NOTICE TO MARINERS.

MASTERS of vessels and others navigating the River Yarra are hereby informed that a lighter lies sunk in 12 feet water, nearly mid-channel, about 200 fathoms north of the boat channel, and near the upper part of the shell bank.

The sunken vessel lies with her mast-head about 14 feet above water. Two lighters are now alongside engaged in raising her.

A red flag will be hoisted at the sunken vessel's mast-head by day, and a bright light by night, until she is removed.
