SUSPECTED MURDER.

FIFTY POUNDS REWARD.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Government that a German named Martin Leahman was last seen in company with one Christian Von See, proceeding in the direction of Myers's Flat, with a horse and cart, at Seven o'clock in the morning on some day about the middle of June last, and has not been since heard of: And whereas there is reason to suspect that the said Martin Leahman has been murdered: Notice is hereby given that a reward of Fifty pounds will be paid by the Government to any person giving information to the police which will lead to the apprehension and conviction of the person or persons who murdered the said Martin Leahman, should it prove that he has been murdered.

PARTICULARS.

Description of the missing man.—Martin Leahman, a German, of slight make, about 48 years of age, with light hair slightly inclined to grey, and rather bald at the top of his head, without whiskers, but he did not shave for a fortnight before he left. He had on two cloth jumpers, the inner one yellow, two pairs of trousers made by himself of old flour bags, a pair of old bluchers or shoes, with blue stockings tied with old rags, an old black hat with a cover of old sacking.

On some day about the middle of June last, at 7 a.m., Leahman and Christian Von See were seen going in the direction of Myers's Flat with a horse and cart. About 8 a.m. they passed the "Allies Hotel," at Myers's Flat, and were then going towards Pearson's. Some days subsequently, at 5 p.m., Von See called at the "Allies Hotel;" he was accompanied by an aboriginal, and stated that he had been looking for a horse on the Loddon but could not find him. Von See also stated that he had travelled that day from the Serpentine, and had stopped the previous night at "Wood's Hotel."

Leahman, it appears, accompanied Von See to search for a lost chestnut horse, which had once strayed from its former owner (Mr. Cotton, of the Allies Hotel), and was eventually found at the Lower Loddon pound. Von See had on two occasions previously gone on foot and alone in search of this horse. There is reason to believe that they on this last occasion proceeded towards the Lower Loddon. The aboriginal above-mentioned is said to have gone to the Whipstick.

On Saturday, the 19th, and Sunday, the 20th of June last, Von See was at the "Durham Ox" public-house (Wood's), at Serpentine Creek, and then gave to mounted constable Emerson the following brands and description of a chestnut horse, which he stated he had lost and had come to look for, viz., "a chestnut horse, branded CT near shoulder, T off shoulder."

On Sunday, the 20th of June, the constable saw Von See's horse and cart at the above-mentioned public-house.

On Monday, the 21st of June, Von See left, and went in the direction of the Serpentine Inn (Rolph's).

MUNICIPALITY OF EMERALD HILL.

REPORT OF THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE COUNCIL FOR THE HALF-YEAR ENDING 30TH JUNE, 1858.

PUBLIC WORKS.

THE following works have been completed during the half-year, viz.:—

The formation of Yarra street, Coventry street between Clarendon and Moray streets, Ferrers street between Bank and Park streets, York street between Cecil and Ferrers streets, Bank street east, Park street east, Little Park street between Cecil and Clarendon streets, Montague street between Coventry street and the Sandridge road, Clarendon street between Coventry and Park streets.

Improvements have been made in Grant street and also in York street and Coventry street between Cecil and Clarendon streets.

The carriage ways of the following streets have been metalled:—Montague street from Coventry street to the Sandridge road, York streets east and west, Park street east, Little Park street between Cecil and Clarendon streets, Coventry street east, Coventry place, Yarra street, Grant street, Clarendon street from Coventry to Park streets, and the tables of Cecil street.

Kerbing has been laid down in York streets east and west, Park street east, Little Park street, Yarra street, Clarendon street from Coventry to Park street on both sides, and from the Sandridge road to York street on the west side.

The following streets have been channelled:—Yarra street, Coventry place, York street west, Little Park street, and in portion of Grant street.

A foot-bridge with approaches has been constructed across the St. Kilda Railway, in the line of Coventry street.

A dangerous nuisance has been abated by filling up the old quarry opposite Grant street.

The council having purchased nearly 10,000 square feet of flagging, the western footpath of Clarendon street has been paved to a width of four feet from the Sandridge road to Park street, and a contract entered into for paving the east footpath

of Cecil street, the same width, from the Sandridge road to Dorcas street.

The formation of Dorcas street east, and of Moray street between Bank and Coventry streets, is in progress; also the extension of Moray street from York street to the Sandridge road.

Contracts have been entered into for the formation, metal-ling, kerbing, and channelling of Union street; kerbing Queen and Emerald streets; and for various improvements in Clarendon street.

Applications have been made to the Government for the extension of Park and Dorcas streets to the Brighton road, and of Moray street to the Yarra, which have been complied with.

The council have been unceasing in their efforts to secure the immediate erection of the bridge at the Falls. Arrangements were entered into with Mr. George Bate to construct the bridge on his patent, but the patentee not being in a position to commence the work, the council are in communication with the Government with a view to a bridge on some other plan being constructed with as little delay as possible.

Several matters of importance are at present under the consideration of the council, such as the establishment of district slaughter-houses, dairy-yards, cemetery, a road through the South Park to St. Kilda, and local gas-works.

The council have also at length succeeded in securing an arrangement with the Commissioners of Water Supply for the extension of Yan Yean water to this district.

SANDRIDGE ROAD.

Considerable improvements have been effected on this road during the half-year. The formation of the south footpath has been continued from the small bridge to the angle of the road near Prince's Bridge; and the north footpath has been formed from the toll-house to the railway crossing. The footpath to the flight of steps near the bridge has been re-formed, and the contract for the repairs and maintenance of the road renewed.

In order to ascertain the relative traffic of the road as regards Emerald Hill and Sandridge, returns have been compiled, the result showing that two-thirds of the traffic belong to this district.

BYE-LAWS.

The council having affirmed the desirability of introducing the ballot at municipal elections, framed a bye-law for the purpose, which, with bye-laws for the regulation of wood carters, and for the licensing and regulation of nightmen, have received the approval of the Government.

"CROWN EXPLANATION" BILL.

After considerable exertion on the part of the council, they have succeeded in securing the passing of this bill in both Houses of the Legislature; and they trust the result will be the speedy termination of the long pending dispute between the railway company and the council respecting the extension of Clarendon street to the Yarra Yarra.

POLICE COURT HOUSE.

The cost of erecting the police court house having exceeded the amount available for the purpose, the council advanced the sum of £455, in order that the work might be completed, which sum was refunded by the Government on the passing of the Supplementary Estimates.

HODGKINSON TESTIMONIAL.

The council joined in a movement to present a testimonial to Clement Hodgkinson, Esq., C.E. (Deputy Surveyor General), in token of the valuable services rendered to this district by that gentleman, whilst acting as honorary consulting engineer to the metropolitan municipalities.

GOVERNMENT GRANT.

The Government grant-in-aid for the year 1858 amounted to £8430 13s. 4d., of which £5044 has already been received.

EXTENSION OF THE COUNCIL CHAMBER.

In order to afford additional accommodation to the rate-payers, the council chamber has been considerably enlarged in size.

ANNUAL ELECTION.

At the close of the municipal year three vacancies were occasioned in the council by the retirement by rotation of Messrs. R. S. Anderson, A. Hancock, and W. Thistlethwaite. The election to supply the vacancies took place on 25th and 26th June, and resulted in the return of Messrs. R. S. Anderson, W. McCutcheon, and C. Chessell.

ATTENDANCE OF MEMBERS.

During the past half-year there have been twenty-five ordinary and twelve special meetings of council, out of which
