by the Bay to the southern boundary of the said Survey; thence west by the southern boundary of the said Survey to the intersection of the main road from Melbourne to Frankston; and thence by that main road to the commencing point.

And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that the specific name or designation of such road district shall be, "The Great Brighton Road District."

## MARYBOROUGH MARKET.

## MUNICIPALITY OF BALLAARAT EAST.

**BYE-LAW No. 8.—FOR REGULATING THE FORMATION OF CROSSING PLACES OVER FOOTPATHS, FOR WHEELED VEHICLES, AND FOR PROTECTING THE FOOTPATHS AND WATER CHANNELS WITHIN THE SAID MUNICIPALITY.**

**W**HEREAS great inconvenience and danger have arisen to the public from the absence of proper crossing-places at the intersections of footpaths by cart or carriage entrances and roadways within the municipality: Be it and it is hereby enacted by the municipal council of Ballarat East as follows, that is to say:—

1. All persons who may now or hereafter have any such cart or carriage entrance or roadway for wheeled vehicles across the footpaths that may be now or hereafter formed by direction of the said council within the said municipality shall, upon fourteen clear days' notice from the said council or their authorised officer or officers so to do, at their own cost provide, construct and maintain a crossing-place over the channel and footpath in the manner following:—

2. In streets where a stone or wood kerb is or may be fixed, a kerbing of like material, form and dimensions to that next the street shall be continued round the pavement next the crossing up to the inner edge of the footpath; the water channel shall not be altered, damaged or obstructed; the crossing shall be paved with stone or wood from the water channel to a line with the aforesaid inner edge of the footpath; and the whole (kerbing, water channel and crossing) shall be kept in good repair by the owner or occupier of the property to which the crossing is used as an access.

3. In streets where a footpath or side channel is or may be formed, and where no kerbing is laid, wood planks or suitable framing of adequate scantling shall be provided and fixed over the water channel, so as to leave a free passage for water, and shall extend in width equal to that of the crossing, and transversely five feet from the outer edge of the crossing into the road; and the crossing-place shall be so framed, metalled or gravelled as to be at all times as clean and dry as the footpath immediately adjoining it itself is.

4. The width of any such crossing-place shall in no case exceed ten feet between the edges of the footpath abutting thereon.

5. The materials, construction and arrangement of every such crossing-place shall be subject to the approval of the municipal council for the time being, or their duly authorised officer appointed to inspect and superintend the same; nor shall any such crossing-place be commenced unless the plan or specification thereof shall have been at least seven days previously to the intended date of commencement left with the town surveyor or other officer appointed for the purpose, and the approval thereof by the council notified to the parties proposing to construct the same.

6. Any person passing over any formed water channel (except the channels in the carriage ways at the intersections of the public streets) or footpath, or causing such to be passed over by or with any cart, dray or other wheeled vehicle, unless over and by means of a crossing-place formed in one of the modes hereinbefore described, or otherwise refusing or neglecting to comply with any of the provisions of this bye-law, shall on conviction before two or more justices of the peace forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds in conformity with the statute 18 Victoria No. 15, sec. 35.

## MUNICIPALITY OF BEECHWORTH.

**BYE-LAW No. 22.—FOR LICENSING AND REGULATING CARTERS AND OTHERS PLYING FOR HIRE WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF BEECHWORTH.**

**BE** it and it is hereby enacted by the municipal council of Beechworth (under the provisions of the 18 Victoria No. 15 section 26), that from and after the date of this bye-law being gazetted as assented to by His Excellency the Governor of this colony, all carters, waggons, draymen, and others, plying with vehicles for hire within this municipality, shall conform to and be bound by the hereinafter enumerated regulations and provisions, viz:—

1. That no carter, drayman, waggoner or other the proprietor or lessee of any vehicle whatever shall ply for hire with same within the limits of this municipality, without having first applied for and obtained from the town clerk a license so to do, in the form hereunto annexed, under his hand and the corporate seal of the council, and registered such vehicle in a book to be kept for that purpose in the town clerk's office.

2. That the proprietor or lessee of any two or more vehicles with which it is intended to ply for hire must provide himself with a license for each.

3. That the licenses shall be issuable for the quarters ending 31st March, 30th June, 30th September, and 31st of December, and any fractional part of either of those quarters will be considered and taken (in respect to the issuing of the licenses) as a whole quarter.

4. That every vehicle so registered and licensed shall have legibly painted in white letters upon a black ground on the off side the letters "B. M.," the owners name, and "License No.," with a number to correspond with the registration number in the town clerk's books.

5. That no proprietor or lessee of any registered vehicle so licensed as aforesaid shall, whilst waiting for such vehicle to be hired, keep the same standing in any street or thoroughfare other than on the north-east side of Camp street from the junction of the Bank of New South Wales building with the dead wall in its rear to Loch street, or at such other place or places as the council may from time to time hereafter appoint as a public stand or as public stands for the purpose.

6. And that every proprietor or lessee of any licensed dray or drays shall, when called upon by any constable, or fireman, or by any officer of the municipality so to do, attend with his shaft horse or horses ready harnessed at any place or places where the water carts belonging to the municipality may be kept, and shall there yoke his horse or horses to the water carts and attend any fire within the municipality with such water cart or carts loaded with water and there supply the same, and shall continue to cart water or otherwise afford the use of his horse or horses as may be directed by the superintendent or such other person as on the occasion shall have charge of the fire brigade or engines.

7. And be it and it is hereby further enacted by the aforesaid council, That any person plying for hire within this municipality with any vehicle without having first registered and obtained a license for same, or otherwise in any way neglecting or refusing to comply with any of the requirements, regulations, and provisions of this bye-law, or refusing to produce and show his No. and license whenever required so to do, shall upon conviction before any two or more justices of the peace forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

**BYE-LAW No. 11.—FOR PREVENTING DAMAGE TO THE PUBLIC FOOTPATHS AND WATERCOURSES, AND FOR REGULATING THE FORMATION OF PRIVATE DRAINS AND CROSSINGS.**

**W**HEREAS it has been deemed expedient to make provision for the better protection of the footpaths and watercourses in this municipality: Be it ordered and directed by the municipal council of Maryborough, that any person who shall ride or drive any horse or beast, or who shall drive or wheel any vehicle upon or across any of the public footpaths or watercourses within the municipal district of Maryborough, or who shall cause damage to the said footpaths or watercourses, or any of them, shall upon conviction thereof, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Twenty pounds. Provided that any owner or occupier of any gateway, yard, or lane to which access for horses, carts, or other vehicles can only be obtained by crossing any of the said public footpaths or watercourses, who shall make and maintain such crossing or crossings over the said public footways or watercourses or any of them, as may be necessary for access to any private gateway, yard, or lane, at the expense of such owner or occupier, or such respective owners or occupiers, and under the superintendence of such officer as the said municipal council may appoint for that purpose, shall be allowed to use such crossing without being liable to the penalty hereinbefore imposed. The owner or occupier of any building or premises who shall cause or suffer any water to be discharged or to overflow from any such building or premises into or over any public footpath or highway within the said district, shall upon conviction forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum or penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds: Provided that if such owner or occupier shall make and maintain such drains leading through and under the adjoining paths, as shall be necessary



to discharge the water from such building or premises into the public water tables, channels, or gutters, at the expense of such owner or occupier, or respective owners or occupiers, and under the superintendence of such officer as the council may appoint for that purpose, he shall not be liable to the penalty hereinbefore imposed.

MALDON.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and sixty-eight householders resident at and near Maldon, praying for the erection of the said township into a municipality.

The petitioners state that at a public meeting held at Maldon, on the 19th of May last, a resolution to the effect that it is desirable to erect Maldon into a municipality, was carried; and that they are impressed with the conviction that such a step is advisable, for the better government and improvement of Maldon and its vicinity.

The petitioners suggest that the proposed municipal district should be circumscribed as follows, viz.:—Commencing at a point one chain and a half west from the north-west corner of allotment 12, section 2, suburban lots, north of Maldon (i.e. allowing for a road on the west side of allotment 12); thence north one mile; thence east two miles and a quarter; thence south four miles; thence west two miles and a quarter thence north three miles to the commencing point.

They further state that the area of the proposed district does not exceed nine square miles; that it contains more than three hundred householders; and that no one point therein is distant more than six miles from any other point.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners therefore humbly pray that your Excellency may declare the said district a municipal district, under the name of 'The Maldon Municipality,' pursuant to the provisions of the Act 18 Victoria No. 15, &c."

## MUNICIPALITY OF KYNETON.

FIRST REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF KYNETON FOR THE HALF-YEAR ENDING AND INCLUSIVE OF 10TH JUNE, 1858.

## 1. FORMATION OF MUNICIPALITY.

THE district of Kyneton was duly constituted a municipality by Proclamation of His Excellency Sir Henry Barkly, on the 30th day of October, 1857.

## 2. BOUNDARIES OF THE MUNICIPALITY.

The boundaries of the municipality were fixed by the said Proclamation as follows, viz.:—"Commencing at the south-eastern angle of suburban portion 1, parish of Lauriston; thence by a line bearing north being the western boundary of a Government road to the north-eastern angle of suburban portion 18; thence west by the southern side of a Government road to the north-western angle of suburban portion 17; thence west one chain; thence north one chain to the south-eastern angle of section 43; thence north by the western side of a Government road to the north-eastern angle of section 42; thence by a line bearing north-westerly, being the south-western boundary of a Government road to a road forming the eastern boundary of portion D, section 45; thence by the eastern side of that road and by the northern and western boundaries of the Racecourse Reserve to the River Campaspe; and thence southerly and easterly by the right bank of that river to the south-eastern angle of suburban portion 1, the commencing point.

## 3. ELECTION OF COUNCILLORS.

A public meeting of the householders and landowners within the district was held in the Court House, Kyneton, on Thursday, the 10th day of December, 1857, at which Wm. Lavender, Esq., P.M., presided, by appointment of His Excellency the Governor; and George Wilson, Esq., J.P., and Mr. John Apperly, performed the duties of assessors. The meeting resolved that the council should consist of seven members, and that they should not receive any pecuniary remuneration. Several gentlemen having been proposed as candidates, and a poll demanded, the election took place on the following day, when the undermentioned gentlemen were duly elected, viz.:-

## 4. ELECTION OF CHAIRMAN.

The council held their first meeting on the 14th December, when Edmund Walker Kelly, Esq., was elected chairman of the council for the current year, and he has since been sworn in as an *ex-officio* justice of the peace for the municipality.

## 5. MEETINGS AND ATTENDANCE OF MEMBERS.

The council have held twenty-five general and two special meetings during the half-year. The attendance of members was as follows:—The chairman attended 24; councillors Kenworthy, 24; Geary, 18; Douglas, 20; Leete, 16; Fitzgerald, 25; and Healey, 15 meetings.

## 6. MUNICIPAL CHAMBERS.

The council rented and held several meetings in the Assembly Rooms, Hutton street, and afterwards removed to the Junction Hotel, where they at present meet.

## 7. APPOINTMENT OF OFFICERS.

After advertising in the local newspapers, the following officers were appointed, viz.:-

1st. Town clerk and treasurer, Mr. J. Apperly, salary £200 per annum.

2nd. Town surveyor, valuator and collector, Mr. J. Blakely, salary £200 per annum.

Both officers have been required to find sureties for the proper discharge of their duties.

T. L. James, Esq., has also been appointed solicitor to the council for the current year.

## 8. PERMANENT COMMITTEES.

On the 12th March, 1858, the council appointed the following standing committees, viz.:-

1st. Public works committee—Councillors Douglas, Kenworthy, and Geary.

2nd. Finance committee—Councillors Fitzgerald, Healey, and Leete.

3rd. Legislative committee—Councillors Douglas, Kenworthy, and Fitzgerald.

## 9. MUNICIPAL SEAL.

A design for the common seal has been approved of by the council and sanctioned by the Government, and forwarded to Messrs. Wyon, of London, through Mr. Birkitt, the artist, for engraving.

## 10. RATEPAYERS' ROLL.

The ratepayers' list was prepared soon after the election of the council, and the usual notices given, but no appeal took place against the same.

## 11. BYE-LAWS.

The following are the titles of those which have been assented to by the Governor, viz.:-

1st. To regulate by means of standing orders the proceedings of the council.—Assented to 16th February, 1858.

2nd. For making public any plans of works, &c., before the same be passed by the council.—Assented to 18th May, 1858.

3rd. For levying a rate of One shilling in the pound for the current year.—Assented to 18th May, 1858.

## 12. ASSESSMENT OF PROPERTY.

1st. *Valuation*.—The council having caused an estimate to be made of the probable sum required for the current year's expenditure, resolved to levy a rate of One shilling in the pound on the annual value of all assessable property, to be payable in moieties, one on and after thirty days from the service of the notices, and the other on and after the 1st July, 1858, which was assented to by the Governor, but owing to the delay in its being gazetted no part of the rate has yet been collected.

2nd. *Rating*.—The notices of the rate are now in course of service, against which several appeals have been lodged, but the court for hearing them has not yet been held. The gross assessment after the appeals are heard, it is supposed, will amount to the sum of about £25,000.

## 13. APPLICATIONS TO GOVERNMENT.

In addition to those already adverted to, the following applications have been made to Government:—

1st. For the temporary use of the Court House, Kyneton, for the meetings of council.—Refused.

2nd. For a map of the municipality, showing the original Crown grantees of lands.—Granted.

3rd. To ascertain the powers, if any, of the council over the public lands in the municipality.—Reply, that the council had no powers.

4th. To ascertain the present strength of the police force in the municipality.—Information furnished.

5th. For an increase in the police force in the district.—An additional policeman granted.

6th. For two constables to be placed under the special orders of the council.—Refused, unless the council paid their salaries.

7th. For additional police for night patrol.—One granted, making in all five foot constables for the municipal district.

8th. For money to be inserted on the Supplementary Estimates for a gaol in Kyneton.—Reply, that the matter would receive due consideration when the Estimates for 1859 were framed.

9th. For grant of lots 4 and 5 of section 5 as site for council chambers or town hall.—Not yet replied to.

10th. For seventeen acres of land adjoining the Campaspe, as a site for a botanical garden, in lieu of one and a half acres adjoining the Mechanics' Institute Reserve.—Not yet replied to.

11th. For grant of lands set apart in Langley and Carlisle, as commonage for the town.—Reply, that a grant could not be made, but that the lands would be reserved from sale.

## 14. LEGISLATIVE.

The Government having determined in future to grant money to municipalities only in proportion to the amount raised by rates, and the council feeling the injustice that would thereby be done to this and other newly created municipal districts, sent a petition to the Legislative Assembly, praying the grants to be continued as heretofore.

The council, feeling the importance of legislative endowments to municipalities being settled on a satisfactory foundation, appointed delegates to conferences at Castlemaine and Melbourne on the subject, the result of whose deliberations has not yet been ascertained.

## 15. FINANCE.

This municipality having been formed so late in the year 1857, rendered it impossible to comply with the Government requirements so as to entitle it to a monetary grant for that year. Several applications were, however, made to the Government for that purpose, but the request could not be complied with.

Application has also been made for a grant of money for the current year, and although no official communication to the effect that the same has been granted has yet been received, the council are led to believe that £1000 has been set apart, and will shortly be placed at the disposal of the council.

## 16. PUBLIC MARKET.

The council finding by the Government map of the township that a reserve had been set apart for a market, and feeling the importance of the proper steps being taken to make the same available to the public, applied to the Government on the subject, who referred the council to the Act in that case made, for information. Subsequently, the proper steps having been taken by the public in the matter, the Government have established and proclaimed a market, and the site thereof, namely, section 27; but no steps have as yet been taken by the council towards making the same available as a public market.

## 17. PUBLIC WORKS.

The council received an application from the Kyneton Gas Company for permission to lay gas mains through the town.—Granted.

The council have had under consideration the lighting of the town with gas, and the matter has been referred to the

public works committee to report thereon, but the report has not yet been received.

#### 18. RECEIPTS AND EXPENDITURE.

The certified account following this Report shows the receipts and expenditure of the council for the half-year.

#### 19. MISCELLANEOUS.

The council have been engaged in correspondence with the Government, neighbouring municipalities, and private individuals, on various matters which cannot be detailed within the limits of this report. The same observation is applicable to a variety of miscellaneous matters which have occupied the attention of the council during the half-year.

In conclusion, the council would simply remark that little opportunity has been hitherto afforded them of projecting any works of importance from the absolute want of funds owing to the delay in receiving a Government grant, but they hope shortly to be in a position to take practical steps towards carrying out various necessary improvements within the district.
