WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty (Number 14), intituled, An Act to provide for the Management of Towns and other places in Victoria, it was amongst other things enacted, that so many of the provisions of the said Act as relate to the good order of towns and other populous places, being sections numbered V., VI., VII., VIII., X. and X., in the said Act, should extend to and be in force in such cities, towns, districts, and places as the Lieutenant Governor might by Proclamation in the Government Gazette-declare to come under the operation of the same respectively, or any of them, and it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor to define the limits of such places, and to vary and alter such limits and revoke any such Proclamation; and all the other provisions of the said Act except the last (being numbered XXXIX.) should extend to and be in operation throughout Victoria and its dependencies from and after the passing thereof: Now I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor ot Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the township of Heathcôte, in the county of Dalhousie, the limits whereof are hereinafter defined, shall come under the operation of the sections of the said Act numbered respectively V., VI., VII., VIII., IX. and X.

And I do hereby define the limits of the said township of Heathcote to be the following, viz.:—Commencing at a marked post three chains and forty links, south 31 degrees and 35 minutes east, from the south-west angle of allotment 1 of section 1, town of Heathcote; thence by a line bearing north 58 degrees and 25 minutes east, sixty chains; thence by a line bearing south the hundred and twenty chains; thence by a line bearing south
