## MUNICIPALITY OF BALLAARAT EAST.

**BYE-LAW No. 3.**—FOR IMPOSING A RATE OF ONE SHILLING IN THE POUND ON THE RATEABLE PROPERTY OF THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF BALLAARAT EAST FOR THE CURRENT YEAR.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, "An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," the council of any municipal district is empowered to impose a rate on all houses and lands within the limits of such municipal district; according to the fair average annual value thereof, such rate not to exceed the sum of Two shillings in the pound of such value: Be it therefore enacted by the council of the municipal district of Ballaarat East, that a rate for the current year of One shilling in the pound on the annual value of all property in houses and lands within the limits of the said municipal district, be imposed and levied, and be due and payable in one whole sum on the 26th day of December, in the present year 1857.

## MUNICIPALITY OF BEECHWORTH.

**BYE-LAW No. 10.**—FOR REGULATING AND LICENSING BLASTING OPERATIONS WITHIN THIS MUNICIPALITY.

WHEREAS great danger to life and property accrues from the want of proper precautions being taken during the progress of blasting operations in this municipal district: Be it and it is hereby enacted by the municipal council thereof (under the powers vested in them by 18 Victoria No. 15, sections 26 and 27, and by 18 Victoria No. 14, section 4, and clause 16 of section 5), that from and after the date this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor of this colony, every person carrying on blasting operations in this district, for any purpose whatever, shall conform to, and be bound by, the following regulations, viz.:

1. No person shall commence blasting any substance or material of any kind soever, within the limits of the municipality of Beechworth, without having previously obtained from the town clerk a license so to do in the form to this bye-law appended.

2. The license shall be charged Ten shillings (except to bona fide gold miners, who shall obtain the same without payment), which sum shall be paid to the town clerk towards the council's general fund before the license is issued.

3. The license may be renewed on application to the town clerk, each renewal to be considered and paid for (except as abovementioned) as a new license.

4. Any holder of such license altering same, or allowing it to be altered, or refusing to shew it when required so to do by any of the council's officers, shall be considered and be liable to the same penalty as an unlicensed person.

5. Any person commencing or carrying on blasting operations of any kind in the said municipality without holding a license for the purpose as above required, or any holder of a license exceeding the powers granted thereby, or not conforming to the regulations and provisions of such license and of this bye-law, or any person lending to another such license granted to himself, or any person acting or endeavouring to carry on blasting operations under a license granted to another, shall, upon conviction before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay for each and every such offence a sum or penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

## BLASTING LICENSE.

Mr. \_\_\_\_\_ of \_\_\_\_\_ having made application for a blasting license to enable him to blast on allotment of section \_\_\_\_\_ being in [or abutting on, or near] street [or \_\_\_\_\_], within the municipality of Beechworth, for the purpose of \_\_\_\_\_ permission is hereby granted him to carry on such operations, in such locality, for such purpose, for a period of thirty days from the date of this license inclusive, but on the following conditions only, namely:—

1. That no actual blasting shall take place except during the undermentioned times; i.e., between half-past Four and Eight o'clock in the mornings, and between Five and Seven o'clock in the evenings, during any period between the first day of October and the last day of March in any year; or between Six and half-past Eight o'clock in the mornings and between half-past Three and Six in the afternoons, during any period between the first day of April and the last day of September in any year; unless and except that the municipal council, by minute at a general meeting, authorise a departure from such regulations, in any particular case, under special circumstances, to be laid

before them, in writing, by the person requesting such deviation from rule.

2. That over and upon every portion of the substance or material, of whatever kind, intended to be blasted, shall be placed (and kept there during the actual blasting) a quantity of bushes, brushwood, or branches of trees, bound into trusses of a sufficient thickness or depth, and on these a quantity of planks, slabs, or boards, sufficiently loaded with stone or other heavy substance, as, with the said trusses, shall effectually prevent the material thrown up by the blast from rising or spreading in manner liable to prove injurious to adjacent lives or property.

3. That immediately before the fire is ignited for the purpose of the blast, notice thereof shall be given to all residents within a distance of fifty yards of the intended operation, and also to all persons approaching the spot from either side within the said distance.

4. That any injury of any kind soever that may be done or caused by any blasting under this license shall forthwith be repaired in a thorough manner by and at the expense of the holder of the license.

## MUNICIPALITY OF BELFAST.

**BYE-LAW No. 11.**—A BYE-LAW FOR LEVYING A RATE OF ONE SHILLING IN THE POUND FOR THE CURRENT YEAR.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, "An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," the council of any municipal district is empowered to impose a rate upon all property in houses and lands within such district according to their fair average annual value, such rate not to exceed Two shillings in the pound: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Belfast, that a rate of One shilling in the pound for the current year be levied on all rateable property in houses and lands within this municipal district.

## MUNICIPALITY OF BRUNSWICK.

**BYE-LAW No. 3.**—A BYE-LAW FOR MAKING AN ASSESSMENT, AND IMPOSING A RATE OF ONE SHILLING IN THE POUND FOR THE YEAR 1858.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled "An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," the council of any municipal district is authorised and required to assess all property in houses and lands within the limits of such municipal district (except property belonging to and in the occupation of Her Majesty), according to its fair average annual value, and to impose a rate on all such properties for the current year: Be it therefore enacted by the council of the municipal district of Brunswick, that all the several properties within the limits of the said municipal district shall be assessed for the year 1858 according to the several amounts of annual value respectively affixed to the same in the assessment roll, confirmed by the said council on the 23rd December, 1857, and amounting to a total sum of Thirty-three thousand nine hundred and seventeen pounds (£33,917); and also that a rate of One Shilling in the pound of said annual value is hereby imposed on all the said properties for the year 1858, the first moiety thereof to be due and payable on the 15th day of January, and the second moiety on the 1st day of July, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight.

## MUNICIPALITY OF PRAHRAN.

**BYE-LAW No. 52.**—A BYE-LAW TO AMEND BYE-LAW No. 38, FOR REGULATING THE FORMATION OF CROSSINGS FOR WHEELED VEHICLES OVER FOOTPATHS AND FOR THE PROTECTION OF THE FOOTPATHS AND WATER CHANNELS.

THAT all persons having, or that may hereafter have, roads ways for carts and other wheeled vehicles across the footpaths now formed or that may hereafter be formed by the

municipal council of Prahran, shall, at their own cost, provide, construct and maintain a crossing-place over the water channel and footpath, in the manner following:—In streets where a stone or wood kerb is now or hereafter may be laid, the crossing shall be paved with stone or wood pavement the whole width of the footpath, from the interior edge thereof to the pavement of the water channels, and the pavement shall be enclosed on both sides with stone or wood kerb of the same size and description as the street kerbing, which it must join closely at the angles; the water channel must not in any way be altered or obstructed, and it must be maintained at all times in as good repair, at the cost of the persons having the crossing, as the other portions of the water channel immediately adjoining.

In streets where a footpath and side channel is or may be hereafter formed, and where no kerbing is laid, suitable wood planks or scantlings shall be provided and fixed over the water channel, so as to have a free passage for the water underneath, to project into the public roadway not less than five feet from the outer edge of the footpath, and the crossing-place over the footpath shall be paved, metalled, or gravelled in such manner that it shall at all times be as clean and dry as the footpath itself is immediately adjoining such crossing-place.

The materials used for such crossing-places and kerbing, and the manner of laying the same, shall be subject to the approval of the municipal council or their duly appointed surveyor; and in cases where the material or manner of laying the same or forming the crossing-places shall, on the report of the surveyor, be deemed objectionable by the said council, it shall be lawful for the said council (after the expiration of seven days from any day on which such council shall give notice of objection to the person forming or causing to be formed such crossing-place), to proceed in the manner hereinafter stated as against parties refusing or neglecting to comply with the provisions of this bye-law.

All persons about forming crossing-places over footpaths shall give notice in writing of their intention and submit a specification of the manner in which the work is to be performed to the surveyor, who shall give permission for the same to be proceeded with as specified, provided the specified manner is not objectionable, and shall charge and receive a fee of five shillings for each examination and permission; and the same shall be formed without delay.

All persons crossing any formed water channel or footpath, or causing such to be crossed with or by any cart, dray, or other wheeled vehicles, excepting the channels in the carriage ways at the intersections of the public streets, unless over and by means of a crossing-place formed in one or other of the manners hereinafter stated, and any person neglecting or refusing to comply with any other provisions of this bye-law, on conviction before two or more justices of the peace shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds to be recovered in pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15.

It shall be lawful for the said municipal council also whenever it appears that carts or other wheeled vehicles habitually and frequently cross any formed channel and footpath to any right-of-way, yard, or other premises without a crossing-place having been made as hereinbefore stated, to form such a crossing-place and recover the expense and cost of its construction from the owner or occupier of the premises entered by its use; and cases of common right-of-way from the several owners and occupiers of the premises forming the boundaries thereof, or to which it is appurtenant; and any person refusing or neglecting to pay the amount owing for such construction in the manner aforesaid, shall be liable to the penalty hereinbefore stated for a breach of this bye-law, and the amount of forming such crossing shall and may be recovered in a summary way before any two or more justices of the peace in the same manner as penalties are recovered as by this bye-law is provided.

No. 4, intitled, "An Act for abating the nuisance occasioned by Dogs in the streets of certain towns and on highways in New South Wales," to the township of Avoca, the boundaries of which township are specified below, viz.:—

Commencing at the north-western angle of garden allotment 1, township of Avoca; thence by a line bearing east to the Avoca rivulet; thence by the Avoca rivulet northwards 6 chains and 60 links, more or less, to the northern side of North street; thence by the northern side of that street north 70 degrees east 14 chains, more or less; thence by a line bearing east 42 chains, more or less; thence by a line bearing south 91 chains, more or less; thence by a line bearing west, crossing Rutherford's Creek, 80 chains; and thence by a line bearing north, crossing the Avoca rivulet, 80 chains, to the commencing point aforesaid.

**PARTICULARS.**

On the 30th ultimo, the bodies of two men hereafter described were found dead in a hole between Dunolly and Jones's Creek, two and a half miles from Dunolly, and a quarter of a mile from the old Jones's Creek-road. Over the bodies were found an opossum rug, repaired in the centre with two pieces of striped calico, a blanket, and two calico caps, one of which had a hole in the crown:—1st, a man 6 feet high, thirty-five years old, very muscular, black hair, and small dark whiskers, had on a pea jacket, blue shirt, trousers, and Blucher boots; and 2nd, 5 feet 10 inches high, forty years old, light hair, reddish whiskers, thick beard and moustache, and sharp features, had on a pea jacket, drawers, moleskin trousers, and Blucher boots. The skulls of both men are fractured, and the bodies are in an advanced stage of decomposition, and appear to have been in the hole in question about five or six weeks.—10th December, 1857.
